GAME OVERVIEW

• Virginia concludes ACC play on Saturday when the Cavaliers travel to Durham, N.C., to face the Duke Blue Devils. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m.

• This week Virginia is ranked No. 18 in the USILA coaches the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls. Duke is ranked No. 9 in the coaches poll and No. 8 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. DUKE

 Saturday marks the 81st all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Blue Devils, a series in which the Cavaliers own a 49-31 advantage since 1938. The 49 victories are the second most wins UVA has against an opponent in program history, but the Blue Devils have won 16 of the last 17 meetings, including the last eight. Virginia's last win in the series was in the 2010 ACC Tournament.

• Duke head coach John Danowski is in his 11th season at Duke and has won NCAA titles in 2010, 2013 and 2014. The Blue Devils are coming off an 11-8 season with an appearance in the NCAA First Round in 2016.

ONE-GOAL GAMES

• Seven of UVA's 13 games this season have been decided by one goal or less. UVA is 3-4 in those games with two losses in overtime. Three of the six games not decided by one goal or less took place over a four game span between Feb. 18-March 1.



Dox Aitken is No. 2 in the nation among all midfielders with 28 goals. In eight games he broke the Cavalier freshman record for goals by a midfielder.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE BLUE DEVILS

• Virginia leads the all-time series by a 49-31 margin, but Duke has won 16 of the last 17.

• Duke had won eight in a row before losing to UVA in the ACC Tournament on April 23, 2010, serving as the longest series winning streak since winning seven in a row from 1939-50.

• UVA and Duke played three times in 2010. After UVA beat the Blue Devils in the 2010 ACC Tournament, Duke topped the Cavaliers in the 2010 NCAA semifinal round, 14-13, starting a current eight-game winning streak for the Blue Devils.

• The Cavaliers have defeated Duke more than any other team in school history but one (UNC -50).

• No current Cavalier has ever beaten Duke in their careers.

DUKE SHUTS DOWN THE CAVALIER OFFENSE

• Duke has been among the most powerful offenses in the country recently, but it has been the Blue Devil defense that has helped during the streak of 16 wins over last 17 meetings with UVA.

• The Cavaliers reached double figures in 34-of-35 meetings from 1962-98, but have scored 10+ in just 13 of the last 27.

• Virginia reached double digits once during the former eight-game losing streak to Duke (2009 regular season).

• Prior to the regular season loss in 2009, the last time Virginia scored at least 10 goals occurred in a 13-4 win in 2004, which also represented UVA's last victory until a 16-12 triumph on April 23, 2010 in the ACC Tournament in College Park, Md.

TURNER AGAINST DUKE

 Nearly 10 years ago current UVA assistant coach Kip Turner made 20 saves against Duke in a 7-6 overtime loss in Durham, N.C., on April 14, 2017.

THOMPSON TIES FRESHMAN GAME SAVE MARK

With 18 saves against Robert Morris on April 11, freshman goalie Griffin Thompson tied the UVA record for saves in a game by a freshman keeper.
Thompson is the fourth UVA freshman goalie to reach 18 saves in a game, sharing the record with Rodney Rullman, who reached the mark twice in 1972, once against Washington & Lee and again vs. Army in UVA's opening NCAA game. Tillman Johnson also saved 18 shots in a game at Johns Hopkins in four overtimes in 2001.

HOOPER SOLID ON DEFENSE

Defenseman Scott Hooper is No. 3 in the nation with 32 caused turnovers.
His seven CTs against Robert Morris are the most by any player in the nation in a game this season.

• Hooper has three games of five or more CTs (Drexel & UN with five), tying him with Richmond's Brendan Hynes for the most in the nation.

CONRAD AND WILLIAMS ON THE GROUND

• Midfielder Ryan Conrad and attackman Zed Williams are No. 1 and No. 2 on the team with 61 and 47 ground balls, respectively. The duo ranks No. 1 and No. 2 in the nation among non-faceoff sepecialists and defensemen in ground balls.

KRAUS HOT IN ACC PLAY

Attackman Michael Kraus has 15 points on 11 goals and four assists in ACC play.
 The college rookie is averaging five points per ACC contest in 2017, going 4-2-6 at Syracuse, 5-2-7 vs. Notre Dame and 2-0-2 vs. North Carolina.

FIRST YEARS SHINE AT LOYOLA

First years Dox Aitken (four goals) and Michael Kraus (two goals, three assists) led UVA with nine combined points at then-No. 6 Loyola.
The nine combined points is the most by a UVA freshmen duo in a season-opening collegiate debut since Drew McKnight (two goals, four assists) and Jay Jalbert (four goals) combined for 10 points in the 1997 season opener against then-No. 2 Syracuse.

 Aitken's four goals in his collegiate debut makes the freshman the third Cavalier since 1997 to score four goals in a season-opening collegiate debut, joining Jay Jalbert (1997, 4 against Syracuse) and Joe Yevoli (2002, 4 against Drexel).

AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017

• Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.

• It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.

• Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER

• UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.

• Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.

• Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

• UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.

• Currently UVA ranks No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (45.23).

• UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in

ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.

• Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.

• The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

• Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent. • No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.

• UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.

• During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.

• The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.

 According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 30 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.

• UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

OVERTIME GAMES IN 2017

• UVA has played three overtime games in 2017.

• In fact, they all came in a row, marking only the second time in program history such a feat has happened..

• This year UVA has gone to overtime with Cornell (March 11), Notre Dame (March 18) and Johns Hopkins (March 25).

• The only other time UVA has gone to overtime in three straight games was the 1980 NCAA Tournament and UVA beat Cornell in overtime, North Carolina in double overtime, before losing to Johns Hopkins in double overtime.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

• Virginia owns a 131-34 (.7939) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 5-2 mark in 2017. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.

Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

NEAR INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

• Virginia has lost only nine night games at Klöckner Stadium.

• Overall UVA is 39-9 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium. • UVA is 4-2 so far in 2017 under the Klöckner lights.

· Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.

• UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.

• Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights, ironically, also to Duke on April 17, 2010.

• UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.

• Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.

• UVA also lost to North Carolina in 2015, a 7 p.m. start.

• UVA lost its first night game in 2016, an overtime setback (12-11) to High Point.

It was a wild finish at the Ridley Athletic Complex as 13 combined goals were scored in the fourth quarter, but No. 14 Virginia (1-0) outlasted No. 6 Loyola (0-1), 16-15, to open the Lars Tiffany era.

Virginia owned a 10-5 lead with 7:50 left in the third quarter when Zed Williams found Ryan Conrad for a Cavalier goal that capped a 6-0 UVA run. It took 45 seconds for Loyola to begin a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game, 10-10, with 12:57 left in the game.
