FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

• Saturday is the 77th all-time meeting between UVa and Duke and first in Durham since the 2011 ACC Tournament semifinal round.

• UVa is not ranked in the USILA coaches poll for the first time since March 15, 2004 and for only the second week in the Dom Starsia era.

• UVa is trying to avoid its first six-game losing streak since the 1965-66 seasons.

• UVa's roster of 41 is made up 58.5% Fr. & Soph. (24), juniors are responsible for 52.7% of team scoring and the sophs & juniors together make up 76.1% of UVa's scoring in 2013.

• Mark Cockerton has 32 goals through his first 10 games played. Chris Bocklet, UVa's last player to amass over 50 goals had 30 goals through 10 games played.

GAME OVERVIEW

The Virginia Cavaliers (5-6, 0-2 ACC) are receiving votes in both the USILA coaches and Nike/Inside Lacrosse media polls, marking the first time since March 15, 2004 that UVa is not ranked in the Top 20. The Cavaliers conclude ACC play on Friday against the Duke Blue Devils (9-4, 1-1 ACC), ranked No. 7 in the USILA coaches and No. 8 in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse media polls. The game will be contested at Duke's Koskinen Stadium. Faceoff is slated for 6 p.m.

THE SERIES VS. THE BLUE DEVILS

Friday marks the 77th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and the Blue Devils, a series in which the Cavaliers own a 49-27 advantage since 1938. The 49 victories equal the most UVa has against any opponent in program history (matches 49 victories against UNC), but the Blue Devils have won 12 of the last 13 meetings, including the last four. Virginia's last win in the series was in the 2010 ACC Tournament and its last win at Koskinen Stadium was during the 2003 regular season, an 11-8 triumph.

Duke head coach John Danowski is in his seventh season at Duke and returns 31 letterwinners and eight starters off of last season's NCAA semifinal team that went 15-5.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 21st season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four

NCAA titles and reached the final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 245-82 (.749) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In 21 seasons with Virginia, Starsia has coached 327 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

• Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)

• He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011

• He becomes the second UVa head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder

• He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008

• He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)

 His teams have made 24 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history

His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times

• One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urick and John Danowski joining the group this season)

• Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution

• He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)

• ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

THE SERIES VS. THE BLUE DEVILS Virginia leads the all-time series by a 49-27 margin, but Duke has won 12 of the last 13 Duke had won eight in a row before losing to UVa in the ACC Tournament on April 23, 2010, serving as the longest series winning streak since winning seven in a row from 1939-50 The Cavaliers have defeated Duke more than any other team in school history but one UVa also has 49 all-time victories over the Tar Heels, tying UVa's 49 all-time wins over Duke The win over the Blue Devils in the 2010 ACC Tournament is the only against Duke for all current Cavaliers (UVa's last win was in 2004)

DUKE SHUTS DOWN THE CAVALIER OFFENSE

• Duke has been among the most powerful offenses in the country recently, but it has been the Blue Devil defense that has helped during the streak of 12 wins over last 13 meetings with UVa

• The Cavaliers reached double figures in 34-of-35 meetings from 1962-98, but have scored 10+ in just 12 of the last 23

• Virginia reached double digits once during the former eight-game losing streak to Duke (2009 regular season)

• Prior to the regular season loss in 2009, the last time Virginia scored at least 10 goals occurred in a 13-4 win in 2004, which also represented UVa's last victory until a 16-12 triumph on April 23 in the ACC Tournament in College Park, Md.

• While at UVa, Dom Starsia has a 17-17 overall record against Duke and in only six of those 17 losses have the Cavaliers reached double figures in scoring, including both meetings in 2011

UVA IN THE MIDST OF A HISTORICAL DROUGHT

Virginia is looking to snap its current five-game losing streak

• In Dom Starsia's tenure at UVa, the Cavaliers have never had a five-game losing streak

• This current drought is the first time UVa has lost five in a row since men's lacrosse became an NCAA Championship sport in 1971

• UVa last lost five games in a row when the Cavaliers opened the 1966 season with five-straight losses, a streak that was part of a six-game losing streak dating back to the 1965 season

• UVa's biggest drought was an 18-game losing streak that spanned the 1939, 1941, 1942 and 1947 seasons - there was a break of fielding a team during that span due to WWI

• UVa also owned a 16-game losing streak that spanned the 1927, 1928, 1929 and 1930 seasons

• Since the end of WWII there has been four, four-game losing streaks by UVa (1956, 1987, 2004, 2013)

DEFENDING IN A QUARTER'S FINAL SECONDS

 Despite playing very well for long stretches on defense, an Achilles' heel for UVa this season is allowing goals in the final seconds of quarters

• Thirteen times this season UVa has allowed a goal in the final 30 seconds of a period and 12 of those goals came in the final 16 second of a period

• There have been 44 regulation periods in the UVa season this year - meaning that 27.3 percent of periods this year saw UVa yield a goal in final 16 seconds & 29.5 percent of periods UVa has yielded a goal in the final 30 seconds of the frame

• During UVa's current five-game losing streak, the Cavaliers have given up a goal in the final seconds in every game, including the first three periods against Ohio State • UVa is 3-6 when allowing last second goals in a quarter and 2-0 when the Cavaliers don't yield any last second goals

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

 Accoriding to UVa head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."

• Currently UVa leads the nation in ground balls at 39.20 per game

Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their nationall rankings

in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game

• UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationall in ground balls per game over the last five seasons

• Five other schools can only boast finishing in the Top-5 twice during the same span (Duke, Georgetown, Jacksonville, North Carolina, Robert Morris)

Below is how UVa has fared over the last five seasons in ground balls:

MORE LOSING STREAK NOTES - THE MATT WHITE FACTOR

• During the current five-game losing streak, maybe no offensive player for UVa has struggled as much as senior Matt White

• Matt White is only shooting .115 percent (3-of-26) during the five-game slide

• Prior to the losing streak when UVa was 5-1, Matt White was shooting .343 percent (12-of-35)

• Matt White's dip of .228 percent is the biggest slide among UVa's top goal scorers

• Rob Emery is down (.114), Mark Cockerton is down (.067) and Ryan Tucker is down (.036), while Nick O'Reilly is as even as one could be, down from .368 to .367 during the current losing streak - a drop of .001

THE UVA DEFENSE IS SCORING POINTS - LEADS THE NATION

 Virginia's starting close defense of Greg Danseglio, Harry Prevas and Scott McWilliams have scored a combined 11 points so far this season to lead the nation in defensive scoring

• The combination of long pole stick skills by the trio, the new rules that eliminate the horn and encourage fast starts, and the fact UVa opponents are clearing at a .838 clip are factors in the increase of UVa scoring from its close defense.

GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER BODES WELL

• This year's senior class has compiled an 22-8 record at Klöckner Stadium during their careers

• Their only losss at Klöckner were to Duke in 2010 & 2012, as well as setbacks in 2012 to Johns Hopkins and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament

Sanderson was the starting goalie on Team Canada's 2006 FIL World Championship team and battled cancer since 2008 - he also played in the 2010 World Championships and was Lacrosse Magazine's 2010 Comeback Player of the Year

 Sanderson played briefly in the MLL in 2010 for the Toronto Nationals and sepent four seasons in the NLL - he currently ranks No. 5 at UVa with 495 career saves

CHRIS LAPIERRE SHUT DOWN FOR REST OF THE 2013 SEASON

• On March 20 Chris LaPierre was shut down for the remainder of the season with a lower extremity injury

MATT WHITE SCORING STREAK

• Senior Matt White has scored at least one goal in his 26 of his last 34 games, tallying a total of 43 goals and 67 points

• During the span, White is shooting 33.3 percent (43-of-129) and he is shooting 63.2 percent (43-of-68) when his attempts are on goal

Game 1 Virginia 13, Drexel 12 - OT Feb. 16 • Charlottesville, Va.

Eleven seconds into the first overtime period, Virginia's Matt White scored his second career overtime goal off a feed from Nick O'Reilly to give the Cavalier men's lacrosse team (1-0) a 13-12 win over Drexel (0-1) on a blustery afternoon at Klöckner Stadium. White's other overtime goal came against Bucknell in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The win gives UVa its sixth consecutive seasonopening win over the Dragons.

While White scored the game-winner inside the left post, it was set up by an unsettled situation off the faceoff that opened the overtime period. Drexel's Deven Thomas beat Mick Parks on the draw, pulling the ball back toward the Dragons' goal. UVa's Rob Emery beat all players to the ball to set up a transition. Emery found O'Reilly, who quickly found White for the score.

The game started heavily in Virginia's favor. The Cavaliers scored twice before Drexel even shot the ball. Twenty-one seconds into the game Emery scored unassisted, followed by an O'Reilly unassisted goal at 12:25. UVa concluded its 3-0 run with another score by O'Reilly at 4:10 in the first quarter.

Drexel streaked on a 5-1 run, entering the intermission with a 5-4 advantage. Five different Dragons scored and Ben McIntosh capped the run with his goal with eight seconds left in the first half.

The scoring in the second half was slow to start. Until Matt Cockerton grabbed a carom off Drexel goalie Will Gabrieslson and deposited at 8:54, no ball ripped nylon in the second half. Cockerton's goal tied the game at 5-5. Pat Harbeson followed up with a goal about a minute later to give UVa a 6-5 lead, but was flagged after the goal for unsportsmanlike conduct. The penalty was a full-time served penalty with no ensuing faceoff. Andrew Vivian quickly tied the game as a result, 6-6, with 7:42 left.

Vivian's goal was part of a 3-1 Drexel run that gave the Dragons an 8-7 lead with 2:00 minutes to play in the third guarter. Virginia responded with a 4-1 run of its own that included goals by Bobby Hill, Parks and White. Owen Van Arsdale added a man-down score of his own, the first UVa man-down score since the 2011 season. White's third goal of the game capped the run with 5:15 left to play, as UVa held a narrow 11-9 lead.

Drexel scored the next two via Aaron Prosser and Frank Fusco, tying the game, 11-11, with 1:23 left to play.

Thomas won the ensuing faceoff, but Scott McWilliams stripped Garrett McIntosh, giving UVa the ball back. Charlie Streep scored his first career Virginia goal with 49 seconds left, giving UVa the narrow 12-11 lead.

Drexel won the next faceoff and Robert Chruch's shot was blocked out front, Belka beat UVa goalie Dan Marino to the ball in front of the crease, quickly depositing the ball in the goal with eight second remaining, setting up the winner-take-all scenario.

Mark Cockerton scored five goals and the No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers (3-0) outlasted the Stony Brook Seawolves (1-2) at Kenneth P. LaValle Stadium. True to form of the Virginia-Syracuse series, it took overtime to decide the 29th alltime meeting, as the No. 6 Cavaliers (4-1) lost for the first time this season, falling inside the Carrier Dome to the No. 18 Orange (2-1), 9-8.

Mick Parks won the faceoff to start the overtime period, his 16th win in 21 attempts on the night. Matt Whiteattempted a shot, but the shot was saved by Syracuse goalie Bobby Wardwell, starting the Orange offensive possession.

After a timeout, Dylan Donahue found Kevin Rice who slipped the ball past UVa goalie Dan Marinowith 1:00 left in the first overtime. Virginia retorted on an unassisted goal by James Pannell with 2:41 left before the intermission. O'Reilly scored again at 1:48 to return the lead to UVa, 5-4.

Rob Pannell scored his first goal of the game at 1:22 to even the score at 5-5. Doug Tesoriero won the ensuing faceoff for Cornell, but Mock tried a skip pass and UVa goalie Dan Marino intercepted the pass and started the transition clear. Matt White grabbed the ball and took it coast-to-coast and deposited the unassisted goal with six seconds remaining, sending UVa into the break with a onegoal lead, 6-5.

The Cavaliers jumped out in the third quarter on a 3-0 run, extending their lead to four goals, 9-5. O'Reilly tallied a goal to start the run, and then Scott McWilliams intercepted a Cornell clear attempt, which led quickly to a Greg Danseglio transition goal. Cockerton capped the run at 6:43 in the third quarter on a pass from Van Arsdale.

Game 8 Ohio State 11, Virginia 10 March 16 • Charlottesville, Va.

Nick O'Reilly had four goals and one assist, but it wasn't enough as the No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers (5-3) dropped a Saturday afternoon meeting with the No. 12 Ohio State Buckeyes (5-1) inside Klöckner Stadium, 11-10. UVa's three losses this season are by a combined three goals and each opponents' game-winning goal has all come in either overtime, or in the final 1:31 of regulation.

The game's first three quarters were separated from the games final 15 minutes by a lightning delay that lasted one hour and 43 minutes. Virginia clawed its way back with two goals in the fourth quarter, tying the game, 10-10, with 1:48 left in the contest. After a caused turnover by Tanner Scales, Greg Danseglio found Ryan Tucker in transition for the equalizer.

In the scrum on the ensuing faceoff, Dominique Alexander came up with the ground ball and scored in transition for Ohio State with 1:31 left in the game, which proved to be the game-winning goal. Virginia managed an extra-man situation to close out the game, but both shot attempts didn't connect, including a doorstep opportunity by O'Reilly. Ohio State goalie Greg Dutton stuffed the shot and UVa's chance at winning the game with roughly five seconds on the clock.

The game started out well in UVa's favor, O'Reilly scored back-to-back unassisted goals to start the UVa scoring and gave the Cavaliers a 2-0 lead. Both times O'Reilly wrapped around from X and scored high. Ohio State finally got on the board at 4:58 in the first period on a Jesse King goal on a Carter Brown assist, cutting the UVa lead to one goal, 2-1.

The Cavaliers scored the next two goals, taking a 4-1 lead. Mark Cockerton found Ryan Tucker for a goal at 2:08. O'Reilly secured the hat trick with 47 seconds left in the first period when Matt White found the attackman.

Ohio State won the ensuing faceoff and deposited a goal just as time expired in the first quarter, cutting into UVa's lead, 4-2. Ohio State would experience the same fortune at the end of the second and third quarter.

No. 10 Johns Hopkins (6-2) scored nine goals in a row to pace the Blue Jays' 15-8 triumph over the No. 14 Virginia Cavaliers (5-4) , inside M&T Bank Stadium. Not only did the Blue Jays win the Konica Minolta Face-Off Classic, but also won the quest for the Doyle Smith Cup for the third year in a row. Virginia won the first 5 meetings since the institution of the cup in 2006.

The game was scoreless for over the first six minutes, but Johns Hopkins finally broke through at 8:56 when Wells Stanwick found Brandon Benn for the game's first goal. On the ensuing faceoff Mike Poppleton won the draw and raced straight down the alley and ripped the nylon for an early Johns Hopkins 2-0 lead.

Cockerton and Charlie Streep each scored twice and Rob Emery added a goal in the fourth quarter as Virginia outscored Johns Hopkins in the second half, 7-6.

Cockerton tallied his eighth career hat trick and led UVa with four goals. Streep tallied his first multi-goal game of his Virginia career and 23rd of his collegiate career. UVa goalie Rhody Heller saved a career-high 13 shots inside the cage.

The No. 2 Maryland Terrapins (7-1, 2-1 ACC) started the contest at Klöckner Stadium on a 5-1 run, which proved to be the foundation in topping the No. 17 Virginia Cavaliers (5-5, 0-1 ACC) by two goals, 9-7, in front of 5,225 fans. Virginia fell in its ACC opener for the second time in three seasons.

Kieran Burke made 23 saves for No. 4 North Carolina (8-3, 2-1 ACC), lifting the Tar Heels to a 10-7 win over the No. 18 Virginia Cavaliers (5-6, 0-2 ACC), in front of 6,787 fans inside Klöckner Stadium. Despite winning almost every statistical category over UNC by a large margin, UVa has lost five games in a row for the first time since 1966.

Virginia dominated at the faceoff X, wining 15-of-20, while also nearly doubling up North Carolina on ground balls (41-21) and having fewer turnovers (10-12). Virginia also won the shots battle (51-32).
