FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Friday is the 79th all-time meeting between UVa and UNC in a series that began in 1938.
- Virginia's 50 all-time victories over the Tar Heels are the most over any opponent in school history. UVa has 49 all-time wins over Duke, which is second.
- For the eighth time in the past 10 seasons UVa has reached the eight-win plateau before the end of March. UVa's 2013 squad as well as its NCAA title team in 2011 are the only Cavalier teams over the past 10 years that failed to win eight games by the end of March. Prior to the 2006 season, UVa never played eight games prior to the end of March.
- Five of UVa's six starting offensive players have 30 or more points. The loss of James Pannell after game six is keeping it from a perfect 6-of-6.
- Friday's game is the 148th all-time men's lacrosse game to be played at Klöckner Stadium.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia returns to ACC action on Friday when the North Carolina Tar Heels come to Klöckner Stadium. Faceoff is set for 7 p.m. UVa is ranked No. 6 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 8 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll. North Carolina is ranked No. 4 in both the coaches and media polls.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

Friday marks the 79th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and the Tar Heels, a series the Cavaliers own a 50-28 advantage in since 1938. Facing the Tar Heels every year since 1964, UVa has faced UNC at least twice in a season for three years straight entering 2015. After winning 19-of-21 meetings dating back to 1997, UVa dropped four straight against UNC until beating them 13-11 in the last meeting at the ACC Showcase Game in April 2014. UNC's four-game winning streak was the longest in the series for the Tar Heels since winning four straight during the 1990-92 seasons.

North Carolina head coach Joe Breschi is in his seventh season at North Carolina and returns 28 letterwinners from last year's 10-5 NCAA first round squad.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 265-92 (.742) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 357 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

- Virginia leads the all-time series with North Carolina by a 50-28 margin.
- The Cavaliers' 50 wins place the Tar Heels on UVa's list of most beaten opponents (UVa has defeated Duke 49 times).
- Overall Virginia has won 20 of the last 26 games dating back to 1997, but North Carolina has won four of the past five meetings -- including in the semifinal round of the 2012 ACC Championship and the 2013 ACC Finals.
- Three of the Tar Heels' wins in this span were all by two goals (7-5 in 2001, 11-9 in 2004 and again in 2012).
- UNC scored back-to-back goals with 2:33 and 2:38 left in the game to escape with an 11-10 win at Fetzer Field in Chapel Hill in 2014's regular season meeting.
- UNC won two of the last four games by three goals, 10-7 in Charlottesville during the 2013 regular season meeting, and 16-13 in the 2013 ACC Championship game at UNC's Kenan Stadium.
- North Carolina's previous five wins over UVa before the 2013 meetings had been by either one or two goals; until 2013 the Tar Heels had not won by more than two goals since a 15-7 win in the 1994 ACC Tournament.
- Virginia owned a 10-game winning streak over the Tar Heels, the longest winning streak in the series since winning six in a row from 1997-2000, but UNC snapped it in the ACC Tournament in 2012.
- UVa is 24-9 against North Carolina in the Dom Starsia era (est. 1993), Starsia went 0-2 against the Tar Heels while the head coach at Brown, for a 24-11 all-time career record against UNC.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 120-26 (.8219) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-0 mark in 2015. UVa also is 11-2 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only five night games at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall UVa is 33-5 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993
- UVa fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010
- UVa dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVa snapped the losing streak at two games with a 14-13 overtime win against No. 12 Loyola to open the 2014 season.

UVA TOPS RANKED TEAM IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- UVa's men's lacrosse team (2-0) has opened the season with wins over No. 7 Loyola (13-12) and No. 16 Drexel (14-10).
- It marks the the eighth time in Dom Starsia's 23 seasons as UVa's head coach the Cavaliers have opened up a season facing back-to-back ranked opponents.
- It is only the third time UVa has swept those ranked opponents, splitting the other five times.
- In addition to this season the feat also happened in 2011 and 1995.
- UVa is ranked No. 7 in this week's USILA coaches poll and eight of UVa's 13 regular season opponents have been ranked in the Top 20. Another two opponents have received votes in the sports' oldest poll (established in 1973).

UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH

- The 2015 UVa defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.
- At SSDM you have sophomore Will McNamara, who made his collegiate debut at Loyola. Sophomore Carlson Milikin and freshman Jack Falk also ran at SSDM against Loyola.
- Sophomore goalie Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- In uncharacteristic fashion for UVa, the Cavaliers have lost five of 10 ground ball battles this season. One contributing factor is UVa is only winning 43.6 percent (175-of-190) of its faceoffs.
- Below is how UVa has fared over the last five seasons in ground balls:

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011
- UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVa is 24-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 14-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 248 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 248 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means in the midst of 23 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 22.1 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVa's dominance are Syracuse at 52 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

- Coming into 2015 - a Dom Starsia-led UVa team averages 7.73 different players a season with at least 10 goals.
- In 2014 UVa had eight players in double digits in goals scored and three in double digits in assists.
- 1994 and 2010 were the best seasons under Starsia as each team had 10 different players have at least 10 goals.
- 2001 and 2004 are tied for the lowest total in a year at 5 different players.
- UVa had seven different double digit goal scorers in 2012.
- Under Starsia, UVa has averaged 4.02 different players a year with at least 10 assists.

- In 2013 six Cavaliers had double digits in goals and three did so in assists.
- In 2014 eight Cavaliers had double digits in goals and three did so in assists.
- Through 10 games the Cavaliers have seven players with double digit goals and three with double digit assists.

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Virginia has a 36-game winning streak going back to 2001 in regular-season midweek games .
- Virginia has two midweek games scheduled in 2015. They beat St. Joseph's 15-14 on March 10 and VMI 17-3 on March 24.
- The last time the Cavaliers lost a midweek contest was an 11-8 loss to Notre Dame on March 14, 2001 (a Wednesday).
- Under head coach Dom Starsia, Virginia is 54-2 (.964) in mid-week games since 1993.
- After losing his first mid-week game (9-6 to Princeton in 1993), the Cavaliers rattled off 22 wins in a row before that loss to Notre Dame 13 years ago.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a five-goal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third quarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.

The No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) overcame a snowstorm and an early three-goal deficit to defeat No. 16 Drexel (0-1) at Klöckner Stadium, 14-10.

Drexel scored the game's first three goals to take an early 3-0 lead. UVa fought back with a 6-1 run to take a 7-5 lead with 3:45 left in the second period. Ryan Tucker scored two goals during the run and Zed Williams capped the scoring with an unassisted goal.

Jules Raucci tallied a goal at 2:05 in the second quarter to bring Drexel within one goal, 7-6, but that was as close as the Dragons got to the Cavaliers. James Pannell scored on a Ryan Lukacovic helper with 26 seconds left that started a 5-1 Cavalier run that carried into the third quarter.

Drexel managed back-to-back goals to cut the UVa advantage to four goals, 14-10, courtesy of Jake Gennosa and Ryan Belka. The two goals by Drexel capped the game's scoring as UVa's defense thwarted any Drexel comeback attempt.

Lukacovic, Pannell and Tucker all led UVa with four points, while Matt Barrett made 12 saves in the cage, four of which came in a late fourth-quarter barrage by the Dragons. Van Arsdale led all players with three goals.
