2 Virginia Cavaliers (32-1) vs #3 Ohio State (33-3)

- The Cavaliers advanced to the NCAA semifinals for the eighth-straight year, the longest streak since 1977. Stanford twice had five-year streaks of making the Final Four, going every year from 1988-92 and 1994-98, but fell in the 1993 quarterfinals

- Virginia and Ohio State faced one another in the final of the ITA National Indoor Championship in February with UVA edging the Buckeyes, 4-1, to win the title for the sixth time in program history

- Virginia is 8-4 all-time against the Buckeyes. Ohio State's last win over UVA came in the semifinals of the 2014 National Team Indoor Championships

- Senior JC Aragone has clinched the last two matches for the Cavaliers. Aragone was also the MVP of the ACC Championship after clinching the win over Wake Forest in the finals. Aragone leads the Cavaliers with 35 singles victories this season and a team-high 25 wins in dual matches but was the only Cavalier in the singles lineup to not be named to the All-ACC Team. Aragone is on a nine-match winning streak

- Junior Collin Altamirano, who clinched the Cavaliers' first and second round matches in Charlottesville, comes into the semifinals on a team-best 11-match win streak. His last loss was on March 31, falling in straight sets to Wake Forest's Skander Mansouri. He is one of two Cavaliers competing in the NCAA singles championship

- The Cavaliers won the doubles point in 29 of 33 matches this season. UVA dropped the doubles point in their first two matches of the season (at Vanderbilt and Kentucky) and then won it in 15 straight before being topped by Wake Forest in doubles in the regular season. North Carolina also took the doubles point in their regular-season match against the Cavaliers but lost the point in the ACC semis

- Seniors Thai-Son Kwiatkowski and Alexander Ritschard are 23-1 this season as a doubles team. Their only loss this season came in the regular-season meeting against North Carolina when they fell to Jack Murray and Simon Soendergaard. Collin Altamirano and JC Aragone are 20-3 in doubles this season. Both doubles teams are 10-0 in their last 10 matches

- In the last 46 matches (dating back to April 3, 2016), Virginia is 41-2, with both losses coming against Wake Forest (2016 ACC Championship match and 2017 regular-season meeting in Winston-Salem)

- The Cavaliers have a 152-31 mark in singles matches this season, which is an .831 winning percentage. Ohio State is the only other top-ranked team with a singles winning percentage close to .800 with the Buckeyes at .793 (180-47). The Cavaliers top singles winning percentage in recent seasons was a .795 mark (194-50) during the 2015 NCAA Championship season

NCAA TOURNAMENT NOTES

- The Cavaliers won the NCAA Championship in 2013, 2015 and 2016
- The Cavaliers are one of six schools to win multiple NCAA Championships (USC, Stanford, UCLA, Georgia, William & Mary)
- Virginia has advanced to five of the last six NCAA finals, with the exception being a semifinal loss to USC in 2014
- Virginia has made at least the quarterfinals in each of the past 13 years and the semifinals each of the last eight years (longest active streak in the nation for both)
- UVA was the only ACC team to ever make it to the semifinals before North Carolina downed Wake Forest on Saturday evening
- It is the 11th-straight year the Cavaliers have been a top-four seed, which is the longest current streak and is second-longest streak in tournament history (14-Stanford, 1988-2001)
- UVA is the only team to be a top-eight seed in each of the past 14 years
- The Cavaliers have a 59-10 record in the NCAA Tournament under Brian Boland

AWARDS AND HONORS

- The Cavaliers had a conference-best five players earn All-ACC honors. Thai-Son Kwiatkowski was named to the first team, his fourth career All-ACC award but his first time on the top team. Collin Altamirano, Alexander Ritschard and Carl Söderlund were named to the second team while Henrik Wiersholm was on the third team
- Thai-Son Kwiatkowski was named the ITA Atlantic Region Senior Player of the Year.
- Alexander Ritschard was named the ITA Atlantic Region Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award winner
- Carl Söderlund was the ITA Atlantic Region Rookie of the Year
- Brian Boland was named the ITA Atlantic Region Coach of the Year
- Dustin Taylor was named the ITA Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year

MORE VIRGINIA NOTES

- UVA returned five of six singles players from its 2016 NCAA Championship lineup this year, losing their line one singles player, 2015 NCAA Singles Champion Ryan Shane, but adding freshman Carl Söderlund, the top player in the preseason ITA National Freshman/Newcomer rankings
- The junior and senior classes of this team have won two NCAA Championships, an ITA National Team Indoor Championship and three ACC Championships
- The squad features a pair of two-time All-Americans. Thai-Son Kwiatkowski is a two-time All-American in singles and Luca Corinteli is a two-time All-American in doubles
- As a junior, Kwiatkowski won the singles and doubles titles at the 2015 ITA All-American, the first player since 2009 and fourth in the history of the ITA Men's All-American to win both titles in the same year, in Tulsa at the Case Tennis Center
- Kwiatkowski was the 2016 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Tennis Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was just named the Virginia Athletic Department's Male Scholar Athlete of the Year for the second-straight year
- Virginia has two players with over 100 career singles victories in Kwiatkowski (129) and JC Aragon (107)

HEAD COACH BRIAN BOLAND

BRIAN BOLAND QUICK FACTS

- In his 16th season with Virginia
- 575-90 career record (.864)
- 454-58 at UVA (.886)
- ITA National Coach of the Year (2008 and 2016)
- Ten-time conference coach of the year, seven-time ITA Regional Coach of the Year
- Boland's teams have had a No. 1 national ranking during 10 different seasons, won six ITA National Team Indoor Championships, 11 ACC Championships, 13 ACC regular season titles, advanced to the NCAA finals four-straight seasons and set the school record for wins in a year (39). His 2013 NCAA Championship squad finished the year with a perfect 30-0 record
- Has his eighth 30-win season this year
- Boland's teams have featured three NCAA Singles Champions, three NCAA Doubles Champions, 42 All-Americans, 39 NCAA singles and 17 NCAA doubles participants, 54 All-ACC selections, three ITA National Players of the Year, two ITA National Freshmen of the Year, nine ITA Regional Rookies of the Year, four ACC Freshmen of the Year, 12 ACC Tournament MVPs, and three ACC Players of the Year.
- Boland's players have gone on to find success on the professional tour after graduation from Virginia. Three former players have cracked the top-75 of singles or doubles in the ATP Rankings and a Cavalier has participated in the main draw in each of the past 29 Grand Slams

On March 29, Brian Boland announced he would be stepping down as Virginia's head coach at the end of the 2017 season. Boland will take over the role of USTA Player Development Head of Men's Tennis, replacing Jay Berger, who had been in the position for the last nine years.

In his new role, Boland will oversee all training and coaching of male junior, collegiate and pro players by USTA Player Development, and he will manage all USTA national coaches on the men's side. He will report to USTA Player Development General Manager Martin Blackman.

Quotes from Coach Boland on this position

After much consideration and many conversations over a long period of time with my wife Becky, I have decided to resign at the end of this season and accept the role of head of men's tennis for USTA Player Development at the newly constructed USTA National Campus in Orlando, Florida. I consider this next step in my career to be the absolute highest honor and the ultimate responsibility that can be bestowed upon any tennis coach in the United States. I plan on doing everything in my power, together with the entire USTA and the private sector, to make sure American men's tennis regains its position as the global leader on the ATP Tour, in the Davis Cup and in the Olympics. Lastly, with the recent move of my parents to Florida, where several other of our family members currently reside, this decision gradually developed into the right one for not only my career, but most importantly for my family as well.

My primary goal is to continue to build a culture within Team USA that exemplifies the character, commitment, communication and camaraderie we will need, not only to win Grand Slams, Davis Cups and Olympic medals but, more importantly, to make sure our culture sets our players up for success in their lives after tennis. Under my leadership, the development of the person will be just as important as the development of the tennis player, because the two clearly go hand in hand. In addition, I would like for every stakeholder within Team USA to consider our USTA National Campus at the very least a second home, where they can come to collaborate with our men's national coaches and work together to maximize the potential of our players.

The three most exciting aspects of my new position as Head of Men's Tennis for USTA Player Development will undoubtedly be: 1) learning and growing together with our men's national coaches; 2) building close, trusting and transparent relationships with our Team USA players; and 3) tapping into the wealth of knowledge, experience and talent that exists in the private sector when it comes to overall player development. I plan on fulfilling my duties and responsibilities in my new role with great pride for American tennis and an appreciation for all the great work that has been done up to this point by our Team USA coaches and players.
