

GAME OVERVIEW

The Virginia Cavaliers (6-0) are ranked No. 1 this week in both the USILA coaches and Nike/Inside Lacrosse media polls and are coming off home wins over then-No. 3 Syracuse and Vermont. Next up for UVa is the Cornell Big Red (3-0), ranked No. 3 in both the coaches and media polls. The 2012 edition of the series brings UVa back to Baltimore a second-consecutive season for the Konica Minolta Face-Off Classic. Faceoff is set for 1:30 p.m. It is UVa's first appearance inside Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium since winning the 2011 NCAA title on Memorial Day last May.

THE SERIES VS. THE BIG RED

The 2012 season marks the fourth-straight season the Cavaliers and Big Red have faced each other in a series in which UVa holds an 8-3 all-time advantage. The series began during the regular season in 1971, a game contested in Charlottesville. The next five meetings took place in the NCAA Tournament before the next regular season matchup, a 2009 contest at Klöckner Stadium.

Ben DeLuca enters his second season as the Big Red's head coach, taking over a program in 2011 that he spent 16 years with as a player and assistant coach. DeLuca is 17-3 during so far as a collegiate head coach, guiding the Big Red to the 2011 Ivy League title. Of his three career losses, two have come at the hands of the Cavaliers.



STEELE STANWICK RETURNS HOME TO BALTIMORE

Senior Steele Stanwick is a native of Baltimore and returns home for his eighth career game in his home town

- In seven previous contests in the Charm City, Stanwick has tallied 14 goals and 10 assists for 24 points
- Four of those games have been played in M&T Bank Stadium where he is 6-5-11 GAP
- Two were played at Johns Hopkins, down the street from the Stanwick compound, where he was 6-4-10 GAP
- The other Baltimore area game was a 2-1-3 GAP performance at Towson in 2010

BOCKLET AND BRIGGS ENJOY THE NYLON AT M&T BANK STADIUM

- In three career games inside M&T Bank Stadium Colin Briggs has nine career goals
- Eight of those goals came in his last two games, both in 2011

Briggs tallied three goals against Cornell in the 2011 Face-Off Classic and was named game MVP by Inside Lacrosse

• He scored five more against Maryland in the 2011 NCAA title game and took home Most Oustanding Player honors for the 2011 NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship

• Chris Bocklet has had a few good games inside M&T Bank Stadium as well - scoring eight career goals in four career games

- Bocklet scored four goals against Duke in the 2010 NCAA semifinal game
- He scored three more times against Denver in the 2011 NCAA semifinal game

• Maryland held Bocklet scoreless in the 2011 NCAA title game, snapping his 35-game consecutive goal scoring streak - which was the longest active streak in the nation at that point

ASSISTED GOAL VARIANCE

- UVa's opponents have only assisted 23 of their 43 goals for a rate of 53.4 percent
- That is a difference of 9 percent
- Heading into the Syracuse game the previous difference was 30.2

MATT WHITE SCORING STREAK

• Junior Matt White has scored at least one goal in his 11 of his last 12 games, tallying a total of 20 goals and 25 points

BOCKLET SCORING THE ROCKS

- Since Chris Bocklet became a starter at the begining of the 2010 season, he has made 42 consecutive starts
- Bocklet has tallied at least one goal in 41 of those 42 games
- Bocklet failed to score a goal against Maryland in the 2011 NCAA title game when he was limited to one shot which was saved

THE STANWICK TO BOCKLET CONNECTION ESTABLISHED CIRCA 2009

- Steele Stanwick and Chris Bocklet have been playing together at UVa since 2009
 While no connections between the two happened during their first year on
- Grounds, Stanwick has assisted Bocklet on 38 of his 116 career goals
- That means that 32.8 percent of Bocklet's 116 career goals have been assisted by Stanwick
- In turn, 34.2 percent of the goals scored via one of Stanwick's 111 career assists has been by Bocklet
- By the numbers, 15 of Bocklet's goals in 2010 were via Stanwick assists 17 of Bocklet's 2011 goals were from Stanwick and thus far in 2012, the Stanwick to Bocklet train has produced six scores
- The most connections in a game is four and it has happened twice, most recently on Tuesday against Vermont the other time was against VMI last season

STANWICK JOINS THE 100/100 CLUB

- Steele Stanwick currently has 104 career goals and 111 career assists, making him the third UVa player in program history to reach the 100/100 club joining Kevin Pehlke (1990-93) and Danny Glading (2006-09)
- Stanwick reached both milestones with a two goal/three assist performance against Stony Brook (Feb. 25)
- Stanwick is the seventh player in ACC history to join the club, including Duke's Matt Danowski (2004-08), Tony Cullen (1978-80) and Steve Sachs (1966-69), NC State's Marc Resnick (1976-79) and UVa's Pehlke and Glading
- Stanwick is also the 46th player in NCAA history to join the club
- UVa is tied with Air Force and Duke for No. 2 among schools with most members in the 100/100 club Syracuse leads all with six
- Stanwick played one season with Danny Glading, who finds himself on this list
- In 2009 Danny Glading assisted Stanwick 11 times
- In 2009 Stanwick assisted Glading only once vs. Duke in ACC Tournament

GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER BODES WELL

- This year's senior class has compiled a 27-1 record at Klöckner Stadium during their careers
- Their only loss at Klöckner was to Duke in 2010
- Overall Virginia is 107-16 (.870) all-time at Klöckner (since 1993), including 10-1 in the NCAA Championship
- Two scheduled home games are not included in record for the 2012 seniors 2010 Stony Brook game played at UHall Turf Field and 2011 Maryland game played at Scott Stadium

SENIOR CLASS BRINGING HOME THE WINS

- This year's senior class has ammassed a 50-10 overall record for a .833 winning percentage
- This year's senior class is 28-2 at home, 12-5 on the road and 10-3 at neutral sites since the start of the 2009 season

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only two night games at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall UVa is 28-2 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993
- UVa fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010
