THIS WEEK

- Virginia looks to capture its ninth consecutive ACC Tournament title and its 11th in the past 12 seasons
- By winning the title, Virginia would tie Duke for the most ACC Championships (11) during the team tournament era (since 1986)
- By winning the title, Virginia would tie the longest streak of consecutive ACC Men's Tennis Championships (North Carolina won nine consecutive from 1970-78)

ACC TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Virginia has won the ACC Tournament in 2004, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014
- The Cavaliers have a 33-3 record in the ACC Tournament under Brian Boland
- Virginia has a 22-1 all-time record at the Cary Tennis Center
- In the team tournament era (since 1986), only Duke (11 championships) has more ACC titles than Virginia (10)
- UVa's current streak of eight straight titles is tied for the longest active streak of ACC Championships in any sport (UVa women's swimming has won the last eight ACC Championships)

THE STREAK

- Virginia has won 136 consecutive matches against ACC opposition (regular season and tournaments)
- The Cavaliers' last loss to a conference foe was a 4-3 decision to Duke in the 2006 ACC Championship final
- Last year the streak became the longest in conference history in all sports, passing Duke women's tennis' 116 straight wins against ACC foes from 1989-2000

2015 Opponents in Bold

DECADE OF DOMINANCE

- Virginia won its 12th consecutive ACC regular season title this season
- The Cavaliers have gone undefeated through the league in 10 of those 12 years
- During the last 12 years, Virginia has gone 124-3 (.976) in ACC regular season matches
- The three losses came to UNC ('04), at UNC ('06) and Miami ('06)

DOUBLES SUCCESS

- The Cavaliers have won 14 consecutive doubles points
- Virginia has won the doubles point in 21 of 23 matches this season (lost doubles point in both matches vs. Baylor)
- In ACC play, the Cavaliers lost two doubles matches, sweeping the doubles in 10 of 12 ACC contests

IN THE RANKINGS

- Virginia currently has four nationally ranked singles players (No. 7 Ryan Shane, No. 18 Thai-Son Kwiatkowski, No. 21 Mitchell Frank and No. 93 Collin Altamirano)
- On Feb. 22, the Cavaliers had both the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked singles players (No. 1 Kwiatkowski, No. 2 Shane) in the nation for the second time in school history
- Luca Corinteli and Ryan Shane are currently ranked a career-high No. 2 in the ITA Doubles Rankings and are the highest-ranked Cavalier doubles team since Jarmere Jenkins and Mac Styslinger ended the 2013 season at No. 2
