FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVa is playing at PPL Park for the third time in program history. The Cavaliers first played at the stadium in Chester during the 2012 NCAA quarterfinal round against Notre Dame (L, 10-12). UVa also faced North Carolina (W, 13-11) last season in the ACC Showcase game.
- Saturday is the seventh all-time meeting between UVa and Penn in a series that began in 1929. Four of the six games played in the series have been contested since 1997.
- The Cavaliers are looking for their 10th win of the season on Saturday. A win over Penn gives UVa its 18th 10-win season in 23 years under head coach Dom Starsia. Prior to the Dom Starsia era at UVa the Cavaliers only managed 10 seasons with 10 or more wins over a 63-year span of lacrosse on Grounds.
- UVa has played nine nationally ranked opponents, the most of any school in the nation entering the week. Syracuse, Villanova and Loyola have played eight. Syracuse is the only school among those listed that plays a ranked opponent this week (No. 2 UNC).
- UVa is one of two schools in the nation (Syracuse) that is undefeated in non-conference play.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia concludes the regular season on Saturday when the Cavaliers head to Chester, Pa., for the ACC/Penn Challenge at PPL Park. Faceoff against the Quakers is set for 7:30 p.m. UVa is ranked this week No. 8 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 9 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Penn is not ranked.

THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

Saturday marks the seventh all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and the Quakers, and the second neutral site meeting. UVa owns a 4-2 advantage in a series that dates back to 1929, but is being contested outside of Charlottesville for only the second time. UVa dropped the first two contests (1929 & 1931), before winning the past four (1997, 1998, 2011 and 2012) under Virginia head coach Dom Starsia.

Penn head coach Mike Murphy is in his sixth season as the head coach of the Quakers and he returns 19 letterwinners and six starters off a 2014 team that went 11-4 and won the Ivy League title. Murphy served as an assistant on Starsia's final Brown team in 1992 and his first five UVa teams from 1993-97.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 266-94 (.739) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 360 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

- UVa leads the series with Penn 4-2, as the Cavaliers are winners of the past four meetings in a series that started in 1929.
- The series had only been played in Charlottesville (1929, 1931, 1997, 1998, 2011) until the 2012 meeting took place in Denver at Sports Authority Field as part of the Mile High Classic.
- Only two current Cavaliers played in the 10-8 UVa win. Attackman Owen Van Arsdale started at attacked and assisted the first of Steele Stanwick's game-high six goals. Midfielder Ryan Tucker also saw time on the second midfield for UVa, but only recorded one ground ball.
- There are a few Penn and UVa connections to this game.
- Penn head coach Mike Murphy was an assistant coach under UVa head coach Dom Starsia on his final Brown staff in 1992 and his first five UVa teams from 1993-97, which included two NCAA title games and three NCAA semifinal games.
- US Lacrosse Hall of Fame head coach Jim Adams served as head coach at both Penn (1970-77) and Virginia (1978-1992), retiring in Charlottesville in 1992 and was succeeded by Dom Starsia.
- Current UVa associate head coach Marc Van Arsdale was the head coach at Penn from 1997-2001.
- Dom Starsia faced Penn all 10 of his seasons as the head coach at Brown and went an even 5-5, but has gone 4-0 during his time at UVa.
- The 2015 season marks the sixth season out of the last nine that UVa has a regular season schedule that features two Ivy League teams (2010, 2013, 2014 did not).
- UVa played Cornell early this season - in 2011 and 2012 it was Cornell and Penn - In 2009 it was Cornell and Dartmouth.
- In 2007 and 2008 the schedule featured Dartmouth and Princeton.

GERMAN STEPS UP AFTER PANNELL'S INJURY

- Even though UVa head coach Dom Starsia considered captain Tyler German the fourth member of the first midfield, the senior was bumped up to starting on the first midfield after the season-ending injury to attackman James Pannell on March 12 in practice.
- Midfielder Greg Coholan was moved to Pannell's starting attack position.
- In the first six games of the season German had four goals and two assists. In the seven games since Pannell's injury German has 13 goals and three assists for 16 points.
- Coholan had 14 goals and five assists through the first six games. Since Pannell's injury he has 19 goals and four assists playing attack and midfield.

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only six night games at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall UVA is 33-6 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA snapped the losing streak at two games with a 14-13 overtime win against No. 12 Loyola to open the 2014 season.
- UVA's most recent loss at night at Klöckner Stadium was to No. 4 North Carolina, 10-6, in 2015.

UVA TOPS RANKED TEAM IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- UVA's men's lacrosse team (2-0) has opened the season with wins over No. 7 Loyola (13-12) and No. 16 Drexel (14-10).
- It marks the the eighth time in Dom Starsia's 23 seasons as UVA's head coach the Cavaliers have opened up a season facing back-to-back ranked opponents.
- It is only the third time UVA has swept those ranked opponents, splitting the other five times.
- In addition to this season the feat also happened in 2011 and 1995.
- UVA is ranked No. 9 in this week's USILA coaches poll and nine of UVA's 13 regular season opponents have been ranked in the Top 20. Another two opponents have received votes in the sports' oldest poll (established in 1973).

UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH

- The 2015 UVA defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.
- At SSDM you have sophomore Will McNamara, who made his collegiate debut at Loyola. Sophomore Carlson Milikin and freshman Jack Falk also ran at SSDM against Loyola.
- Sophomore goalie Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 122-27 (.8188) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-2 mark in 2015. UVA also is 11-2 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- In uncharacteristic fashion for UVa, the Cavaliers have lost five of 10 ground ball battles this season. One contributing factor is UVa is only winning 45.8 percent (159-of-347) of its faceoffs.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011
- UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVa is 24-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 14-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 251 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 251 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means in the midst of 23 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 21.9 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVa's dominance are Syracuse at 52 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a five-goal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third quarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.

Zed Williams scored a career-high four goals and assisted another to help propel No. 6 Virginia (3-0) to a 14-5 road win over Rutgers (1-2), inside High Point Solutions Stadium.

The first half was all Williams as the sophomore midfielder tallied a hat trick to help give UVa a 6-1 lead entering the intermission. Williams started the scoring with an unassisted score at 9:58. Matt Emery followed up with his second goal of the season at 8:54. Zack Sikora put Rutgers on the board with a transition goal at 5:11.

Williams scored two more unassisted goals to start the second quarter and James Pannell found nylon with 19 seconds left in the second quarter to cap the first half scoring. Rutgers peppered 21 shots in the first half and UVa goalie Matt Barrett made 11 saves, and allowed one goal.
