FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVa and Drexel are meeting for the 15th time and for the 14th straight season in a series that began in 1947.
- Senior defenseman Davi Sacco walked on to the team in 2012 and played in nine career games before earning his first career start at No. 7 Loyola in the season opener. Sacco earned ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors after limiting Loyola All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello to one goal.
- The last three meetings between UVa and Drexel have been won by a razor-thin margin by the Cavaliers. UVa has won each of the last three meetings by a single goal, including 13-12 in overtime the last time the Dragons came to Charlottesville in 2013.
- Drexel's Deputy of Athletics Nick Gannon is a 1992 graduate of Virginia and was a goalie for the men's lacrosse team. His lone season as a letterwinner was 1992, Jim Adams' last season as head coach of the Cavaliers.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia (1-0) returns to Charlottesville on Saturday for its home opener against the Drexel Dragons (0-0) at Klöckner Stadium. Faceoff is set for 5:30 p.m. UVa is ranked No. 9 in the USILA coaches poll and the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Drexel, opening its season against the Cavaliers, is ranked No. 16 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 18 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll.

THE SERIES VS. DRAGONS

UVa and Drexel are meeting for 15th time in a series that began in 1947. The first meeting may have been in 1947, but the series was put on hiatus until 2002. Since restarting the series, UVa and Drexel are meeting for the 14th-straight season.

Drexel head coach Brian Voelker is in his sixth season in charge of the Dragons, and returns 29 letterwinners and five starters off last year's 13-5 team that reached the NCAA guarterfinal round.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 258-90 (.741) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 348 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVa head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urick and John Danowski who joined the group in
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division **I** institution

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIOUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pénnsylvania.

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVa Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. DREXEL

- Saturday marks the 15th all-time meeting between UVa and Drexel in lacrosse. UVa owns the advantage in the series with a 13-1 record.
- The all-time series with Drexel dates back to 1947, a 7-2 UVa win in Philadelphia, but went on hiatus until 2002.
- The 2015 season marks the 14th year in arrow the Cavaliers and Dragons have met in lacrosse.
- After suffering a surprising loss to Drexel in Charlottesville to open 2007, the Cavaliers got back on the winning track against the Dragons with an 11-7 win in the 2008 season opener.
- UVa's 20-5 win in 2002 was the first meeting with Drexel in more than 50 years.
- The first meeting of the two schools occurred in 1947, Virginia's first season following World War II. The Cavaliers gained a 7-2 victory in Philadelphia. Barry Robertson was high man for UVa with four goals, while goalie Bob Catzen registered 12 saves. Curiously Catzen's 12 saves that afternoon stood as the most by a Cavalier goalie in the series, along with Rob Fortunato (2011), until Dan Marino's 15 in 2013. That mark was topped by Matt Barrett last year when a new standard was set with 16 saves.
- As the No. 1 team in the nation during the 2012 meeting, UVa escaped the City of Brotherly Love with a narrow 9-8 victory as Rob Emery and Owen Van Arsdale each had two goals. Steele Stanwick, playing his first game as the reigning Tewaaraton Trophy winner, was held point-less for only the fourth time in his illustrious UVa career.
- In 2013 Drexel tied the game with 10 seconds left on a Ryan Belka goal. UVa however won the game in overtime, 13-12, when Matt White scored on a Nick O'Reilly pass 11 seconds into the overtime period. It was O'Reilly's sixth assist of the game. With eight points on the day O'Reilly was named the ACC Player of the Week.
- In last year's meeting, UVa used a game-winning goal by Mark Cockerton with 15 seconds left to elevate the Cavaliers over Drexel, 11-10, at Vidas Field in Philadelphia.
- Goalie Matt Barrett made a big save for UVa and the Cavaliers were able to push the ball into transition to setup the game-winning score. Owen Van Arsdale tried to feed Ryan Tucker in front of the crease, but his stick was hit on the pass. Cockerton picked up the ball off the turf and deposited it into the goal from the front of the crease.

VIRGINIA IN SEASON OPENERS

- UVa is now 49-32-1 (.604) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 16-16 (.500) when the season opener is on the road after its win at No. 7 Loyola.
- This was the sixth time in the last 16 seasons the Cavaliers have opened on the road.

UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH

- The 2015 UVa defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.
- At SSDM you have sophomore Will McNamara, who made his collegiate debut at Loyola. Sophomore Carlson Milikin and freshman Jack Falk also ran at SSDM against Loyola.
- Sophomore goalié Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011 UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVa is 23-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 13-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 241 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 241 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means that over the past 22 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 22.8 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVa's dominance are Syracuse at 48 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

Game 1 Virginia 13, Loyola 12 Feb. 7 • Baltimore, Md.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a fivegoal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third guarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.
