FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- The 2012 game is only the third time UVa has been ranked No. 1 by the USILA coaches poll the week of the Syracuse game, while SU has been ranked No. 1 eight times the week they have played UVa.
- Steele Stanwick joins fellow Tewaaraton Award winners Mike Powell (Syracuse) and Matt Danowski (Duke) as former winners of the prestigious award to have remaining collegiate eligibility, returning to the NCAA game as the "reigning Tewaaraton winner".
- Stanwick became the 7th player in ACC history with at least 100 career goals and 100 career assists against Stony Brook.
- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia made a cameo as himself in the new lacrosse movie "Crooked Arrows" opening nationwide on May 18.
- Former UVa men's lacrosse player Jason Leneau plays the lacrosse double of the character "Dixon" in the CW's New 90210 show.

GAME OVERVIEW

No. 1 in the USILA coaches and Nike/Inside Lacrosse media polls, the Virginia Cavaliers (4-0) will clash with the Syracuse Orange (2-0), No. 3 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 6 in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse media poll, on Sunday at Klöckner Stadium. Faceoff is slated for 4:30 p.m. This is the fourth year in a row that one of the two teams is ranked No. 1 in the nation during the regular season series matchup, including last year when the USILA ranked both teams No. 1. UVa will raise its 2011 NCAA title flag prior to the game and honor Dom Starsia for becoming the all-time leader in Division I head coaching wins.

THE SERIES VS. THE ORANGE

The Cavaliers had won six regular-season games in a row against Syracuse before losing 12-10 in the Carrier Dome last year. The setback broke a string of three-straight UVa victories inside the Carrier Dome, the most by any Syracuse opponent. UVa owns the narrow 14-13 margin in the all-time series, including an exciting 11-10 triumph the last time these two squads met in Charlottesville back in 2010. These two programs have captured four of the last six NCAA titles.

Sunday's game also marks the fifth year in a row both squads have featured unblemished records at game time (during the regular season). Syracuse head coach John Desko enters his 14th year at Syracuse where the Orange have won five NCAA national championships under his direction.

THE SERIES VS. SYRACUSE

- UVa narrowly leads the series 14-13 which mimics the back-and-forth scoring characteristic of the games between the two teams
- Not only is the series so narrowly contested but the goals scored by each team are the almost the same—UVa has scored 355 goals, while Syracuse is at 356 all-time in the series
- The two schools battled only three times between 1938-93, but have met at least once each season since 1994
- The regular-season series began in 1995, Dom Starsia's third season at Virginia
- The two schools have also met six times in the NCAA Tournament since 1995
- Virginia has won seven of the last nine meetings in the series, including six regular-season match-ups until last year's setback at the Carrier Dome
- The Cavaliers' success lately closely mirrors that of the Orange who won eight of nine games from 1997-2002
- The most recent heartbreaking UVa loss saw the Orange pull out a dramatic come-from-behind 12-11 double overtime win in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Tournament on the way to capturing the national championship
- That win ended Virginia's five-game series winning streak, the longest by either team in the series
- Both teams are known for their high-scoring offenses, but it is interesting to note that since 1999 Syracuse has scored at least 15 goals only four times (2002-03-04-06) and Virginia three (03-06-06) in the series
- Virginia loss last season snapped a three game win streak in the "Dome" over Syracuse, a feat boasted by no other opponent of the Orange

TIGHT GAMES CHARACTERIZE SERIES

- The potential for a high-scoring game such as the classic 1997 match-up won by Syracuse 22-21 is one of the main reasons this game is so widely anticipated
- However, since 1996 a three-goal win can be considered a "blow out"
- 15 of the last 21 games since then have been decided by just one or two goals
- More than half the games between the two schools (17 of 27), have been decided by one or two goals, including both games in 2008, which went to overtime
- In the history of the series, the biggest win by either team is a 13-4 Syracuse win in 1938 in the first meeting between the two squads
- Virginia's biggest win is a 15-7 victory in the Carrier Dome in 1995

NO WONDER THE SERIES IS NEARLY 50/50

- Since Dom Starsia became head coach at Virginia in 1993, the two teams have met 24 times—with Syracuse winning 12 times and Virginia 12
- 16 of those games have been decided by one or two goals, including the last five meetings - both games in 2008 went to overtime

ASSISTED GOAL VARIANCE

- Through the first four games of the season UVa has assisted 42 of their 57 goals for a rate of 73.7 percent
- UVa's opponents have only assisted 10 of their 23 goals for a rate of 43.5 percent
- That is a difference of 30.2 percent

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVa head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 23 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of three coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer and Dave Urick)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times
- Starsia is currently ranks in the top two on two different all-time coaching lists

MATT WHITE SCORING STREAK

- Junior Matt White has scored at least one goal in his nine of his last 10 games, tallying a total of 17 goals and 22 points
- During the span, White is shooting 63.0 percent (17-of-27) and he is shooting 85.0 percent (17-of-20) when his attempts are on goal

STANWICK JOINS THE 100/100 CLUB

- Steele Stanwick currently has 103 career goals and 102 career assists, making him the third UVa player in program history to reach the 100/100 club - joining Kevin Pehlke (1990-93) and Danny Glading (2006-09)
- Stanwick reached both milestones with a two goal/three assist performance against Stony Brook (Feb. 25)
- Stanwick is the seventh player in ACC history to join the club, including Duke's Matt Danowski (2004-08), Tony Cullen (1978-80) and Steve Sachs (1966-69), NC State's Marc Resnick (1976-79) and UVa's Pehlke and Glading
- Stanwick is also the 46th player in NCAA history to join the club
- UVa is tied with Air Force and Duke for No. 2 among schools with most members in the 100/100 club - Syracuse leads all with six
- Stanwick played one season with Danny Glading, who finds himself on this list
- In 2009 Danny Glading assisted Stanwick 11 times
- In 2009 Stanwick assisted Glading only once - vs. Duke in ACC Tournament

STARSIA HAS COACHED HIS 450TH CAREER GAME

- Saturday's game against Stony Brook was the 450th game for Starsia as a head coach
- Starsia coached his 300th game as the head coach of Virginia on May 30, 2011 - the day UVa won the 2011 NCAA title
- Starsia coached 147 games over 10 years at Brown before coming to Charlottesville

LOW SHOT TOTAL AT DREXEL

- Virginia attempted only 24 shots in its 9-8 triumph at No. 20 Drexel on Saturday
- The 24 shots are the fewest by the Cavaliers in a game since they attempted 21 total shots in a 17-2 road loss at Duke on April 16, 2005
- The 24 shots are the fewest in a UVa win during head coach Dom Starsia's tenure (1993-present)
- The 24 shots are the second-fewest in any UVa game during the Dom Starsia tenure - trailing the 2005 Duke game

GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER BODES WELL

- This year's senior class has compiled a 25-1 record at Klöckner Stadium during their careers
- Their only loss at Klöckner was to Duke in 2010
- Overall Virginia is 105-16 (.868) all-time at Klöckner (since 1993), including 10-1 in the NCAA Championship
- Two scheduled home games are not included in record for the 2012 seniors - 2010 Stony Brook game played at UHall Turf Field and 2011 Maryland game played at Scott Stadium

CLEMENTS SCORES ANOTHER GOAL

- Captain and senior Chris Clements sat out 2010 with a lower extremity injury and in Jan 2011 moved from SSDM to defense and a long pole
- Now Clements plays LSM and in transition scored a goal against VMI
- It was Clements first goal since Feb. 21, 2009 at Stony Brook

SENIOR CLASS BRINGING HOME THE WINS

- This year's senior class has amassed a 48-10 overall record for a .828 winning percentage
- This year's senior class is 26-2 at home, 12-5 on the road and 10-3 at neutral sites since the start of the 2009 season

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only two night games at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall UVa is 27-2 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993
- UVa fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010

COCKERTON BROTHERS

- Against Mount St. Mary's both Mark (1 goal) and Matt (1 goal) Cockerton scored goals
- Against VMI both Mark (3 goals) and Matt (2 goals) Cockerton also scored at least one goal
- It was the third and fourth time in their careers they have both scored goals in the same game
- In 2011, Mark's first year at UVa, both scored in the Mount St. Mary's game and the VMI game as well
- The brothers are the sons of Stan Cockerton, who graduated from NC State in 1980 as the NCAA leader in goals scored with 193 - he currently sits No. 3

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Virginia has a 28-game winning streak going back to 2001 in regular-season midweek games
- Virginia has three midweek games scheduled in 2011
- The last time the Cavaliers lost a midweek contest was an 11-8 loss to Notre Dame on March 14, 2001 (a Wednesday)
- Under head coach Dom Starsia, Virginia is 48-2 (.960) in mid-week games since 1993
- After losing his first mid-week game (9-6 to Princeton in 1993), the Cavaliers rattled off 22 wins in a row before that loss to Notre Dame 10 years ago

VIRGINIA PRE-RANKED NO. 1 IN THE NATION

- Virginia is ranked the preseason No. 1 team in the nation by the USILA coaches poll for the second year in a row
- UVa is ranked the preseason No. 1 team in the nation by the Nike/Inside Lacrosse media poll for the first time since the 2009

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 269 weeks
- UVa has been ranked in the Top 10 in 348 polls
- The USILA Poll began in 1973

2012 CAPTAINS NAMED

- Midfielder Colin Briggs, longstick midfielder Chris Clements, midfielder Matt Kugler and attackman Steele Stanwick have been selected captains this season
- Stanwick and Briggs are first-team preseason All-Americans by Face-Off Yearbook
- Stanwick is a captain for the second year in a row and the first Cavalier to be voted captain in back-to-back seasons since Mike Timms (2008 & 2009)
- In its 83rd lacrosse season, Stanwick is the 23rd Cavalier to be named a captain in more than one season

UVa then took over behind the goals from Hill and the game-capper from Emery, the sophomore's second of the day.
