- UVA has a 22-0 all-time record against VMI, the most wins in program history against a team the Cavaliers have never lost to.
- A James Pannell needs two points to reach 100 for his career.
- M Greg Coholan has the 18th longest active point streak in the nation, tallying at least one in 24 straight games. A Ryan Lukacovic is tied for No. 19 in the nation with a streak of 23 games.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia continues the homestand on Tuesday when in-state foe VMI comes to Klöckner Stadium. Faceoff is set for 7 p.m. UVA is receiving votes in both the USILA coaches and Cascade/Maverik media polls.

THE SERIES VS. THE KEYDETS

Virginia owns a 22-0 all-time record against the Keydets and 2016 is the 11-straight season the two programs have met in a series that started in 1949. Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is 15-0 all-time against VMI. The Cavaliers' average victory margin in the series is 17.6 goals.

VMI head coach Jon Birsner is in his first season as the head coach of the Keydets after serving as an assistant at Furman. Wesley Sanders leads the Keydets with 19 goals and 22 points. Cody Sheetz owns six goals, while Tom Nofi is second on the team with eight points. John O'Donnell leads VMI with five assists. Joe Riccadonna is saving 47 percent of shots in the cage and posting a 14.12 goals against average.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 24th season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 271-100 (.730) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In his 24th season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 371 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. VMI

- UVA holds a 22-0 all-time record against the Keydets.
- 2016 is the 11th-straight season the two programs have met in a series that started in 1949.
- UVA's 11-10 win in the first game in 1949 is the closest of the series.
- The teams met again in 1950 (a 14-4 UVA win) and then did not meet again until 1988.
- Since Under Dom Starsia, Virginia is averaging 23.3 goals per game and has won by an average of 17.6 goals
- The Cavaliers have rarely trailed the Keydets.
- Based on available records going back to 1988, the Cavaliers have only trailed in three games.
- VMI scored the first two goals in 1994 (2:19 and 7:30 of the first quarter) and led for 5:33.
- The Cavaliers quickly tied the score with 7:08 to go in the opening quarter and took the lead for good with 3:51 left in the period.
- VMI scored the first goal in 2012 (13:55 of the first quarter) and led for 5:41.
- The Cavaliers didn't score until the 8:17 mark on a Steele Stanwick unassisted goal, which prompted a 6-0 UVA run.
- Last year VMI scored the first goal of the game at the 13:07 mark of the first quarter and led for 1:42.
- UVA scored at 11:25 on a Nick O'Reilly goal, which prompted a 15-0 run. VMI didn't score again until the fourth quarter.
- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is 14-0 all-time against VMI and Tuesday marks the 15th time in the Starsia era VMI and UVA have met.
- The Cavaliers' average victory margin in the series is 17.6 goals.
- The 2009 meeting between these two teams was UVA's first in Lexington, Va., since 1997.
- UVA played again in Lexington in 2015, a 17-3 Cavalier win as the Keydets didn't score until late in the fourth quarter.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 125-31 (.7987) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 3-3 mark in 2016. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

NEAR INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only seven night games at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall UVA is 34-7 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010.
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA also lost to North Carolina in 2015, a 7 p.m. start.
- UVA lost its first night game in 2016, an overtime setback (12-11) to High Point on Feb. 23.

OPPONENT GOALIES HAVING SEASON/CAREER GAMES VS. UVA

- In UVA's nine games in 2016 there have been six goalies that have set a season high in saves against the Cavaliers. Four of those goalies also set a career high in the same game.
- Saint Joseph's (10 saves), High Point (15 saves) and Johns Hopkins (9) are the only games where the opponent's goalie did not have a season high in saves.

 - Drexel, 17 saves (career high)
 - Penn, 16 saves (career high)
 - Syracuse, 13 saves (career high)

RYAN CONRAD POISED FOR A SPECIAL FRESHMAN SEASON

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVA head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVA has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011
- UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 21 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

James Pannell led No. 11 Virginia (2-2) with three goals and two assists as the Cavaliers outlasted the visiting Penn Quakers (1-1), 15-10, inside Klöckner Stadium.

Virginia controlled the first quarter of play as they peppered 16 shots at Penn goalie Reed Junkin. Behind Junkin's nine first-quarter saves, the game was knotted at 3-3. Pannell and Ryan Conrad scored first for Virginia, giving the Cavaliers a 2-0 lead with 6:23 left in the first quarter. The Quakers came back with a goal by Kevin McGeary and an extra-man goal by Alex Roesner at 4:03.
