FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVa and Cornell are meeting for the 15th time in series history and for the sixth time in Charlottesville.
- UVa is playing its 21st all-time game on U-Hall's Turf Field and owns an 18-2 all-time record at the venue.
- Today marks the first time UVa has played at the UHall Turf Field since beating Mount St. Mary's, 18-11, in 2013.
- Last time Cornell came to Charlottesville in 2013, UVa's James Pannell was able to play in the same lacrosse game for the first time as his brother. 2013 Tewaaraton Trophy winner Rob Pannell was a fifth-year senior during James' first year at UVa.
- UVa's first loss at UHall Turf Field came in an 18-17 OT thriller to Syracuse on Feb. 28, 1998. The only other UVa loss at UHall Turf Field came in 2007 against Drexel.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia returns home to face the Cornell Big Red on Saturday at U-Hall Turf Field. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m. UVa is ranked No. 7 this week in the USILA coaches poll and No. 8 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Cornell is ranked No. 8 in the coaches poll and No. 7 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE BIG RED

The 2014 season marks the seventh-straight season the Cavaliers and Big Red have faced each other in a series where UVa holds a 9-5 all-time advantage. The series began during the regular season in 1971, a game contested in Charlottesville. The next five meetings took place in the NCAA Tournament, including UVa's first trip to Ithaca in 1974. The series returned to regular-season meetings in 2009 when Cornell came to Klöckner Stadium.

Matt Kerwick is in his second season as the Big Red's head coach. Kerwick welcomes back 19 letterwinners and eight starters off Cornell's 11-5 NCAA first round 2014 team.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 260-91 (.741) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 351 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVa head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVa Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. CORNELL

- Virginia holds a 9-5 advantage in the all-time series vs. Cornell.
- Virginia holds the 5-2 lead in the all-time series when its played during the regular season.
- Three of Cornell's five wins against UVa have come in the NCAA Tournament where UVa holds a narrow series advantage, 4-3, in postseason play.
- Cornell's 12-11 win at Klöckner Stadium in 2013 was the Big Red's first win in the series during the regular season. The Big Red overcame a four goal deficit in the third quarter, stealing the victory on a Steve Mock goal with 13 seconds left.
- UVa's 11-9 win over Cornell in 2011's Face-Off Classic and its 9-8 overtime win in the 2012 Face-Off Classic are the only two regular season neutral site meetings in the series.
- The other four neutral site meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament.
- The two teams met for the first time during the 1971 regular season with the Cavaliers winning 10-9 at home.
- Besides the 2011 & 2012 Face-Off Classics, the 2010 and 2014 games in Ithaca and the 2009 & 2013 meeting at Klöckner Stadium, all the other match-ups have occurred in the NCAA Tournament (1974, '79, '80, '88, '02, '09, '11), including the 2011 NCAA quarterfinal round.
- The 1988 and 2009 games occurred in the semifinals, while all remaining NCAA meetings were quarterfinal match-ups.
- Of the eight other programs to win the NCAA title, Virginia has faced Cornell the fewest times. Only Loyola (Md.) is close with 17 meetings.
- Virginia gained an 11-10 win in the '02 quarterfinals at Johns Hopkins' Homewood Field.
- Conor Gill was the star that day for Virginia. He scored the team's first goal and assisted on the final nine. His nine assists are an NCAA Tournament record.
- Colin Briggs had three goals to earn MVP honors of the Face-Off Classic contest against Cornell on March 12, 2011, then scored the overtime goal to beat the Big Red 9-8 during the 2012 Face-Off Classic.

CORNELL IS NO STRANGER TO STARSIA

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia knows the Cornell program well dating back to his days as a player in the Ivy League at Brown.
- As a player there from 1971-74 and later Brown's coach from 1983-92, he went up against the Big Red on an annual basis.
- As a varsity lacrosse player from 1972-74, the Bears won once and lost twice to Cornell.
- Starsia later led Brown to five wins against Cornell in 10 games as head coach at his alma mater.
- He is now 6-3 against Cornell as the head coach at Virginia.
- Starsia's 2011 NCAA meeting with Cornell was one of historic record - the 13-9 win in the 2011 NCAA Quarterfinal round gave him 327 career victories as a head coach, pushing him past the iconic Jack Emmer for most triumphs at a Division I school.
- The win came at Hofstra, roughly seven miles from where Starsia grew up in Valley Stream, N.Y., and on the same field he coached his very first game as a college head coach at Brown - the game ironically was against Virginia on March 13, 1983.

ALL-TIME RECORD AT THE UNIVERSITY HALL TURF FIELD

- UVa holds a 18-2 all-time mark on the UHall Turf Field
- Today marks the first time UVa has played at the UHall Turf Field since beating Mount St. Mary's, 18-11, in 2013.
- Since 1996, there have been seven seasons UVa has not played at least one game at the UHall Turf Field (2000 – 2004 – 2008 – 2009 – 2011 – 2012 – 2014).

NO MIDDLE GROUND

- One of the characteristics of the series between the two schools seems to be there is no middle ground—the games are either extremely tight or routs.
- Four of Virginia's nine wins have been by one goal (including Randy Natoli's extra-man goal 47 seconds into overtime for a 9-8 win in 1980), while all three of Cornell's victories have been by at least seven goals (The Cavaliers' other wins were by seven goals (1979), four goals (2009), eight goals (2010), two goals (2011) and four goals (2011 NCAA QF))
- Cornell's 17-6 win in the 1988 national semifinals represents Virginia's largest loss in NCAA Tournament play and stood as UVa's only loss by more than 10 goals until 2005.
- Curiously Virginia has won nine of the 13 games in the series but has only out-scored Cornell 135-134 all-time.
- Cornell's 12-11 win last season is its only win in the series that was not a blowout.

UVA TOPS RANKED TEAM IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- UVa's men's lacrosse team (2-0) has opened the season with wins over No. 7 Loyola (13-12) and No. 16 Drexel (14-10).
- It marks the the eighth time in Dom Starsia's 23 seasons as UVa's head coach the Cavaliers have opened up a season facing back-to-back ranked opponents.
- It is only the third time UVa has swept those ranked opponents, splitting the other five times.
- In addition to this season the feat also happened in 2011 and 1995.
- UVa is ranked No. 7 in this week's USILA coaches poll and eight of UVa's 13 regular season opponents have been ranked in the Top 20. Another two opponents have received votes in the sports' oldest poll (established in 1973).

UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH

- The 2015 UVa defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.
- At SSDM you have sophomore Will McNamara, who made his collegiate debut at Loyola. Sophomore Carlson Milikin and freshman Jack Falk also ran at SSDM against Loyola.
- Sophomore goalie Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- In uncharacteristic fashion for UVa, the Cavaliers have lost all four ground ball battles this season. One contributing factor is UVa is only winning 36.8 percent (39-of-106) of its faceoffs.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 119-25 (.8264) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 1-0 mark in 2015. UVa also is 11-2 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011
- UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVa is 23-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 13-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a five-goal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third quarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.

The No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) overcame a snowstorm and an early three-goal deficit to defeat No. 16 Drexel (0-1) at Klöckner Stadium, 14-10.

Drexel scored the game's first three goals to take an early 3-0 lead. UVa fought back with a 6-1 run to take a 7-5 lead with 3:45 left in the second period. Ryan Tucker scored two goals during the run and Zed Williams capped the scoring with an unassisted goal.

Zed Williams scored a career-high four goals and assisted another to help propel No. 6 Virginia (3-0) to a 14-5 road win over Rutgers (1-2), inside High Point Solutions Stadium.

The first half was all Williams as the sophomore midfielder tallied a hat trick to help give UVa a 6-1 lead entering the intermission. Williams started the scoring with an unassisted score at 9:58. Matt Emery followed up with his second goal of the season at 8:54. Zack Sikora put Rutgers on the board with a transition goal at 5:11.

Williams scored two more unassisted goals to start the second quarter and James Pannell found nylon with 19 seconds left in the second quarter to cap the first half scoring. Rutgers peppered 21 shots in the first half and UVa goalie Matt Barrett made 11 saves, and allowed one goal.
