VIRGINIA VS PENN STATE

- The Nittany Lions and Cavaliers have met every season since 1983.
- Virginia holds a 17-8 overall lead in the series.
- Virginia won this year's regular-season meeting, 16-15, with Casey Bocklet scoring the gamewinning goal with four seconds remaining in regulation
- Penn State and Virginia have met three previous times in the NCAA Tournament with the Cavaliers holding a 2-1 edge. The two programs are among the top four teams in terms of NCAA Tournament appearances (PSU 21, UVa 28).
- This is the second straight season Penn State has traveled to Charlottesville for the NCAA Tournament. The Nittany Lions fell in the first round last season to Princeton and did not face Virginia
- The winner of Penn State-Virginia will face the winner of North Carolina-Florida next weekend. If the No. 2 seed Tar Heels win, they will host the NCAA Quarterfinal game.
- Penn State has won nine of its last 10 games; Virginia has won 9 of its last 11 games

PENN STATE NOTES

- Tatum Coffey leads the team with 40 goals
- Maggie McCormick leads the team with 64 points (22 goals, 42 assists)
- Goalkeeper Emi Smith has a 476.1 save percentage, averaging 8.31 saves per game
- The second-seeded Nittany Lions won the inaugural Big Ten Tournament, 13-11, over No. 20 Ohio State. Tatum Coffey scored four goals and defender Abby Smucker was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.
- The Nittany Lions are looking for their third trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals in four years.
- Penn State is 17-18 all-time in the tournament with a 4-10 mark in away games. PSU's last win at an opponent's field in tournament play was May 8, 1999 at Princeton in the quarterfinals.

VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This is Virginia's 20th-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament and head coach Julie Myer's 20th-consecutive NCAA bid
- This is Virginia's 28th overall appearance in the tournament
- Virginia is 34-24 in the NCAA Tournament with 14 semifinal appearances, eight trips to the National Championship game and three NCAA Titles (1991, 1993, 2004).

HOOS HOT

- Casey Bocklet had seven points in the win over Winthrop, scoring four goals with three assists.
 It was her third seven-point game in the last four contests
- Bocklet's seven points against Winthrop give her 201 career points in her three seasons with UVa, the ninth player in program history to reach that milestone
- Bocklet has scored at least a hat trick in seven of the last nine games
- In addition to Bocklet, three other Cavaliers also had hat tricks against Winthrop
- Kasey Behr had her fourth hat trick of the year and her first since March 14 when she scored a career-high four goals against Princeton
- After snapping a 42-game points streak against Notre Dame, Liza Blue scored three goals against Winthrop, her 10th of the season and 23rd of her career
- Kelly Boyd scored her second-straight hat trick, with all three goals against the Eagles coming in the first half.

ACC RANKINGS

- Courtney Swan leads the ACC, averaging 1.94 assists per game
- Swan is 12th in the nation with 35 assists
- Swan is fourth in the ACC and 16th in the nation, averaging 4.39 draw controls per game
- Swan is eighth in the ACC, averaging 3.61 points per game
- Casey Bocklet is second in the ACC, averaging 1.72 assists per game
- Bocklet is second in the ACC, averaging 4.06 points per game
- Bocklet is 18th in the nation with 31 assists
- Liza Blue is 10th in the ACC, averaging 2.44 goals per game
- Rachel Vander Kolk is second in the ACC in saves per game (7.61) and third in save percentage (.427)

RECORD WATCH AND MILESTONES

- Casey Bocklet became the ninth player in program history to reach 200 career points in the Winthrop game. She needs five points to tie Ashley McCulloch (2006-09) in eight place
- Bocklet has 81 career assists, Tying her for fifth place on the Virginia career list. She needs 22 assists to tie Lauren Aumiller (2000-03) in fourth place
- Liza Blue moved into the top-10 career list in goals scored in the Navy game
- Blue is currently ranked in eighth place on the UVa career goals list with 136 goals and needs two goals to tie Kate Breslin (2004-07) in seventh place
- Blue has 132 career draw controls, ranking sixth on the career draws list. She needs one to tie Cherie Greer (1991-94) in fifth place and four to tie Nikki Lieb (2003-06) in fourth place
- Courtney Swan's 266 career draws currently ranks second in the Cavalier record book. She is 21 draws shy of tying Brittany Kalkstein (2007-10) for the top total in career history
- Swan has 75 career assists, which ranks in ninth place on the career list. She needs one to tie Caitlin Banks (2001-04) in eighth place and three to tie Blair Weymouth (2006-09) in seventh place
- Swan has 187 career points, needing six points to move into the program's top-10

RANKINGS

- Virginia is currently No. 8 in both the IWLCA Coaches' Poll and the media poll
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top-10 in both polls all season long
- Virginia has been ranked as high as No. 4 in the IWLCA poll this season, the highest in-season ranking for the Cavaliers since the 2010 season,
- Virginia finished the 2014 season with a final ranking of No. 4. but its highest in-season ranking was No. 6 that year
- Virginia has spent four weeks ranked in the topfive this season

VS UNRANKED OPPONENTS

- Since 2007, Virginia has only lost four times to unranked opponents, going 55-4 in that span against teams not ranked in the IWLCA Top-20
- One of those losses came last season when Virginia fell 15-13 at then-unranked Princeton.

SENIOR DAY

- Before the Virginia Tech game, the seven members of the senior class were honored in a pregame ceremony
- •Over the last four, or in one case five years, these Cavaliers have helped Virginia make three trips to the NCAA Tournament, including leading Virginia back to the Final Four last season, and a probable return to the tournament this season. These seniors have helped elevate the team to its highest in-season ranking in the last five years, reaching No. 4 in the IWLCA polls after knocking off three undefeated teams this season.
- Collectively, these players have totaled over 600 points in their careers, scoring 419 goals with 197 assists. Three of them will be leaving their names in the Virginia career records list in the points, goals, assists and/or draw control categories. Four of them have earned All-America honors, one of them has started every single game since her freshman season. And one, Courtney Swan, has earned two prestigious academic honors, being named the Elite 89 Award winner at last season's NCAA Championship Weekend banquet, an award presented to the student-athlete with the highest GPA among all players in the championship games, as well as earning an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship this season.

SNAPPED SIX-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia had won six-straight games, its longest win streak since winning seven games in a row during the 2010 season, before falling to Notre Dame on Saturday
- Of those six victories, four were over ranked teams, three against top-10 teams and two against top-five teams

ONE-GOAL GAMES

- The Cavaliers have played five one-goal games this season, going 1-4 in those games
- Virginia earned a 16-15 road win at No. 9 Penn State
- The Cavaliers fell 13-12 in overtime to No. 16 Loyola and dropped regulation contests at No. 3 Syracuse and in the season-opening neutral-site game against No. 5 Northwestern. The Cavaliers fells 7-6 to Notre Dame in the opening round of the ACC Tournament

OPENING STRETCH

- The Cavaliers played five of their first six games on the road
- UVa played four top-10 opponents, all on the road, in its first six games, going 1-3
- The Cavaliers "home" opener against Harvard was relocated to Turf Field because of snow
- Virginia's first game at Klöckner Stadium was the 13-12 overtime loss to Loyola

100 CAREER GOALS

- Liza Blue scored her 100th career goal and won her 100th career draw control at Penn State
- Courtney Swan scored the 100th goal of her career against Duke
- Casey Bocklet scored the 100th goal of her career at Boston College

DEBUTS

- Freshman goalie Rachel Vander Kolk made her debut at Northwestern, logging five saves
- Freshman midfielder Meghan Heick also made her debut at Northwestern and was in the starting lineup for the first two games of the year
- Heick scored her first career goal at JMU
- Freshman midfielder Kasey Behr made her collegiate debut against Richmond, coming off the bench to score a goal, pick up a ground ball and win two draw controls
- Freshman midfielder Lilly DiNardo made her collegiate debut in the Harvard game
- Four Cavaliers made their Virginia debut at William & Mary. Freshmen Daniela Kelly, Jacqueline Wasilko and Ana Hagerup made their collegiate debuts in the game while Katherine Rueger, a transfer from Davidson, made her UVa debut
- Rueger picked up a ground ball and Hagerup took a shot in the W&M game

CAVALIERS VS RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 5-5 this season against ranked teams, 3-3 against top-10 teams and 2-2 against teams ranked 11-20
- Five of Virginia's first eight games were against top-10 opponents
- Eight of UVa's first 10 games were against top-20 opponents
- The game against BC was the second time this season UVa has taken on a team ranked second in the nation, falling to UNC when it was ranked No. 2
- The BC win was the second time in two weeks that Virginia took down a previously-undefeated team. Duke was 9-0, 3-0 ACC before coming to Charlottesville the Saturday before UVa defeated 10-0 BC in Newton

2014 NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This season Virginia has already played all three teams they faced during the 2014 NCAA Tournament, falling 13-12 in overtime to secondround opponent Princeton, falling 10-7 at North Carolina (last year's quarterfinal opponent) and 14-13 at Syracuse (last year's semifinal opponent).
- Virginia was one of six teams last season to earn a first-round bye, facing the Tigers in the 2nd round

ACC POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

- Courtney Swan has been announced as one of 53 recipients of the prestigious Weaver-James-Corrigan Award.
- •These ACC postgraduate scholarships are awarded to selected student-athletes who intend to pursue a graduate degree following completion of their undergraduate requirements. Each recipient will receive \$5,000 toward his or her graduate education. Those honored have performed with distinction in both the classroom and their respective sport, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community. An additional eight student-athletes who plan to enter a professional career in their chosen sport were named honorary recipients.

TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Casey Bocklet and Courtney Swan are among the 25 nominees for the Tewaaraton Award, as announced on April 23
- Five men's and five women's finalists will be selected from these groups of 25
- The finalists will be announced on Thursday, May 7, and invited to the 15th annual Tewaaraton Award Ceremony will be held Thursday, May 28 in Washington, D.C., at the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of the American Indian.

TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Casey Bocklet, Courtney Swan and Morgan Stephens were all named to the initial 50-player Tewaaraton Award Watch List.
- Liza Blue was one of five players added in the second round of midseason additions on April 9

ALL-ACC

- Casey Bocklet and Morgan Stephens were named to the first team
- Courtney Swan earned second team honors
- This was Bocklet's first All-ACC team honor.
- Morgan Stephens was a second-team honoree in 2014
- Courtney Swan earned second-team honors in 2014 and also earned a place on the 2013 All-ACC team

ACC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Goalkeeper Rachel Vander Kolk was named the ACC Freshman of the Year
- She is the seventh Cavalier to earn the honor and the first since Brittany Kalkstein in 2007

'HOOS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is one of five programs in the NCAA to be ranked at least once in every year of the IWLCA Coaches Poll. The poll was created in 1988, with Dartmouth, Maryland, Penn State and Princeton joining Virginia as the only programs to be nationally ranked every year.
- Of those five programs, Virginia is the only program to be ranked in every week of the IWLCA coaches poll, a span of 281-straight polls.
- Of those 281 polls, the Cavaliers have been ranked among the top-10 in the nation on 243 occasions, the second-most among all NCAA programs.
- The Cavaliers have spent 15 weeks ranked No. 1, including the entire 1993 season, en route to the program's second national championship.
- Virginia debuted at No. 7 in the inaugural coaches poll on March 19, 1988. While the Cavaliers have climbed to a No. 1 ranking, the farthest they have ever fallen was to No. 19 on April 23, 2013. Virginia has only spent five weeks ranked outside the top-15.

ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Casey Bocklet earned ACC Offensive Player of the Week honors on April 14
- Bocklet had seven points on four goals with three assists in the win over Louisville
- It was her third ACC Player of the Week honor in the last four weeks

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK SWEEP

- Casey Bocklet was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week and Rachel Vander Kolk was named the ACC Defensive Players of the Week (March 31)
- Bocklet, who was named the Co-Offensive Player of the Week the previous week, recorded a hat trick and added two assists against the previously unbeaten Eagles. She scored two of Virginia's first three goals at Boston College, setting the foundation for the Cavaliers' 6-0 run to start the game. In a 16-6 win at William & Mary, Bocklet recorded a career-high eight points on five goals and three assists. She has posted at least five points in each of Virginia's last three victories.
- Vander Kolk made an ACC single-game seasonhigh 18 saves in Virginia's upset win at No. 2 Boston College and totaled 27 for the week after making nine in the 16-6 win at William & Mary. The freshman goalkeeper faced 41 shots by the Eagles, including five in the final two minutes of the game with Virginia leading 15-13. 
