FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

 Saturday marks the 11th all-time meeting between Virginia and Stony Brook in men's lacrosse and the sixth meeting at Stony Brook on Long Island.

• UVa has five players on its roster with roots from Long Island, in addition to head coach Dom Starsia. • UVa owns an active streak of eight seasons in a row of winning its first road game of the year. Three of those times the game was at Stony Brook. Senior Matt White enters the game with 96 career points and needs four to reach 100 career points. Chris LaPierre is the first solo captain at Virginia since 1981 when Steve Kraus was captain for head coach Jim Adams.

GAME OVERVIEW

The Cavaliers (2-0), ranked No. 6 in this week's USILA coaches and Nike/Inside Lacrosse media polls, take to the road for their first game of the season away from Charlottesville. Virginia heads to Long Island to face the Stony Brook Seawolves (1-1) on Saturday, inside Kenneth P. LaValle Stadium. Faceoff is slated for noon and live stats will be available at VirginiaSports.com.

THE SERIES VS. THE SEAWOLVES

The Cavaliers own a 10-0 all-time record against the Seawolves and 2013 is the eighth-straight season the two programs have met in a series that started in 1999. Saturday's contest will be the third time since the 2010 season the Cavaliers have played the Seawolves at LaValle Stadium.

Second-year head coach Jim Nagle brings a 1-1 Seawolves team into Saturday's game, with a loss at Marist last Saturday and a midweek win at Lafayette.

Brody Eastwood leads the Seawolves with six goals, while Cole Millican leads the team with three assists. Jeff Tundo shares the team lead with Eastwood with six points. Dan Shaughnessy owns an 11.50 goals against average and is saving 39.5 percent of shots inside the pipes.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 21st season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four

NCAA titles and reached the final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 242-76 (.761) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In 21 seasons with Virginia, Starsia has coached 318 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

 Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)

Game 1 Virginia 13, Drexel 12 - OT Feb. 16 • Charlottesville, Va.

Eleven seconds into the first overtime period, Virginia's Matt White scored his second career overtime goal off a feed from Nick O'Reilly to give the Cavalier men's lacrosse team (1-0) a 13-12 win over Drexel (0-1) on a blustery afternoon at Klöckner Stadium. White's other overtime goal came against Bucknell in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The win gives UVa its sixth consecutive seasonopening win over the Dragons.

While White scored the game-winner inside the left post, it was set up by an unsettled situation off the faceoff that opened the overtime period. Drexel's Deven Thomas beat Mick Parks on the draw, pulling the ball back toward the Dragons' goal. UVa's Rob Emery beat all players to the ball to set up a transition. Emery found O'Reilly, who quickly found White for the score.

The game started heavily in Virginia's favor. The Cavaliers scored twice before Drexel even shot the ball. Twenty-one seconds into the game Emery scored unassisted, followed by an O'Reilly unassisted goal at 12:25. UVa concluded its 3-0 run with another score by O'Reilly at 4:10 in the first quarter.

Drexel streaked on a 5-1 run, entering the intermission with a 5-4 advantage. Five different Dragons scored and Ben McIntosh capped the run with his goal with eight seconds left in the first half.

The scoring in the second half was slow to start. Until Matt Cockerton grabbed a carom off Drexel goalie Will Gabrieslson and deposited at 8:54, no ball ripped nylon in the second half. Cockerton's goal tied the game at 5-5. Pat Harbeson followed up with a goal about a minute later to give UVa a 6-5 lead, but was flagged after the goal for unsportsmanlike conduct. The penalty was a full-time served penalty with no ensuing faceoff. Andrew Vivian quickly tied the game as a result, 6-6, with 7:42 left.

Vivian's goal was part of a 3-1 Drexel run that gave the Dragons an 8-7 lead with 2:00 minutes to play in the third quarter. Virginia responded with a 4-1 run of its own that included goals by Bobby Hill, Parks and White. Owen Van Arsdale added a man-down score of his own, the first UVa man-down score since the 2011 season. White's third goal of the game capped the run with 5:15 left to play, as UVa held a narrow 11-9 lead.

Drexel scored the next two via Aaron Prosser and Frank Fusco, tying the game, 11-11, with 1:23 left to play.

Thomas won the ensuing faceoff, but Scott McWilliams stripped Garrett McIntosh, giving UVa the ball back. Charlie Streep scored his first career Virginia goal with 49 seconds left, giving UVa the narrow 12-11 lead. Drexel won the next faceoff and Robert Chruch's shot was blocked out front, Belka beat UVa goalie Dan Marino to the ball in front of the crease, quickly depositing the ball in the goal with eight second remaining, setting up the winner-take-all scenario.

Mark Cockerton scored a career-high six goals and the Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) cruised to an 18-4 triumph over the visiting VMI Keydets (0-3) at Klöckner Stadium. The win is UVa's 30th-straight midweek win, dating back to 2001.

VMI started the scoring after Bernie Mowbray scored a man-up goal at 13:07, via an Eric Groleau pass. UVa was man-down after Tanner Ottenbreit was charged with tripping.

After the early VMI goal, it was all Virginia. The Cavaliers held the Keydets scoreless for the next 44:08. When VMI scored its next goal at 13:59 in the fourth quarter, UVa had already reeled off 15-straight goals, including Cockerton's six.

Nick O'Reilly and Cockerton took turns scoring the first four goals, finishing the early spurt with two apiece. Then Rob Emery and Cockerton traded goals twice to take the 8-1 advantage. After another Cockerton goal, Owen Van Arsdale scored twice to conclude the first half scoring. UVa entered the intermission with an 11-1 lead.

UVa scored four goals, while VMI tallied zero in the third quarter. In mop up time in the final stanza, the Keydets hit the nylon three times. UVa tallied three goals as well in the fourth quarter, including the game's final two goals to cap off the victory. O'Reilly added three goals and one assist, while James Pannell led UVa with three helpers. Nine Cavaliers scored goals against VMI, including the first career goals by Matt Florence and Greg Coholan.

Virginia won the shots battle (64-25), ground balls (57-43), faceoffs (14-12) and had 20 fewer turnovers (12-32). VMI goalie Matt Lindemann had 24 saves.
