# **GAME OVERVIEW**

- · Virginia returns to Klöckner Stadium on Saturday for a non-conference tilt with with in-state foe Richmond. Faceoff is set for 3 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 7 in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls. Richmond is receiving votes in the coaches poll and No. 18 in the media poll.

### THE SERIES VS. THE SPIDERS

- Friday marks the sixth all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Spiders in men's lacrosse, but only the third at Klöckner Stadium.
- UVA owns a 5-0 record in the all-time series with the Spiders.
- UVA's 2014 game at Robins Stadium was the very first men's lacrosse game in the history of the Richmond program.
- UVA currently owns a 70-game winning streak against programs from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- Dan Chemotti is in his sixth season as the head coach of Richmond after being the top assistant on Charley Toomey's staff at Loyola, including being part of the Greyhounds' 2012 NCAA title team
- Chemotti took Richmond to the NCAA Tournament in the Spiders' first NCAA Division I season as the champions of the Atlantic Sun Tournament.
- UR is coming off a SoCon championship and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2017 with an 11-6 record, losing

# **#GOHOOS: BY THE NUMBERS**

Michael Kraus needs three goals on Friday to become the 16th all-time Cavalier and third fastest (41 games) to 100 career goals.

Virginia is riding a five-game winning streak. It is UVA's first fivegame winning streak since starting the 2014 season 6-0.

Michael Kraus has at least one point in all 40 career games he has appeared in. The active streak is tied for No. 4 in the nation.

Dox Aitken is tied for No. 4 all-time at UVA among midfielders with 88 career goals. He is tied with Matt Poskay (2003-06).

# **COVERING THE CAVALIERS**

### **UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

# **UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

# WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

### THE SERIES VS. THE SPIDERS

- Friday marks the sixth meeting between Virginia and Richmond in men's lacrosse.
- UVA owns a 5-0 all-time record in the series that was first contested in 2014.
- The 2014 meeting was Richmond's very first NCAA Division I men's lacrosse game in program
- James Pannell scored two of his game-high four goals late in the fourth quarter and the UVA defense held on for the narrow 13-12 win over the eventual Atlantic Sun champions and NCAA participant.
- In 2015 at Klöckner Stadium UVA used five goals from Owen Van Arsdale, four from Ryan Tucker and three from Greg Coholan to cruise to a 14-7 triumph over the Spiders.
- Behind 12 saves from goalie Matt Barrett, UVA recorded its first shutout (9-0) since 2007 when UVA and Richmond met in 2016 at Robins Stadium. AJ Fish, Matt Emery and Ryan Lukacovic all scored two goals to help the winning effort.
- Trailing, 7-6, with 1:56 left, UVA scored a man-up goal from Dox Aitken and after UVA won the ensuing faceoff, Ryan Conrad found Jared Conners with 57 seconds left for the game-winning score.
- Because UVA made back-to-back trips to Robins Stadium, UVA and Richmond are meeting at Klöckner Stadium in Charlottesville back-to-back times for the 2018 and 2019 seasons.

### UVA VS. THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA

- UVA enters Saturday's contest with Richmond with a 111-19-2 all-time record against opponents from the Commonwealth.
- Virginia has won 70 games in a row against opponents from the Commonwealth of Virginia. The last loss was to Washington & Lee on April 23, 1977 when the Generals were an NCAA Division I institution in men's lacrosse.
- For the 14th year in a row UVA is facing an opponent from the Commonwealth of Virginia. From 2006-16 UVA played VMI every season, while adding Richmond to the annual schedule with the beginning of the Spiders' program in 2014.
- VMI returned to UVA's schedule in 2018 and visits Klöckner Stadium on April 16.

# LOOKING BACK AT HISTORICAL FIRST RICHMOND LACROSSE GAME

- The inaugural game of the Richmond lacrosse program took place on Feb. 8, 2014 at Robins Stadium against a UVA team that was ranked No. 7 in the nation.
- UVA came away with a 13-12 win in front of 4,249 fans at Robins Stadium.

# VIRGINIA VS. THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

- The Southern Conference is in its fifth season as a men's lacrosse conference.
- Virginia is 34-3 all-time against current memembers of the Southern Conference.
- Virginia is 0-1 against Air Force, 3-0 against Bellarmine, 2-2 against High Point, 5-0 against Richmond and 24-0 against VMI.
- There are three Southern Conference opponents UVA has never played: Furman, Jacksonville and Mercer.
- · All three of those programs started playing lacrosse in the last nine years: Jacksonville (2010), Mercer (2011) and Furman (2014).
- The conference as a whole is very young in lacrosse. Richmond began in 2014 and High Point began in 2013. The old guard in the leauge are Air Force, who began playing lacrosse in 1967, and VMI, who started in 1983.
- By comparison, UVA started its first varsity lacrosse season in 1904.

# VIRGINIA'S WIN AT HOMEWOOD FIELD

- Virginia's 16-11 triumph at then-No. 15 Johns Hopkins last time out served as UVA's largest margin of victory ever over the Blue Jays at historic Homewood Field.

### **UVA ATTACK GETTING IT DONE**

- All three of UVA's starting attackmen rank in the Top-4 in the ACC in points per game. Michael Kraus is No. 1 in the ACC (4.38), while Matt Moore is No. 2 (4.12) and Ian Laviano is No. 4 (3.38).
- Kraus is No. 23 in the nation, Moore is No. 31 and Laviano is No. 71.
- UVA is one of three schools in the nation (Cornell, Princeton) that has each member of its starting attack ranked in the Top 75 nationally in points per game.

# **UVA DEFENSE FORCING SHOT CLOCK VIOLATIONS**

- UVA's defense has forced 11 shot clock violations through the first eight games of the season.
- On offense, UVA had two shot clock violations on back-to-back possessions at Princeton. UVA also had two shot clock violations at Johns Hopkins.

# **UVA ROCKING THE ASSISTS**

• UVA has scored 103 goals through four games this year and has assisted 62 of them. That means UVA has recorded an assist on 60.2 percent of its goals in 2019.

# **DEFENDING THE CLEAR**

- In eight games this season, UVA is limiting its opponents to a 72.0 clearing percentage (116-of-161), which is 5.7 failed clears per game by UVA opponents.
- Contrast, UVA is clearing at an 81.3 percent rate (122-of-150), failing 3.5 clears per game.

# UVA HAS NO EASY OUTS TO BEGIN THE 2019 SEASON

- Of UVA's first 12 opponents of the 2019 season, 10 have been ranked so far this season.
- This week seven of those opponents are currently ranked. UVA's win over then-No. 19 Princeton knocked the Tigers from the polls. UVA also plays Richmond, who dropped out of the Top 20 two weeks ago.
- UVA's first five games of 2019 feature an opponent currently ranked, or previously ranked in the polls in 2019.
- Of UVA's first 12 games, only Brown and Utah have not been ranked at some point this season. Brown was receiving votes heading into the UVA game.

# DOX AITKEN SETS ANOTHER UVA RECORD

- M Dox Aitken reached 100 career points (75-25-100) on Feb. 18 vs. High Point. He is the quickest midfielder in UVA history to the milestone, reaching so in 36 games.
- Aitken broke the previous record of 39 games by Pete Eldredge (1969-72).

# **UVA RECORDS BACK-TO-BACK ROAD RANKED WINS**

- UVA won in overtime, 15-14, at then-No. 14 Syracuse on March 2. With a win at then-No. 19 Princeton (12-11, OT), UVA won back-to-back road games against ranked opponents for the first time since 2012
- In a seven-day span in 2012, UVA won at then-No. 9 Maryland (12-8) on March 31, followed by a win at then-No. 9 UNC (15-10) on April 7.

# AITKEN CLIMBS UVA MIDFIELDER SCORING LISTS

- Midfielder Dox Aitken (88) needs one goal to pass Matt Poskay (88) for sole possession of No. 4 all-time at UVA for career goals among midfielders.
- With 88 career goals, Aitken has reached the 80-goal mark quicker than any other midfielder in UVA history.
- Aitken needs two goals to become only the third Cavalier midfielder to score at least 90 career goals. He would join the program's co-leaders Brian Carroll and Pete Eldredge who both have 94 career goals.
- Aitken needs four points to pass Pete Eldredge (116) for No. 4 in career midfielder points at UVA.
- Aitken is only the second Cavalier midfielder to reach his 100th career point as a third year, joining Shamel Bratton.
- Bratton reached his 100th career point in career game No. 53, while Aitken is the quickest UVA midfielder to 100 points, doing so in 36 career games. Pete Eldredge (1969-72) was the previous record holder reaching 100 career points as a fourth year in career game 39.

# VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Currently UVA is No. 3 in the nation with 39.00 ground balls per game.
- Entering 2019, UVA has led the nation in ground balls five of the last 10 years, including the last two seasons under Lars Tiffany.
- In 2018, UVA ranked No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (38.00).
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game nine times over the last 10 seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

# **VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS**

- Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 281 weeks all-time.
- $\bullet$  UVA has been ranked in the Top 10 in 424 polls all-time.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973.

# **VIRGINIA AND OVERTIME IN 2019**

- UVA had a three-game stretch where the Cavaliers played three overtime games in a row.
- It is only the third time in program history UVA played three consecutive games that went to overtime. It was the first time in program history UVA won all three games with wins at then-No. 19 Princeton (12-11), at then No. 14 Syracuse (15-14) and vs. Brown (14-13).
- UVA last played three consecutive overtime games in 2017, going 1-2 with wins vs. Cornell and back-to-back losses to Notre Dame and Johns Hopkins. UVA also played three overtime games in a row in the 1980 NCAA Tournament, beating Cornell and North Carolina before falling to Johns Hopkins in double OT for the NCAA title.
- UVA has never played four consecutive overtime games.
- $\bullet$  UVA is 5-2 all-time in overtime under Lars Tiffany, including 2-1 at Klöckner Stadium.

# TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.
- Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).

# **DEFENSE SHINES AGAINST NOTRE DAME**

- Team defense against then-No. 7 Notre Dame was on point as they forced the Irish into a season-high 22 turnovers in UVA's 13-11 win. UVA's 11 caused turnovers were also a season high for a Notre Dame opponent.
- The Irish entered the game as the nation's No. 3 clearing team, but failed a season-high four clears against the Cavaliers.
- UVA's defensive effort held Notre Dame's top two scorers to a combined three points (Bryan Costabile 1 goal, Brendan Gleason 2 assists).
- UVA's SSDM John Fox caused two crucial turnovers in the game's final two minutes that helped preserve UVA's lead, including one to close the game on Notre Dame's final offensive possession.

# TIFFANY DOES A RARE THING VS. BROWN

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany has been the head coach at Stony Brook, Brown and now Virginia.
- With UVA's win over Brown, Tiffany owns at least one career win over every program he has served as a head coach. Tiffany is 2-0 all-time against Stony Brook, winning once as the Brown head coach and once as the UVA head coach. Tiffany is 1-1 against Virginia, winning as the Brown head coach and losing as the Stony Brook head coach. He is 1-0 against Brown, winning at the Virginia head coach.
- Only one other active coach that has had at least three DI head coaching jobs has career wins over each of the three programs he has coached. Tiffany joins Duke's John Danowski who coached C.W. Post when they were a DI program, as well as Hofstra and Duke. Danowski has beat all three of those DI programs as a DI head coach.

# **2019 CAPTAINS NAMED**

- Midfielder Ryan Conrad, attackman Michael Kraus and midfielder Dave Smith have been selected by their peers as the captains of the 2019 men's lacrosse team.
- Conrad is the first back-to-back captain since Steele Stanwick in 2011 and 2012.
- Michael Kraus and Conrad in 2018 are the first two "third-years" named captain since Stanwick in 2011. Greg Coholan and Tanner Scales each were named captains as redshirt jurniors during their fourth year on Grounds.

# **FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS**

- UVA has three first-time opponents on its schedule in 2019, hosting Lehigh (Feb. 16), Marist (April 20) and Utah (March 31).
- The last time UVA had at least three first-time opponents on its schedule was 2005 with regular season meetings with Manhattan and Mount St. Mary's, followed by an NCAA Tournament showdown with Albany.

# DEFENSE FORCES TURNOVERS VS LEHIGH

- Lehigh had 22 turnovers against the Cavaliers on Feb. 15. UVA caused 12 of those turnovers.
- Of UVA's 12 turnovers, nine came from the starting defense: D Kyle Kology (3), D Cade Saustad (2), D Logan Greco (2) and LSM Jared Conners (2) led the way.

# VIRGINIA DROPS OPENER AT LOYOLA

- For only the second time in 12 seasons, UVA has lost its season opener. Both times it game at the hands of the Loyola Greyhounds (2016 and 2019).
- In both of those losses, perennial Player of the Year candidate Pat Spencer recorded 11 combined points. In his collegiate debut against UVA in 2016 he scored two goals and two assists. In last week's Loyola win he led all players with five goals and two assists.

Game 1 Loyola 17, Virginia 9 Feb. 9 • Baltimore, Md.

The No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers fell in the season opener against the No. 4 Loyola Greyhounds, 17-9, at the Ridley Athletic Complex.

The Greyhounds' goalie Jacob Stover was hot between the pipes, saving 18 shots by the Cavaliers. UVA opened the game with an extra-man goal by junior Dox Aitken 48 seconds into the game on a Michael Kraus helper. Loyola outscored UVA 8-3 the rest of the first half to take a four-point lead into the intermission, 8-4.

### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

UVA was leading 1-0 when a 3-0 Loyola run gave the Greyhounds the lead for good, 3-1. Two goals by Loyola's Pat Spencer sparked a five-goal first quarter for LU.

Michael Kraus found Ian Laviano 1:02 into overtime and the No. 12 Virginia Cavaliers escaped New Jersey with a 12-11 triumph over the No. 19 Princeton Tigers at Class of 1952 Stadium.

UVA goalie Patrick Burkinshaw made his first collegiate start and collegiate debut against the Tigers. He was stingy in the goal, saving 24 shots. The 24 saves set a UVA freshman goalie record, a UVA first career goalie start record, a Class of 1952 Stadium record and is tied for the most single-game saves in the nation this year. Brukinshaw made six fourth-quarter saves, but no was bigger than the clutch save he made with 32 seconds left in regulation on a Charlie Durbin missile from 10 yards out. Durbin had already found nylon four times on the afternoon.

# **HOW IT HAPPENED**

With Princeton leading 11-10 with 6:55 left in regulation, the UVA defense held firm and kept the Tigers scoreless for the game's final 7:57, including overtime. Ryan Conrad scored an unassisted goal at 4:01 in the fourth quarter to tie the game, 11-11.

The No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers walked away with an impressive 16-11 triumph over the No. 15 Johns Hopkins Blue Jays at historic Homewood Field, returning the Doyle Smith Cup to Charlottesville for the first time since 2016.

The game began as a see-saw battle that boasted seven ties and five lead changes, but the Cavaliers trailing 8-7 early in the third quarter went on a 9-2 run to take a commanding six-goal lead with 7:36 left to play.
