FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVA and Drexel are meeting for the 16th time and for the 15th straight season in a series that began in 1947.
- Three of the last four meetings between UVA and Drexel have been won by a razor-thin margin by the Cavaliers. UVA has won each of the last four meetings, but the 2012, 2013 and 2014 meetings were by a single goal, including an 11-10 triumph over the Dragons the last time the Cavaliers came to Vidas Field. UVA opened the scoring up a bit more in 2015 with its 14-10 win.
- Drexel's Deputy of Athletics Nick Gannon is a 1992 graduate of Virginia and was a goalie for the men's lacrosse team. His lone season as a letterwinner was 1992, Jim Adams' last season as head coach of the Cavaliers.
- Ryan Conrad became UVA's first true freshman to score a goal in a season opener since Ryan Tucker did so at Drexel in 2012.
- M Greg Coholan was the sixth overall pick in the 2016 MLL Draft last month. UVA's 19 all-time first round MLL Draft picks are the most of any school.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia (0-1) returns to action on Saturday for its road opener against the Drexel Dragons (0-0) at Vidas Field in Philadelphia. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m. UVA is ranked No. 14 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 13 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Drexel, opening its season against the Cavaliers, is not ranked.

THE SERIES VS. DRAGONS

UVA and Drexel are meeting for 16th time in a series that began in 1947. The first meeting may have been in 1947, but the series was put on hiatus until 2002. Since restarting the series, UVA and Drexel are meeting for the 15th-straight season.

Drexel head coach Brian Voelker is in his seventh season in charge of the Dragons, and returns 33 letterwinners and nine starters off last year's 7-8 team.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 24th season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 267-96 (.738) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In his 24th season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 363 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. DREXEL

- Saturday marks the 16th all-time meeting between UVA and Drexel in lacrosse. UVA owns the advantage in the series with a 14-1 record.
- The all-time series with Drexel dates back to 1947, a 7-2 UVA win in Philadelphia, but went on hiatus until 2002.
- The 2016 season marks the 15th year in arrow the Cavaliers and Dragons have met in lacrosse.
- After suffering a surprising loss to Drexel in Charlottesville to open 2007, the Cavaliers got back on the winning track against the Dragons with an 11-7 win in the 2008 season opener.
- UVA's 20-5 win in 2002 was the first meeting with Drexel in more than 50 years.
- The first meeting of the two schools occurred in 1947, Virginia's first season following World War II. The Cavaliers gained a 7-2 victory in Philadelphia. Barry Robertson was high man for UVA with four goals, while goalie Bob Catzen registered 12 saves. Curiously Catzen's 12 saves that afternoon stood as the most by a Cavalier goalie in the series, along with Rob Fortunato (2011), until Dan Marino's 15 in 2013. That mark was topped by Matt Barrett last year when a new standard was set with 16 saves.
- As the No. 1 team in the nation during the 2012 meeting, UVA escaped the City of Brotherly Love with a narrow 9-8 victory as Rob Emery and Owen Van Arsdale each had two goals. Steele Stanwick, playing his first game as the reigning Tewaaron Trophy winner, was held point-less for only the fourth time in his illustrious UVA career.
- In 2013 Drexel tied the game with 10 seconds left on a Ryan Belka goal. UVA however won the game in overtime, 13-12, when Matt White scored on a Nick O'Reilly pass 11 seconds into the overtime period. It was O'Reilly's sixth assist of the game. With eight points on the day O'Reilly was named the ACC Player of the Week.
- In the 2014 meeting, the last game in the series at Drexel, UVA used a game-winning goal by Mark Cockerton with 15 seconds left to elevate the Cavaliers over the Dragons, 11-10, at Vidas Field in Philadelphia.
- Goalie Matt Barrett made a big save for UVA and the Cavaliers were able to push the ball into transition to setup the game-winning score. Owen Van Arsdale tried to feed Ryan Tucker in front of the crease, but his stick was hit on the pass. Cockerton picked up the ball off the turf and deposited it into the goal from the front of the crease.
- The last meeting Drexel jumped out to a 3-0 lead on a chilly Valentine's Day night in Charlottesville. UVA then went on an 11-3 run to take full control of the game en route to a 14-10 triumph over then-No. 16 Drexel.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVA head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVA has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- Below is how UVA has fared over the last seven seasons in ground balls:

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011 UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 21 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVA is 24-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVA is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVA is 14-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia at UVA's home edifice.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVA - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 122-29 (.8080) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including an 0-1 mark in 2016. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 255 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 254 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means that over the past 23 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 21.6 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVA's dominance are Syracuse at 54 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.
