## OPENING DRAW

### GAME OVERVIEW

• Virginia concludes the 2017 regular season in the ACC Showcase game against the Penn Quakers. Faceoff is set for 12 p.m. and will be played at Duke's Koskinen Stadium in Durham, N.C.

• This week Virginia is receiving votes in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls.

### THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

• Saturday marks the 10th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Quakers, and the third neutral site meeting with the Ivy League foe. UVA owns a 6-3 advantage in a series that dates back to 1929, but is being contested for the eighth time since 1997 and the sixth time since 2011. UVA dropped the first two meetings in the series in 1929 and 1931, before winning six in a row. UVA lost the 2017 meeting at Franklin Field, 11-10, snapping a six-game winning streak.

• Penn head coach Mike Murphy is in his eighth season as the head coach of the Quakers and he returns 28 letter-winners and three starters off a 2016 team that went 8-7. Murphy was an assistant coach at UVA from 1993-97.



Zed Williams scored three goals in this year's previous meeting with Penn. The then-No. 17 Quakers topped then-No. 6 UVA, 11-10, in the Cavaliers' first-ever game at historic Franklin Field.

### ONE-GOAL GAMES

• Seven of UVA's 14 games this season have been decided by one goal or less. UVA is 3-4 in those games with two losses in overtime. Three of the seven games not decided by one goal or less took place over a four game span between Feb. 18-March 1.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

**INTERVIEWS**

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

**THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS**

- UVA leads the series with Penn 6-3, as the Cavaliers are winners of past six of the past seven meetings in a series that started in 1929.
- UVA lost its first game since 1931 to the Quakers this season (11-10) on Feb. 25 when Penn was ranked No. 17. It was UVA's first-ever men's lacrosse game at historic Franklin Field.
- The series had only been played in Charlottesville (1929, 1931, 1997, 1998, 2011) until the 2012 meeting took place in Denver at Sports Authority Field as part of the Mile High Classic.
- There are a few Penn and UVA connections to this game.
- Penn head coach Mike Murphy was an assistant coach under former UVA head coach and US Lacrosse Hall of Famer, Dom Starsia, on his final Brown staff in 1992 and his first five UVA teams from 1993-97, which included two NCAA title games and three NCAA semifinal games.
- US Lacrosse Hall of Fame head coach Jim Adams served as head coach at both Penn (1970-77) and Virginia (1978-1992), retiring in Charlottesville in 1992 and was succeeded by Dom Starsia.
- Current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany faced Penn all 10 of his seasons as the head coach at Brown and went an even 5-5. That record mirrors what Tiffany's college coach at Brown and UVA predecessor Dom Starsia did in his 10 years in the Ivy League as the Bears' head coach.
- The 2017 season marks the eighth season out of the last 11 that UVA has a regular season schedule that features two Ivy League teams (2010, 2013, 2014 did not).
- UVA also played Cornell March 11 in Costa Mesa, Calif. In 2011 and 2012 it was Cornell and Penn - In 2009 it was Cornell and Dartmouth.
- In 2007 and 2008 the schedule featured Dartmouth and Princeton.

**THOMPSON TIES FRESHMAN GAME SAVE MARK**

• With 18 saves against Robert Morris on April 11, freshman goalie Griffin Thompson tied the UVA record for saves in a game by a freshman keeper.

• Thompson is the fourth UVA freshman goalie to reach 18 saves in a game, sharing the record with Rodney Rullman, who reached the mark twice in 1972, once against Washington & Lee and again vs. Army in UVA's opening NCAA game. Tillman Johnson also saved 18 shots in a game at Johns Hopkins in four overtimes in 2001.

**HOOPER SOLID ON DEFENSE**

• Defenseman Scott Hooper is No. 4 in the nation with 33 caused turnovers.

• His seven CTs against Robert Morris are the most by any player in the nation in a game this season.

• Midfielder Ryan Conrad and attackman Zed Williams are No. 1 and No. 2 on the team with 61 and 47 ground balls, respectively. The duo ranks No. 1 and No. 2 in the nation among non-faceoff specialists and defensemen in ground balls.

**KRAUS HOT IN ACC PLAY**

• Attackman Michael Kraus had 16 points on 12 goals and four assists in ACC play this season.

• The college rookie is averaging four points per ACC contest in 2017, going 4-2-6 at Syracuse, 5-2-7 vs. Notre Dame, 2-0-2 vs. North Carolina and 1-0-1 at Duke.

**WILLIAMS ALREADY IN THE 50-50 CLUB**

• Attackman Zed Williams (25-25-50 G-A-P and 50 ground balls) is the only player in the nation with at least 50 points and 50 ground balls.

## TIFFANY STARTED OUT 3-0 AT UVA

• Lars Tiffany won his first three games as Virginia's 17th head coach. He is only the fifth Cavalier head coach to not lose a game in his first contests at the helm. ## FIRST YEARS SHINE AT LOYOLA

• First years Dox Aitken (four goals) and Michael Kraus (two goals, three assists) led UVA with nine combined points at then-No. 6 Loyola.  
• The nine combined points is the most by a UVA freshmen duo in a season-opening collegiate debut since Drew McKnight (two goals, four assists) and Jay Jalbert (four goals) combined for 10 points in the 1997 season opener against then-No. 2 Syracuse.  
• Aitken's four goals in his collegiate debut makes the freshman the third Cavalier since 1997 to score four goals in a season-opening collegiate debut, joining Jay Jalbert (1997, 4 against Syracuse) and Joe Yevoli (2002, 4 against Drexel).

**AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017**

- Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.
- It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.
- Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

**TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER**

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.
- Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.
- Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

**VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE**

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.
- Currently UVA ranks No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (44.50).
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

**CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL**

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 30 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

**2017 CAPTAINS NAMED**

- Attackman Ryan Lukacovic, midfielder Will McNamara and defenseman Tanner Scales have been selected by their peers as the captains of the 2017 men's lacrosse team.
- Scales is a repeat captain from 2016.

**OVERTIME GAMES IN 2017**

- UVA has played three overtime games in 2017.
- In fact, they all came in a row, marking only the second time in program history such a feat has happened.
- This year UVA has gone to overtime with Cornell (March 11), Notre Dame (March 18) and Johns Hopkins (March 25).
- The only other time UVA has gone to overtime in three straight games was the 1980 NCAA Tournament and UVA beat Cornell in overtime, North Carolina in double overtime, before losing to Johns Hopkins in double overtime.

**VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER**

- Virginia owns a 131-34 (.7939) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 5-2 mark in 2017. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

**NEAR INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS**

- Virginia has lost only nine night games at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall UVA is 39-9 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium.
- UVA is 4-2 so far in 2017 under the Klöckner lights.
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights, ironically, also to Duke on April 17, 2010.
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA also lost to North Carolina in 2015, a 7 p.m. start.
- UVA lost its first night game in 2016, an overtime setback (12-11) to High Point.

No. 3 Notre Dame (4-1, 1-0 ACC) outlasted No. 13 Virginia (5-3, 0-2 ACC) in overtime, 11-10, at Klöckner Stadium. UVA has lost all three of its games this season by one goal. There was also a lightning delay in the first quarter that delayed the game for one hour and thirteen minutes.

Virginia owned a 10-9 lead with 6:33 left to play after Mike D'Amario was fed on the crease from Michael Kraus. Notre Dame responded with a goal by Sergio Perkovic at 4:47, forcing the overtime period. UVA had a chance in the closing seconds, but a shot by Kraus was blocked out in front.

UVA won the overtime faceoff, but immediately turned the ball over. After a big time save by freshman goalie Griffin Thompson, making his first collegiate start, UVA was on the offensive.
