QUICK HITS

THURSDAY NIGHT ACC MATCHUP

• A pair of undefeated ACC teams open their conference schedule this Thursday when Boston College (2-0) travels to Wake Forest (2-0) for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on ESPN. Boston College is 2-0 to start the season for the first time since 2015 after wins over UMass and Holy Cross. The Eagles have started 2-0 three times during the Steve Addazio era. Wake Forest improved to 2-0 for the third consecutive season under head coach Dave Clawson with a win last week over Towson.

• This is the second Thursday night game of the season for Wake Forest, which began the year with a 23-17 overtime win over Tulane on Thursday, Aug. 30.

• In ESPN Thursday night games, Wake Forest is 4-2 since 1997, with all six coming at home.

• Boston College is 5-7 in ESPN Thursday night games as a member of the ACC, but has not played in a Thursday night game since 2011.

WEEK THREE HIGHLIGHTS

• Two Saturday afternoon ACC contests highlight the third week of the 2018 season. Florida State plays at Syracuse at noon on ESPN, and Georgia Tech visits Pitt at 12:30 p.m. on RSN. The Orange is 2-0 for the first time since 2015 and ranks sixth in the country averaging 58.5 points per game.

• Two of the winningest active coaches in college football meet Saturday when Virginia plays host to Ohio. Among coaches with five years of FBS experience, Ohio's Frank Solich ranks 10th with 156 career wins, while Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall is 20th with 108.

• NC State seeks its 13th straight non-conference win at home Saturday when the Wolfpack play host to West Virginia of the Big 12. NC State has not lost to a non-conference opponent at Carter-Finley Stadium since falling to East Carolina late in the 2013 season.

• Playing its first home game of the season, UNC plays host to 18th-ranked UCF, which brings the nation's longest winning streak (15 games) to Kenan Stadium on Saturday at noon on ESPN2. This is UCF's first game against an ACC team since losing to NC State in the 2014 St. Petersburg Bowl.

• Virginia Tech plays host to East Carolina on Saturday at 12:20 p.m. The Hokies are 2-0 against ECU under head coach Justin Fuente, outscoring the Pirates by a 118-34 margin the past two years.

RUSHING QUARTERBACKS

• Four quarterbacks rank among the top 10 in the ACC in rushing through the first two games of the season. Syracuse's Eric Dungey is second in the conference and 18th in the nation with 122.0 rushing yards per game. Virginia signal-caller Bryce Perkins is third in the league at 115.0 yards per game, and a pair of Georgia Tech quarterbacks – TaQuon Marshall and Tobias Oliver – rank sixth and ninth, respectively.

• Dungey and Marshall both rank in the top 15 in ACC career rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. Dungey is 14th with 21 rushing scores, while Marshall is 15th with 20.



BRING YOUR A GAME

ACADEMICS

- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average of 76. That ties for first among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Wake Forest (93) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau last year.
- In the 2017 U.S. News and World “Best Colleges” rankings, ACC member schools combine for an average rank of 54.2, marking the 11th straight year that the ACC has led all Power 5 conferences.

ATHLETICS

- The ACC is the only conference to win national championships in football, men’s basketball, women’s basketball and baseball over the last four years.
- The ACC has won a combined four football and men’s basketball national titles over the last five years, twice as many as any other conference.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past five years.
- The ACC led all conferences with 10 bowl teams in 2017. Over the last two years, the ACC has had a nation’s best 21 teams in bowl games.
- The ACC has earned at least six bowl bids in 17 consecutive seasons. The league ranks second among all conferences with 116 total bowl appearances since 2005.
- Since 2013, the ACC is second among all conferences with 54 postseason appearances, has the second-best record of any conference in BCS, New Year’s Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016).
- Over the last four years, the ACC is 13-3 in games against the SEC on rivalry week, which features Clemson-South Carolina, Florida State-Florida, Georgia Tech-Georgia and Louisville-Kentucky. The league was 3-1 in 2017, winning all three games on the road.
- Two of the last five national champions have come from the ACC, and the league has had a team in the national championship game in three of the last five years. Both are tied for the most from any conference.
- An ACC football player has won the Heisman Trophy or the Campbell Trophy – commonly referred to as the “Academic Heisman” – in four of the last five years, something no other league can claim.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

• The ACC won 10 non-conference games last weekend, including three victories over FBS competition. No. 2 Clemson won at Texas A&M, Duke beat Northwestern on the road and NC State defeated Georgia State in Raleigh.

• Over the last two weekends, the ACC has 19 wins over non-conference opponents, which ranks second only to the SEC.

THREE IN AP TOP 25

• Led by No. 2 Clemson, three ACC teams are ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 football poll (Sept. 4). Clemson received six first-place votes to place second behind Alabama, which received 54. Virginia Tech moved up one spot to No. 13 after beating William & Mary, while Miami moved to No. 21 following a win over Savannah State. Boston College (45), Duke (10), NC State (9) and Florida State (1) also received votes in the poll.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

• Clemson is one of five teams in the country that has not turned the ball over this season. The Tigers are one of four ACC teams ranked in the top six of fewest turnovers lost. Virginia Tech, Boston College and Duke have had just one each.

TACKLES FOR LOSSES

• Virginia Tech and Clemson rank among the top seven teams in the country in tackles for losses. The Hokies are second nationally with 23 TFLs in wins over Florida State and William & Mary. The Tigers are seventh with 20 TFLs after beating Furman and Texas A&M.

SIX ON AP ALL-AMERICA TEAM

• Four players from Clemson and two from Boston College headline the ACC contingent on the 2018 Associated Press Preseason All-America Team. The first-team All-America Tigers include OT Mitch Hyatt, last season’s ACC Jacobs Blocking Trophy winner, defensive end Clelin Ferrell and defensive tackle Christian Wilkins. Defensive tackle Dexter Lawrence is a second-team selection. Boston College running back A.J. Dillon and safety Lukas Denis are also second-team selections.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

• Three-time defending champion Clemson is the preseason favorite to claim another ACC football championship, according to a poll of 148 media members who voted at the 2018 ACC Kickoff. The Tigers, who posted a 12-2 overall record en route to earning a College Football Playoff berth for the third consecutive year in 2017, were also picked to repeat as Atlantic Division winners. Miami was picked to finish atop the Coastal Division for the second consecutive year.

• Clemson was named the likely 2018 ACC champion on 139 ballots, with Miami a distant second with five votes. The Atlantic and Coastal Division winners will meet in the 2018 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game on Saturday, Dec. 1, at Charlotte’s Bank of America Stadium. If this year’s media predictions prove correct, it will be a rematch of last year’s 2017 title game, in which the then-defending national champion Tigers posted a 38-3 win over the Hurricanes en route to securing the CFP berth.

ACC COACHING EXPERIENCE

• Twelve of the 14 ACC football coaches had head coaching experience prior to their current position, including four that previously held a head coaching job at a Power 5 school. In addition, eight of the coaches have been a head coach for 10 years or more.

SIX ACC COACHES IN TOP 25 WIN PERCENTAGE

• Among active coaches, six current ACC head coaches rank among the top 25 in the nation in career winning percentage, led by Clemson’s Dabo Swinney at No. 5 with a .774 mark.

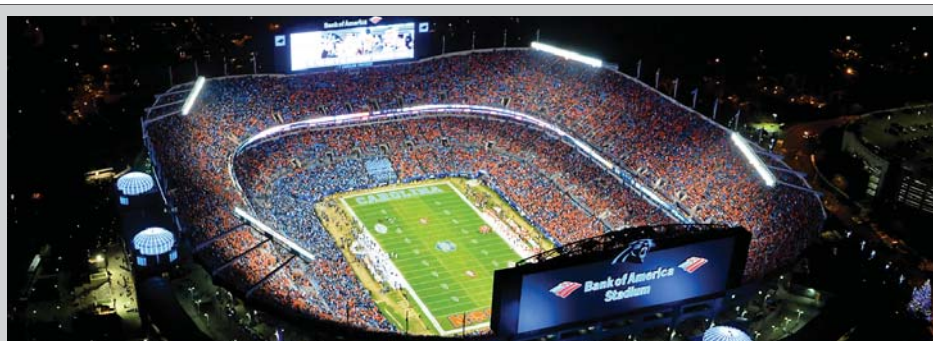
