The Virginia women's basketball team (15-9, 5-6 ACC) hosts No. 7 Florida State (22-3, 9-2 ACC) on Sunday, Feb. 15 at 1 p.m. at John Paul Jones Arena in the annual #Play4Kay game. The players will be wearing special pink jerseys and all fans are encouraged to wear pink to the game in support of breast cancer awareness.

The game is the last of three-straight games for Virginia against top-12 opponents. Uva is 0-4 this season against ranked teams. Virginia's last victory over a ranked team was the 86-72 victory over No. 6 Maryland last season at John Paul Jones Arena.

Virginia is coming off a 71-45 loss to No. 11 Duke on Thursday in which the Cavaliers failed to top 50 points for the first time since falling 49-43 to Kansas State in The Bahamas on Nov. 24, 2013.

Senior center Sarah Imovbioh (Abuja, Nigeria) was the only Cavalier to finish the game in double figures with 14 points and eight rebounds. Imovbioh converted her first five field goal attempts, finishing the game 6-of-10.

After the Cavaliers missed their first nine three-point attempts of the game, freshman guard Mikayla Venson (Arlington, Va.) hit Uva's first trey seven minutes into the second half. After combining to go 21-of-34 (61.7 percent) from three-point range in the victories over Clemson and NC State, Uva has gone 2-of-11 from three in each of the last two losses.

Duke outrebounded Virginia 42-25, the third-straight game in which the Cavaliers were outrebounded by double digits. In the last seven games, five opponents have grabbed 40 or more rebounds including Clemson grabbing 45, the highest by a Virginia opponent this season.

Virginia, who leads the ACC with the fewest turnovers per game (13.8), had 22 against Duke, only the third time this year the team turned the ball over more than 20 times.

**COUNTDOWN TO 1000**

- Two Virginia players have a chance of becoming the 30th and 31st members of the Virginia 1,000 point club this season
- Sarah Imovbioh comes into the game with 954 career points, making her 46 points shy of the milestone
- Faith Randolph has 925 career points, needing 75 points
- Imovbioh also has 721 career rebounds, 48 shy of moving into a tie for 10th place on the Virginia all-time rebounding list

**BACK TO BACK TO BACK BATTLES**

- In the three games before the Notre Game contest, there were a combined 28 lead changes and 23 ties
- Against Georgia Tech, there were 15 ties and 12 lead changes with the Yellow Jackets overcoming a 10-point deficit
- Against NC State, there were six ties and nine lead changes with the Cavaliers overcoming an eight-point deficit
- In the Clemson game, there were seven lead changes and two ties

**ACC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

- Guard Mikayla Venson was named the ACC Freshman of the Week for the week ending Feb. 1, her first career ACC honor
- Venson averaged 17.0 points and shot 80.0 percent (8-of-10) from 3-point range this week, while helping to lead the Cavaliers to a pair of victories over NC State and Clemson. Venson was 6-of-6 from 3-point range in the victory over NC State, setting the Virginia school record for 3-point efficiency in a game. With Virginia trailing by five points with five minutes left in the game, Venson scored eight-straight points, including hitting a pair of three-pointers, in a span of 2:18 to give Virginia a 63-60 lead. The Arlington, Va., native finished the game with 22 points, and also had a critical block down the stretch to help the Cavaliers get the win over the Wolfpack.
- Venson is the first Cavalier to earn the ACC Freshman of the Week honor since Ataira Franklin earned the accolade on Feb. 14, 2011.
- Sarah Imovbioh is the other Cavalier to earn an ACC weekly honor this season. She was named the Player of the Week after her opening weekend performance against Ohio State

**THREE-POINT SHOOTING AGAINST NC STATE AND CLEMSON**

- The Virginia shooters combined to make 10 three-pointers at Clemson, the fifth time this season that the team made 10 or more three-pointers in a game
- The Cavaliers shot 52.6 percent from three-point range at Clemson, the third time this season (and the third time in the last six games) they made more than 50 percent of their 3-pters
- In those two games, the Cavaliers were 21-of-34 from three-point range (61.7 percent)
- Virginia is third in the ACC in three-point shooting efficiency at 35.4 percent

## THREE-POINT SHOOTING DEFENSE

- Virginia's five opponents prior to the Clemson game were held to less than 25 percent shooting from three-point range and were a combined 15-of-84 (17.8 percent)
- In the Louisville game, the Cardinals went 0-of-9 from three-point range, the first time Virginia held an opponent scoreless from beyond the arc since Norfolk State went 0-of-9 in 2012.
- Miami was just 1-of-12 from three-point range in the first half and finished the game shooting 21.1 percent (4-of-19)
- Georgia Tech was 2-of-15 (13.3 percent) from three-point range, 1-of-7 in the first half and 1-of-8 in the second half
- NC State missed its first eight three-point attempts and finished the game 6-of-26 (23.1 percent)
- Clemson snapped the streak by shooting 38.1 percent (8-of-21)
- Notre Dame started a new streak, going 2-of-8 (25.0 percent) from 3

## NON-STARTERS

- In the Louisville and Miami games, the Virginia "bench" scored a combined seven points, three at Louisville and four at Miami, going a combined 1-of-8 from the field
- The non-starters only had two field goal attempts at Miami, a layup from Sydney Umeri and a blocked jumper from Aliyah Huland El. Sarah Beth Barnett was fouled while attempting a three-pointer, scoring two points from the free throw line
- Against Georgia Tech, the non-starters contributed nine points with Aliyah Huland El scoring seven points, all in the first half. Sydney Umeri scored on a second-half layup

## RECORD-SETTING SINGLE-GAME PERFORMANCES

- Mikayla Venson's 6-for-6 three-point shooting performance against NC State was the best long-range shooting in program history, besting three players who have gone 5-of-5 from outside the arc in a game including Donna Holt (1988), Tammi Reiss (1990) and Kate Mooney (1997).
- Only one other player, Makenzi Morrison of BYU, has made more three-pointers in a game this season without a miss. Morrison went 7-of-7 against Pepperdine
- Venson was one trey shy of matching the program record for made-threes in a game with Mimi McKinney (1998), Kate Mooney (1998) and Monick Foote (1995) each having made seven threes in a game (on no fewer than 12 attempts)
- This was the second time this season a Cavalier rewrote a single-game record. Sarah Imovbioh set the school record for rebounds in a single game in the opener against Ohio State, grabbing 24 rebounds

## HOT SHOOTING PERFORMANCES

- Sarah Imovbioh was 9-of-11 (81.8 percent) from the field against Howard, topping her previous-best shooting, a 7-of-9 night against Auburn. She was also 7-of-9 in the final non-conference game against Drexel.
- Mikayla Venson was 6-of-8 from the field against Radford and 3-of-4 against Auburn. All four of her shots against Auburn were from beyond the arc.
- Venson was 5-of-7 from the field against FIU
- Breyana Mason was 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) shooting against Auburn
- Aliyah Huland El went 2-of-3 from 3-point range against FIU
- Sydney Umeri was 4-of-7 at Illinois and 3-of-4 against DSU
- Lauren Moses was 4-of-5 for 8 pts against Wake
- Breyana Mason was 7-of-9 against Georgia Tech with all nine attempts coming inside the 3 pt line
- Venson was 7-of-8 overall and 6-of-6 from three-point range against NC State

**DISHING IT OUT**

- Breyana Mason had seven assists against Delaware State
- Mason matched that mark with seven assists against Boston College (with one TO)
- Mason had six assists in the loss to Duke
- Sarah Beth Barnette had a career-high five assists against Delaware State
- Ten out of Virginia's 11 players had at least one assist against Delaware State
- Faith Randolph had her second five-assist game of the season against NC State

**TURNOVERS**

- The Cavaliers forced 25 turnovers against FIU, scoring 31 points off the miscues. Virginia only turned the ball over seven times in the game.
- The Cavaliers forced 20 Radford turnovers while only committing five.
- Both Mikayla Venson and Sarah Imovbioh had five steals against FIU.
- Seven different players had at least one steal against Radford.
- Virginia leads the ACC in fewest turnovers per game

**THREE-POINT SHOOTING**

- The Cavaliers were 7-of-10 from three-point range against Auburn, the first time Virginia had a 70 percent or better three-point efficiency since making 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) against UCSB in an NCAA Tournament game in 2008.
- The Cavaliers made 13 threes against Boston College, one shy of matching the school record
- Faith Randolph was 9-of-16 (56.3 percent) from three-point range through the first four games of the year
- Breyana Mason went 5-of-7 from three point range in the opener against Ohio State, but hadn't taken another three-point shot until going 0-for-1 against Toledo
- Mason went 4-of-5 against Boston College
- Mikayla Venson made five of her seven three-point attempts against Delaware State. Venson had another five-3 ptr game, making five of Virginia's 10 treys against Wake Forest, going 5-of-10 from long range

- The Cavaliers shot a season-best 73.3 percent (11-of-15) from three-point range, the third-highest team three-point shooting percentage in a game this season with only Stephen A. Austin's 83.3 percent (10-of-12) against Central Arkansas and Chattanooga's 75 percent (12-of-16) posting higher efficiencies while making at least 10 treys.
- The 11 makes from long range was the fourth time this season Virginia made 10 or more three-pointers in a game. Since 2008-09, Virginia has only had five games in which the squad has made at least 10 threes in a game. The Cavaliers went 6-of-7 from three-point range in the first half and made eight of their first nine attempts (88.9 percent).
- Venson went a school-record 6-of-6 from three against NC State
- The Cavaliers started the Clemson game making six of their first nine three-point shots. They finished the game 10-of-19 (52.6 percent)

**ACC LEGENDS**

- Former Audra Smith (1989-92) is a member of the 11th annual class of the ACC Women's Basketball Legends presented by New York Life
- The Cavaliers will face Smith this week as she is in her second season as the head coach of the Clemson Tigers
- During Smith's four-year playing career at Virginia (1989-92), the Cavaliers went 113-18, made three trips to the Final Four and won two ACC Championships. After graduating from Virginia with a degree in sociology in 1992, she worked in her hometown of Milledgeville, Georgia, before joining Debbie Ryan's staff in 1994, serving as an assistant coach. Smith served as the recruiting coordinator beginning in 2000, before leaving in 2004 to become the head coach at Alabama Birmingham. At UAB, Smith amassed a 57-39 record with her teams finishing with a winning record in each of her last four seasons there. On April 8, 2013, Smith was named the head coach at Clemson.

**ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM NOMINEE**

- Sarah Beth Barnette is one of six ACC student-athletes that have been nominated for the 2015 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team
- This prestigious community service award recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities as well as exhibiting exceptional leadership skills and an unwavering commitment to volunteerism.
- A final roster of five Division I student-athletes will be announced in February

**AT NOTRE DAME**

- An and-one by Sydney Umeri with 15:26 remaining cut the deficit to seven, 49-42, the closest the Cavaliers would come.
- Virginia scored two points in the final 5:44 of the game.
- Virginia was 2-of-11 (18.2%) from three-point range. UND was 2-of-8 (25.0 percent)
- Faith Randolph scored 14 points in the first half, starting the game making 6 of 9 shots in the half. She finished the game with 16 points, going 7-of-13
- Sarah Imovbioh made zero field goals, going 0-fo-3, but scored three points on 3-of-4 free throw shooting. Imovbioh also added three assists and a steal.

**CONTAINING CLEMSON COMEBACK BID**

- After a hot-shooting first half in which the team made nine three-pointers and shot 62.1 percent, the Cavaliers built up a 19-point lead, 53-34, with 17:41 left in the game. Virginia started the second half making just five of its first 21 field goal attempts (23.8 percent) while the Tigers chipped away at the lead. Clemson erased the last of the deficit and took a 68-67 on a three-pointer after having an initial shot blocked but kicking out the offensive rebound to Chelsea Lindsay on the perimeter with four minutes left in the game.
- Clemson went 0-of-6 from the field in the final three minutes while Virginia got a key putback from freshman forward Lauren Moses (Mount Holly, N.J.) with 1:47 left in the game. Virginia made six free throws in the final 2:30 to shore up the 77-72 victory.

**WIN OVER THE WOLFPACK**

- With Virginia trailing by five points with five minutes left in the game, Mikayla Venson scored eight-straight points, including hitting a pair of three-pointers, in a span of 2:18 to give Virginia a 63-60 lead. After NC State narrowed the gap back to one, 64-63, with 1:13 remaining, Venson kicked the ball out to Breyana Mason who hit UVA's 11th three-pointer with 52 seconds remaining. After a pair of UVA free throws increased the lead to 69-63, NC State's Jennifer Mathurin took a three-point shot that was blocked by Venson. Mason scooped up the rebound and was fouled, going to the line to convert two free throws with seven seconds remaining to give the Cavaliers a 71-63 victory.
- Venson matched her career high with 22 points, going 7-of-8 overall and 6-of-6 from three-point range. Her 6-of-6 performance was the best long-range shooting in program history, besting three players who have gone 5-of-5 from outside the arc in a game including Donna Holt (1988), Tammi Reiss (1990) and Kate Mooney (1997).
- The Cavaliers made eight of their first nine three-point attempts and finished the game making 11 of 15 (73.3 percent). The Wolfpack went 6-of-26 from three with Mathurin making four of the long-range goals.

**ROAD LOSS AT MIAMI**

- Virginia held a 27-25 advantage at halftime, but the Hurricanes outscored the Cavaliers 42-31 in the second half
- Both teams shot less than 40 percent in the game with Miami going 25-of-64 (39.1 percent) while Virginia was 19-of-49 (38.8 percent) from the field.

**LACK OF THREES AT LOUISVILLE**

- After coming within one of the program record when they hit 13 three-pointers in the victory over Boston College last Thursday (Jan. 15), the Cavaliers made just one at Louisville, shooting a season-low 9.1 percent from beyond the arc.
- The Cardinals went 0-of-9 from three-point range, the first time Virginia held an opponent scoreless from beyond the arc since Norfolk State went 0-of-9 in 2012.
- Faith Randolph scored 24 points with five rebounds and three assists against the Cardinals. Randolph, in her third-straight game scoring 23 or more points, made a career-best 11 field goals while taking 22 shots. It was the fourth time this season Randolph took 20 or more shots in a game.
- Sarah Imovbioh had back-to-back double-doubles against BC and Louisville, scoring 11 points with 15 rebounds against the Cardinals, the fourth time this season she had 15 or more rebounds in a game.

**13-3'S VS BC**

- The Cavaliers hit 13 three-pointers, including going 10-of-16 from long range in the first half, while limiting the Eagles to just three long-range baskets. Virginia shot just 36.1 percent overall in the game (22-of-61), but made 50.0 percent of its three-point attempts (13-of-26).
- Virginia's 13 three-pointers was one make shy of tying the program record for made-threes in a game. It was the third time this season that UVa made 10 or more three-pointers in a game.
- The Cavaliers had 16 assists, including the seven by Mason, on 22 field goals.
- Faith Randolph had her second-straight 20-point game, scoring 23 points, including going 4-of-6 from three-point range, with six rebounds.
- Breyana Mason scored 12 points, going 4-of-5 from three-point range, with seven assists and two steals.
- Sarah Imovbioh had her eighth double-double of the season, with 11 rebounds while scoring all 10 of her points in the second half.

**COLD SHOOTING AT 'CUSE**

- Virginia got off to a slow start in the first half, going making 10 of 39 shot attempts in the period including starting the game 1-of-12, while the Orange made eight three-pointers to take a 41-23 lead into halftime. The Cavaliers briefly cut the deficit to single digits with 12:30 remaining in the game, but Syracuse's timely three-pointers cut down Virginia's comeback attempts.
- Faith Randolph paced the Cavaliers at Syracuse with her sixth 20-point game of the year, scoring 24 points. Randolph made 10 field goals, scoring six of Virginia's 10 buckets in the first half, her second 10-basket performance of the season. Randolph also took 22 shots in the game, the third time this season she attempted 20 or more in a game.
- Lauren Moses matched her season high with 13 rebounds against Syracuse, grabbing 11 of those in the first half.

**CAVALIERS COMEBACK VS WAKE**

- Virginia earned a 72-70 home victory over Wake after trailing by nine points with 7:27 left in the game
- Mikayla Venson scored 16 of her 21 points in the final 6:39 of the game
- Venson scored Virginia's final 10 points, including hitting a pair of free throws with 1.0 seconds remaining.
- Venson went 5-of-10 from three-point range
- Lauren Moses had a well-balanced game, scoring eight points on 4-of-5 shooting, with seven rebounds, two assists and two steals. Moses also had three blocked shots, including batting down a potential game-winning attempt by the Demon Deacons in the final 18 seconds of the game.

**NATIONAL GIRLS & WOMEN IN SPORTS DAY**

Meghan O'Leary, a former two-sport student-athlete and Jefferson Scholar at Virginia and current member of the USRowing Board of Directors, will be honored on National Girls and Women in Sports Day when the Cavalier women's basketball team hosts Georgia Tech on Sunday, Jan. 25 at 2 p.m. at John Paul Jones Arena.

National Girls and Women in Sports Day brings national attention to the achievements of female athletes and to issues facing girls and women in sport. The event is co-sponsored by the University of Virginia Athletics Department and the University of Virginia Women's Center.

The theme of this year's event is "Bold in the Pursuit of Excellence."

O'Leary was a two-sport student athlete at Virginia playing volleyball for two seasons (2003-04) and softball for four years (2005-08), including being named the softball team captain in 2008. She was a Jefferson Scholar and a five-time member of the Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Honor Roll. Following graduation, O'Leary was a full-time staff member in production and programming for ESPN.

In 2010, O'Leary's career took a dramatic turn after picking up an oar for the first time and discovering she had a love for rowing. By 2011, she joined the USRowing National Training Center in Princeton, N.J., and since has earned a spot on two U.S. Senior National Teams (2013-14) and is an Olympic hopeful for 2016. O'Leary has represented America at the last two World Rowing Championships in the women's double sculls and in 2014 was named the Female Athlete Representative on the USRowing Board of Directors.

O'Leary will be the featured guest at a pre-game reception and she will be honored on the court at halftime of the Virginia-Georgia Tech women's basketball game.

National Girls and Women in Sports Day will also feature a pregame sports festival held in the men's basketball practice court at John Paul Jones Arena. The festival will include seven sports stations for youth to visit, including basketball, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, and volleyball. The festival will take place from 12:30-1:45 p.m. Youth completing all seven stations will receive a complimentary t-shirt. Admission to the festival is free with a game ticket. There will also be activities for youth set-up in the main lobby of the arena starting at 12:30 p.m., including a photo booth, a sign-making station, face painting, a balloon artist, and inflatable games.

Recent honorees at Virginia's National Girls and Women in Sports Day celebration include two-time volleyball MVP and philanthropist Amy (Mitchell) Griffin, Olympic-gold-medal swimmer Lauren Perdue, Paige Selenski and Michelle Vittese (members of the Cavalier field hockey team and gold-medal winners at the 2011 Pan Am games with USA Field Hockey), Natalie Randolph (former UVa track standout and varsity football coach at Calvin Coolidge High School in Washington, D.C.) and Lindsay Shoop (former UVa rower and Olympic gold medalist).

**CAVALIERS OPEN ACC PLAY**

- Virginia's 62-47 victory over Virginia Tech in the ACC opener was the first time since 2008-09 that the Cavaliers won the first conference game of the season.
- Virginia hadn't started the season 2-0 in conference play since 2007-08
- The victory over the Hokies was the 17th-consecutive win in the series for the Cavaliers.
- The Cavaliers hit eight three-pointers, including making five in the first half.
- Breyana Mason was one of three Cavaliers to finish the game scoring in double digits, putting up 16 points, including making a pair of 3 ptrs.
- Mikayla Venson scored 13 points, going 5-of-11 from the field overall and 3-of-7 from three-point range.
- Sarah Imovbioh had 11 rebounds while also scoring nine points.
- Virginia Tech's Rachel Camp scored 23 points, including making one of VT's three three-pointers.

**ACTING HEAD COACH**

- Associate head coach Kim McNeill served as the acting head coach for three games (Longwood, Saint Mary's, Howard), while Joanne Boyle was finalizing an adoption. McNeill went 3-0 in those games. The wins will still be reflected in Boyle's career record.

**CAVALIER CLASSIC TOURNAMENT**

- For the first time, the Cavalier Classic, which dates back to 1976, had pre-determined match-ups as opposed to a true "classic" format.
- All four teams finished with 1-1 records.
- Virginia fell 67-57 against Davidson, bouncing back with a 72-66 victory over Drexel
- Sarah Imovbioh and Faith Randolph were named to the six-player All-Tournament team
- Imovbioh scored 40 pts with 28 rebs, four assts and five steals
- Randolph scored 27 pts with four rebs, 3 assts and 2 steals
- The Cavaliers had their worst-shooting game of the year, going 31.3 percent from the field against Davidson. Imovbioh went 9-of-11 from the field, with the rest of the team combining to go 12-of-51 (23.5 percent)
- Virginia had four players finish in double-digits against the Dragons. The Cavaliers made their last 14 free throws in the game, including going 6-of-6 from the line in the final 32 seconds.

**100-POINT GAME**

- Virginia defeated Delaware State, 100-62, before finals break
- After Delaware State tied the game, 11-11, on a pair of free throws seven minutes into the game, Virginia went on a 30-4 run, including a span in which UVA scored 18-straight points.
- The Cavaliers went into halftime with a 55-25 lead with three players already with double-digit points. Virginia outscored Delaware State, 45-37, in the second half.
- Freshman forward Jae'Lisa Allen scored a lay-up with 17 seconds remaining in the game, the first points of her career, to give UVA its first 100-point game since the Cavaliers scored 110 points in a Nov. 18, 2009 game against USC Upstate.
- Virginia had five players finish the game scoring in double figures. Mikayla Venson had the first 20-point performance of her career, finishing with 22 points, going 8-of-10 from the field, including 5-of-7 from three-point range.
- Breyana Mason scored 16 points while also dishing seven assists with three rebounds and three steals.
- Sarah Beth Barnette had a career-high 11 rebounds to lead the team while also scoring nine points with five assists a block and a steal.

**LAST ROAD GAME OF 2014**

- The Illinois game was Virginia's last road contest of the calendar year. The Cavaliers will not hit the road again until kicking off ACC play at Virginia Tech on Jan. 4, 2015 and will not leave the Commonwealth until playing at Syracuse on Jan. 11.

**ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE**

- The Cavaliers now have a 5-3 record all-time in the Challenge after falling 86-63 at Illinois.
- For only the second time in ACC/Big Ten Challenge history, the challenge ended in a tie with each conference winning seven games
- The ACC moves to 6-0-2 all-time in the Challenge with a 54-39 record against the Big Ten in Challenge games.
- Virginia started the game in a 13-0 deficit after going 0-for-8 from the field while also committing five turnovers before making their first field goal 8:12 into the contest.
- The Illini, who led 38-22 at the break, started the second half on a 21-5 run to put the game out of reach.
- Junior guard Faith Randolph (Derwood, Md.) led the Cavaliers with 16 points. Freshman forward Lauren Moses (Mount Holly, N.J.) had a season-high 13 rebounds, scoring five points with two blocked shots.
- The Illini shot 50.0 percent, including making 17 of 28 shots (60.7 percent) in the second half. Virginia shot 37.5 percent in the game. The Cavaliers held a 42-29 rebounding edge. UVA committed 18 turnovers while the Illini turned the ball over 11 times.

**FIU THANKSGIVING CLASSIC TOURNAMENT**

- Faith Randolph was named to the All-Tournament team, scoring 21 points against Toledo and 16 against FIU
- The Cavaliers suffered their first defeat of the season, falling 64-62 in their opening-round game against Toledo. Virginia held a 10-point lead, 51-41, with 11 minutes remaining in the game, but Florida International chipped away at the deficit, coming back to tie and then take a 56-55 lead with 3:22 remaining. The final minute of play included three lead changes beginning with Toledo taking a 61-60 lead with 32 seconds remaining after Virginia committed an offensive foul. Mikayla Venson swung the score back in UVA's favor, pulling up for a free-throw-line jump shot with 13 seconds remaining. Zanoquera hit a three-pointer with five seconds left in the game to give the Rockets a 64-62 lead. Venson fired off a three-point attempt as the buzzer sounded, but it clanged off the rim.
- In the consolation final, Virginia earned a 74-61 victory over FIU.
- Virginia, which led the entire game, forced 25 FIU turnovers, scoring 31 points off the miscues.
- Virginia had four players finish the game with double-digit points, led by Sarah Imovbioh who logged her fourth double-double of the season with 16 points and 10 rebounds while also matching a career high with five steals.
- Virginia went 7-of-7 from the field to start the game and 5-of-5 to start the second half.

**RAINING THREES VS AUBURN**

- Virginia won its fourth-straight game, 66-51
- The Cavaliers broke open a five-point game by going on a 19-3 run early in the second half, making 10 of their first 13 field goal attempts in the period while Auburn went 3-of-14 in the same span. The Tigers also committed five turnovers during that same span.
- Virginia's hot-shooting second-half performance propelled the Cavaliers to a 20-point advantage with 9:16 remaining in the second half. Virginia held a 21-point lead heading into the final two minutes of play, but Auburn capitalized on four late UVA turnovers to go on a 6-0 run to close out the game.
- The Cavaliers shot 70.0 percent from three-point range, making seven of 10 while Auburn was 8-of-20 for 40.0 percent. It was the first time Virginia had a 70 percent or better three-point efficiency since making 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) against UCSB in an NCAA Tournament game in 2008.
- Sarah Imovbioh had her third double-double of the season, reaching double figures in points and rebounds by halftime and finishing with 21 points and 13 rebounds. Faith Randolph scored 18 points on 6-of-13 shooting, including going 3-of-4 from three-point range. Mikayla Venson scored 10 points.

**ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 17)**

- Virginia senior center Sarah Imovbioh has been named the Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week
- Imovbioh set the Virginia single-game rebounding record with 24 boards against Ohio State, and accounted for almost half of Virginia's 51 total rebounds in the game.
- Against Radford, Imovbioh only played 20 minutes, but still nearly had another double-double with 14 points and 9 boards.
- Imovbioh averaged 16 points and 16.5 rebounds in UVA's two wins.
- Imovbioh is the first Cavalier to earn this honor since Chelsea Shine was named the ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 21, 2011 after Virginia upset No. 3 Tennessee, 69-64, in overtime.

**ROAD WIN AT XAVIER**

- Virginia led nearly the entire game, taking a 37-25 lead into halftime.
- Xavier made just one three pointer on 11 attempts in the first half, but went 7-of-14 after the break, including Jada Byrd hitting a three-pointer as time expired, to cut the final deficit to single digits.
- The Cavaliers were 3-of-7 from three-point range and 10-of-12 from the free throw line, shooting 46.8 percent overall from the field. Virginia outrebounded Xavier, 44-33, with UVA scoring 17 second-chance points.
- Faith Randolph scored 26 points, matching her career high. Randolph went 8-of-8 from the free throw line, helping her to her second 25-point game of the season.
- Sarah Imovbioh finished with 18 points and 13 rebounds.
- Breyana Mason (6) and Mikayla Venson (5) accounted for 11 of Virginia's 14 assists.

**ROUTING RADFORD**

- Virginia closed out the opening homestand with a 75-47 victory over Radford.
- UVA had four players end the game in double-figures. Mikayla Venson (12 points on 6-of-8 shooting), Sarah Imovbioh (14 points with nine rebounds in 20 minutes on the court), Breyana Mason (11 points, five assists.) And Faith Randolph (11).
- Virginia never trailed in the game, holding a 31-21 advantage at halftime and outscored the Highlanders 44-26 after the break.
- Virginia forced 20 turnovers, with seven different Cavaliers getting at least one steal, scoring 21 points off the miscues. Radford outrebounded Virginia 43-38, scoring 23 second-chance points to Virginia's 13.

**OHIO STATE OPENER**

- Virginia topped Ohio State, 87-82 in the season-opener
- Sarah Imovbioh pulled in a school-record 24 rebounds while also scoring 18 points for her 16th career double-double.
- The game, which featured 18 lead changes and six ties, was knotted 79-79 with a minute remaining. Randolph drove through the Ohio State zone, converting a lay-up with 51 seconds left on the clock to give UVa an 81-79 advantage. After Ohio State missed a three-pointer on the opposite end, Lauren Moses came up with the rebound, her seventh of the game. The Cavaliers went 6-for-6 from the free throw line in the final 36 seconds of the game to secure the season-opening victory.
- Breyana Mason scored a career-high 22 points, going 8-of-11 from the field including making five of seven three-point attempts, with six assists.
- Faith Randolph led the Cavaliers with a 25-point performance.
- Virginia has won nine of its last ten season-openers and has never lost a home opener at John Paul Jones Arena, winning its first home game in each of the last 15 seasons.

**2015-16 RECRUITING CLASS**

- The Cavaliers signed three post players (two forwards and a center) to join the team in 2015-16
- Debra Ferguson, a 6-4 center from Madison Heights, Va., has averaged 10.7 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game.
- Ferguson, whose Amherst County High is located an hour south of Charlottesville, is a two-time Second-Team All-Seminole District honoree and also named First-Team All-Conference 23 last season.
- Moné Jones, a 6-3 forward from Durham, N.C., averaged 10 points, eight rebounds, six blocks and 1.5 assists per game last season, helping to lead Riverside High to the state tournament's elite eight.
- Jones is ESPN-W's No. 61 overall recruit and ranked No. 11 at her position.
- Jones earned PAC 6 All-Conference honors in 2012, 2013, and 2014 in both basketball and volleyball.
- Jones participated in the 2014 USA Basketball Women's U18 National Team Trials last May.
- Shakyna Payne, a 6-3 forward from Acworth, Ga. (the same hometown as sophomore forward Sydney Umeri), averaged 12.6 points, 10.7 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game last season

**FUTURE HOO NEWS**

- Moné Jones, a 6-3 senior forward at Riverside High in Durham, N.C. who has signed an NLI to join the Cavaliers next season, was a nominee for the McDonald's All-American game
- Jones is averaging 15.8 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.4 blocks per game for the Pirates
- She was not named to the roster of 24 players for the April 1 game that was announced on Wednesday, Jan. 28

**HIGH POWERED PREP SCORING**

- The Cavaliers have four players who scored over 1800 points in their prep careers.
- Aliyah Huland El leads the pack with 2286 followed by Breyana Mason at 1979, Sarah Beth Barnette at 1928 and Lauren Moses at 1823.
- Mason was the 2013 Gatorade High School State Player of the Year for Virginia.
- Barnette was the 2010 Gatorade High School State Player of the Year for Kentucky as well as being named Miss Kentucky Basketball

**NO. 13 RECRUITING CLASS MAKING ITS DEBUT**

- The players that made up the Cavaliers second-straight top-15 recruiting class are poised to make their collegiate debuts.
- Point guard Mikayla Venson (Arlington, Va.) was the No. 8 player at her position according to Hoop-Gurlz and the top-ranked recruit in the state of Virginia despite only playing high school basketball her freshman season at Yorktown.




