### FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Sunday marks the 31st all-time meeting between Virginia and Syracuse and the 10th meeting at the Carrier Dome.
- UVa and Syracuse are meeting for the 17th time when both teams are ranked in the USILA coaches poll's top 5. UVa holds a slight lead in those games with a 9-7 record.
- UVa head coach Dom Starsia coached his 350th career game for the Cavaliers last week at Rutgers. He is closing in on career number 500. Sunday's game at Syracuse will be career game number 498.
- UVa head coach Dom Starsia and Syracuse head coach John Desko have a combined nine NCAA titles between them. Denver's Bill Tierney is the only other active coach to have won at least four NCAA titles.
- This week's USILA coaches poll places UVa at No. 5 in the nation, marking the 400th week the Cavaliers have found themselves ranked in the top 10 since the poll began in 1973.

### GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia (3-0) heads north again on Sunday to face the Syracuse Orange (3-0) at the Carrier Dome. Faceoff is set for noon. UVa is ranked No. 5 in both the USILA coaches poll and the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Syracuse is ranked No. 2 in the coaches poll and No. 3 in the media poll.

### THE SERIES VS. ORANGE

The Cavaliers and Orange are meeting for the 31st time in series history, but are playing each other for only the second time as part of ACC play. Virginia has won 9 of the last 12 regular season meetings, but two of the three losses have come at the Carrier Dome (2011 and 2013). UVa owns the narrow 16-14 margin in the all-time series between two programs that recently won four NCAA titles between 2006-11.

The Orange came away with a 9-8 overtime win the last time these teams got together at the Carrier Dome in 2013. It marked the first time that neither team reached double figures in goals scored in series history.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 260-90 (.743) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 350 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

**HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST**

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

**COVERING THE CAVALIERS**

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**CREDENTIALS**

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

**RADIO**

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

**INTERVIEWS**

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

When covering a game at Klöckner Stadium, please include the umlaut above the letter 'ö' in Klöckner. Mac users can do this by clicking Alt-u or Option-u and then typing the letter o. PC users should make sure their number lock is off and then type Alt 0246.

**THE SERIES VS. SYRACUSE**

- UVa narrowly leads the series 16-14 which mimics the back-and-forth scoring characteristic of the games between the two teams.
- The two schools battled only three times between 1938-93, but have met at least once each season since 1994.
- The regular-season series began in 1995, Dom Starsia's third season at Virginia.
- The two schools have also met six times in the NCAA Tournament since 1995.
- Virginia has won nine of the last 12 meetings in the series, including six straight regular-season matchups until the 2011 setback at the Carrier Dome.
- The Cavaliers' success lately closely mirrors that of the Orange who won eight of nine games from 1997-2002.
- The Orange won in overtime, 9-8, in last meeting in the Dome during the 2013 season. It was the first time in the series that neither team scored in the double figures.
- Another recent heartbreaking UVa loss saw the Orange pull out a dramatic come-from-behind 12-11 double overtime win in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Tournament on the way to capturing the national championship.
- The 2008 Syracuse NCAA win ended Virginia's five-game series winning streak, the longest by either team in the series.
- Both teams are known for their high-scoring offenses, but it is interesting to note that since 1999 Syracuse has scored at least 15 goals only four times (2002-03-04-06) and Virginia four (03-06-06-14) in the series.
- Virginia's loss in 2011 snapped a three game win streak in the "Dome" over Syracuse, a feat boasted by no other opponent of the Orange.
- The last meeting between UVa and Syracuse at Klöckner Stadium in 2014, James Pannell scored a career-high seven goals in a 17-12 triumph.

**WHEN UVA AND SYRACUSE IS A TOP 5 MATCHUP**

- UVA and Syracuse are meeting for the 17th time where both teams are ranked in the top 5 of the USILA coaches poll.
- UVA is 9-7 all-time in series history against Syracuse when both teams are ranked in the top five of the USILA coaches poll.
- UVA head coach Dom Starsia and Syracuse John Desko are meeting for the ninth time when both their squads are ranked in the top five. UVA holds a narrow 5-3 advantage in those games.
- UVA and Syracuse's meeting in 2011 at the Carrier Dome was a No. 1 vs. No. 1 matchup in the USILA poll. Both teams shared the coaches poll's top spot, marking only the second time since the poll was introduced in 1973 two teams shared the No. 1 ranking in the same week. The 1985 regular season final poll had Syracuse and Johns Hopkins sharing the top spot. Syracuse and Johns Hopkins later faced each other for the NCAA title.

**TIGHT GAMES CHARACTERIZE SERIES**

- The potential for a high-scoring game such as the classic 1997 match-up won by Syracuse 22-21 is one of the main reasons this game is so widely anticipated.
- However, since 1996 a three-goal win can be considered a "blow out"
- 16 of the last 23 games since then have been decided by just one or two goals.
- More than half the games between the two schools (18 of 30), have been decided by one or two goals, including both games in 2008, which went to overtime.
- In the history of the series, the biggest win by either team is a 13-4 Syracuse win in 1938 in the first meeting between the two squads.
- Virginia's biggest win is a 15-7 victory in the Carrier Dome in 1995.
- UVA's 14-10 win in 2012 was the largest winning-margin for the Cavaliers in the series since winning 17-10 in the 2006 Final Four.
- UVA's 2014 win was a five-goal margin, 17-12, at Klöckner Stadium.

**NO WONDER THE SERIES IS NEARLY 50/50**

- Since Dom Starsia became head coach at Virginia in 1993, the two teams have met 27 times—with Syracuse winning 13 times and Virginia 14.
- 17 of those games have been decided by one or two goals, including a string of five meetings - both games in 2008 went to overtime - until UVA's four-goal win in 2012 in Charlottesville snapped the streak.

**UVA TOPS RANKED TEAM IN FIRST TWO GAMES**

- UVA's men's lacrosse team (2-0) has opened the season with wins over No. 7 Loyola (13-12) and No. 16 Drexel (14-10).
- It marks the the eighth time in Dom Starsia's 23 seasons as UVA's head coach the Cavaliers have opened up a season facing back-to-back ranked opponents.
- It is only the third time UVA has swept those ranked opponents, splitting the other five times.
- In addition to this season the feat also happened in 2011 and 1995.
- UVA is ranked No. 6 in this week's USILA coaches poll and eight of UVA's 13 regular season opponents are also ranked in the Top 20. Another two opponents are receiving votes in the sports' oldest poll (established in 1973).

**UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH**

- The 2015 UVA defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.

- Sophomore goalie Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

**VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE**

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- In uncharacteristic fashion for UVa, the Cavaliers have lost all three ground ball battles this season. One contributing factor is UVa is only winning 40.5 percent (32-of-79) of its faceoffs.

**VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER**

- Virginia owns a 119-25 (.8264) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 1-0 mark in 2015. UVa also is 11-2 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

**CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL**

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011
- UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

**VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA**

- UVa is 23-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 13-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

**DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS**

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 243 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 243 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means in the midst of 23 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 22.6 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVa's dominance are Syracuse at 48 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a five-goal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third quarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.

The No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) overcame a snowstorm and an early three-goal deficit to defeat No. 16 Drexel (0-1) at Klöckner Stadium, 14-10.

Drexel scored the game's first three goals to take an early 3-0 lead. UVa fought back with a 6-1 run to take a 7-5 lead with 3:45 left in the second period. Ryan Tucker scored two goals during the run and Zed Williams capped the scoring with an unassisted goal.

Jules Raucci tallied a goal at 2:05 in the second quarter to bring Drexel within one goal, 7-6, but that was as close as the Dragons got to the Cavaliers. James Pannell scored on a Ryan Lukacovic helper with 26 seconds left that started a 5-1 Cavalier run that carried into the third quarter.

The snow came bellowing in during half-time, forcing a 15-minute delay to clear the lines and stock the field with yellow lacrosse balls.

The UVa run continued with the Cavaliers scoring the first four goals of the third quarter. Pannell score the first, followed by Owen Van Arsdale and then Jeff Kratky capped the run after winning the ensuing faceoff and streaking in for the goal, giving Virginia an 11-6 advantage at the 8:29 mark in the third quarter.

Drexel and Virginia traded two goals apiece over the next several minutes with the score standing at 14-8 with 12:33 left. Drexel managed back-to-back goals to cut the UVa advantage to four goals, 14-10, courtesy of Jake Gennosa and Ryan Belka. The two goals by Drexel capped the game's scoring as UVa's defense thwarted any Drexel comeback attempt.

Lukacovic, Pannell and Tucker all led UVa with four points, while Matt Barrett made 12 saves in the cage, four of which came in a late fourth-quarter barrage by the Dragons. Van Arsdale led all players with three goals.
