FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

• UVa and Richmond are meeting for the first time. The game is the first NCAA contest for the UR men's lacrosse program.

• UVa currently has won 61 games in a row against programs from the Commonwealth of Virginia, dating back to 1977 (loss to Washington & Lee).

 With its win over Lovola on Thursday Virginia has won 13 of its last 14 season openers, losing only to Drexel on the UHall Turf Field in 2007.

• Thursday's home game marks the earliest game in program history by eight days. The previous mark was Feb. 14, 2009 when UVa hosted Drexel. With Saturday's game at UR, UVa will have played two games in 2014 prior to Feb. 14 - the previous earliest start date at UVa.

• UVa has five games in February, which rates as 35.7 percent of its regular season schedule.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia returns to action on Saturday afternoon as the Cavaliers travel to Richmond to face the Spiders in UR's first-ever NCAA Division I contest. Faceoff is set at Robins Stadium for 1 p.m. Richmond is making the move from a club program to a full-fledged NCAA program. UVa owns preseason rankings of No. 7 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 8 in the Warrior/Inside Lacrosse media poll.

THE SERIES VS. SPIDERS

Saturday marks the first meeting between the Cavaliers and Spiders in men's lacrosse. UVa currently owns a 61-game winning streak against programs from the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Dan Chemotti is in his first season as the head coach of Richmond after being the top assistant on Charley Toomey's staff at Loyola, including being part of the Greyhounds' 2012 NCAA title team. This is Chemotti's first season as a head coach.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 21st season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four

NCAA titles and reached the final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 248-84 (.747) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In 22 seasons with Virginia, Starsia has coached 332 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

• Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVa Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE SPIDERS

- Saturday marks the first meeting between Virginia and Richmond in men's lacrosse.
- Saturday also marks the very first NCAA Division I men's lacrosse game for Richmond's program.

UVA VS. THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA

• UVa enters Saturday's contest with Richmond with a 102-19-2 all-time record against opponents from the Commonwealth.

• Virginia has won 61 games in a row against opponents from the Commonwealth of Virginia. The last loss was to Washington & Lee on April 23, 1977 when the Generals were an NCAA Division I institution in men's lacrosse.

• UVa head coach Dom Starsia is 19-0 against teams from the Commonwealth as the head coach at Virginia. As the head coach at Brown he was 1-6 all-time against UVa.

• 2014 marks the first season since 1996 where UVa had two opponents from the Commonwealth of Virginia. This year UVa faces Richmond and VMI, in 1996 the Cavaliers faced VMI and Radford.

VIRGINIA IN SEASON OPENERS

• UVa won its season opener against No. 12 Loyola on Thursday in overtime, 14-13.

- This is the first season in 13 years that Virginia has not opened a season against Drexel.
- UVa is now 48-32-1 (.599) all-time in season openers.

• When the season opener is at home, the Cavaliers have compiled a 28-16-1 (.633) record throughout the years.

• This is the 10th time in the last 15 seasons the Cavaliers have opened at home.

• Virginia has now won 13 of its last 14 season openers, losing only to Drexel on the UHall Turf Field in 2007.

MATT BARRETT MAKES COLLEGIATE DEBUT IN CAGE FOR CAVALIERS

• Against Loyola on Thursday Matt Barrett became only the seventh first-year at UVa to start a seasonopening game in the cage since lacrosse became an NCAA Championship sport in 1971.

• The other Cavalier rookies to start in goal at UVa are Scott Howe (1972), Brian Gregory (1979), Derek Kenney (1999), Tillman Johnson (2001), Adam Ghitelman (2008) and Dan Marino (2013).

• Rodney Rullman also as a first-year started games in 1972, including all three NCAA Tournament contests that led to UVa's first NCAA title. Barrett becomes the eighth first-year to start a game in goal for the Cavaliers.

• Howe, Rullman, Kenney, Johnson and Ghitelman all won NCAA titles during their careers at UVa. Rullman and Kenney did so as first-years, starting the NCAA title game.

• Gregory and Ghitelman lost NCAA semifinal games as first-years and Johnson lost in the first round. Gregory is the only one in the group to not win an NCAA title while on Grounds, while Marino is a sophomore on this current UVa team — which group will Barrett fall into during his UVa career?

- Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent
- No other team in the nation boasts such a streak
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring
- 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.

• According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 13 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport

CLEARING - THE CHRIS LAPIERRE FACTOR - DEBATE

• While no team boasts a streak of four seasons in a row of clearing the ball at a .900 percent clip - the current four-year streak for UVa are also the only four years in Dom Starsia's 21 seasons at Virginia where the Cavaliers have had a season with a .900 percent or better clearing rate.

• The streak coincidently started with the matriculation at Virginia of M Chris LaPierre. The senior has been a one-man clear for the Cavaliers and arguably the nation's top defensive midfielder over the 2010-12 seasons. Begs the question with UVa's current success clearing the ball – is it a coincidence, or is it the Chris LaPierre factor?

• The 2010, 2011 and 2012 seasons also happen to be the only seasons a UVa team has cleared the ball at .900 or better since lacrosse became an NCAA Championship sport in 1971

• The LaPierre Factor becomes a debate because of his limited play in 2013 due to injury that resulted in a medical hardship and yet the Cavaliers are clearing at a .918 rate through 15 games.

• LaPierre is back in 2014 for his final year, where will UVa finish in clears?

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

• UVa is 22-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.

• Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 12-4 in overtime games under Starsia.

• The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.

- Virginia is 13-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.

• Starsia is 13-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

CHRIS LAPIERRE RETURNS TO THE FIELD IN 2014

• On March 20, 2013 Chris LaPierre was shut down for the remainder of the season with a lower extremity injury.

· LaPierre earned a medical hardship after appearing in only three games.

• At the time of LaPierre being shut down on March 20, he was No. 6 in the nation among active players in career ground balls with 209.

• LaPierre currently ranks No. 34 at UVa in career ground balls - He averages 3.9 ground balls per game for his career and in a full 2014 can position himself to finish career in the Top-5 all-time at UVa (271+).

• LaPierre enters 2014 No. 9 among active players in ground balls and No. 1 among non-faceoff specialists.

Game 1 Virginia 14, Loyola 13 - OT Feb. 6 • Charlottesville, Va.

Virginia attackman James Pannell recorded a career-high four goals, including his sudden death score with 2:16 left in the overtime period, lifting the No. 7 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) to a 14-13 season-opening win over the No. 12 Loyola Greyhounds (0-1), at Klöckner Stadium.

The overtime heroics almost didn't come to fruition after UVa squandered an eight-goal lead heading into the fourth quarter. After closing the third period with a 12-4 lead, UVa started the final frame with a man down when Greg Danseglio was tagged for slashing. The extra-man opportunity was just what Loyola needed to jumpstart a run of nine-straight goals, taking a 13-12 advantage. Tyler Albrecht capped the run with a goal with 17.7 second left in regulation.

Mick Parks won the ensuing faceoff for UVa and as time expired Ryan Tucker took a pass from Pannell, and tied the game, 13-13, with one-tenth of a second left. Parks then won the overtime faceoff and UVa managed to get three shots off before Pannell's gamewinner.

Loyola started the game quickly, owning a 2-0 lead at the 11:17 mark in the first period. UVa then rattled off a 4-1 run with three goals by Pannell leading the way. Brian Sherlock scored with 1:00 left in the first period to tie the game, 4-4. Loyola did not score again till the fourth quarter, a span of 31:23 without finding the back of the net.

UVa rattled off eight goals in the second and third period, including three by Mark Cockerton, one each by Tucker, Tyler German, Greg Coholan and Rob Emery. Emery's goal with 1:23 left in the third quarter was UVa's final score until Tucker tied the game at the end of regulation.
