VIRGINIA-GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- Georgia Tech owns a 63-40-2 series edge over Virginia, although UVA is 13-8-1 against the Yellow Jackets since the current coaching staff took over in 2004.
- Last year the Cavaliers took two of three in Charlottesville.
- In UVA's last trip to Atlanta, the teams split three games, 1-1-1. Both teams scored 21 runs in the series.
- Recent games have been extremely tight – 18 of the 22 games since 2004 have been decided by three runs or fewer (10 by one run or a tie).

VIRGINIA OFF TO BEST 30-GAME START IN SCHOOL HISTORY, TIED FOR BEST START IN ACC HISTORY

- Virginia started the season with a 28-2 record, the best 30-game start in program history.
- This also matches the best 30-game start to a season in ACC history.
- The 2007 Florida State and 1977 and 1995 Clemson teams also got off to 28-2 starts to their seasons.
- The best start in NCAA history came from the 1977 Texas team, which began the season with 34-consecutive wins.

WIN STREAKS ON THE LINE THIS WEEKEND

- Virginia has won 10 straight games, dating to March 22 against Towson.
- It marks UVA's second double-figure win streak of the year; the Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19. It also is the first time UVA has posted two double-figure win streaks in one season.
- Virginia is 7-0 on the road this year and has won nine straight road games, dating to the 2010 season. The nine-game streak is the longest current road win streak in the nation.
- The nine-game road win streak also matches the school record, set from May 17, 2003 to March 14, 2004.

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN FIRST RPI

- Virginia is ranked No. 2 in the first RPI report, announced Tuesday by the NCAA.
- Florida holds the No. 1 spot in the first report; Georgia Tech stands No. 5.
- Virginia already has eight wins against the RPI top 25 and 11 against the top 50 this year.

- UVA owns a 10-game win streak, the longest current streak in the nation.
- UVA is outscoring its opponents by 5.2 runs per game (best in Division I).

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.3 runs per game, fewest in Division I baseball.
- Virginia owns a .984 fielding percentage, which is second in the nation behind San Francisco (.986).
- UVa has committed 18 errors in 31 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-5 in all of those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (5th, 2.00), strikeouts/nine innings (2nd, 10.6), fewest hits/9 inns (2nd, 6.38), fewest walks/9 inns (5th, 2.09).
- UVa has recorded nine shutouts and allowed more than four earned runs just once this year.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,004 games all time (1,608 losses, 40 ties).

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 64 batters (2.03/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 1.93 team ERA.
- UVa averages more than a walk fewer per nine innings than any other ACC team this year. (FSU, 3.16/9 IP).

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this season with 78, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA, who has 82.
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in six of his seven starts this season (15.16 per nine innings - first in the nation).
- He has issued only nine walks (8.67:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 7-0 in Hultzen's starts this year and 31-8 in his career, including 21-2 since 2010; UVa is 12-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia has won 13 straight series openers with Hultzen pitching, dating to April 2, 2010 at NC State.
- He has allowed no more than six hits in any start this season.

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record two weeks ago. With 308 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He needs four strikeouts to reach the top 20.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He is now second in career wins at UVa with 26; the record is 27, set by Jacob Thompson (2006-08).
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.929; 26-2), just ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.28 stands fourth in UVa history, while his 308 strikeouts ranks first.
- He ranks ninth in innings pitched with 248.1. With 2.0 innings he will match Frank Lankford (1990-93) for eighth.

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort last week against George Washington, Will Roberts has been named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced Monday.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

NOTING THE ROBERTS PERFECT GAME

Some quick bullet points on Will Roberts' perfect game against George Washington on March 29:

- Eighth nine-inning perfect game in NCAA Division I since 1957 (19 total - 10 7-inning, one 5-inning)
- Second ACC perfect game (Dick Reitz of Maryland vs. Johns Hopkins, 1957)
- First perfect game in Virginia history; first UVa no-hitter since Mike Ballard vs. BC on April 16, 2006
- First perfect game in Division I since March 2, 2002 (Auburn's Eric Brandon vs. Murray State)
- Roberts threw 98 pitches (67 strikes)
- He went to just four three-ball counts (one 3-0 count) and six two-ball counts
- He was behind in the count in just 12 instances (five were at 1-0); nine outs came on first two pitches
- Roberts recorded 10 strikeouts, 14 groundouts, two pop outs and one fly out
- He tied a career high with his 10 strikeouts
- Final out came on a groundout to second baseman Keith Werman, who was the busiest UVa defender with seven assists and two putouts
- It was Roberts' first career complete game and shutout (previous career high was 7.2 innings)
- He threw seven pitches in second and seventh inning and eight in the third
- Game lasted just 1 hour, 55 minutes
- The perfect game earned ESPN's top play that night and the next day
- The win marked Virginia's 2,000th victory in program history (122 seasons)

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has virtually stopped its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just nine stolen bases in 20 at-tempts (45 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 15 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 55 percent of potential base stealers, UVa easily tops the ACC. UNC is second at 42.5 percent.

SHUTOUTS PILING UP

- Virginia has recorded an ACC-best nine shutouts in its 29 wins this season. That represents more than the last two seasons combined (five in 2009, two in 2010).
- It is the third most in program history (tied with the 2007 team).
- The school record for shutouts in a season is 11, set in 2005. That mark is tied for the ACC record with the 1977 Clemson team.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 25 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 19 dates), Virginia ranked 22nd nationally in total attendance in 2011 with a total of 49,868.
- UVa also stood 22nd in average attendance at 2,624 fans per game.
- UVa has played in front of four home crowds of 3,000-plus this season.

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 11 saves in as many opportunities.
- He is tied for the national lead with Georgia's Tyler Maloof; the total also is tied for the fourth most in a season in UVa history.
- Kline has struck out 24 in 17.2 innings. In that span he has allowed two runs, 10 hits and five walks (1.02 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

COLEMAN RIDES 9-GAME HIT STREAK

- David Coleman has a nine-game hitting streak entering the weekend.
- That represents a career best.
- During this stretch he is 13-for-28 (.464) with 10 RBI.
- He registered a four-hit, five-RBI game last Saturday at Virginia Tech (career highs in both categories).

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate to start the year.
- He is batting a team-best .362, which ranks eighth in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks has racked up a .333 batting average in nine ACC games this season (14th in conference).

PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .426 clip (23-for-54). That ranks fourth in the conference.
- He stands first among the conference's players with 16 RBI and second with 23 hits in ACC games.
- He owns a .448 on base percentage in ACC play.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers.
- He has moved into seventh place in career RBI at Virginia with 155; he needs two RBI to match Dan Grovatt (2008-10) for sixth and three to tie George Priftis (1980-83) for fifth.
- He is 12 shy of Sean Doolittle's school record of 167.
- Proscia also owns 51 career doubles, which fourth in the Virginia career annals.
- He needs one double to match Bill Narleski (1984-87) for third and two to tie Brandon Guyer (2005-07) for second.
- Proscia also is 17 hits shy of reaching the top 10 in Virginia history.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He ranks fourth on the team with a .310 batting average and stands fourth in the ACC with 33 runs.
- He has notched hits in 26 of his 31 games this year and has reached base safely in all but one game.
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

CAVALIERS SHUT DOWN BIG OFFENSES

- Virginia is yielding just 2.29 runs per game — the fewest in Division I baseball; Texas A&M is second at 2.37.
- It's not like UVa is padding its numbers against inferior offenses. UVa has played seven games (six wins) against top 25 offenses in the nation this year.
- UVa swept three games from Clemson (No. 22, 7.5 runs/game), won two of three against Florida State (No. 15, 7.8) and picked up a 7-3 midweek victory over James Madison (No. 1, 10.6).

ROTATION SETS TONE FOR CAVALIERS

- Virginia's starting rotation of Danny Hultzen, Tyler Wilson and Cody Winiarski collectively has been strong this year.
- The three have combined to go 14-1 with a 2.05 ERA in 127.1 innings. The trio has allowed just 89 hits and 30 walks while striking out 164.
- Last weekend the trio allowed just two earned runs in 18 innings in the Virginia Tech series.
- They have allowed more than two runs in a start just four times this year.

ROBERTS RUNS SCORELESS STREAK TO 21 INNS

- After pitching seven scoreless innings against Radford, Will Roberts ran his scoreless innings streak to 21.

LAST WEEKEND: VIRGINIA SWEEPS HOKIES

- Virginia swept its three-game series with Virginia Tech last weekend in Blacksburg, outscoring the Hokies 37-8 in the series (18-3, 9-3, 10-2).
- UVa scored a season-high 18 runs in the opener.
- Virginia's starting pitchers allowed just two runs – both coming in the first inning of game one. In all, Hultzen, Wilson and Winiarski combined to work 18 innings and allow just 13 hits and five walkswhile striking out 19.
- All eight Virginia Tech runs scored on home runs.
- David Coleman went 5-for-8 (.625) for the weekend, with a four-hit, five-RBI game Saturday.
- Kenny Swab hit .545 (6-for-11) with seven runs scored, while Jared King was 4-for-9 with six RBI.

2010: VIRGINIA WINS 2 OF 3 AGAINST JACKETS

- Virginia took two of three games last year with Georgia Tech, winning the opener 7-4, dropping the Saturday game, 9-7, and cruising to a 9-1 win in the rubber game.
- Danny Hultzen out-dueled Deck McGuire in the opener; UVa pitchers combined to strike out 17 in the win.
- Virginia held Georgia Tech to 14 runs and 24 hits in the series – the Yellow Jackets were averaging 10.8 runs and 12.5 hits per game entering the weekend.
- Tyler Cannon went 5-for-10 in the series, while Jarrett Parker was 4-for-10. Stephen Bruno had a team-best six RBI in the series.
- UVa scored 23 runs in the series; Georgia Tech's pitching staff entered with an ACC-low 3.15 ERA.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 4-0 with a 1.90 ERA this year. In 42.2 innings he has allowed just 33 hits and 11 walks with 55 strikeouts (third most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 21 career wins, which is tied for third in Virginia history (21-7, 2.97 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 79 (eight starts).

WILSON A CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 19.0 innings out of the bullpen and 23.0 innings total in 21 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVa averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.
