OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia opens ACC play on Saturday at the Carrier Dome against the Syracuse Orange. Faceoff is set for 12 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 10 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 13 in the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media poll. Syracuse is No. 14 this week in the coaches poll and No. 12 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE ORANGE

- The Cavaliers and Orange are meeting for the 36th time in series history, but are playing each other for only the sixth time as part of ACC play. Virginia has won nine of the last 16 regular-season meetings, but four of the last seven losses have come at the Carrier Dome (2011, 2013, 2015, 2017).
- UVA and Syracuse won four combined NCAA titles between 2006-11.

BURKINSHAW SHINES IN DEBUT

- GK Patrick Burkinshaw made his collegiate debut at then-No. 19 Princeton. He started and with 24 saves set a UVA freshman goalie record, a UVA first career goalie start record, a Class of 1952 Stadium record and is tied for the most single-game saves in the nation this year.

UVA SWEEPS ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Virginia men's lacrosse players Patrick Burkinshaw and Ian Laviano swept the ACC Player of the Week honors on Feb 25.
- Laviano led UVA with eight goals on the week, including the overtime game-winner at Princeton. Burkinshaw made 24 saves against the Tigers in his collegiate debut.



GK Patrick Burkinshaw set a UVA freshman goalie record with 24 saves in his collegiate debut at then-No. 19 Princeton last time out. The 24 saves are also a UVA record for a goalie making his first career start.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. SYRACUSE

- Syracuse leads the series, 18-17, which mimics the back-and-forth scoring characteristic of the games between the two teams.
- Not only does Syracuse lead the series by one game, but also has scored one more goal than UVA when you combine all the games, 452-451. The last four games in the series have been decided by one goal, three of which have been won by Syracuse.
- The two schools battled only three times between 1938-93, but have met at least once each season since 1994.
- The regular-season series began in 1995.
- The two schools have also met six times in the NCAA Tournament since 1995.
- Last season was the first time UVA and Syracuse met in the ACC Tournament, an 11-10 win for UVA in the semifinals.
- Virginia has won 10 of the last 17 meetings in the series, including six straight regular-season match-ups until a 2011 setback at the Carrier Dome.
- The Orange won in overtime, 9-8, in the 2003 at the Dome. It was the first time in the series that neither team scored in the double figures.
- Another heartbreaking UVA loss saw the Orange pull out a dramatic come-from-behind 12-11 double overtime win in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Tournament on the way to capturing the national championship.
- The 2008 Syracuse NCAA win ended Virginia's five-game series winning streak, the longest by either team in the series.
- Both teams are known for their high-scoring offenses, but it is interesting to note that since 1999 Syracuse has scored at least 15 goals only five times (2002-03-04-06-15) and Virginia four (03-06-06-14) in the series.
- Virginia's loss in 2011 snapped a three game win streak in the "Dome" over Syracuse, a feat boasted by no other opponent of the Orange.
- The 2014 meeting at Klöckner Stadium between UVA and Syracuse, James Pannell scored a career-high seven goals in a 17-12 UVA triumph.
- The Orange in 2016 and 2017 have come out on top, 14-13, over the Cavaliers. Syracuse's win at Klöckner Stadium in 2016 snapped UVA's four-game winning streak in Charlottesville.

TIGHT GAMES CHARACTERIZE SERIES

- The potential for a high-scoring game such as the classic 1997 match-up won by Syracuse, 22-21, is one of the main reasons this game is so widely anticipated.
- However, since 1996 a three-goal win can be considered a "blow out"
- 20 of the last 28 games since then have been decided by just one or two goals.
- More than half the games between the two schools (22 of 35), have been decided by one or two goals, including both games in 2008, which went to overtime.
- In the history of the series, the biggest win by either team is a 13-4 Syracuse win in 1938 in the first meeting between the two squads.
- Virginia's biggest win is a 15-7 victory in the Carrier Dome in 1995.
- UVA's 14-10 win in 2012 was the largest winning-margin for the Cavaliers in the series since winning 17-10 in the 2006 Final Four.
- UVA's 2014 win was a five-goal margin, 17-12, at Klöckner Stadium.
- Syracuse's 2015 win was a six-goal margin, 15-9, at the Dome, its largest win in the series since winning 18-12 in Charlottesville in 2004.

NO WONDER THE SERIES IS NEARLY 50/50

- Since 1994, the two teams have met 32 times—with Syracuse winning 17 times and Virginia 15.
- 21 of those games have been decided by one or two goals, including a string of five meetings - both games in 2008 went to overtime - until UVA's four-goal win in 2012 in Charlottesville snapped the streak.

LARS TIFFANY AND THE CARRIER DOME

- Lars Tiffany hails from LaFayette, N.Y., and attended LaFayette High School, which is roughly 10 miles from the Carrier Dome.
- The 2017 meeting between UVA and Syracuse was the first time Tiffany was on the sidelines of the Carrier Dome since his final game as a student-athlete at Brown in 1990, when the Bears fell to the Orange, 20-12, in the NCAA Quarterfinals. The 1990 season also served as the Gait brothers' final season with the Orange.

DOX AITKEN SETS ANOTHER UVA RECORD

- M Dox Aitken reached 100 career points (75-25-100) on Feb. 18 vs. High Point. He is the quickest midfielder in UVA history to the milestone, reaching so in 36 games.
- Aitken broke the previous record of 39 games by Pete Eldredge (1969-72).

UVA LOOKING FOR BACK-TO-BACK ROAD RANKED WINS

- UVA plays at No. 14 Syracuse on Saturday. With a win last time out at then-No. 19 Princeton (12-11, OT), UVA is looking to win back-to-back road games against ranked opponents for the first time since 2012.
- In a seven-day span in 2012, UVA won at then-No. 9 Maryland (12-8) on March 31, followed by a win at then-No. 9 UNC (15-10) on April 7.

UVA HAS NO EASY OUTS TO BEGIN THE 2019 SEASON

- Of UVA's first 12 opponents of the 2019 season, 10 have been ranked so far this season.
- This week eight of those opponents are currently ranked. UVA's win over then-No. 19 Princeton knocked the Tigers from the polls. UVA also played previously ranked Lehigh, who has dropped three games in a row after losing their top two goal scorers to injury.
- UVA's first five games of 2019 feature an opponent currently ranked, or previously ranked in the polls in 2019.
- Of UVA's first 12 games, only Brown and Utah have not been ranked at some point this season.

UVA ROCKING THE ASSISTS

- UVA has scored 45 goals through four games this year and have assisted 31 of them. That means UVA has recorded an assist on 68.9 percent of its goals in 2019.

AITKEN CLIMBS UVA MIDFIELDER SCORING LISTS

- Midfielder Dox Aitken (77) needs one goal to pass Ryan Tucker (77) for sole possession of No. 8 all-time at UVA for career goals among midfielders.
- With 77 career goals, Aitken has reached the 70-goal mark quicker than any other midfielder in UVA history.
- Aitken needs one point to pass Scott Gerham (102) for No. 9 in career midfielder points at UVA. Four points will move him to a tie for No. 8 with Greg Traynor (106).
- Aitken is only the second Cavalier midfielder to reach his 100th career point as a third year, joining Shamel Bratton.
- Bratton reached his 100th career point in career game No. 53, while Aitken is the quickest UVA midfielder to 100 points, doing so in 36 career games. Pete Eldredge (1969-72) was the previous record holder reaching 100 career points as a fourth year in career game 39.

The No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers fell in the season opener against the No. 4 Loyola Greyhounds, 17-9, at the Ridley Athletic Complex.

The Greyhounds' goalie Jacob Stover was hot between the pipes, saving 18 shots by the Cavaliers. UVA opened the game with an extra-man goal by junior Dox Aitken 48 seconds into the game on a Michael Kraus helper. Loyola outscored UVA 8-3 the rest of the first half to take a four-point lead into the intermission, 8-4.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA was leading 1-0 when a 3-0 Loyola run gave the Greyhounds the lead for good, 3-1. Two goals by Loyola's Pat Spencer sparked a five-goal first quarter for LU.

After being outshot in the first quarter, 15-6, the Cavaliers managed 13 shots in the second quarter but only managed one goal as Stover made six saves in the second quarter.

Stover made seven saves in the third quarter as the Greyhounds started to pull away from UVA. Loyola picked up 11 ground balls in the fourth quarter and outscored UVA 5-2 in the final frame to solidify the win. Spencer and Kevin Lindley each scored five goals in the winning effort for Loyola, while Spencer also added two assists.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"Fantastic overall effort from the entire Loyola team. It would be easy to focus on a Herculean effort by their goalie, Jacob Stover, and certainly look at potentially the nation's best player in Pat Spencer and what those two did, but that would take away from the entire team effort that we encountered. It was a heck of a team effort by Loyola on both sides of the field. We tried to hold our slides on defense and they made us pay for that. When we did slide and double the ball, they seemed to find openings. It was one of those frustrating days as defensive coordinator trying to figure out the magic formula and there wasn't one. It is easier to learn from the sting of a loss and we have the opportunity to learn from this loss. I love this team." – Lars Tiffany.

The No. 11 Virginia Cavaliers used an 8-2 run to overcome an early deficit and dispose of the Lehigh Mountain Hawks, 11-8, at Klöckner Stadium. The game which was originally scheduled for Saturday was moved up a day due to a forecast for inclement weather in the Charlottesville area.

Cavalier goalie Alex Rode made three key saves in the third quarter, two of which came in man-down situations. The saves aided Virginia in holding Lehigh scoreless for 19:57 from the second quarter until the fourth quarter.

HOW IT HAPPENED

For the second week in a row UVA scored first, but then found itself in a hole. With a 2-0 lead over the Mountain Hawks, Lehigh responded by scoring five goals in a row to take a 5-2 lead at 7:42 in the second quarter.

Lehigh owned a two-goal lead, 6-4, at halftime. UVA, who handed Lehigh three extra-man goals in the first half on four penalties, settled in nicely. Dox Aitken scored a big goal to lead the third-quarter scoring. Michael Kraus scored back-to-back goals to give UVA the lead for good.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"We had a couple man down stops in the third quarter and those two stops were big. Rode made a couple nice saves that could have been big momentum goals for Lehigh. From there we just got smarter about what we were doing physically. We're a physical team, we put some people on the ground after they take shots and we want to get after it in the ride. We take a lot of pride in our riding here and we had another good game in that phase. You have to put a lot of pressure on the ball and sometimes we do foul. Michael Kraus right here at the midline got that hold and I can't get upset with Michael because we're asking him to be relentless. We tell our attackmen that they are the defensive frontline of a football team, you got to get pressure. If we can get pressure with three or four rushing the passer then we don't have to implement a 10-man [ride] and we can cause turnovers, which we saw tonight. But it starts with our defensive line, they have to pressure. We tell them you don't have to make the sack, just force a bad pass or an interception because our safeties, our middies, they're ready to jump on errant passes." – Lars Tiffany

A fourth-quarter surge by No. 13 High Point lifted the Panthers over the No. 12 Virginia Cavaliers, 14-13, at Klöckner Stadium. UVA entered the final period with a 12-11 lead before High Point reeled off three-straight goals to take a 14-12 lead with 2:02 left to play.

Jeff Conner brought UVA to within one goal, 14-13, with 1:04 left to play. HPU won the ensuing faceoff and tried to kill the clock. UVA goalie Alex Rode forced a turnover and the Cavaliers had a chance for one more play. UVA attackman Matt Moore unleashed a shot with a couple seconds left, but High Point goalie Tim Troutner made his 17th save of the game to end the HPU win. The win for the Panthers is their second this season against an ACC team. They won at then-No. 2 Duke on Feb 6, 13-9.

HOW IT HAPPENED

For the third game in a row UVA scored first, but then found itself in a hole. With a 3-0 lead over the Panthers, HPU responded by scoring five goals in a row to take a 5-3 lead at 9:10 in the second quarter.

Michael Kraus found Ian Laviano 1:02 into overtime and the No. 12 Virginia Cavaliers escaped New Jersey with a 12-11 triumph over the No. 19 Princeton Tigers at Class of 1952 Stadium.

UVA goalie Patrick Burkinshaw made his first collegiate start and collegiate debut against the Tigers. He was stingy in the goal, saving 24 shots. The 24 saves set a UVA freshman goalie record, a UVA first career goalie start record, a Class of 1952 Stadium record and is tied for the most single-game saves in the nation this year. Burkinshaw made six fourth-quarter saves, but no was bigger than the clutch save he made with 32 seconds left in regulation on a Charlie Durbin missile from 10 yards out. Durbin had already found nylon four times on the afternoon.

HOW IT HAPPENED

With Princeton leading 11-10 with 6:55 left in regulation, the UVA defense held firm and kept the Tigers scoreless for the game's final 7:57, including overtime. Ryan Conrad scored an unassisted goal at 4:01 in the fourth quarter to tie the game, 11-11.

The Cavaliers also overcame a two-goal deficit early in the third quarter, 7-5 and 9-7. A Laviano goal at the end of the third quarter, followed by a Kraus goal at the start of the fourth tied the game at 9-9. It was one of seven ties in the game.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"At UVA we believe in creating a culture of competition and you have to earn your playing time all year, not just in the Fall or in pre-season. We are not going to create a starting lineup game number one and stick with it. We believe that creates better intensity in practice and continually promotes each man's moment and what we saw today was positive output of that process. In practice we have seen Patrick Burkinshaw emerge and we let the goalies know on Thursday Patrick earned the start. What a performance by Patrick in his first career start.
