FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Steele Stanwick becomes the first Cavalier to be named ACC Player of the Year multiple times in his career and the fourth player in ACC history to win the accolade in back-to-back seasons.
- UVa plays its first game in the state of Colorado since 2004 and will contest the sixth all-time meeting with Penn for the first time outside the friendly confines of Charlottesville, Va.
- Chris LaPierre needs 2 ground balls to become the 31st Cavalier to reach the 200 plateau - 67 ground balls will place him No. 10 all-time at UVa.
- Steele Stanwick joins fellow Tewaaron Award winners Mike Powell (Syracuse) and Matt Danowski (Duke) as former winners of the prestigious award to have remaining collegiate eligibility, returning to the NCAA game as the "reigning Tewaaron winner".
- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia made a cameo as himself in the new lacrosse movie "Crooked Arrows" opening nationwide on May 18.

GAME OVERVIEW

The Virginia Cavaliers (10-3) are ranked No. 6 in this week's USILA coaches poll and Nike/Inside Lacrosse media poll after falling in the opening round of the ACC Championship. UVa travels to Denver, Colo., for a rendezvous with the Penn Quakers (3-9) at the Whitman's Sampler Mile High Classic on Friday evening, inside Sports Authority Field at Mile High.

The trip to Colorado is the second in UVa program history and the first since the 2004 season. In 2004 the Cavaliers played a road game at Denver and a neutral site game against the Air Force Academy at Denver University.

THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

Friday marks the sixth all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and the Quakers, and the first neutral site meeting. UVa owns a narrow 3-2 advantage in a series that dates back to 1929, but has never been contested outside of Charlottesville until this season. UVa dropped the first two contests (1929 & 1931), before winning the past three (1997, 1998 and 2011) under Virginia head coach Dom Starsia.

Penn head coach Mike Murphy is in his third season as the head coach of the Quakers and he returns 16 letterwinners and 10 starters off a 2011 team that went 8-7 and made the NCAA Tournament. Murphy served as an assistant on Starsia's final Brown team in 1992 and his first five UVa teams from 1993-97.

THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

- UVA leads the series with Penn 3-2, as the Cavaliers are winners of the past three meetings in a series that started in 1929
- The series has only been played in Charlottesville (1929, 1931, 1997, 1998, 2011), as Friday's game in Denver will be the first in the series away from the Commonwealth of Virginia
- There are a few Penn and UVA connections to this game
- Penn head coach Mike Murphy was an assistant coach under UVA head coach Dom Starsia on his final Brown staff in 1992 and his first five UVA teams from 1993-97, which included two NCAA title games and three NCAA semifinal games
- US Lacrosse Hall of Fame head coach Jim Adams served as head coach at both Penn (1970-77) and Virginia (1978-1992), retiring in Charlottesville in 1992 and was succeeded by Dom Starsia
- Current UVA associate head coach Marc Van Arsdale was the head coach at Penn from 1997-2001
- Former UVA All-American Doug Knight is in his first season as a volunteer assistant on the Penn coaching staff
- Dom Starsia faced Penn all 10 of his seasons as the head coach at Brown and went an even 5-5, but has gone 3-0 during his time at UVA
- The 2011 season marks the fifth season out of the last six that UVA has a regular season schedule that features two Ivy League teams (2010 was only one that didn't)
- UVA played Cornell early this season - in 2011 it was Cornell and Penn - In 2009 it was Cornell and Dartmouth
- In 2007 and 2008 the schedule featured Dartmouth and Princeton

UVA IN INSIDE LACROSSE EVENTS

- Virginia is 6-0 all-time in Inside Lacrosse Events
- They are 4-0 in the Face-Off Classic and 2-0 in the Big City Classic
- UVA defeated then-No. 3 Cornell this season in the Face-Off Classic in overtime, 9-8
- UVA is playing in the third inaugural event held by Inside Lacrosse, the Cavaliers played Syracuse in the inaugural Face-Off Classic in 2008. They played North Carolina in the inaugural Big City Classic in 2009 and now against Penn in the inaugural Mile High Classic

UVA IN NFL STADIUMS

- Virginia will be making its first appearance inside Sports Authority Field at Mile High, the sixth-different NFL stadium the UVA laxers have appeared in
- UVA is 13-5 all-time in NFL stadiums, including 9-2 inside M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore
- The Cavaliers have also appeared in Foxborough's Gillette Stadium (0-2), Philadelphia's Lincoln Financial Field (2-1), East Rutherford's Meadowlands (1-0) and East Rutherford's MetLife Stadium (1-0)
- This year's senior class is 6-2 during their four seasons in NFL stadiums with the losses coming in the 2009 and 2010 NCAA semifinal rounds

COMING HOME TO COLORADO

- UVA has two players on its roster that hail from the state of Colorado
- First-year's Rhody Heller and Tanner Ottenbreit were teammates together at Regis Jesuit - Heller is from Denver and Ottenbreit calls Parker home
- Dom Starsia signed two players last November to NLI's from the state of Colorado - Matt Florence (Greenwood) and Tanner Scales (Denver) will enter UVA for the fall semester

COLORADO ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH

- Virginia's game against Penn in Denver, Colo., marks the sixth-different state the Cavaliers have played in this season
- UVA has also played in Pennsylvania, Maryland, North Carolina, Ohio and Virginia
- Its the most states UVA has played in since playing in six-different states during the 2008 season
- This is UVA's second-ever trip to the state of Colorado and first since the 2004 season
- UVA is 0-2 all-time in the state of Colorado, losing to Air Force (6-7) and Denver (7-9) during the 2004 season - both games were played on the campus of Denver University

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 23 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of three coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer and Dave Urlick)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times
- Starsia is currently ranks in the top two on two different all-time coaching lists

STANWICK CRACKS TOP 30 IN NATION IN ALL-TIME CAREER POINTS

- With 253 all-time points, Steele Stanwick ranks No. 27 all-time in the history of Division I men's lacrosse in career points

STANWICK LEADS NATION IN ASSISTS PER GAME

- Steele Stanwick leads the nation in assists per game with a 3.38 average. He also ranks No. 3 in the nation with 4.92 points per game

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only four night games at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall UVa is 28-4 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993
- UVa fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights also to Duke on April 17, 2010
- UVa's third loss ironically also game to Duke on April 13 of this season
- UVa lost its fourth game a week later against North Carolina on April 20 - the only time the Cavaliers have dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium

STANWICK NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES IN 2012

- Steele Stanwick was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on April 10 after his 7-point (3gls, 4 asst) game at then-No. 9 UNC - its was his third honor of the season and fifth of his career
- He becomes the first player in ACC history to earn player of the week honors three times in a year since the weekly award was first given out in 1986

LAPIERRE IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Chris LaPierre leads UVa with 55 ground balls, which ranks No. 2 in the nation among non faceoff specialists - he is nine ground balls behind the No. 1 spot, Jordan Houtby of Detroit
- His 55 total ground balls rank No. 36 among all players, including faceoff specialists
- LaPierre needs 2 ground balls to become the 31st Cavalier to reach the 200 plateau - 62 ground balls will place him No. 10 all-time at UVa
- LaPierre's 198 career ground balls ranks No. 12 in the nation among active players

SENIOR CLASS BRINGING HOME THE WINS

- This year's senior class has amassed a 54-13 overall record for a .806 winning percentage
- This year's senior class is 28-5 at home, 15-5 on the road and 11-3 at neutral sites since the start of the 2009 season

STANWICK NAMED A FINALIST FOR THE LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Steele Stanwick was named one of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award on Wednesday. Winner will be announced at Championship Weekend in Boston

UVa AND OHIO STADIUM

- The March 17 game marked the second time a UVa athletics team has contested an event inside the historic "Horseshoe"
- The UVa football team faced Ohio State inside Ohio Stadium on Oct. 7, 1933 and lost 75-0 -- 78 years and five months ago

ASSISTED GOAL VARIANCE

- Through the first 13 games of the season UVa has assisted 104 of their 158 goals for a rate of 65.8 percent
- UVa's opponents have only assisted 62 of their 113 goals for a rate of 54.8 percent
- That is a difference of 11.0 percent
- Heading into the Syracuse game the previous difference was 30.2

MATT WHITE SCORING STREAK

- Junior Matt White has scored at least one goal in his 17 of his last 20 games, tallying a total of 27 goals and 37 points
- During the span, White is shooting 48.2 percent (27-of-56) and he is shooting 79.4 percent (27-of-34) when his attempts are on goal

BOCKLET SCORING THE ROCKS

- Since Chris Bocklet became a starter at the beginning of the 2010 season, he has made 49 consecutive starts
- Bocklet has tallied at least one goal in 48 of those 49 games
- Bocklet failed to score a goal against Maryland in the 2011 NCAA title game when he was limited to one shot - which was saved

THE STANWICK TO BOCKLET CONNECTION ESTABLISHED CIRCA 2009

- Steele Stanwick and Chris Bocklet have been playing together at UVa since 2009
- While no connections between the two happened during their first year on Grounds, Stanwick has assisted Bocklet on 45 of his 131 career goals
- That means that 34.4 percent of Bocklet's 131 career goals have been assisted by Stanwick
- In turn, 33.1 percent of the goals scored via one of Stanwick's 136 career assists has been by Bocklet
- By the numbers, 15 of Bocklet's goals in 2010 were via Stanwick assists - 17 of Bocklet's 2011 goals were from Stanwick and thus far in 2012, the Stanwick to Bocklet train has produced 13 scores
- The most connections in a game is four and it has happened twice, most recently against Vermont this season - the other time was against VMI last season

TUCKER HIGH ON GOAL SCORING LIST FOR NATION'S FRESHMEN

- Freshman Ryan Tucker ranks tied for No. 22 in the nation among freshmen goal scorers with 13 tallies - he was No. 7 heading into the Maryland game
- He is one of two running on second midfield in the Top 19 nationally

STANWICK REPEATS AS ACC'S PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Steele Stanwick was named the 2012 ACC Offensive Player of the Year, winning the accolade for the second year in a row
- Stanwick is the first Cavalier to ever win the Player of the Year honor more than once
- This season the ACC changed the postseason awards and named an Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year - Stanwick won the last Player of the Year award that covered the entire field and won the very first Offensive Player of the Year award
- He is the first repeat winner since Duke's Matt Danowski won in 2007 & 2008
- Stanwick is the fourth back-to-back winner in ACC history
- Stan Cockerton of NC State, the father of current Cavaliers Matt and Mark, won the very first two ACC Player of the Year awards in 1977 & 1978
- Ryan Wade of North Carolina accomplished the feat in 1993 & 1994
- Danowski is the league's only three-time winner - taking honor in 2005, before repeating in 2007 & 2008
- Joe Walters of Maryland is the only other multiple ACC Player of the Year winner, taking the accolade home in 2004 and 2006
- UVa is now tied with UNC for most Player of the Year honorees with 10
- Before Stanwick won the 2011 honor, the last UVa player to be named ACC Player of the Year was Chris Rotelli in 2003

FOLLOWING UP AN NCAA TITLE

- Virginia has won five NCAA titles and the Cavaliers are 3-2 all-time in their season-opening games after winning a title. The wins came following the 1972, 2003 and 2011 seasons. The losses came after the 1999 and 2006 titles. UVa is 2-1 when facing Drexel in a season-opening game in a year following a title
- Since the NCAA started holding a men's lacrosse tournament in 1971, only seven times has a school repeated as champions - three of those efforts were part of a three-peat
- UVa has never repeated as champions following an NCAA title season

CLEMENTS SCORES ANOTHER GOAL

- Captain and senior Chris Clements sat out 2010 with a lower extremity injury and in Jan 2011 moved from SSDM to defense and a long pole
- Now Clements plays LSM and in transition scored a goal against VMI
- It was Clements first goal since Feb. 21, 2009 at Stony Brook
- Clements tallied a transition goal against No. 3 Syracuse - his second of the season and fourth of his career

MCWILLIAMS ADDS TO LONG POLE SCORING

- Scott McWilliams scored his first collegiate goal against Cornell
- UVa has scored three goals via the long pole this season
- Chris Clements and McWilliams each have tallied at least one score - becoming the first long pole duo since Mike Timms and Peter Borrer in 2009 to score goals for the Cavaliers

GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER BODES WELL

- This year's senior class has compiled a 27-3 record at Klöckner Stadium during their careers
- Their first loss at Klöckner was to Duke in 2010 prior to the March 24 OT loss to Johns Hopkins. UVa's third loss for the senior class was to Duke on April 13, 2012
- Overall Virginia is 107-18 (.863) all-time at Klöckner (since 1993), including 10-1 in the NCAA Championship
- Two scheduled home games are not included in record for the 2012 seniors - 2010 Stony Brook game played at UHall Turf Field and 2011 Maryland game played at Scott Stadium

WHEN STARSIA HAS A NO. 1 TEAM

- When the USILA coaches poll has a Dom Starsia UVa team ranked No. 1 in the nation, the Cavaliers are 46-11 (.807)

UVA IN M&T BANK STADIUM/INSIDE LACROSSE EVENTS

- Virginia is now 9-2 all-time at M&T Bank Stadium, including winning the 2003 & 2011 NCAA titles and the 2006 ACC title inside the venue
- The losses were to Maryland in the 2005 ACC Tournament and Duke in the 2010 NCAA semifinal round
- UVa's senior class played their fifth and final career game inside M&T Bank Stadium against Cornell - the fifth-years (Briggs, Clements & Lovejoy) were also with the Cavaliers for the 2008 Face-Off Classic against Syracuse
- Virginia is 6-0 all-time in Inside Lacrosse Events
- They are 6-0 in the Face-Off Classic and 2-0 in the Big City Classic
- The Cavaliers will also play in the inaugural Mile High Classic in Denver on April 27

STEELE STANWICK RETURNS HOME TO BALTIMORE

- Senior Steele Stanwick is a native of Baltimore and played his eighth career game in his home town against Cornell on March 10
- In eight contests in the Charm City, Stanwick has tallied 15 goals and 13 assists for 28 points
- Five of those games have been played in M&T Bank Stadium where he is 7-8-15 GAP
- Two were played at Johns Hopkins, down the street from the Stanwick compound, where he was 6-4-10 GAP
- The other Baltimore area game was a 2-1-3 GAP performance at Towson in 2010

BOCKLET AND BRIGGS ENJOY THE NYLON AT M&T BANK STADIUM

- In four career games inside M&T Bank Stadium Colin Briggs has 11 career goals
- 10 of those goals came in his last three games, two in 2011 & this year vs Cornell
- Briggs tallied three goals against Cornell in the 2011 Face-Off Classic and was named game MVP by Inside Lacrosse - he scored twice in this year's meeting
- He scored five more against Maryland in the 2011 NCAA title game and took home Most Outstanding Player honors for the 2011 NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship
- Chris Bocklet has had a few good games inside M&T Bank Stadium as well - scoring nine career goals in five career games
- Bocklet scored four goals against Duke in the 2010 NCAA semifinal game
- He scored three more times against Denver in the 2011 NCAA semifinal game
- Maryland held Bocklet scoreless in the 2011 NCAA title game, snapping his 35-game consecutive goal scoring streak - which was the longest active streak in the nation at that point

BENINCASA AND THE FACEOFF RECORD BOOK

- Senior Ryan Benincasa enters Friday's game with 258 career wins at the faceoff X, needing 8 to pass Brian McDermott (2007-11) for No. 10 all-time at UVa
- Benincasa's 20 faceoff wins against Syracuse on March 4 was only the eighth time a Cavalier has reached at least 20 wins in a game - the 20 wins are tied for seventh best in the UVa record book for a game

2012 CAPTAINS NAMED

- Midfielder Colin Briggs, longstick midfielder Chris Clements, midfielder Matt Kugler and attackman Steele Stanwick have been selected captains this season
- Stanwick and Briggs are first-team preseason All-Americans by Face-Off Yearbook
- Stanwick is a captain for the second year in a row and the first Cavalier to be voted captain in back-to-back seasons since Mike Timms (2008 & 2009)
- In its 83rd lacrosse season, Stanwick is the 23rd Cavalier to be named a captain in more than one season

STANWICK JOINS THE 100/100 CLUB

- Steele Stanwick currently has 117 career goals and 136 career assists, making him the third UVa player in program history to reach the 100/100 club - joining Kevin Pehlke (1990-93) and Danny Glading (2006-09)
- Stanwick reached both milestones with a two goal/three assist performance against Stony Brook (Feb. 25)
- Stanwick is the seventh player in ACC history to join the club, including Duke's Matt Danowski (2004-08), Tony Cullen (1978-80) and Steve Sachs (1966-69), NC State's Marc Resnick (1976-79) and UVa's Pehlke and Glading
- Stanwick is also the 46th player in NCAA history to join the club
- UVa is tied with Air Force and Duke for No. 2 among schools with most members in the 100/100 club - Syracuse leads all with six
- Stanwick played one season with Danny Glading, who finds himself on this list
- In 2009 Danny Glading assisted Stanwick 11 times
- In 2009 Stanwick assisted Glading only once - vs. Duke in ACC Tournament

VIRGINIA PRE-RANKED NO. 1 IN THE NATION

- Virginia is ranked the preseason No. 1 team in the nation by the USILA coaches poll for the second year in a row
- UVa is ranked the preseason No. 1 team in the nation by the Nike/Inside Lacrosse media poll for the first time since the 2009

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 275 weeks
- UVa has been ranked in the Top 10 in 355 polls
- The USILA Poll began in 1973

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Virginia has a 28-game winning streak going back to 2001 in regular-season midweek games
- Virginia has three midweek games scheduled in 2011
- The last time the Cavaliers lost a midweek contest was an 11-8 loss to Notre Dame on March 14, 2001 (a Wednesday)
- Under head coach Dom Starsia, Virginia is 48-2 (.960) in mid-week games since 1993
- After losing his first mid-week game (9-6 to Princeton in 1993), the Cavaliers rattled off 22 wins in a row before that loss to Notre Dame 10 years ago

COCKERTON BROTHERS

- Against Mount St. Mary's both Mark (1 goal) and Matt (1 goal) Cockerton scored goals
- Against VMI both Mark (3 goals) and Matt (2 goals) Cockerton also scored at least one goal
- Mark (3 goals) and Matt (1 goal) Cockerton teamed up against Vermont
- The brothers have scored in the same game now three times in 2011 and five for their careers
- In 2011, Mark's first year at UVa, both scored in the Mount St. Mary's game and the VMI game as well
- The brothers are the sons of Stan Cockerton, who graduated from NC State in 1980 as the NCAA leader in goals scored with 193 - he currently sits No. 3

HOPKINS LOSS OFFERS ALOT OF FIRSTS

- UVa's OT loss to Johns Hopkins on March 24 snapped two streaks that were the longest in the nation
- UVa had a 13-game winning streak and a 14-game winning streak inside Klöckner Stadium, both were tops in the nation at the time of the loss to the Blue Jays
- The setback was the first OT loss by UVa since losing to Syracuse in the 2008 NCAA Semifinal round
- The home OT loss was the first for UVa since losing to Syracuse in 1998 at the UHall Turf Field
- UV had never lost a game in overtime at Klöckner Stadium (est. 1993) until the March 24 loss to Johns Hopkins
- The win for Johns Hopkins was also the first for the Blue Jays inside Klöckner Stadium since 1998

STARSIA HAS COACHED HIS 450TH CAREER GAME

- The Feb. 25 game against Stony Brook was the 450th game for Starsia as a head coach
- Starsia coached his 300th game as the head coach of Virginia on May 30, 2011 - the day UVa won the 2011 NCAA title
- Starsia coached 147 games over 10 years at Brown before coming to Charlottesville

LOW SHOT TOTAL AT DREXEL

- Virginia attempted only 24 shots in its 9-8 triumph at No. 20 Drexel on Saturday
- The 24 shots are the fewest by the Cavaliers in a game since they attempted 21 total shots in a 17-2 road loss at Duke on April 16, 2005
- The 24 shots are the fewest in a UVa win during head coach Dom Starsia's tenure (1993-present)
- The 24 shots are the second-fewest in any UVa game during the Dom Starsia tenure - trailing the 2005 Duke game

Three overtime turnovers by the No. 1 Virginia Cavaliers (8-1) set the table for the No. 2 Johns Hopkins Blue Jays (8-0) to walk out of Klöckner Stadium with the victory, 11-10, in front of 6,899 fans. The UVA loss snapped a 14-game winning streak inside Klöckner Stadium, the longest current streak in the nation. It also broke UVA's 13-game winning streak, which was tops in the nation. UVA's senior class is now 27-2 all-time inside Klöckner Stadium.

Johns Hopkins' John Ranagan's split dodge allowed him to unload the game-winning score with five seconds remaining in the overtime period. The loss was UVA's first in overtime since falling to Syracuse, 12-11, in the 2008 NCAA Semifinal round. The loss was the first overtime loss at home since Syracuse won 18-17 on Feb. 28, 1998.

Virginia started the scoring on a Colin Briggs score via a Rob Emery pass at 10:41 in the first quarter. Emery scored unassisted at 4:24 to give UVA the 2-0 lead in the opening stanza. Mike Poppleton scored unassisted at 4:19 off the ensuing faceoff to cut the Blue Jays' deficit to one goal, 2-1.

Chris Bocklet scored back-to-back goals to give UVA the 4-1 lead with 14:40 left in the second period.

Johns Hopkins made a run in going into the intermission, outscoring UVA 2-1 the rest of the way, as the Cavaliers owned a 5-3 lead at the break. Brandon Benn and Wells Stanwick scored during the spurt.

The Blue Jays started out the second half on a 5-1 streak to take their first lead of the game, 8-6. Back-to-back scores by Rob Guida ended the run with 13:18 left in the fourth quarter.

Nine different Cavaliers scored at least one goal to help No. 1 Virginia (10-1, 2-0 ACC) to a key league road victory over the No. 9 North Carolina Tar Heels (8-4, 1-2 ACC) on Saturday afternoon, in front of 5,138 fans at Fetzer Field. The attendance was the largest crowd to watch a lacrosse game at Fetzer Field since 1991.
