## OPENING DRAW

### GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia returns to the road on Saturday to visit an old rival, as the Princeton Tigers host the Cavaliers at Class of 1952 Stadium. Faceoff is set for noon.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 12 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 12 in the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media poll. Princeton is No. 19 in the coaches poll and is ranked No. 20 in the media poll.

### THE SERIES VS. THE TIGERS

- Saturday marks the 26th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Tigers, and the first meeting in Princeton since beating the Tigers 12-10 at Princeton Stadium. UVA leads the all-time series 15-10. UVA is 1-3 all-time in the NCAA Tournament against Princeton. The losses in the 1994 and 1996 NCAA Tournaments came in the title game, while the 2000 setback was in the semifinal round. UVA's last NCAA meeting with Princeton (2012) is the Cavaliers' only win against the Tigers in the NCAA Tournament. It was a 6-5 triumph at Klöckner Stadium.
- Of UVA's seven previous trips to Princeton, one game (1995) was played at old Palmer Stadium, while the 2006 and 2008 games were played at Princeton Stadium.
- Saturday is the first meeting between UVA and Princeton at Class of 1952 Stadium since a 10-7 Cavalier win in 2003.

### DOX AITKEN SETS ANOTHER UVA RECORD

- M Dox Aitken reached 100 career points (75-25-100) last time out against High Point. He is the quickest midfielder in UVA history to the milestone, reaching so in 36 games.
- Aitken broke the previous record of 39 games by Pete Eldredge (1969-72).



Dox Aitken is the quickest UVA midfielder all-time to 100 career points, doing so in 36 career games. He is only the 11th UVA midfielder to reach at least 100 career points in program history.

## COVERING THE CAVALIERS

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

**INTERVIEWS**

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

**THE SERIES VS. THE TIGERS**

- Virginia holds a 15-10 lead in the all-time series.
- The first meeting occurred in 1948, but it wasn't until the 1990s that the two schools began to meet with regularity (an annual series began in 1992).
- The annual series was contested from 1992-2008.
- In addition to the regular season series, the two teams have battled in the NCAA Tournament championship game twice (1994, '96), in the semifinals once (2000) and the first round once (2012).
- Virginia has won six in a row and eight of the last nine match-ups.
- The Cavaliers are 5-2 in Princeton, including a 12-10 win the last time they visited (2008).
- The one-goal win in 2006 was Virginia's closest game as the Cavaliers rolled to the 2006 national title undefeated.
- The 2006 and 2007 games have been 7-6 Cavalier victories with Ben Rubeor scoring the winning goal each time.

**HISTORY SUGGESTS A TIGHT CONTEST**

- One of the most prominent characteristics of the Princeton series is how close the games have been—a game decided by more than three goals qualifies as a rout.
- Only five of the last 21 meetings since 1992 have been decided by more than three goals.
- One goal has been the margin on eight occasions (including 7-6 Cavalier wins in 2006 and 2007, and 6-5 in 2012), while five more have been decided by two goals and four by three goals
- Princeton has had remarkable success vs. Virginia in tight games, winning five of the eight one-goal games
- The Cavaliers have won four of five games decided by two goals and three of the three three-goal games.
- Since 1992, Virginia's average margin of victory is 2.9 goals, while Princeton's is 2.4.

**THE LAST MEETING IN A LACROSSE RIVALRY**

- Virginia and Princeton faced each other in the regular season every year from 1992-2008, a span of 17 seasons.
- The last meeting came during the 2012 NCAA First Round at Klöckner Stadium.
- UVA's 6-5 win was unique. It was the lowest number of scores for the Cavaliers in an NCAA win. The combined 11 goals at the time tied for the fifth-fewest ever for an NCAA Tournament game.
- A fourth quarter goal from Chris Bockett via Steele Stanwick proved to be the difference in the game. The game was the very last contest the All-American duo played at Klöckner Stadium.

**THOMPSON RETURNS HOME**

- Virginia goalie Griffin Thompson hails from Princeton, N.J., and will get to face his hometown team on Saturday.
- Thompson went to The Lawrenceville School, which is located roughly six miles from the Princeton campus.

**CAVALIERS HAND TIGERS RARE LOSSES**

- The Tigers lost just once during their NCAA championship seasons in 1996 and 1998—both times to Virginia.
- UVA's 9-7 win over the Tigers in 1998 ended their 29-game winning streak.

**VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER**

- Virginia owns a 138-39 (.7797) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 1-1 mark in 2019. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 12-7 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

**UVA ROCKING THE ASSISTS**

- UVA has scored 33 goals through two games this year and have assisted 22 of them. That means UVA has recorded an assist on 66.7 percent of its goals in 2019.

**DEFENDING THE CLEAR**

- In three games this season, UVA is limiting its opponents to a 69.2 clearing percentage (45-of-65), which is roughly 6.7 failed clears per game by UVA opponents.
- Contrast, UVA is clearing at an 84.9 percent rate (45-of-53), failing 2.7 clears per game.

**DEFENSE FORCES TURNS VS LEHIGH**

- Lehigh had 22 turnovers against the Cavaliers on Feb. 15. UVA caused 12 of those turnovers.
- Of UVA's 12 turnovers, nine came from the starting defense: D Kyle Kology (3), D Cade Saustad (2), D Logan Greco (2) and LSM Jared Conners (2) led the way.

**AITKEN CLIMBS UVA MIDFIELDER SCORING LISTS**

- Midfielder Dox Aitken (75) needs one goal to pass Andy Kraus (75) for sole possession of No. 9 all-time at UVA for career goals among midfielders.
- With 75 career goals, Aitken has reached the 70-goal mark quicker than any other midfielder in UVA history.
- Aitken needs one point to enter the Top 10 in career midfielder points at UVA, tying Ryan Tucker (101).
- Aitken is only the second Cavalier midfielder to reach his 100th career point as a third year, joining Shamel Bratton.
- Bratton reached his 100th career point in career game No. 53, while Aitken is the quickest UVA midfielder to 100 points, doing so in 36 career games. Pete Eldredge (1969-72) was the previous record holder reaching 100 career points as a fourth year in career game 39.

The No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers fell in the season opener against the No. 4 Loyola Greyhounds, 17-9, at the Ridley Athletic Complex.

The Greyhounds' goalie Jacob Stover was hot between the pipes, saving 18 shots by the Cavaliers. UVA opened the game with an extra-man goal by junior Dox Aitken 48 seconds into the game on a Michael Kraus helper. Loyola outscored UVA 8-3 the rest of the first half to take a four-point lead into the intermission, 8-4.

**HOW IT HAPPENED**

UVA was leading 1-0 when a 3-0 Loyola run gave the Greyhounds the lead for good, 3-1. Two goals by Loyola's Pat Spencer sparked a five-goal first quarter for LU.

After being outshot in the first quarter, 15-6, the Cavaliers managed 13 shots in the second quarter but only managed one goal as Stover made six saves in the second quarter.

Stover made seven saves in the third quarter as the Greyhounds started to pull away from UVA. Loyola picked up 11 ground balls in the fourth quarter and outscored UVA 5-2 in the final frame to solidify the win. Spencer and Kevin Lindley each scored five goals in the winning effort for Loyola, while Spencer also added two assists.

**FROM THE LOCKER ROOM**

"Fantastic overall effort from the entire Loyola team. It would be easy to focus on a Herculean effort by their goalie, Jacob Stover, and certainly look at potentially the nation's best player in Pat Spencer and what those two did, but that would take away from the entire team effort that we encountered. It was a heck of a team effort by Loyola on both sides of the field. We tried to hold our slides on defense and they made us pay for that. When we did slide and double the ball, they seemed to find openings. It was one of those frustrating days as defensive coordinator trying to figure out the magic formula and there wasn't one. It is easier to learn from the sting of a loss and we have the opportunity to learn from this loss. I love this team." – Lars Tiffany.

The No. 11 Virginia Cavaliers used an 8-2 run to overcome an early deficit and dispose of the Lehigh Mountain Hawks, 11-8, at Klöckner Stadium. The game which was originally scheduled for Saturday was moved up a day due to a forecast for inclement weather in the Charlottesville area.

Cavalier goalie Alex Rode made three key saves in the third quarter, two of which came in man-down situations. The saves aided Virginia in holding Lehigh scoreless for 19:57 from the second quarter until the fourth quarter.

**HOW IT HAPPENED**

For the second week in a row UVA scored first, but then found itself in a hole. With a 2-0 lead over the Mountain Hawks, Lehigh responded by scoring five goals in a row to take a 5-2 lead at 7:42 in the second quarter.

Lehigh owned a two-goal lead, 6-4, at halftime. UVA, who handed Lehigh three extra-man goals in the first half on four penalties, settled in nicely. Dox Aitken scored a big goal to lead the third-quarter scoring. Michael Kraus scored back-to-back goals to give UVA the lead for good.

**FROM THE LOCKER ROOM**

"We had a couple man down stops in the third quarter and those two stops were big. Rode made a couple nice saves that could have been big momentum goals for Lehigh. From there we just got smarter about what we were doing physically. We're a physical team, we put some people on the ground after they take shots and we want to get after it in the ride. We take a lot of pride in our riding here and we had another good game in that phase. You have to put a lot of pressure on the ball and sometimes we do foul. Michael Kraus right here at the midline got that hold and I can't get upset with Michael because we're asking him to be relentless. We tell our attackmen that they are the defensive frontline of a football team, you got to get pressure. If we can get pressure with three or four rushing the passer then we don't have to implement a 10-man [ride] and we can cause turnovers, which we saw tonight. But it starts with our defensive line, they have to pressure. We tell them you don't have to make the sack, just force a bad pass or an interception because our safeties, our middies, they're ready to jump on errant passes." – Lars Tiffany
