2010-11 SEASON OUTLOOK

TEAM

Virginia returns eight former NCAA qualifiers, including 2010 redshirts Nick Nelson and Jedd Moore, for the 2010-11 season. After winning the program's first ACC championship since 1977 and earning a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championships (second best in program history), the Cavaliers return plenty of firepower as they look to defend their league crown.

The Cavaliers' goals this year are simple: repeat as ACC champions and pick up even more hardware at NCAAs.

Virginia also brings in a stellar freshman class, which adds depth and puts plenty of pressure on the incumbents at each weight class.

125 POUNDS

The frontrunner for the starting spot 125 pounds is third year Matt Snyder, who went 27-16 in his first season as a Cavalier. To help the team, Snyder shifted from 125 to 133 for the second half of last season and, despite being undersized, nearly earned an NCAA bid.

He dropped a 2-1 decision in the championship match of the ACC Championships to two-time All-American Steve Bell of Maryland. Snyder is a very funky wrestler that consistently poses a matchup problem for his foes. Snyder, who transferred from Bloomsburg University last year, racked up a 27-16 record his first full year in Charlottesville. He is tough on top and likely will rank among the team leaders in pins this year.

Snyder will be challenged by second year Gabe Gomez, a former two-time state champion from Bloomfield, Colo., who redshirted last season. Gomez stayed in Charlottesville all summer to train, which should pay dividends this season.

133 POUNDS

Virginia returns only one wrestler at this weight class, sophomore Matt Cubillos, who started at 133 for the first half of the season last year. He took some lumps because of a very tough schedule but made some major strides over the summer. Much like the rest of the roster, Cubillos made the decision to stay at UVa this summer and train. He should be much improved this year.

Cubillos will be pushed by a pair of talented freshmen – Joe Spisak, a state champion and two-time state finalist in Pennsylvania, and Gus Sako, a two-time Ohio state champion.

Spisak is very good on top, while his biggest strength on his feet is his scrambling ability. He is physically gifted and recently benched press 260 pounds and will look to improve on his technical skills.

Sako, from national powerhouse St. Edward High School, also is very tough on top and has great technique but will have to develop quickly from the bottom position.

Bryan Whitt, a five-time Virginia state champion, is one of the most decorated high school wrestlers ever to come out of the Commonwealth of Virginia. He will add depth and continue to push the Cubillos, Spisak and Sako for a starting spot.

141 POUNDS

2009 NCAA qualifier Nick Nelson returns to the lineup after a redshirt year in 2010. Nelson was an ACC runner up as a freshman and reached the NCAA round of 12 in 2009, narrowly missing All-America honors after upsetting the No. 2 seed at NCAAs. One of the most vocal leaders in the Cavaliers' wrestling room, Nelson is ranked among the top 20 nationally in the preseason and has All-America aspirations.

Freshman Tanner Hirstine will back up Nelson at 141. Hirstine was a 2010 Colorado state champion who shows great promise for the future.

149 POUNDS

The 149-pound class will be an interesting weight class for the Cavaliers this season. Derek Valenti moves up from 141 and looks to be the front runner for the spot but has plenty of talented teammates pushing him. Valenti earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Championships last year at 141. He is extremely talented from the top position and went 25-10 last



season, including a 1-2 mark at NCAAs but will be looking for much better results this season.

Dave Ebbott started five matches last year, going 3-2 over that span. He put a run together last season where he pinned three opponents in a row (Princeton, Duke and NC State). Ebbott has a motor that never stops but needs to continue to improve his technique to stay a consistent starter this season.

Nicky Gordon redshirted last season and will be moving up to 149 this year. Garland said Gordon is as gifted a wrestler as the Cavaliers have in their room, packed with fast twitch muscles, speed and skill.

Sam MacGregor came in as a walk on but has become one of the favorite wrestlers on the team. He is a coaching staff favorite because he loves wrestling, loves being in the room and is a hard worker.

157 POUNDS

NCAA qualifier Shawn Harris will move up a weight class this season. Harris took second in the ACC last season and will be looking for even more this season. Harris went 20-14 last year; his biggest win came when he bumped up a weight class to 157 and beat then-No. 5 Thomas Scotton from North Carolina.

Dan Clarke also will be looking to make his way into the lineup. A former high school All American, Clarke is very good from the top position but will need to make an effort to open up more with his offense to beat the top guys. He is very talented, has been battle tested in the past and could be a force in the lineup in the near future.

165 POUNDS

Jedd Moore returns to the UVa lineup after sitting out last season with a foot injury. The former two-time Ohio state champion burst onto the scene as a freshman and won 30 matches while earning a bid to the NCAA Championships. His biggest win came against two-time All-American and eventual NCAA runner-up Dan Vallimont of Penn State. Moore, whose nickname is "machine," is explosive, hard nosed and never stops pushing the action.

Freshman Conner Miller also will be looking to crack the starting lineup. Miller is a former state champion from Virginia (Fauquier HS). He has tremendous upside and the coaches expect him to improve a great deal this year while training with the Cavaliers.

174 POUNDS

Two-time All-American Chris Henrich will be looking to bring home the first NCAA title in Virginia history this season. In his junior season Henrich came very close to earning that title before settling for third place. Henrich went 35-3 last season and, with 101 career wins, needs just 16 more victories to become the winningest wrestler in Virginia history. His summer training included trips to Missouri and Colorado Springs to workout with some of the best wrestlers in the country.

The Cavaliers also have two extremely talented freshmen at this weight class as well. Billy Coggins is a state champ from Rocky Point, N.Y. that will be a staple in the program for years to come. Garland said that on top of being very physically gifted, Coggins boasts some of the best technique he has seen in a wrestler his age and has picked up the college game quickly as well.

Nick Sulzer was one of the top ranked recruits nationally at any weight class last year. He led his St. Edward High School team to an Ohio state championship and was the 2010 Ohio state champ at 160 pounds, which helped him earn Most Outstanding Wrestler honors at the state championship. He has great physical tools and the coaching staff is very high on him. He also will be a key player in the Cavaliers' lineup for several years to come.

184 POUNDS

Jon Fausey will come off his redshirt season to compete this year. Fausey was the No. 2-ranked 189-pounder coming out of high school and competed very well in open tournament competition last year. He earned All-America honors in the offseason after placing fourth at the University National Championships in Akron, Ohio, where he defeated highly touted Penn State wrestler Eddie Ruth along the way. He also trained at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs this summer.

Also competing at 184 this season will be sophomore Stephen Doty, a former state champion from Missouri. Very quiet and unassuming, Doty boasts toughness on the mat, both mentally and physically. He made some spot starts last season at 174 behind Chris Henrich but put on a lot of muscle over the summer and will be moving up a weight class.

197 POUNDS

Reigning ACC Champion and NCAA qualifier Mike Salopek will move up to 197 pounds this season. At 6-feet-3 Salopek is arguably the best pure athlete on the team, but he also is very mentally tough. He is affectionately referred to as "pipe bomb" in the Cavaliers' wrestling room because when he mat returns an opponent it looks like an explosion. Salopek went 28-10 last year during his redshirt freshman season.

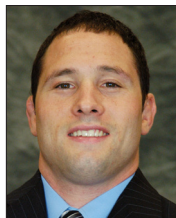
HEAVYWEIGHT

Fifth-year senior Jack Danilkowicz returns for his final season in Charlottesville at this weight class. Danilkowicz graduated last year from the McIntire School of Commerce and is now pursuing a Master's degree in higher education (with an emphasis on leadership). Danilkowicz has taken more of an active role as a vocal leader within the program this year. Last season he defeated two very tough opponents to take third at the ACC tournament, which qualified him for the NCAA Championships. At the NCAA tournament he went 1-2 and gained invaluable experience which has pushed him to make the commitment to come back for his last year of eligibility.

Freshman Derek Papagianopoulos joins the heavyweight mix this season. He was a top 10 nationally ranked heavyweight coming out of Massachusetts and was a three-time Massachusetts state champ and a two-time Northeast champion as well. He also was a two time Junior National All-American. Papagianopoulos is a tough, powerful kid with plenty of room for growth.

Fifth-Year Head Coach

STEVE GARLAND



Former Cavalier All-American Steve Garland is serving in his fifth season as head wrestling coach at Virginia. A master motivator, recruiter and coach, Garland has worked diligently to push the Cavaliers among the nation's elite.

The results of Garland's perseverance are evident. In 2010 Garland was named the ACC Coach of the Year as Virginia won the program's first ACC Championship since 1977 before earning a 15th-place finish

at the NCAA Championship, UVa's second-best finish at the national championships.

In Garland's first four seasons at Virginia, the Cavaliers have won eight ACC individual titles while qualifying 20 to the NCAA Championships. Chris Henrich became Virginia's first two-time All-American in 2010 when he took third place at 174 pounds. Henrich was part of UVa's strong 2007 recruiting class, which was ranked No. 5 nationally by W.I.N. Magazine and No. 8 by InterMat. Garland has brought in five straight Top-25 recruiting classes, including the 2009 class, which was ranked as high as No. 6 nationally.

Virginia is coming off a memorable 2010 season in which the Cavaliers won the ACC title and took 15th at the NCAA Championships. A school-record eight Cavaliers qualified for the NCAA event. At the ACC Championships, Henrich and freshman Mike Salopek won individual championships but the championship was a total team effort. All 10 competing Cavaliers reached the semifinal round and posted finishes of fourth place or better. Henrich finished 35-3, while Brent Jones earned the Gorrarian Trophy at the NCAA Championships. As a team, Virginia went 16-6 in dual meets, including a 3-2 mark in ACC bouts, and earned a program-best national ranking of No. 16 in January.

Virginia qualified seven wrestlers to the NCAA Championships in 2009, despite an injury-riddled season. Henrich was named an All-American at 174 pounds after taking seventh place at the national championship. He went 40-3 during a dominating season. For the second straight year, Virginia took second place at the ACC Championship, again coming up two points shy of the title. Henrich, Caponi (184) and Brent Jones (197) all earned ACC titles, and Jones was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler.

In 2007-08, the Cavaliers went 18-5 in dual meets (3-2 ACC) in setting a school record for dual-meet wins. Chris Henrich was named ACC Freshman of the Year and joined Michael Chaires on the Amateur Wrestling News All-Rookie Team. In January 2008, Virginia earned its first-ever national ranking in the W.I.N. rankings at No. 25.

With a young lineup including four freshmen and three sophomores, UVa made major waves at the ACC Championships in taking runner-up honors to Maryland, falling short of the title by just two points. UVa wrestlers finished in the top three in nine of 10 weight classes, with Ross Gitomer (125) and Rocco Caponi (184) earning championships. Both were named All-ACC, as were Henrich and freshman Nick Nelson. Gitomer, Caponi and Henrich all advanced to the NCAA Championships.

Garland's Cavaliers notched an 8-10 overall mark and 2-3 ACC record in his opening campaign in 2006-07. Under Garland's tutelage, Caponi captured the ACC title at 184 pounds, while Eric Albright was the league runner-up at 133. Both earned a berth in the NCAA Championships, where Albright won three matches. The duo also earned All-ACC honors, as did freshman Kellon Balum.

Garland was appointed to his post on April 20, 2006, after serving the previous six seasons as an assistant coach at Cornell, where he helped the Big Red to four-consecutive top-11 finishes at the NCAA Championships. He spent his final four seasons at Cornell as the top assistant under 2005 NCAA Coach of the Year Rob Koll. Garland was named the 2005-06 NCWA Assistant Coach of the Year after helping the Big Red to a top-five finish at the NCAA Championships.

During his six seasons at Cornell, Garland helped the Big Red wrestling program move into the national spotlight. He coached 17 All-Americans, four NCAA finalists and 46 NCAA qualifiers.

The Cornell wrestling team finished in the top five at the NCAA Championships two years in a row (2005-06) and the top 11 at the NCAA Tournament for four straight seasons. The Big Red won the Ivy League title in five of Garland's six seasons. He worked closely with and was integral in the development of four-time All-American (2001-05) and two-time NCAA Champion Travis Lee and true freshman NCAA finalist Troy Nickerson (2006).

As the recruiting coordinator his last four years, Garland helped bring in two top-five recruiting classes, which included three high school national champions, four junior national champions and numerous state champions. His 2005-06 class was ranked second nationally and included the No. 1 recruits at their weight classes in Nickerson (125 pounds) and Adam Frey (130 pounds).

Garland, a 2000 Virginia graduate, was a three-time Atlantic Coast Conference finalist and winner of the ACC championship at 125 pounds in 1997. He qualified for the NCAA championships in each of his three years of competition. At the 2000 NCAA Championships, Garland earned All-America honors, falling in the national title match after he upset the top seed, Jody Strittmatter of Iowa, 9-7 in overtime, in the semifinals. Garland ranks seventh all-time in UVa career wins (91).

In 2000, Garland was named the ACC Wrestler of the Year. In his career, he compiled 91 wins, including a 30-5 mark during his senior season, when he competed in the NWCA All-Star meet. He also is a member of the 50th Anniversary Atlantic Coast Conference Team.

Garland is currently on the Board of Directors for the National Wrestling Coaches Association and a member of the NCAA Division I Wrestling Rules Committee.

Garland (33) and his wife, English, are the proud parents of two daughters, Sarah and Grace.

ALEX CLEMSEN



Alex Clemesen is serving in his second season as assistant wrestling coach at Virginia. A former All-America wrestler at Edinboro, Clemesen helped Virginia produce one of the best seasons in program history during his first year with the Cavaliers.

Virginia won the ACC Championship in 2010 and also recorded a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2010, marking UVa's top finish at the national championships since 1957. The Cavaliers

were ranked as high as No. 16 nationally in 2010 – Virginia's highest ranking ever.

In Clemesen's first season in Charlottesville, Virginia won its first ACC Championship since 1977 as Chris Henrich and Mike Salopek each captured individual crowns. Behind Henrich's All-America finish at the NCAA Championships, UVa notched a 15th place, which was tops among ACC schools. Brent Jones also won the Gorrarian Trophy at the NCAA Championships, becoming just the second Cavalier to earn the honor.

Prior to his time at Virginia, Clemesen worked the last two years as Oregon State's Director of Wrestling Operations. During Clemesen's time at OSU, the Beavers had seven NCAA qualifiers, one All-American and one Academic All-American.

At Edinboro, Clemesen was an All-American and four-time NCAA qualifier while posting a 121-35 career record. He was just the 14th wrestler to win four Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships, and he also was named an Eastern Wrestling League Champion. He ended his career with the ninth-most wins in Edinboro history.

At the international level, Clemesen was a University Nationals All-American and a University World Team Trials runner-up.

Clemesen also was a two-time Academic All-American, graduating with the highest GPA of any wrestler in school history.

At Moberly Senior High School, Clemesen finished with a 158-7 career record and was an All-American. He twice posted perfect records, while winning the Missouri state championship three times and advancing to the state finals all four years. Clemesen also holds the state record with 27 tournaments won. In addition, he received Academic All-America honors.

A native of Moberly, Mo., Clemesen graduated in 2007 from Edinboro with a bachelor's degree in business administration with concentrations in financial services and marketing.

MANNY RIVERA



Manny Rivera is serving in his first season as an assistant wrestling coach at Virginia.

Rivera comes to Virginia after working as an administrative assistant wrestling coach last season at Minnesota, where he assisted in training, motivating and directing student-athletes. He also assisted in structured practices, weight training and conditioning.

Rivera also served for two years as an assistant director at the School of Champions in Minneapolis and was a volunteer wrestling coach at Rosemead High School.

Rivera had a standout wrestling career at Minnesota. He was a four-year starter for the Golden Gophers and was a three-time NCAA qualifier, earning All-America honors in 2008 when he took seventh place at 141 pounds. He also was a member of Minnesota's 2007 NCAA Championship team.

Rivera finished his Minnesota career with a 113-40 record and 27 falls. As a senior, he was a team captain. As a junior, he carried a 35-match winning streak at one point during the season - the sixth-longest winning streak in school history.

Rivera has been successful at the international level as well. He was a bronze medalist at the 2010 Pan-American Games as a member of the Mexican National Team.

A native of El Monte, Calif., Rivera earned a psychology degree from Minnesota in 2008.

After a highly successful wrestling career at Virginia, Brent Jones takes over as the Cavaliers' volunteer assistant coach for the 2010-11 season.

Jones wrestled at Virginia from 2005-10 and finished his UVa career as the school's all-time leader in pins (45) and fourth in career victories (106).

Jones earned the 2010 Gorrarian Trophy at the NCAA Championships. The award is presented to the wrestler who pinned the most opponents in the least amount of time at the championships. Jones recorded a pair of pins in the competition and needed just one minute, 33 seconds to do so.

He also was the ACC champion at 197 pounds in 2009 and was named the ACC Championships' Most Outstanding Wrestler that year. Jones was a two-time NCAA qualifier who also won the 2008 University National Freestyle Championship at 211 pounds and the 2006 FILA Junior Freestyle National Championship at 211 pounds.

He still competes at the international level with aspirations of competing at the world championships and Olympic level.

2009-10 SEASON REVIEW

• Virginia had a record-breaking season that culminated in a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. The finish was UVa's second best in program history and was topped only by a 10th-place standing in 1957.

• The Cavaliers won the ACC Championship for the first time since 1977 and the fourth time in program history. Henrich (174) and Mike Salopek (184) each won ACC titles.

• Virginia scored 85.5 points to defeat No. 10 Maryland (80.5) and No. 14 Virginia Tech (78.5) for the ACC crown.

• UVa racked up 34 points in the tournament, its most ever at the event.

• Brent Jones became the second Cavalier ever to win the Gorrarian Trophy, which is awarded to the wrestler who pinned the most opponents in the least amount of time at the NCAA Championships.

• Chris Henrich finished third in the 174-pound weight class at the NCAA Championships and became the first two-time All-American wrestler in Virginia history. Henrich went 35-3 and recorded his 100th career win with his win in the NCAA quarterfinals.

• UVa finished with a program-best 15 individual wins from seven wrestlers and earned the top finish of any ACC school this season.

• At the ACC Championships, Salopek scored a takedown with 10 seconds

remaining in the third period to earn a 2-0 win over top-seeded Tommy Spellman of Virginia Tech; that win clinched the title for the Cavaliers.

• All 10 competing Cavaliers reached the semifinal round and placed fourth or better at ACCs. Five made their respective championship matches.

• Steve Garland, in his fourth season as Virginia head coach, was named the ACC Coach of the Year, becoming the first UVa wrestling coach to earn the distinction.

• Brent Jones set the UVa career record after finishing with 45 career falls.

• Virginia earned a No. 16 national ranking in January – the program's highest national ranking ever.

• Garland was named VaSID Coach of the Year, while Henrich earned the state's Wrestler of the Year award.

• The Cavaliers had three wrestlers named to the All-State First Team - Henrich at 174, Salopek at 184 and Jones at 197.

• Matt Snyder and Jack Danilkowicz each were named to the VaSID second team at 133 pounds and heavyweight, respectively.

• UVa scored its first-ever dual-match wins over Michigan, notching a pair of victories over the Wolverines at the Virginia Duals.

• The Cavaliers earned their first win ever over a ranked team after defeating then-No. 16 American, 20-19, on Nov. 15.
