OPENING KICK

UVA HOSTS WILLIAM & MARY IN HOME OPENER

- The University of Virginia opens its 89th season of play at Scott Stadium when the William & Mary Tribe visit Charlottesville on Friday night.
- UVA is 92-30-7 (.740) all-time in home openers.
- In his career as a head coach, Bronco Mendenhall is 9-5 in 14 home-openers, including 2-1 at UVA.

VIRGINIA VS. WILLIAM & MARY, CAA

- Virginia owns a 29-6-1 edge in the all-time series with William & Mary. UVA has won nine of the last 10 meetings, including a 28-10 win the last time these teams met in 2017.
- In games played in Charlottesville, Virginia has a 23-4 advantage.
- William & Mary's last win in the series came in 2009, a 26-14 victory at Scott Stadium.
- The Cavaliers own a 60-10-3 record against current members of the CAA.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- Virginia hosts former Cavalier head coach Mike London and his William & Mary Tribe football team. London was UVA's 39th head coach over six seasons from 2010-15, notching a 27-46 record.
- Including London, eight members of the William & Mary coaching staff have playing or coaching ties to UVA. Former UVA football players include: Darryl Blackstock, Keenan

Carter, Ras-I Dowling, Matt Johns, Gordon Sammis and

Josh Zidenberg. Blackstock and Dowling went on to earn multiple All-ACC honors for the Cavaliers. W&M associate head coach/defensive coordinator Vincent Brown also served at UVA as an assistant coach on London's staff from 2010-13.

- $\bullet \textit{Virginia's 30-14} \textit{ win at Pitt in the season opener gave the Cavaliers a season-opening win on the road } \\$ for the first time since 2004 at Temple (44-14). The win also served as UVA's first triumph at Pitt in six
- Going back to the 2018 Belk Bowl, UVA has shutout its opponents in seven of the last eight quarters played. UVA shutout South Carolina (28-0) in the Belk Bowl and followed that up in the season opener at Pitt not allowing the Panthers to score in the first, third or fourth quarters.
- Dating back to 2000, UVA's 78 rushing yards allowed at Pitt is the fewest the Cavaliers have given up to an FBS opponent in a season opener. Only three other opponents during that 20-year span, all FCS schools, were held to fewer rushing yards in a season opener (UR, 28, 2012; UR, 34, 2018; W&M, 48, 2011)

#TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

After UVA's 30-14 win at Pitt in the season opener, Bronco Mendenhall is 4-0 in ACC openers.

Last time out, WR Joe Reed had a career-high seven receptions in the season-opening win at Pitt.

2019 marks the 89th season Virginia has played football at Scott Stadium after opening on Oct. 15, 1931.

VIRGINIA FACTS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT
The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

MIKE LONDON RETURNS TO SCOTT STADIUM

- William & Mary head coach Mike London returns to Scott Stadium to coach his first game on Friday since being Virginia's 39th all-time coach (2010-15).
- Friday marks the second time London has been the visiting head coach at Scott Stadium. Eleven years ago to the day, Sept. 6, 2008, London brought his Richmond Spiders team to Charlottesville.
- London replaces former Tribe head coach, Jimmye Laycock, who was the head coach at William & Mary for 39 years.
- The last time a William & Mary head coach roamed the visiting sideline at Scott Stadium against UVA that wasn't Laycock was Jim Root in 1976.
- London is one of 10 head coaches in 2019 that faces a former program they were the head coach of.

MENDENHALL AND LONDON MEET AGAIN

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall and William & Mary head coach Mike London meet for the second time as head coaches in a college football game.
- •The 2013 season opener was between Mendenhall's BYU squad and London's UVA team at Scott Stadium.
- The game was delayed in the first quarter for 2:09 due to weather. UVA went on to win 19-16.
- Friday's play-by-play announcer for the ACC Network, Anish Shroff, also called that 2013 season opener for ESPNU.

MORE ON THE WILLIAM & MARY SERIES

- Current Cavaliers Dillon Reinkensmeyer, Reed Kellam, Jamari Peacock, Brenton Nelson, De'Vante Cross, Nick Grant, PK Kier, Joey Blount, Germane Crowell, Nash Griffin, Matt Gahm, Terrell Jana, Mandy Alonso, Brian Delaney and A.J. Mejia all made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe in 2017.
- Former UVA CB Maurice Canady's 74-yard punt return for a touchdown in the 2015 William & Mary game is the fifth-longest punt return for a touchdown in school history.
- UVA held William & Mary to only 169 yards of total offense in the 2011 meeting, a 40-3 Cavalier win.
- University of Virginia founder Thomas Jefferson attended William & Mary from 1760-1762.

VIRGINIA - W&M CONNECTIONS

- Seven members on Mike London's William & Mary staff have a connection to the University of Virginia.
- London has six UVA graduates on staff, which includes: Darryl Blackstock, Ras-I Dowling, Keenan Carter, Matt Johns, Gordon Sammis and Josh Zidenberg.
- W&M associate head coach and defensive coordinator/ linebackers coach Vincent Brown was UVA's linebacker coach from 2010-12 and defensive line coach in 2013.
- Brown (2007), Johns (2018), Sammis (2010-11) and Zidenberg (2009-10) also served as grad assistants at UVA.
- W&M offensive coordinator/QB coach Brennan Marion spent one season at Arizona State working offensive quality control in 2015 when current UVA QB Bryce Perkins and WR Terrell Chatman were freshmen. Current UVA director of football development and performance Shawn Griswold was also at ASU during this time as the head coach for sports performance.

Last Meeting

Kurt Benkert threw for three touchdowns as Virginia topped William & Mary, 28-10, the last time these teams met in 2017.

Jordan Ellis ran for 80 yards and a touchdown and scored the clincher on Benkert's final pass with 55 seconds remaining. It came minutes after Chris Peace intercepted a ricochet, setting the Cavaliers up at the Tribe's 25 and setting the stage for the final drive.

Benkert hit Andre Levrone for a 34-yard touchdown on a fourth-and-9 play with 1:31 left in the first half, giving Virginia a 14-0 lead. He later hit Olamide Zaccheaus for a 17-yard score, and found Ellis from a yard out on a fourth-and-goal play. He was 27 for 39 for 262 yards.

UVA WINS THIRD SEASON OPENER IN A ROW

- With its season-opening win at Pitt, UVA has won back-to-back season openers for the first time since winning four straight from 2010-13. UVA is 83-38-9 all-time in season openers.
- UVA defeated William & Mary to open the 2017 season and Richmond to start the 2018 campaign.
- With a win on Friday, UVA would be 2-0 to start a season for the first time since 2012.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Against Pitt, NT Jowon Briggs became the fifth UVA freshman (true or redshirt) since 1986 to start a season opener on the defensive line. Briggs is also the second in two seasons as teammate NT Jordan Redmond (also a true freshman) did so last year against Richmond. Briggs and Redmond are the first UVA freshmen to start a season opener on the defensive line since 2002 when DE Kwakou Robinson started against Colorado State. The other two UVA freshmen to start an opener on the defensive line are DE Matt Conrath (RS-Fr., 2008 vs. USC) and NT Tim O'Conner (RS-Fr., 1986 vs. South Carolina).
- Briggs was part of UVA's run-stop game, helping limit Pitt to only 78 rushing yards on 30 carries (2.6 ypr).
- Briggs was 17-years old for the season-opener at Pitt, turning 18 on Sept. 1. The team sang him happy birthday on the return flight to Charlottesville after it was officially Sept. 1.

EIGHT CAVALIERS MAKE COLLEGIATE DEBUT IN SEASON-OPENING WIN

- UVA had eight collegiate debuts against Pitt. LS Enzo Anthony**, DT Jowon Briggs**, LS Lee Dudley, WR Dorien Goddard**, RB Mike Hollins**, ILB Nick Jackson**, C Olusegun Oluwatimi, WR Dontayvion Wicks**.
- **-denotes true freshman

FIRST CAREER STARTS AT PITT

•TB Wayne Taulapapa, WR Terrell Chatman, C Olusegun Oluwatimi, NT Jowon Briggs, OLB Matt Gahm, CB Nick Grant all made their first collegiate starts at Pitt in the season opener.

CAVALIER DEFENSE SHUTS DOWN PITT'S RUSHING ATTACK

- Virginia held Pitt to 78 rushing yards on 30 rushes, which was only 2.6 yards per rush.
- During UVA's previous four-game losing streak to Pitt, the Panthers rushed for 780 yards on 166 carries and eight touchdowns. That comes to an average of 195 rushing yards on 41.5 carries (4.7 ypr) and a two-touchdown average during the UVA losing streak to Pitt. The Panthers rushed for 254 yards in the 2018 meeting and 209 yards in the 2016 meeting.
- UVA's defense as a whole was stout in the season opener at Pitt. If you take away the two Pitt scoring drives, which yielded 165 yards of total offense on 21 plays, UVA's defense held the Panthers to 98 yards of total offense on 50 plays (1.96).

TAULAPAPA PICKS UP THE TAILBACK MANTLE FOR THE CAVALIERS

- Sophomore running back Wayne Taulapapa, who lettered in 2018 on special teams, carried the ball for the first time in his collegiate career at Pitt in the season opener.
- Taulapapa, who made his first career start, rushed 10 times for 66 yards (6.6 ypr) and one touchdown as Virginia looks for a running back to replace 1,000-yard rusher Jordan Ellis from 2018.
- Taulapapa is a member of the 2016 recruiting class, but did not enroll until 2018 after serving a two-year LDS mission to Managua, Nicaragua.
- The native of Laie, Hawaii attended Punahou High School in Honolulu. Taulapapa's roundtrip to high school each day was an average of 3.5 hours (1:45 one way) on the road.

PERKINS IS PLAYING KEEP-AWAY WITH THE PASS

- Dating back to 2018, UVA quarterback Bryce Perkins has gone 132 passes without throwing an interception. The streak is the longest active streak in FBS.
- Only two players in the nation have gone at least 75 attempts without throwing an interception.

NASH GRIFFIN SHINES IN PUNTING DEBUT

- With the graduation of former All-ACC punter Lester Coleman, junior Nash Griffin made his punting debut in the season opener at Pitt. Griffin previously had appeared in 26 games from 2017-18 as UVA's holder. Griffin continues his holding duties in 2019.
- Griffin punted four times against the Panthers and averaged 45.5 yards per punt. Three of his punts went inside the 20-yard line and his long punt went 49 yards.
- Griffin was high school basketball teammates at Lawrence Central High School in Indianapolis, Ind., with Kyle Guy, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player from Virginia.
- Griffin was roommates for three years at UVA with Kyle Guy before he was drafted (and married) in the second round of the 2019 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings.

HALL MAKING THE START AT CB

- CB Bryce Hall has made 34 consecutive starts. That is the most in the nation among active cornerbacks. He made his first collegiate start on Oct. 15, 2016 when Pitt came to Scott Stadium.
- Hall is tied for No. 2 in the nation for consecutive starts among active defensive players. Below is where Hall ranks among the nation's defensemen with the most consecutive starts.

2019 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

BRONCO MENDENHALL LED VIRGINIA TO BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS

- After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Bronco Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since 2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite.
- Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

BRONCO MENDENHALL IS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- Bronco Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).
- Mendenhall inherited a BYU team that went 5-6 in 2004 and in his first season the Cougars went 6-6 and played in the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall took over a Virginia team that went 4-8 in 2015 and took the Cavaliers to the 2017 Military Bowl in year No. 2, finishing 6-7.

RETURNING DEFENSE LOOKS TO BUILD UPON STRONG 2018

- While the UVA defense lost three players that are currently in the NFL, CB Tim Harris (49ers), OLB Chris Peace (Chargers) and SS Juan Thornhill (Chiefs), the unit returns 11 Cavaliers that started at least five games in 2018.
- The defense shined in 2018, finishing No. 12 in the nation in team passing efficiency defense (107.62), No. 16 in passing yards allowed (183.0), No. 20 in the nation in team defense (330.5) and No. 20 in scoring defense (20.1).
- UVA returns defensive starts in 2018 from Bryce Hall (13), Charles Snowden (13), Eli Hanback (12), Brenton Nelson (12), Jordan Mack (9), Zane Zandier (8), Robert Snyder (6), Mandy Alonso (5), Joey Blount (5), Darrius Bratton (5) and Jordan Redmond (5).
- UVA also returns Chris Moore, who had six starts in 2017 but missed 2018 with an injury.

RETURN OF THE MACK

- Senior inside linebacker Jordan Mack is UVA's leading returning tackler after finishing 2018 with 66 tackles. Despite missing four games with an injury in 2018, he still finished No. 2 on the team in stops behind current NFL safety Juan Thornhill (98).
- Mack is on the 2019 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List and is UVA's candidate for the 2019 Campbell Trophy.
- Mack enters 2019 No. 2 in the ACC among active career tackle leaders with 220 stops (No. 17 nationally). Miami's Shaquille Quarterman (249) is the only ACC player with more career tackles entering 2019.
- He finished No. 5 in the ACC with 114 tackles in 2017 (No. 26 nationally). Joining 2017 Campbell Trophy winner Micah Kiser, an All-American, and fellow All-American Quin Blanding, Mack was a part of the only "Power 5" trio (one of two in FBS) to each have at least 100 tackles in the same season.
- Mack's older brother, Charles, is on staff at UVA as a regional scout for the football program. Charles was a four-year letterwinner at Richmond and was on the field for the Spiders when Jordan made his collegiate debut in 2016. Jordan and Charles' father, Charles Mack Sr., played football at Georgia Tech (1983-87).

PERKINS IS A THREAT ON THE RUN

- QB Bryce Perkins is the nation's leading returning quarterback when it comes to avoided tackles. He led all "Power 5" quarterbacks with 46 last season, second only to UConn's David Pindell (56).
- Among quarterbacks, Perkins was also tied for No. 7 in the nation in 2018 among rushes of 15+ yards. He recorded 13 rushes of 15+ yards, tying him with Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray. When you take out the three option quarterbacks ahead of Perkins (and Murray), the UVA signal caller ranked tied for No. 4.
- Of all the quarterbacks with more rushes of 15+ yards than Perkins in 2018, none threw for over 2,500 yards. Perkins logged 2,680 passing yards. Only Ohio's Nathan Rourke returns in 2019 having more rushes of 15+ yards than Perkins. Rourke had 17 in 2018.

PERKINS ON THE VERGE OF 1,000-CAREER RUSHING YARDS

- Perkins needs 33 rushing yards to become the 44th Cavalier in program history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He would be only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and first since Shawn Moore in 1990.
- In addition to 33 rushing yards, Perkins needs 139 passing yards to become the second Cavalier to amass 1,000 career rushing yards and 3,000 career passing yards, joining Shawn Moore (1987-90). Appearing in only 14 career games, Perkins is on track to reach the plateau faster than Moore (31 games).

PERKINS CAN JOIN SPECIAL COMPANY IN 2019

- Last year Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma).
- Since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- If Perkins manages 2,500+ passing yards, 500+rushing yards, 30+ touchdowns responsible for and completes at least 60 percent of his passes, he will join a special list of the following quarterbacks over the past 10 years to post multiple seasons with those numbers: Marcus Mariota (3 times), JT Barrett (3 times), Robert Griffin III, Taylor Kelly, Johnny Manziel, Brett Hundley, Dak Prescott, Marquise Williams and Deshaun Watson.

DUBOIS AND REED LOOK TO LEAD THE RECEIVING CORPS

- WRs Hasise Dubois and Joe Reed are on the verge of becoming the 40th and 41st Cavaliers to record at least 1,000-career receiving yards.
- Dubois holds the slight advantage in the race between the duo who will reach the career 1,000-yard plateau first, needing 158 yards. Reed needs 180 yards.
- The duo combined to catch 77 receptions for 1,043 yards and 12 touchdowns. They are looking to lead a receiving corps that lost Olamide Zaccheaus to graduation, UVA's career and single-season receptions leader. Zaccheaus became only UVA's third 1,000-yard single-season receiver in 2018 after breaking his own single-season receptions record with 93 for 1,058 yards and nine touchdowns.

REED FINISHED 2018 WITH THE HOT HAND

- Over the last four games of the 2018 season, WR Joe Reed made nine receptions for 227 yards and five touchdowns. He averaged 25.2 yards per reception over that span.
- For the 2018 season, Reed averaged 18.6 yards per reception, which ranked No. 4 in the ACC and No. 19 in the nation. Reed added seven receiving touchdowns, which was second on the team.

REED IS SPECIAL ON "SPECIAL TEAMS"

- WR Joe Reed owns UVA's career all-time kick return yardage record with 2,294 career kick return yards.
- Reed also led UVA in 2018 in special teams tackles with seven. He has made five on kickoffs and two on punt returns.
- In 2018, Reed returned 26 kicks for 707 yards (27.2 yards per return), which was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 10 nationally.
- In 2017, Reed returned 29 kicks for 861 yards (29.7 yards per return), which was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 nationally.

- Reed is one of two active FBS players to average 27+ yards per return for their career. Houston's Marcus Jones joins Reed. Jones owns a career average of 27.6 yards per return, which includes his 2017 and 2018 seasons played at Troy. Per transfer rules, Jones is sitting out the 2019 season at Houston.
- Since 2000, Reed is one of eight "Power 5" players to average 27+ yards for a career. He is one of 22 FBS players since 2000 to average 27+ yards per kick return for a career.

- WR Terrell Jana taught himself to play the piano by watching YouTube videos in his spare time at Woodberry Forest. He originally started to learn a song to surprise his mom and ended up enjoying it so much he kept up the self-study.

- ILB Jordan Mack is UVA's 2019 nominee for the prestigious Campbell Trophy (Academic Heisman).

HAILING FROM THE GRAND CANYON STATE; IT'S AN ASU CONNECTION

- QB Bryce Perkins and graduate transfer WR Terrell Chatman were both part of the same recruiting class at Arizona State in 2015. Both current Cavaliers utilized a redshirt year with the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Perkins spent two seasons at ASU before transferring to Arizona Western JC for the 2017 season, followed by his move to Virginia in 2018. Chatman comes to Virginia after graduating last spring from Arizona State.
- Perkins and Chatman hit it off immediately through the recruiting process and were even roommates in Tempe. The duo are rommates again, this time in Charlottesville.
- Also, UVA's current director of football development & performance, Shawn Griswold, was the head coach for sports performance at Arizona State from 2012-17, working with both Perkins and Chatman. Griswold has been at UVA since 2018.

SEVEN CAVALIERS FROM KEY POSITIONS OWN 30+ CAREER GAMES PLAYED

- Entering 2019, six different Cavaliers have appeared in at least 30 career games at Virginia.
- Bryce Hall, Eli Hanback and Chris Sharp lead the way with 38 games played each. Hasise Dubois (37), Joe Reed (37), Tanner Cowley (34) and Jordan Mack (34) all have appeared in at least 30 career games for UVA.

2018 WAS A BIG CHANGE FOR UVA ON THIRD DOWN

• Virginia was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage (49.1), which was a vast improvement from 2017 when the Cavaliers were No. 8 in the ACC and No. 74 in the nation at 39.2 percent.

TEAM NOTES

UVA PASSING GAME UNDER BRONCO MENDENHALL

- Four of the top seven single-game passing contests from a quarterback standpoint have happened during the head coach Bronco Mendenhall and offensive coordinator Robert Anae's tenure at UVA (2016-pres.).
- Kurt Benkert, the starting quarterback in 2017 and 2018 owns the No. 1 (455, vs. UConn, 2017), No. 2 (421, vs. Central Michigan, 2016) and No. 6 (384, at Miami, 2017) spots. Current UVA quarterback Bryce Perkins has the No. 7 spot (379, vs. Ohio, 2018).
- Virginia also amassed 5,003 yards of total offense in 2018, marking the fifth time in program history a Cavalier team recorded over 5,000 yards in a single season. UVA also set a single-season program record with 276 first downs.

UVA ROSTER HAS THE THIRD-MOST FRESHMEN AND REDSHIRT FRESHMEN IN FBS

- Virginia has 63 freshmen and redshirt freshmen on its roster in 2019, which is tied for No. 3 in FBS.
- UVA's 63 total freshmen and redshirt freshmen is the most among teams that played in bowl games in 2018. Also, 48.46 percent of UVA's roster is made up of freshmen and redshirt freshmen, which ranks No. 4 in FBS behind UCLA (53.3), Coastal Carolina (51.2) and Nebraska (50.9).

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field. Virginia has played 470 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 265-193-12.

BRYCE PERKINS NOTES

IT IS A PERK TO HAVE BRYCE AT QUARTERBACK

- QB Bryce Perkins returns to Charlottesville for his senior season after breaking UVA's single-season record for total offense during his first season on Grounds with 3,603 total yards in 2018. Perkins broke the previous record by 459 yards, which was set a year earlier by Kurt Benkert.
- Perkins was one of two players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards (2,680) and 900+ rushing yards (923), joining Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) in 2018.
- In fact, since the year 2000, Perkins and Murray are the only players in the nation in a single season to complete at least 64 percent of their passes, while also throwing for 2,000+ yards, rushing for 900+ yards and being responsible for at least 30 touchdowns.
- Perkins transferred to UVA in January 2018 from Arizona Western Community College after leading the Matadors to the 2017 NJCAA Championship game, before falling 31-28 to East Mississippi.
- Perkins originally signed as a top recruit with hometown Arizona State, but never saw action during his two seasons in Tempe. He redshirted the 2015 season and missed the 2016 season with an injury.
- Perkins' father, Bruce, lettered at Arizona State in 1988 and 1989 as a fullback and later played briefly in the NFL. Perkins' older brother, Paul, was a three-year letterwinner at running back with the UCLA Bruins and currently plays with the New York Giants. Perkins' uncle, Don Perkins, played eight seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys.

PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS RATING BRYCE HALL

- Hall finished with an overall grade of 91.2 that included a coverage grade of 91.4, both of which lead all returning FBS cornerbacks, a group of 349 players who logged at least 200 snaps a season ago.
- •There is no better returning cornerback from a season ago when it comes to tracking passes in the intermediate to deep range of the field, those passes targeted at least 10 yards downfield. Hall was targeted 44 times on throws in that range, allowing just 14 receptions while he came away with two interceptions and recorded 18 forced incompletions.
- According to PFF "Hall may be more important to his team's success than any other non-offensive player in the country."

HALL OF SPEED CLOCKED AT 22.3 MPH

- Hall was clocked at 22.3 mph via the Catapult system he was wearing when he made a touchdown-saving tackle on Miami's Travis Homer, a rush that went for 70 yards in the 2018 meeting at Scott Stadium.
- Hall's touchdown-saving tackle eventually forced Miami to kick a field goal in a game UVA won over the then-No. 16 Hurricanes, 16-13.

HALL ANCHORS VIRGINIA SECONDARY

- CB Bryce Hall returns for his senior season after earning second-team All-America honors in 2018 when he led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Hall led the ACC in forced incompletion percentage (31.9 percent) in 2018. PFF has Hall ranked as the No. 1 defensive player in the country entering 2019 and the No. 4 FBS player overall.
- According to PFF, Hall ranked tied for first with LSU's Kristian Fulton in forced incompletion percentage (38.9 percent) in Cover-0 and Cover-1 looks
- Hall allowed just 2.9 yards after the catch in 2018 and had eight performances in which he held opposing receivers in his coverage to just single-digit yards after catch numbers.
- Hall has five career interceptions, three of which have come against former Duke quarterback and 2019 NFL first rounder Daniel Jones (Giants, sixth overall). Jones tossed nine interceptions in his three career games against Virginia.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Fourth Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his fourth season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

Mendenhall enters the 2019 season with a career record of 115-65, which includes a 99-43 mark in 11 seasons as the head coach at BYU. Between UVA and BYU, Mendenhall has led his teams to bowl games in 13-of-14 seasons as a head coach. That 92.9 percent rate ranks tied for No. 3 among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of FBS coaching.

After playing in the Military Bowl in 2017, Mendenhall led Virginia to back-to-back bowls in 2018 for the first time since

2004 and 2005 after the Cavaliers earned a Belk Bowl invite. Mendenhall's Cavalier squad shutout South Carolina, 28-0, in the 2018 Belk Bowl to give UVA its first bowl victory since the 2005 Music City Bowl. UVA's shutout performance was the first over an SEC team in a bowl game by a non-SEC team since the 1975 Gator Bowl.

Mendenhall is one of three active coaches that has inherited at least two programs in his career that were coming off a losing season and in year one, or year two, played in a bowl game. The others to do it are Nick Saban (Alabama, LSU, Michigan State) and Mark Dantonio (Michigan State/Cincinnati).

Year number three under Mendenhall saw great strides in performance on the field. UVA's defense finished No. 20 in the country and No. 3 in the ACC, allowing 330.5 yards per game, while finishing No. 21 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC in scoring defense (20.1). UVA's defense finished No. 16 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC in fewest passing yards allowed and the offense finished No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC in third-down conversion percentage.

With Bryce Perkins at quarterback, UVA scored 370 points in 2018, which ranks No. 3 all-time for the Cavaliers. Perkins and Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray (Oklahoma) were the only players in the nation with 2,600+ passing yards and 900+ rushing yards. Under Mendenhall in 2018, Bryce Hall earned second-team All-America honors from both the Walter Camp Foundation and the Football Writers Association of America. Hall led the nation with 22 pass breakups and 24 passes defended. Hall, SS Juan Thornhill and HB Olamide Zaccheaus all earned first-team All-ACC accolades, leading UVA's eight selections. Thornhill finished 2018 No. 3 in the nation with six interceptions and Zaccheaus, the 2018 Belk Bowl MVP, was No. 1 in the ACC with 93 receptions (a UVA single-season record).

Zaccheaus leaves UVA with a program-record 250 career receptions, which ranks No. 6 all-time in ACC history.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over Mendenhall's 11 years at BYU, the Cougars were one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program was highlighted in a management book, Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall — 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.
