OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia welcomes the High Point Panthers to Klöckner Stadium on Monday. Faceoff is set for 4 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 12 in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls. High Point is No. 13 in the coaches poll and No. 11 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE PANTHERS

- Monday night Virginia and High Point meet for the fourth time, a series that UVA leads, 2-1.
- UVA holds a 34-2 all-time advantage over current teams from the Southern Conference.
- Jon Torpey is in his seventh season as the Panthers' head coach, their only one in program history. The Panthers first season of playing lacrosse was the 2013 season. Torpey welcomes back 24 letterwinners from last year's 6-8 team. High Point won the SoCon in 2015 and made its first NCAA Tournament appearance.

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Since 1993 UVA is 64-3 all-time in mid-week games.
- The losses came to Princeton in 1993, Notre Dame in 2001 and High Point in 2016.
- UVA has two games on its schedule in 2019 that don't fall on either a Friday, Saturday or Sunday. The other game is against VMI on Tues., April 16.



Michael Kraus scored four goals and dished out one assist last time out against Lehigh. He scored his five points during an 8-2 UVA run that started as the Cavaliers trailed 5-2.

UVA was No. 1 in the nation in 2018 with 684 ground balls. UVA has led the nation in GBs 5 of last 10 years.

Dox Aitken (73) is tied for No. 10 all-time at UVA in career goals among midfielders with Rob Emery (2011-14).

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. HIGH POINT AND THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

- Monday marks the fourth meeting in the all-time series with High Point. UVA leads the series, 2-1. HPU won the first meeting in the series in 2016, a 12-11 win in overtime win at Klöckner Stadium.
- Zed Williams scored five goals in the final 25:10 of the game to force overtime. UVA trailed 10-5 until Williams scored his first goal with 5:10 left in the third quarter. That Williams goal started a 4-0 UVA run that cut the deficit to one goal, 10-9. Williams scored the first three in that spurt. After High Point scored with 4:41 left to increase its lead to two goals, 11-9, Williams put UVA on his back and scored twice with under a minute left to force overtime. High Point's Dan Lomas scored the game-winning 27 seconds into the extra frame to clinch the upset for the Panthers.
- Virginia bounced back in 2017 and beat High Point at Klöckner Stadium, 18-12. Dox Aitken scored five goals, while Michael Kraus dished out five assists and scored two goals in the win.
- UVA beat HPU again in 2018 by six goals, 18-12. It was UVA's first trip in the series to High Point. After trailing 5-2 early, UVA surged back to tie High Point 9-9 at the half. UVA outscored HPU 9-3 in the second half to pick up the win. Kraus had seven points again, but this time on five goals and two assists. Ian Laviano tallied four goals and Dox Aitken scored three. Mikey Herring dished out four assists.
- The Southern Conference is in its fifth season as a men's lacrosse conference.
- Virginia is 34-2 all-time against current members of the Southern Conference.
- Virginia is 0-1 against Air Force, 3-0 against Bellarmine, 2-1 against High Point, 5-0 against Richmond and 24-0 against VMI.
- There are three Southern Conference opponents UVA has never played: Furman, Jacksonville and Mercer.
- All three of those programs started playing lacrosse in the last eight years: Jacksonville (2010), Mercer (2011) and Furman (2014).
- The conference as a whole is very young in lacrosse. Richmond began in 2014 and High Point began in 2013. The old guard in the league are Air Force, who began playing lacrosse in 1967, and VMI, who started in 1983.
- By comparison, UVA started its first varsity lacrosse season in 1904.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 138-38 (.7840) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 1-0 mark in 2019. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 12-6 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

UVA ROCKING THE ASSISTS

- UVA has scored 20 goals through two games this year and have assisted 15 of them. That means UVA has recorded an assist on 75 percent of its goals in 2019.

DEFENSE FORCES TURNOVERS VS LEHIGH

- Lehigh had 22 turnovers against the Cavaliers on Feb. 15. UVA caused 12 of those turnovers.
- Of UVA's 12 turnovers, nine came from the starting defense: D Kyle Kology (3), D Cade Saustad (2), D Logan Greco (2) and LSM Jared Conners (2) led the way.

AITKEN CLIMBS UVA MIDFIELDER SCORING LISTS

- Midfielder Dox Aitken (73) needs one goal to pass Rob Emery (73) for sole possession of No. 10 all-time at UVA for career goals among midfielders.
- With 73 career goals, Aitken has reached the 70-goal mark quicker than any other midfielder in UVA history.
- Aitken needs three points to enter the Top 10 in career midfielder points at UVA, tying Ryan Tucker (101).
- Two points will make Aitken only the 11th midfielder at UVA to record at least 100 career points.
- Aitken is poised to become only the second Cavalier midfielder to reach his 100th career point as a third year, joining Shamel Bratton.
- Bratton reached his 100th career point in career game No. 53, while Aitken is six shy through 34 career games.

KRAUS HAS A POINT IN 34-STRAIGHT GAMES

- Michael Kraus has a point in all 34 games of his career, which ranks tied for No. 4 among active players

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 281 weeks all-time.
- UVA has been ranked in the Top 10 in 421 polls all-time.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973.

TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.
- Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls five of the last 10 years.
- In 2018, UVA ranked No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (38.00).
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game nine times over the last 10 seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

The No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers fell in the season opener against the No. 4 Loyola Greyhounds, 17-9, at the Ridley Athletic Complex.

The Greyhounds' goalie Jacob Stover was hot between the pipes, saving 18 shots by the Cavaliers. UVA opened the game with an extra-man goal by junior Dox Aitken 48 seconds into the game on a Michael Kraus helper. Loyola outscored UVA 8-3 the rest of the first half to take a four-point lead into the intermission, 8-4.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA was leading 1-0 when a 3-0 Loyola run gave the Greyhounds the lead for good, 3-1. Two goals by Loyola's Pat Spencer sparked a five-goal first quarter for LU.

After being outshot in the first quarter, 15-6, the Cavaliers managed 13 shots in the second quarter but only managed one goal as Stover made six saves in the second quarter.

Stover made seven saves in the third quarter as the Greyhounds started to pull away from UVA. Loyola picked up 11 ground balls in the fourth quarter and outscored UVA 5-2 in the final frame to solidify the win.

Spencer and Kevin Lindley each scored five goals in the winning effort for Loyola, while Spencer also added two assists.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"Fantastic overall effort from the entire Loyola team. It would be easy to focus on a Herculean effort by their goalie, Jacob Stover, and certainly look at potentially the nation's best player in Pat Spencer and what those two did, but that would take away from the entire team effort that we encountered. It was a heck of a team effort by Loyola on both sides of the field. We tried to hold our slides on defense and they made us pay for that. When we did slide and double the ball, they seemed to find openings. It was one of those frustrating days as defensive coordinator trying to figure out the magic formula and there wasn't one. It is easier to learn from the sting of a loss and we have the opportunity to learn from this loss. I love this team." – Lars Tiffany.

The No. 11 Virginia Cavaliers used an 8-2 run to overcome an early deficit and dispose of the Lehigh Mountain Hawks, 11-8, at Klöckner Stadium. The game which was originally scheduled for Saturday was moved up a day due to a forecast for inclement weather in the Charlottesville area.

Cavalier goalie Alex Rode made three key saves in the third quarter, two of which came in man-down situations. The saves aided Virginia in holding Lehigh scoreless for 19:57 from the second quarter until the fourth quarter.

HOW IT HAPPENED

For the second week in a row UVA scored first, but then found itself in a hole. With a 2-0 lead over the Mountain Hawks, Lehigh responded by scoring five goals in a row to take a 5-2 lead at 7:42 in the second quarter.

Lehigh owned a two-goal lead, 6-4, at halftime. UVA, who handed Lehigh three extra-man goals in the first half on four penalties, settled in nicely. Dox Aitken scored a big goal to lead the third-quarter scoring. Michael Kraus scored back-to-back goals to give UVA the lead for good.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

"We had a couple man down stops in the third quarter and those two stops were big. Rode made a couple nice saves that could have been big momentum goals for Lehigh. From there we just got smarter about what we were doing physically. We're a physical team, we put some people on the ground after they take shots and we want to get after it in the ride. We take a lot of pride in our riding here and we had another good game in that phase. You have to put a lot of pressure on the ball and sometimes we do foul. Michael Kraus right here at the midline got that hold and I can't get upset with Michael because we're asking him to be relentless. We tell our attackmen that they are the defensive frontline of a football team, you got to get pressure. If we can get pressure with three or four rushing the passer then we don't have to implement a 10-man [ride] and we can cause turnovers, which we saw tonight. But it starts with our defensive line, they have to pressure. We tell them you don't have to make the sack, just force a bad pass or an interception because our safeties, our middies, they're ready to jump on errant passes." - Lars Tiffany
