FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Saturday is the third all-time meeting between UVa and Georgetown and the first in regular season action. The Cavaliers and Hoyas have previously met in the the 2003 and 2006 NCAA Tournament.
- Nine fourth and fifth-year members of the UVa men's lacrosse program will be honored prior to the the game as part of the "Senior Day" festivities.
- UVa is playing its ninth nationally ranked opponent this week, the most of any school in the nation. Syracuse, Villanova and Loyola have played eight.
- UVa is one of three schools in the nation (Syracuse, Yale) that is undefeated in non-conference play.
- For the eighth time in the past 10 seasons UVa has reached the eight-win plateau before the end of March. UVa's 2013 squad as well as its NCAA title team in 2011 are the only Cavalier teams over the past 10 years that failed to win eight games by the end of March. Prior to the 2006 season, UVa never played eight games prior to the end of March.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia returns home on Saturday when the Cavaliers host the Georgetown Hoyas on Senior Day. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m. UVa is ranked No. 9 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 10 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Georgetown is ranked No. 14 in the coaches poll and No. 13 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE HOYAS

Despite the relative proximity of the two schools, Saturday is only the third time UVa and Georgetown have met (although they have scrimmaged regularly in the preseason.) Prior to Saturday the series has only been played in the NCAA Tournament when UVa won the 2003 and 2006 meetings, both NCAA quarterfinal matchups, en route to NCAA championships for the Cavaliers.

Georgetown head coach Kevin Warne is in his third season at Georgetown and returns 25 letterwinners and seven starters off of last season's 4-10 squad.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 265-94 (.738) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 359 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's guarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVa head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- · ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIOUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RANIA

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVa Athletics Media Relations Office.

THE SERIES VS. THE HOYAS

- Virginia leads the all-time series by a 2-0 margin.
- Despite the relative proximity of the two schools, this is only the third time UVa and Georgetown have met (although they have scrimmaged regularly in the preseason.)
- Saturday is the first time these two teams will meet in the regular season.
- UVa faced Georgetown in the NCAA Tournament in 2003 and 2006 on the Cavaliers way to NCAA titles.

SENIOR DAY AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- There will be nine fourth and fifth-year students involved with the men's lacrosse program that will be honored prior to the game as part of of UVa's annual Senior Day festivities.
- Some will not be playing their final games at Klöckner Stadium and will return in 2016 due to the use of a redshirt year or due to a medical hardship.
- The fourth-years being honored are Thompson Brown, Greg Coholan, Tyler German, manager Sean Knightly, Tanner Ottenbreit, Davi Sacco, manager Michael Starsia and Ryan Tucker.
- The lone fifth-year being honored is Owen Van Arsdale.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 121-27 (.8176) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-2 mark in 2015. UVa also is 11-2 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Virginia has a 36-game winning streak going back to 2001 in regular-season midweek games.
- Virginia has two midweek games scheduled in 2015. They beat St. Joseph's 15-14 on March 10 and VMI 17-3 on March 24.
- The last time the Cavaliers lost a midweek contest was an 11-8 loss to Notre Dame on March 14, 2001 (a Wednesday).
- Under head coach Dom Starsia, Virginia is 54-2 (.964) in mid-week games since 1993.
- After losing his first mid-week game (9-6 to Princeton in 1993), the Cavaliers rattled off 22 wins in a row before that loss to Notre Dame 13 years ago.

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only six night games at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall UVa is 33-6 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993
- UVa fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010
- UVa dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVa snapped the losing streak at two games with a 14-13 overtime win against No. 12 Loyola to open the 2014 season.
- UVa's most recent loss at night at Klöckner Stadium was to No. 4 North Carolina, 10-6, in 2015.

UVA TOPS RANKED TEAM IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- UVa's men's lacrosse team (2-0) has opened the season with wins over No. 7 Loyola (13-12) and No. 16 Drexel (14-10).
- It marks the the eighth time in Dom Starsia's 23 seasons as UVa's head coach the Cavaliers have opened up a season facing back-to-back ranked opponents.
- It is only the third time UVa has swept those ranked opponents, splitting the other five times.
- In addition to this season the feat also happened in 2011 and 1995.
- UVa is ranked No. 9 in this week's USILA coaches poll and nine of UVa's 13 regular season opponents have been ranked in the Top 20. Another two opponents have received votes in the sports' oldest poll (established in 1973).

UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH

- The 2015 UVa defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.
- At SSDM you have sophomore Will McNamara, who made his collegiate debut at Loyola. Sophomore Carlson Milikin and freshman Jack Falk also ran at SSDM against Loyola.
- Sophomore goalie Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- In uncharacteristic fashion for UVa, the Cavaliers have lost five of 10 ground ball battles this season. One contributing factor is UVa is only winning 44.7 percent (144-of-322) of its faceoffs.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011 UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVa is 24-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 14-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.

Game 1 Virginia 13, Loyola 12 Feb. 7 • Baltimore, Md.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a fivegoal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third quarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.

The No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) overcame a snowstorm and an early three-goal deficit to defeat No. 16 Drexel (0-1) at Klöckner Stadium, 14-10.

Drexel scored the game's first three goals to take an early 3-0 lead. UVa fought back with a 6-1 run to take a 7-5 lead with 3:45 left in the second period. Ryan Tucker scored two goals during the run and Zed Williams capped the scoring with an unassisted goal.

Drexel managed back-to-back goals to cut the UVa advantage to four goals, 14-10, courtesy of Jake Gennosa and Ryan Belka. The two goals by Drexel capped the game's scoring as UVa's defense thwarted any Drexel comeback attempt.

Lukacovic, Pannell and Tucker all led UVa with four points, while Matt Barrett made 12 saves in the cage, four of which came in a late fourth-quarter barrage by the Dragons. Van Arsdale led all players with three goals.

Zed Williams scored a career-high four goals and assisted another to help propel No. 6 Virginia (3-0) to a 14-5 road win over Rutgers (1-2), inside High Point Solutions Stadium.

The first half was all Williams as the sophomore midfielder tallied a hat trick to help give UVa a 6-1 lead entering the intermission. Williams started the scoring with an unassisted score at 9:58. Matt Emery followed up with his second goal of the season at 8:54. Zack Sikora put Rutgers on the board with a transition goal at 5:11.

Williams scored two more unassisted goals to start the second quarter and James Pannell found nylon with 19 seconds left in the second quarter to cap the first half scoring. Rutgers peppered 21 shots in the first half and UVa goalie Matt Barrett made 11 saves, and allowed one goal.
