Virginia Tech Hosts 8th-ranked Florida State Thursday Night on ESPN Coastal Leader Miami at Virginia; BC Hosts #4 Notre Dame 10th-Ranked Clemson, Maryland Meet in Key Atlantic Division Game

With just three weeks remaining in the regular season, 8th-ranked Florida State and Miami have emerged as the leaders in the Atlantic and Coastal Divisions...The Seminoles of Coach **Jimbo Fisher** are tied with Clemson for the Atlantic Division lead, but would earn a berth with wins at Virginia Tech this Thursday night and at Maryland on Nov. 17, by virtue of their regular season win over the Tigers on Sept. 22...FSU, led by senior **QB EJ Manuel** and featuring a defensive unit which leads the nation in total defense (227.11 yds/gm), faces Virginia Tech in a nationally televised game at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg Thursday night (ESPN, 7:30 p.m.)...The Hokies, coached by Frank Beamer, and led by **QB Logan Thomas**, are looking to stay in the Coastal Division race...The Hokies are a game and half behind Miami and cannot afford another league loss after dropping a 30-12 decision to the "U" last Thursday night...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden** and led by **QB Stephen Morris**, can claim a berth in Charlotte by defeating Virginia this Saturday in Charlottesville at Scott Stadium (ABC, Noon) and Duke on Nov. 24 in Durham...Virginia, coached by **Mike London** and led by its QB tandem of junior **Michael Rocco** and sophomore **Phillip Sims**, is coming off an impressive 33-6 win over NC State and needs to win its final three games to earn a bowl invitation...In Clemson, S.C., the 10th-ranked Clemson Tigers,

coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Tajh Boyd**, hosts Maryland, coached by **Randy Edsall** and led by **DE Joe Vellano** and a defense ranked 11th nationally (301.67)...Clemson is looking to keep pace with the Seminoles in the Atlantic race and could earn a trip to Charlotte should FSU falter...Boyd has thrown 5 TD passes in the first half of each of his last two games and has accounted for 871 yards of total offense and 11 TDR...Due to an unprecedented spate of injuries to their quarterbacks, the Terrapins are down to their 5th starting signal caller since the beginning of fall camp in converted linebacker **Shawn Petty**, a true freshman...In Chapel Hill, N.C., North Carolina hosts Georgia Tech at Kenan Stadium (ACC network, 12:30 pm) in an important Coastal Division battle...Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** led by **RB Orwin Smith**, still has hopes for a berth in the ACC Championship Game, but needs to win against the Tar Heels and on Nov. 17 at home versus Duke, while getting help against Miami and Virginia Tech...The Tar Heels, coached by Larry Fedora and led by **TB Giovani Bernard** and **QB Bryn Renner**, have an opportunity to actually finish the year with the best record in the Coastal Division, but are ineligible for postseason play due to NCAA sanctions...Bernard leads the nation in punt returns, is 3rd nationally in all-purpose yardage and scoring and 5th in rushing...In

Raleigh, NC State, coached by **Tom O'Brien** and led by **QB Mike Glennon**, and Wake Forest, coached by **Jim Grobe** and led by **QB Tanner Price**, meet in an Atlantic Division contest at Carter-Finley Stadium (3 p.m., RSN) that will make one team bowl eligible...Both teams come into Saturday's contest with 5-4 records and need one more victory to qualify for postseason play...The Deacons and Wolfpack will be meeting for the 106th time in a series which has been played every year since 1910 and is the ACC's longest continuous football rivalry...Finally, Boston College, coached by **Frank Spaziani** and led by the junior passing combination of **QB Chase Rettig** and **WR Alex Amidon**, will host 4th-ranked and undefeated Notre Dame (9-0) in a nationally televised primetime contest at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill, Mass. (8 p.m., ABC)...Amidon ranks 5th nationally in receiving yards per game...The Irish, coached by **Brian Kelly**, and led by **LB Manti Te'o**, are coming off a heart-stopping 29-26 triple overtime win over future ACC member Pittsburgh last weekend and are ranked 2nd nationally in scoring defense...Notre Dame, which announced in August that it would be joining the ACC, will be meeting its second of three ACC foes this fall, having defeated Miami on Oct. 6 and faces Wake Forest next week.

National Football Hall of Fame To Induct Miami's Jimmy Johnson

Atlantic Coast Conference schools will have one inductee this year at the annual National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annual banquet in New York City. Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

Johnson coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

2012 ACC Football By The Numbers

1st - For the seventh time in the last eight years, the **Atlantic Coast Conference** leads the nation in the FBS in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR). ACC schools combined for an average GSR of 74.75%. The ACC was the only FBS league nationally to have multiple teams finish with 90 percent GSR or better in every year since 2006, with three schools--Boston College (94), Miami (92) and Duke (92)--recording GSRs this year of well over 90 percent.

1 - **Florida State's** defense leads the nation in total defense. The Seminole stop troops are allowing just 227.11 yards per game. They are also ranked 3rd nationally in scoring defense, 3rd in rushing defense and 2nd in pass efficiency defense.

Also 1- North Carolina sophomore **TB Giovanni Bernard** leads the nation in punt return average (20.75), is 3rd nationally in all-purpose yardage (214.0) and scoring (12.86) and 5th in rushing (132.9). In his last four games, Bernard has run for 717 yards, an average of 179.3 yards per game, while averaging 7.4 yards per carry.

3 - Boston College **LB Nick Clancy** ranks 3rd this week in the nation in tackles per game. Clancy, who succeeded Luke Kuechly at his position, is averaging 11.89 hits per game. Kuechly led the nation in tackles per game in 2010 and 2011.

4 - The number of ACC placekickers named as semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, which is given annually to the nation's best placekicker. Named to the semifinal list of 20 are Florida State's **Dustin Hopkins**, Clemson's **Chandler Catanzaro**, Duke's **Ross Martin** and North Carolina's **Casey Barth**. Hopkins is a semifinalist for the 3rd time and was also a finalist last year.

5 - When Maryland started true freshman **Shawn Petty** at QB last Saturday, it marked the 5th different starting quarterback for the Terrapins' since they began fall camp due to an unprecedented run of injuries at the position. Original starter **C.J. Brown** was lost for the season in pre-season camp. True freshman **Perry Hills** started the first 7 games before succumbing to a knee injury in the NC State game. His backup, WR convert **Devin Burns** suffered a foot injury in the same game. One week later, in his first college start, true freshman **Caleb Rowe** was also lost for the year with a knee injury. Petty, who was playing linebacker until the injuries to Hills and Burns, completed 9 of 18 passes for 115 yards and 2 TDs and ran for 24 more yards in his first college action.

6 - Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** tied an ACC single-game record for touchdown responsibility for the second time in his career, throwing for 5 TDs and running for a sixth in the Tigers win over Duke. Boyd originally tied the record last year with 6 TDR against North Carolina, but this year he tied the ACC single-game record in the FIRST HALF.

7 - Maryland true freshman **WR Stefon Diggs** ranks 7th nationally in all-purpose yards this week, the most of any freshman nationally. In fact, Diggs' per-game average of 174.9 yards per game is better than the ACC season record of 171.4, set last year's by Clemson's **Sammy Watkins**, who earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors and was also a first-team AP All-America.

13 - Clemson junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins** had 3 TD catches in the Tigers' win over Duke and now leads the ACC with 13 touchdown catches this season. The single-season league record is 17 TD receptions by former Duke All-America NFF Hall of Fame member **Clarkston Hines** in 1989.

16 - Wake Forest junior **WR Michael Campanaro** tied an ACC single-game record held by four others when he caught 16 passes for 123 yards against Boston College.

17 - The number of career interceptions for NC State junior **CB David Amerson**, who led the nation in interceptions last year. Amerson leads the nation among active players in career interceptions and is tied for 4th on the ACC career list. Clemson's **Rashard Hall**, who has 13 career picks, is tied for 4th nationally among active players.

26 - The number of times **ACC teams** have topped the 40-point mark this season. With three weeks to go in the regular season, as well as the Championship Game and bowl games, the conference could break its single-season record of 30 40-point games set in 2010.

30 - The number of times **ACC teams** have topped the 500-yard mark in total offense through the first ten weeks of this year. In all of the 2011 season, conference teams only topped the 500-yard mark a total of 15 times.

34 - The number of career rushing touchdowns for Georgia Tech senior **QB Tevin Washington**. This year, Washington is tied for 9th nationally in points per game (10.67) and is 2nd the ACC career list in career TDs for a QB, trailing only former ACC standout **Joshua Nesbitt** of Georgia Tech (35).

37 - With a 56-point outing against Duke Thursday night, **Clemson** became the only team in ACC history to score 37 or more points in 8 consecutive games. The Tigers' streak began on Sept. 8 with a 52-point outing against Ball State and Clemson has averaged 44.8 points a game during the streak. The 1995 Florida State team opened the year with seven straight games of 42 or more points and averaged 56.1 points a game during that span.

45 - Duke's **Conner Vernon** has now caught a pass in 45 consecutive games, every game of his Blue Devil career. The streak is the longest, current streak in the NCAA's FBS and Vernon has tied the ACC record set by North Carolina's **Corey Holliday** during the 1990-93 seasons.

67.3 - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 498 of 740 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .673. If maintained for the rest of this year, that would be the best in ACC history. Virginia's **Matt Schaub** (.670) and Wake Forest's **Riley Skinner** (.669) are currently 1-2 on the career list.

81 - The number of career field goals for Florida State senior **PK Dustin Hopkins**, who is now the ACC's career leader. Hopkins' record-breaker was a

career-long 56-yard field goal against Duke. He is in 4th place on the NCAA's career list and needs just 7 field goals to break the record set by Georgia's **Billy Bennett** during the 2000-03 seasons.

106 - Saturday's meeting between Wake Forest and NC State extends the longest, continuous series in the ACC as the two rivals have met every year since 1910, or 102 consecutive years. This week's game marks the 106th meeting of the two Atlantic Division schools in a series which began in Raleigh in 1895 and resulted in a 4-4 tie.

130 - Boston College junior **WR Alex Amidon** had 130 receiving yards against Wake Forest. That marked the 6th time in 9 games that Amidon has topped 100-yards in a game this fall, the most of any receiver in the league. He also topped 1,000 receiving yards for the first time in his career and now has 1,073 yards this season on 67 catches.

240.85 - The pass efficiency rating for Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** in the Tigers' 56-20 win over Duke. Boyd threw for 5 TD passes in the first half alone for the second consecutive week. He completed 16 of 23 passes for 344 yards, 3 interceptions and 5 TDs.

257 - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon became the ACC's all-time career-leading receiver on Oct. 6 against Virginia. He has shattered the old mark of 232 catches set by Clemson's **Aaron Kelly** during the 2005-2008 seasons. His career total of 3,483 receiving yards puts him in 4th place on the ACC career list. He needs 35 receiving yards to set a new standard, currently held by FSU's **Peter Warrick** (3,517).

255 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 255 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. With the Hokies' win over Duke on Oct. 13, Beamer tied former Nebraska head coach **Tom Osborne** for 7th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list.

318.22 - **Georgia Tech** is averaging 318.22 yards per game this year in rushing offense, which ranks 4th nationally. Since the beginning of the 2008 season, when head coach **Paul Johnson** brought his spread option attack to the Flats, Tech has rushed for more yards than any other team in the FBS. During that time, Tech has averaged 304.34 rushing yards per game with 18,869 yards in 62 games.

429 - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** improved upon his ACC and Florida State career scoring records last weekend with a 12-point performance against Duke. That gives him 429 points for his career, outdistancing the records of 393 points set by Maryland's **Nick Novak** (ACC, 2001-04) and **Derek Schmidt**. He is now in 3rd place on the NCAA's career list for points by kicking and needs only 11 points to break the NCAA record of 439 points set by Boise State's **Kyle Brotzman** during the 2007-10 seasons.

718 - **Clemson's** 718 yards of total offense in its 56-20 win over Duke is most by an ACC team this year and the 10th-highest figure in ACC history and the 9th-best figure in a conference game.

2012 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Nov. 1-3

Miami 30, Virginia Tech 12

QB Stephen Morris threw for a pair of touchdowns, RB Duke Johnson scored on a 7-yard run and PK Jake Wieclaw kicked three field goals as the Hurricanes (5-4 overall, 4-2 ACC) snapped a three-game losing skid and took over sole possession of first place in the Coastal Division at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens. Morris threw 16-yard scoring passes to WR Allen Hurns and RB Mike James to lead Miami, which still has conference games remaining against Coastal Division foes Virginia and Duke. Virginia Tech (4-5, 2-3) was led by QB Logan Thomas, who threw for 199 yards and rushed for 124 more, including a 73-yard touchdown run. LB Eddie Johnson had 11 tackles to key a Miami defense that fed off three Virginia Tech turnovers in the Thursday night win.

#9/10 Clemson 56, Duke 20

QB Tajh Boyd threw three touchdown passes to De'Andre Hopkins in the first 7:47 of the game, and the Tigers rolled on to an ACC road victory at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham before Saturday night's national television audience. Clemson (8-1, 5-1) posted its fifth straight win and remained in the hunt for the Atlantic Division title. Boyd wound up throwing for 344 yards and tied a school record with five touchdown passes for the second straight week. Boyd also tied an ACC single-game record with 6 TDR, all in the first half. WR Jamison Crowder finished with 166 receiving yards and a touchdown for Duke (6-4, 3-3), which fell one game behind Miami in the Coastal Division standings with two games remaining. Hopkins became Clemson's career leader and single season leader in touchdown receptions in the first half. He now has 22 TD catches for his career, two more than Aaron Kelly (2005-08).

Virginia 33, NC State 6

The visiting Cavaliers (3-6, 1-4) forced five NC State turnovers and recorded six quarterback sacks while snapping a six-game losing streak on Saturday at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C. One of the biggest sacks came from DT Will Hill, who dropped Wolfpack QB Mike Glennon for a safety. The Cavaliers also came up with three interceptions. QB Phillip Sims ran for one touchdown and threw for another, and Kevin Parks rushed for 115 yards and a late 31-yard touchdown for Virginia. Backup QB Michael Rocco added an 18-yard touchdown pass to WR Darius Jennings. The Wolfpack (5-4, 2-3) avoided its first home shutout since 2007 with 6:30 remaining in the game, when Glennon fired a 2-yard touchdown pass to TE Mario Carter.

Georgia Tech 33, Maryland 13

RB Orwin Smith ran for 89 yards and a touchdown, and Georgia Tech (4-5, 3-3) amassed 370 yards rushing against the nation's fourth-ranked defense against the run at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium in College Park, Md. Yellow Jacket freshman QB Vlad Lee added a pair of 2-yard touchdown runs, and senior QB Tevin Washington also rushed for a score, the 34th of his career -- one short of the school and ACC record for quarterbacks held by Joshua Nesbitt. Maryland (4-5, 2-3) found the end zone twice despite playing without a true QB due to a rash of injuries. True freshman Shawn Petty, previously a linebacker for the Terps who played quarterback in high school, started under center for the Terrapins. Petty threw touchdown passes of 16 and 23 yards to WR Stefon Diggs, who finished the game with 220 all-purpose yards.

Wake Forest 28, Boston College 14

WR Michael Campanaro, back in full stride after a midseason hand injury that forced him to the sidelines for two full games, tied an ACC record and set a Wake Forest school mark with 16 receptions as the Demon Deacons (5-4, 3-4) improved their hopes of a bowl bid with a win over the visiting Eagles at BB&T Field in Winston-Salem. Deacon RB Josh Harris added a 23-yard scoring run. Wake Forest junior QB quarterback Tanner Price completed 39-of-57 passes for 293 yards and three touchdowns. The completions and attempts were both career-highs and are also highs by an ACC player this season. Defensively, Wake Forest came up with five turnovers to stifle the Eagles (2-7, 1-5). WR Alex Amidon led Boston College with 10 catches for 130 yards and one touchdown, his 6th 100-yard receiving game of the year. TE Chris Pantale also caught a touchdown pass for the Eagles as junior QB Chase Rettig completed 29 of 49 passes for 357 yards and a TD, but also was responsible for three interceptions.

Clemson's Tajh Boyd and Brandon Thomas headline honorees for performances in the Tigers' win over Duke

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Clemson quarterback Tajh Boyd and offensive lineman Brandon Thomas headline a list of nine players named as the Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week, announced by the conference on Monday. Boyd tied the ACC record for touchdown responsibility with six, all in the first half, and Thomas helped the offense accumulate 718 yards for the 10th best offensive performance in conference history in the Tigers' 56-20 win over Duke.

Two Hurricanes garnered accolades after Miami's 30-12 win over Virginia Tech. Running back Duke Johnson amassed 217 all-purpose yards, including 100 rushing, and was named the Rookie of the Week for the third time. Linebacker Gabe Terry blocked a Virginia Tech punt to set up the first Miami score and was named the Specialist of the Week.

Wake Forest's Michael Campanaro, the Receiver of the Week, tied a conference record with 16 receptions and cornerback Kevin Johnson, the Co-Defensive Back of the Week, had seven tackles and an interception in the 28-14 win over Boston College.

Virginia defensive tackle Chris Brathwaite, the Defensive Lineman of the Week, and cornerback Maurice Canady, the Co-Defensive Back of the Week, helped the Cavalier defense limit the Wolfpack offense in the 33-6 win at NC State.

Georgia Tech linebacker Jeremiah Attaochu had three sacks, a forced fumble, and a recovered fumble to be named the Linebacker of the Week after the Yellow Jackets' 33-13 win at Maryland.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Tajh Boyd, Clemson, R-Junior, QB, 6-1, 225, Hampton, Va.

Boyd completed 16-of-23 passes for 344 yards and five touchdowns in the Tigers' 56-20 win over Duke. He guided the Clemson offense to 718 yards of total offense, the second most in school history and the most by an ACC team this year. Boyd threw all five of his touchdown passes in the first half and also scored on a 21-yard run, giving him six TDR, the most by an ACC player in a game this year. He finished with 416 yards of total offense and a passing efficiency rating of 240, the third best in school history given a minimum of 20 attempts.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Brandon Thomas, Clemson, R-Junior, OL, 6-3, 305, Spartanburg, S.C.

Thomas graded 95 percent for his 62 snaps in the win over Duke and had five knockdown blocks in helping the Tigers score 56 points, the most in the program's history in Wallace Wade Stadium. The 95 percent grade was the highest of his career and the highest for a Clemson starting offensive lineman in a game this year. His blocking was a big reason Clemson rushed for 334 yards and a 6.5 yards per carry average on 52 attempts. Clemson finished the game with 718 yards of total offense, second most in Clemson history, 10th most in ACC history and the most by an ACC team this year.

RECEIVER – Michael Campanaro, Wake Forest, R-Junior, WR, 5-11, 195, Clarksville, Md.

Campanaro set a school record and tied the ACC mark with 16 receptions in Wake Forest's 28-14 win over Boston College. He had 123 receiving yards and tied the school record with three touchdown catches. His touchdown receptions were on passes of 5, 27 and 16 yards from Tanner Price. Campanaro broke the previous Wake Forest record of 15 which was shared by three players. The ACC mark of 16 was last accomplished by Alvin Pearman of Virginia in 2003.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Chris Brathwaite, Virginia, Sophomore, DT, 6-1, 280, Brooklyn, N.Y.

Brathwaite helped the Cavalier defense hold NC State to a season low 216 yards of offense (19 rushing yards) in Virginia's 33-6 victory in Raleigh. The Wolfpack entered the game averaging 429.2 yards per game. Brathwaite had five tackles, two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss while also forcing a fumble. The six points and 19 rushing yards were season lows for NC State.

LINEBACKER – Jeremiah Attaochu, Georgia Tech, Junior, LB, 6-3, 240, Washington, D.C.

Attaochu matched a career-high with three sacks, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in Georgia Tech's 33-13 win at Maryland. Attaochu joins Derrick Morgan as the only Tech players over the last five seasons to record three sacks in one game. Attaochu, playing in his hometown, upped his career totals to 22 tackles for loss and 14 sacks.

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – Maurice Canady, Virginia, Freshman, CB, 6-2, 180, Richmond, Va.

Canady started his first game and led Virginia's defense with seven tackles and had an interception with a return of 39 yards in the Cavaliers' 33-6 win over NC State. He helped limit the Wolfpack passing game to just 197 yards, a season low. The Wolfpack entered the game averaging 306.9 yards per game. NC State's longest reception during the game was 14 yards. The last time NC State did not have a reception in a game for at least 15 yards was its season opener in 2006, a streak of 84 games. The Cavaliers also ended NC State's Bryan Underwood's streak of catching a touchdown in eight straight games this season, preventing him from tying Virginia's Herman Moore's streak of nine straight games with a touchdown catch in 1990.

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – Kevin Johnson, Wake Forest, R-Sophomore, CB, 6-1, 175, Clarksville, Md.

Johnson was second on the team with seven tackles in Saturday's 28-14 win over Boston College. Johnson had five solo tackles and two assists. He also intercepted a pass for the third time in the last four games and broke up two passes.

SPECIALIST – Gabe Terry, Miami, Freshman, LB, 6-3, 215, Wellington, Fla.

Terry blocked a Virginia Tech punt that led to the Miami Hurricanes' first score of the night during their 30-12 win Thursday over the Hokies. On the Virginia Tech 41, Terry blocked the punt and it was recovered by Rayshawn Jenkins at the Virginia Tech 16 to set up the Miami score two plays later. It was Miami's first blocked punt since 2008 against UCF and first in ACC play since 2004, also against Virginia Tech.

ROOKIE – Duke Johnson, Miami, Freshman, RB, 5-9, 188, Miami, Fla.

Johnson notched his second 100-yard rushing game of the season, collecting 100 yards and one touchdown on 11 carries in Miami's 30-12 win over Virginia Tech. Sixty-five of his 100 yards came in the first half on one rush, a new career long. Johnson later added a fourth quarter touchdown, his sixth rushing score of the season and first since Sept. 29 vs. NC State. He finished the night with 217 all-purpose yards, his fourth 200 yard all-purpose game of the season. Johnson had 118 returning yards on two returns, including an 81-yard scamper. He now has 13 plays of 25-plus yards, including seven for 50 or more yards.



ATLANTIC DIVISION TEAM NOTES



Boston College

Senior **LB Nick Clancy** ranks third nationally in tackles per game (11.89) heading into this Saturday night's home contest against No. 3 Notre Dame ... Fellow **LB Kevin Pierre-Louis** ranks 24th with 9.71 tackles per game ... After making 10 catches for 130 yards and one touchdown in last Saturday's ACC road game at Wake Forest, **WR Alex Amidon** ranks fifth nationally among NCAA Division I leaders in receiving yards per game (119.2) ... Amidon also ranks 10th in receptions per game (7.44) ... Amidon has 1,073 receiving yards for the season following Saturday's performance ... After picking off passes in each of the Eagles' last two games, **DB Spenser Rostiano** ranks 25th nationally in pass interceptions (.43 per contest) ... As a team, Boston College continues to rank first nationally in yards per punt return (25.0) ... **WR Spiffy Evans** is averaging 31.6 yards per punt return, but his seven runbacks fall short of the NCAA individual qualifying mark ... Evans is also averaging nearly 19 yards per kickoff return and has caught 17 passes for 193 yards and a touchdown.



Maryland

Entering last Saturday's ACC game against visiting Georgia Tech, Maryland was tied for fifth nationally with 17 players having drawn their first career start this season. The Terrapins added to that tally as converted linebacker **Shawn Petty** made his first career start at quarterback ... Maryland has seen three different quarterbacks start a game this season (also **Perry Hills** and **Caleb Rowe**). It's the first time that Maryland has had three different starting QBs in a season since 1973 (Ben Kinard, Bob Avellini and Al Neville) ... Maryland has lost another important player to a season-ending knee injury, as **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, the ACC's active leader in career tackles, has been sidelined by a torn ACL ... **WR Stefon Diggs** caught his fifth and sixth touchdown passes of the season against Georgia Tech, passing Darrius Heyward-Bey (2006) and Sean Sullivan (1983) for the freshman receiving touchdowns record at Maryland ... With 55 receiving yards, Diggs now has 721 this season. That's also a Maryland freshman record and ranks 11th overall ... Diggs is averaging all-purpose 174.9 yards per game, which currently ranks first all-time in the ACC among freshmen.



Clemson

Clemson had 487 yards of total offense in the first half of Saturday's ACC road win at Duke, a school record for a half. The previous high was 393 in the second half against Wake Forest in 1981 ... The Tigers ended the game with 718 yards of total offense, second most in Clemson history. The record is 756 against Wake Forest in 1981 ... It marked just the second game in Clemson history the Tigers had at least 300 yards rushing and 300 yards passing in the same game. The only other time it happened was against Central Michigan in 2007 ... **QB Tajh Boyd** tied the Clemson single game record for touchdown responsibility with five touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown for a total of six (all in the first half) ... Boyd's 388 yards of total offense set a Clemson record for a half ... **WR DeAndre Hopkins** had three touchdown receptions in the first half vs. Duke to tie a Clemson record for a game and his own record for a quarter ... Hopkins had three touchdown receptions in a span of 8:11 in the second period against Ball State earlier this year... He scored three touchdowns in 7:47 vs. Duke.



NC State

The Wolfpack continues to lead the ACC in quarterback sacks per game (2.78) ... **DE Darryl Cato-Bishop** leads the squad with 4.5 sacks in nine games, and **DT T.Y. McGill** has four ... NC State ranks ninth nationally in tackles for loss with 7.44 per game, led by **LB Rickey Dowdy's** 1.11 per game and McGill's .89 per contest ... **QB Mike Glennon's** 294.7 yards passing per game rank second in the conference behind Clemson's Tajh Boyd, and his 20 touchdown passes trail only Boyd's 25 among ACC quarterbacks ... Glennon enters this Saturday's home game against Wake Forest with 280.56 yard total offense per game, a figure that ranked 33rd-best nationally ... **WR Bryan Underwood** failed to catch a touchdown pass in last Saturday's ACC game against visiting Virginia for the first time this season, snapping his consecutive-game TD streak at eight, an NC State school record and one shy of the conference mark established Virginia's Herman Moore in 1990 ... Underwood is still tied for fourth in scoring among ACC players with 60 points on 10 touchdown receptions, and his number of touchdown catches trails only Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins ... Underwood's fellow **WR Quintin Payton** ranks eighth in the ACC with 72.4 receiving yards per game.



Florida State

The Seminoles continue to rank first nationally in total defense (227.1 yards allowed per game) and third in scoring defense (12.0 points allowed per game) ... As a team, the FSU ranks among the nation's top five in five major defensive categories ... The Seminoles' defensive line tandem of **Cornellius "Tank" Carradine** and **Bjoern Werner** is tied for 15th nationally and ranks first in the Atlantic Coast Conference with .89 quarterback sacks per game ... On the offensive side, **QB EJ Manuel's** 174.03 passing efficiency rating ranks second nationally ... Sophomore **RBs Devonta Freeman** and **James Wilder Jr.** combined for three rushing touchdowns in the Oct. 27 win over Duke to give the Seminoles 29 touchdowns on the ground this season, and putting them just six scores away from tying the all-time FSU record for rushing TDs in a season of 35 set in 1995 ... Senior **PK Dustin Hopkins** is just 10 points shy of the NCAA career mark for points by kicking set in 2010 by Kyle Brotzman of Boise State (439) ... Hopkins ranks fifth nationally this season in scoring at 11.44 points per game and was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award.



Wake Forest

Junior **WR Michael Campanaro** hauled in 16 passes in last Saturday's 28-14 win over Boston College, which ties the ACC record for most receptions in a single game ... Campanaro is the fifth in the ACC with 16 catches, matching Alvin Pearman of Virginia against FSU on Oct. 13, 2008, Corey Thomas of Duke against Georgia Tech on Nov. 15, 1998, Geroy Simon of Maryland against FSU on Nov. 18, 1995 and Charley Carr of UNC against Air Force on Nov. 12, 1966 ... Campanaro tied the school record for most receiving touchdowns in a game with three. He is the seventh Demon Deacon to accomplish that feat ... Junior **QB Tanner Price** completed 39-of-57 passes for 293 yards and three touchdowns against Boston College ... The 39 completions and 57 attempts were both career-highs and are also highs by an ACC player this season ... With his three touchdown passes, Price moved into fifth place in school history with 39 career TD passes ... Wake Forest had three interceptions vs. BC, its first time with that many in a game since snagging four in the win over Florida State last season.



COASTAL DIVISION TEAM NOTES



Duke

QB Sean Renfree's 77-yard pass completion to WR Jamison Crowder in the first quarter of Saturday night's ACC game against Clemson was Duke's longest offensive play of the season ... Crowder finished the game with seven receptions for 167 yards, tied for the 19th-most receiving yards in a single game in Duke history ... With 20 points against Clemson, the Blue Devils have totaled 307 points this season, eclipsing the 300-point barrier for the year ... The 2012 squad is the 10th team in school history to score 300-plus points, including the third in five seasons under head coach **David Cutcliffe** ... Other 300-point Blue Devil teams were 1941 (327), 1943 (335), 1982 (307), 1987 (301), 1988 (324), 1989 (356), 1994 (360), 2009 (302) and 2010 (303) ... The Blue Devils' defensive unit caused four turnovers for the third time this season (also vs. Wake Forest and Florida State), intercepting three Clemson passes and recovering one fumble... The three interceptions marked the first time Duke has accomplished that feat since playing at Virginia Tech on Nov. 22, 2008 ... **S Walt Canty** had two forced turnovers during the second quarter vs. Clemson, including his first interception of the season.



North Carolina

RB Giovani Bernard ranks first nationally in yards per punt return at 20.75 yards ... Bernard also ranks third nationally in all-purpose yardage (214 per game) and in scoring (12.86 per game) ... Bernard scored three touchdowns on 33 touches in the Tar Heels' most recent outing against NC State on Oct. 27, including a 74-yard punt return with 13 seconds remaining that broke a tie and gave UNC a 43-35 victory ... Bernard earned a spot on the Paul Hornung Award's honor roll for the second time this season following his showing against the Wolfpack ... UNC's offensive line leads the ACC and ranks ninth nationally in fewest quarterback sacks allowed (nine in nine games) ... **TE Eric Ebron** extended his single-season UNC record for receiving yards by a tight end to 546 with 79 yards against NC State, the seventh-best single season in ACC history... He also pulled within one catch of Ryan Taylor's single-season record for receptions by a tight end (36 in 2010) ... Defensively, the Tar Heels lead the ACC and rank fourth nationally in tackles for lost yardage at 7.89 per game ... **DE Kareem Martin** leads the Tar Heels with 15 tackles for loss on the season, including 10 solo stops.



Georgia Tech

Georgia Tech ranks fourth nationally in rushing at 318.2 yards per game following last Saturday's 370-yard showing against Maryland, which entered the game ranked No. 4 nationally ... Eleven Yellow Jackets had at least one rushing attempt against the Terps ... **QB Tevin Washington** scored a touchdown vs. Maryland to move within one of the ACC career record for quarterbacks (35, held by former Yellow Jacket star Josh Nesbitt) ... Washington is tied for ninth nationally in scoring at 10.67 points per game ... **LB Jeremiah Attaochu** had a career-high three sacks plus a fumble force/recovery against the Terps en route to earning ACC Linebacker of the Week honors ... Georgia Tech has recorded at least one interception in eight consecutive games, and the team's 10 interceptions are tied for third in the ACC ... **DB Jemea Thomas** recorded his third interception of the season in Saturday's 33-13 win over Maryland ... With a 3-3 record in ACC play, Tech has conference games left vs. North Carolina and Virginia before facing rival Georgia in the Nov. 24 regular-season finale.



Virginia

The Cavaliers allowed 216 yards of total offense in last Saturday's 33-6 ACC road win at NC State ... Virginia has held each of its last three opponents to 235 or fewer total yards ... UVa won at Carter-Finley Stadium for the first time since 1999 ... The Cavaliers won on the road for the first time in 2012 and the first time since the 2011 Florida State game ... UVa held NC State to 197 passing yards. The Wolfpack entered the game No. 2 in the ACC averaging 306 passing yards per game ... Virginia forced five turnovers against NC State ... UVa entered the game with only four turnovers created on the season ... True freshman **DE Eli Harold** collected his first career interception in the second quarter vs. the Wolfpack ... The Cavaliers entered the NC State game with seven sacks on the season and finished the game with six ... UVa had four sacks in the second quarter alone ... Harold's interception was the first by a UVa defensive lineman since Nate Collins' pick-six at Maryland in 2009 ... **RB Perry Jones** now has 114 career receptions and is tied for No. 9 in the UVa annals with Herman Moore and Wali Lundy.



Miami

ACC Coastal Division-leading Miami (5-4, 4-2 ACC) will look to become bowl eligible in Saturday's road game at Virginia ... Miami is converting 85.7 percent of its red zone opportunities (30 of 35)... Dating back to the third quarter of its 44-37 win Sept. 29 vs. NC State, Miami has converted 14 consecutive red zone trips in ACC play, including 9 TDs ... Through nine games, Miami has forced 18 turnovers (8 interceptions, 10 fumbles), three more than the Hurricanes forced in all of 2011 ... Senior **RB Mike James** and freshman **RB Duke Johnson** have combined for 1,032 of Miami's 1,171 rushing yards on 204 carries. ... Johnson (8) and James (7) have accounted for 15 of Miami's 29 touchdowns this season ... Seventeen of Miami's 38 scoring drives this season have needed less than two minutes, including seven that have needed less than 60 seconds ... Of Miami's 17 sub-two minute scoring drives, 13 have come in ACC play ... In each of its five wins this season, Miami has scored at least 30 points, including 3 wins when scoring 40-plus points - all in ACC play.



Virginia Tech

QB Logan Thomas is 9-1 as a starter at home in his career ... Thomas is one of six FBS quarterbacks to currently lead his team in both rushing (422 yards) and passing (2,109 yards) ... The Hokies are 25-3 in November conference games since joining the ACC in 2004 ... This week's game against Florida State will mark the Hokies' 26th appearance on ESPN Thursday Night Football (19-6) ... Tech is 11-3 all-time on Thursday night ESPN broadcasts at home, and this will be the 11th-straight season Tech hosts an ESPN Thursday Night game ... Tech has won its last seven games at Lane Stadium and lost its last seven games away from Lane Stadium ... **WR Marcus Davis** (1,560) moved past Myron Richardson (1,541) for ninth place in career receiving yards at Tech ... The Hokies have played just two schools from outside the Commonwealth of Virginia (NC State and West Virginia) more times in football than Florida State (35 times) heading into Thursday night's game ... The Hokies have five scoring plays of over 70 yards so far this season.

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When Virginia Tech hosts Florida State this Thursday night (7:30 p.m.) at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va., the game will be the 82nd contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the 26th time that Virginia Tech has appeared on a Thursday night game, the most of any ACC school.

The game between the Hokies and Seminoles also marks the first time the two teams have met on ESPN's Thursday night package. Virginia Tech has won more games on ESPN Thursdays than any other ACC team, posting a 19-6 overall mark, including an 8-3 record at home in Lane Stadium.

Florida State has a 7-5 record on Thursday nights, playing all but one of those away from Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee. FSU's last appearance on Thursday night was a 38-7 win over Boston College last year on Nov. 3.

Virginia Tech is making its second straight appearance on Thursday night, having dropped a 30-12 decision to Miami last week at Sun Life Stadium.

Miami has the highest winning percentage on nationally televised games on Thursday night of any current ACC school, having posted a 16-3 overall mark, an .842 winning percentage. The Hurricanes are even better at home, posting a 11-1 mark in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

While Virginia Tech has won more nationally televised games on Thursdays than any other current ACC school, and are very effective at home in Lane Stadium, the Hokies of Coach Frank Beamer are also almost equally effective on the road (.727 winning percentage) as at home (.786), and have won more Thursday ESPN road games (8) than any other ACC squad.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 136 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

Virginia Tech (26) and Georgia Tech (25) lead all ACC schools in appearances, followed by Miami (19), NC State (18), Maryland (13), Boston College (12), Florida State (12), Virginia (11) and Clemson (11).

Georgia Tech has hosted more games (18) than any other ACC school. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

There have been many other great moments in the series including the game on Oct. 25, 2007 when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech,

14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents who were both ranked in the Top Ten nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC turned the tables, upsetting 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by UNC placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was also a classic; a see-saw battle which featured a dramatic 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Hokies' David Wilson with 2:23 remaining as the deciding play.

Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's dramatic upset of 2nd-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State, which resulted in a 6.1 rating.

This week's game is the third of four consecutive ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. Wake Forest and Clemson began the string on Oct. 25 in Winston-Salem, with the Tigers claiming a 42-13 triumph. Last week, Miami defeated Virginia Tech, 30-12 at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens. Next week, North Carolina visits Virginia's Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va. on Nov. 15.

Florida State's EJ Manuel North Carolina's Gio Bernard Named Semifinalists for Maxwell Award

Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel and North Carolina sophomore TB Giovanni Bernard were among 16 players chosen nationally as semifinalists for the 2012 Maxwell Award, which is presented annually to the nation's outstanding college football player.

Manuel, from Virginia Beach, Va., has led the Seminoles to an 8-1 overall record and a No. 8 national (AP) ranking. Manuel ranks 2nd nationally in pass efficiency and is 4th nationally among all active players in the FBS in career pass completion percentage (.673).

Bernard, from Davie, Fla., leads the nation in punt return average (20.75 avg.), is 3rd nationally in all-purpose yardage (214.00 yds/gm) and in scoring (12.86 pts/g.m) and is 5th nationally in rushing yards per game, averaging 132.86 per contest.

The winners of the 76th Maxwell Award will be announced as part of the Home Depot College Football Awards Show which will be broadcast on ESPN on December 6, 2012. Three finalists for each award will be announced on November 19, 2012 and a second round of voting will take place at that time.

But North Carolina junior Bryn Renner is right behind, having completed 65.5 percent of his passes. In all, five ACC quarterbacks have completed better than 60 percent of their passes for their careers, while nine have completed 56.7 percent or better. Manuel ranks 3rd in the NCAA among active players in career completion percentage with Renner 10th and Duke's Sean Renfree 16th.

Florida State's EJ Manuel: The ACC's Accuracy Leader

Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel continues to enjoy one of the most accurate seasons and careers in ACC history.



The 6-5 Virginia Beach, Va., signal-caller is currently on pace to set an ACC career passing percentage record. Manuel has completed 498 of 740 passes, a completion percentage of .673. If maintained through the end of this year, that would make Manuel the most accurate passer in league history. Manuel is also putting together quite a senior campaign.

■ His pass efficiency rating for this year of 174.03 ranks 2nd nationally among all quarterbacks in the NCAA's FBS.

■ He is completing 70% of his passes this fall, the best of his career and close to the ACC mark for the best percentage in a season, which is currently held by former Wake Forest standout Riley Skinner (72.4 in 2007).

■ His career pass efficiency rating of 154.78 would be the best in ACC history if maintained, surpassing the mark of 151.15 set by former FSU Heisman Trophy winner Chris Weinke during the 1997-99 campaigns.

■ He is currently ranked 3rd among all active players in the NCAA's FBS in career pass completion percentage (.673). He is also currently ranked 4th among all active players in the NCAA's FBS in career pass efficiency rating (154.78).

■ In games against Clemson and Boston College this year, he has completed 54 of 69 passes (78.3%), for 819 yards, 6 TDs and only 2 interceptions, an impressive pass efficiency rating of 200.86.

■ He has led Florida State to a 21-5 record as a starter for the Seminoles including consecutive bowl wins over West Virginia, South Carolina and Notre Dame.

Duke's Sean Renfree Named NFF Scholar-Athlete



The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Football Hall of Fame has announced that Duke University redshirt senior quarterback Sean Renfree has been named one of 15 recipients of the 2012 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award, presented by Fidelity Investments, a leading provider of not-for-profit workplace retirement savings plans in higher education. The 15 honorees also comprise the list of finalists for the 2012 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by HealthSouth, which recognizes an individual as the absolute best scholar-athlete in the nation. They are selected from a nationwide pool of 147 exceptional semifinalists from among all NCAA divisions and the NAIA. This season, Renfree has guided Duke to a 6-4 overall record – the school's best start since 1994 – by hitting on 200-of-297 (.673) pass attempts for 2,125 yards with 12 touchdowns and seven interceptions. On Duke's all-time charts, he ranks first in pass completion percentage (.643), fourth in passing yardage and fifth in touchdown passes. In addition, his passing yardage (8,477) total is the 15th-highest in ACC history. Renfree graduated from Duke in December of 2011 with a degree in public policy studies, boasting a cumulative grade point average of 3.40. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in humanities, where he holds a 3.81 GPA. A native of Scottsdale, Ariz., Renfree becomes the third Duke player to earn the honor, joining Mike Diminick (1988) and Bill Obremskey (1983).

Four ACC Defensive Ends Named to Ted Hendricks Watch List

Duke's Vernon Threatens ACC Career Reception Yardage Record

Duke senior **WR Conner Vernon (Miami, Fla.)** is now on the verge of breaking the

ACC's career mark for reception yardage, currently held by Florida State's Peter Warrick (3,517). Vernon, who already holds the ACC career mark for pass receptions with 257 catches, is now in 2nd place in career receiving yardage with 3,483 yards and needs 33 more yards to become the ACC's all-time leader in receptions and receiving yardage. A 2nd-team All-ACC pick last year, he became the first receiver in league history with back-to-back 70-catch seasons, and is also the first receiver in ACC history with four seasons of 50 or more receptions. Vernon also holds the longest current streak in the NCAA for catching a pass. Vernon has caught a pass in 45 straight games--every game of his college career--and has tied the ACC record, held previously by UNC's Corey Holliday.

UNC's Bernard Leads Nation in Punt Returns, 3rd in All-Purpose Yards, Scoring



After missing two of the Tar Heels' first three games of the season with an injury, UNC sophomore **TB Giovani Bernard** has pushed himself into high gear. Bernard has rushed for 717 yards in his last four games (179.3 avg.), including a 262-yard effort against Virginia Tech and 177-yard versus Miami. Bernard now has run for 930 yards on just

126 carries, a sparkling 7.4 yards per carry average, and 10 TDs. He leads the nation in punt return average (20.75) and is 3rd in all-purpose yardage (214.0) and scoring (12.9) and is 5th nationally in rushing (132.9). In his 20 college games, Bernard has totaled 2,183 rushing yards, a career average of 109.2 yards per game. NC State's Ted Brown is the current ACC record-holder, averaging 107.0 yards per game in his 43-game career. Bernard has now topped the 100-yard mark a total of 11 times in 20 games. Brown holds the ACC record with 27.

Clemson's Tajh Boyd Is One of the ACC's Most Productive Quarterbacks



Clemson junior QB Tajh Boyd, who recently broke the Clemson career record for touchdown passes after just a year and a half as a starter for the Tigers and was named a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award for the second straight year, is becoming one of the most productive quarterbacks in ACC History. With 7,438 yards of total offense in 30 career games, he is averaging 247.9 yards per game. In his 23

starts, his average jumps to 307.7 yards per game.

■ The Hampton, Va., native has now thrown 62 touchdown passes in 30 career games, an average of 2.07 per game.

■ Boyd has accounted for 73 TDs rushing and passing (TDR) in his 30 games, an average of 2.43 per game. As a starter, Boyd's TDR average in 23 games as a starter (68 TDR) is 2.96.

■ Boyd's TD pass average is even better as a starter with 58 TD passes in 23 starts, an average of 2.52 per start.

■ Boyd broke the school record with 428 passing yards against Wake Forest and now has thrown for 6,508 yards in his 23 games as a starter, an average of 282.9 yards per game. His average of 227.9 yards per game for his entire 30-game career would place him 9th on the ACC career list.

Florida State's Dustin Hopkins Sets ACC Scoring Mark

Florida State senior PK Dustin Hopkins, a 2011 finalist for the Lou Groza Award and a 2010 Groza semifinalist, continued his assault on the ACC and NCAA record books.



Hopkins became the ACC's career scoring leader on Oct. 13 against Boston College on 3 field goals and 6 PATs and added another 13 points against Duke. He now has 429 career points and has moved into 3rd place on the NCAA's career scoring by

kicking list. Boise State's Kyle Brotzman is the current national record-holder with 439 points. Hopkins has now made 81 of 104 FG attempts (.779) and 186 of 191 PATs. His string of consecutive PATs ended earlier this year against Savannah State at 145, the 6th longest such streak in NCAA history. His 81 career field goals is an ACC record, a mark he set last Saturday against Duke with a career-long 56-yarder. Hopkins is in 4th place on the NCAA career list for field goals and needs 7 more to pass Georgia's Bill Bennett, who made 87 field goals during the 2000-03 seasons.

NC State's Mike Glennon Leading Wolfpack's High Powered Passing Attack

In the history of the Atlantic Coast Conference only seven quarterbacks have averaged over 300 yards a game in passing offense



for an entire season. NC State's senior QB **Mike Glennon (Centreville, Va.)** is close to joining that elite club. Through the first 9 games of the season, Glennon, who threw for 328 yards in just the first half of the Wolfpack's 43-35 loss

to North Carolina on Oct. 27, is averaging 294.7 yards of passing per game, just behind Clemson's Tajh Boyd's 297.8 mark. If both marks are maintained they would be the 8th and 9th-best figures in league history. Glennon has already thrown 20 TD passes this year and has 51 in just 22 games as a starter for the Wolfpack, an impressive average of 2.32 TD passes per game as a starter. Boston College's Chase Rettig (284.6) is not far behind.

BC's Andre Williams Records Longest Run In ACC History

In the midst of a career-best 191-yard rushing day at Army on Oct. 6, Boston College junior RB **Andre Williams** uncorked the longest run from scrimmage in league history. With 10:45 remaining in the second quarter, Williams, from Greenfield, Mass., broke open at the line of scrimmage and scampered 99 yards for a TD, bettering the previous mark of 98 yards set by former Maryland standout Steve Atkins on Nov. 18, 1978. The run also tied an NCAA record set originally by Gale Sayers of Kansas in 1963 and matched since by eight others including Williams. Williams also tied the record for shortest possible TD run against the Cadets that is held by many, scoring from one yard out with 5:47 remaining in the first quarter.

Virginia's **Mike London** has had an impressive start to his career, averaging 9 wins a season in his first four years as a head coach at FCS member Richmond and at UVa., while **Jimbo Fisher** is averaging 9.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at the helm at Florida State.

Five Current ACC Head Football Coaches Have UVa Ties

When **Al Golden** joined the ACC as Miami's head coach for the 2011 season, he became the fifth former UVa assistant or graduate assistant coach to be a current head football coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Golden joined Boston College's **Frank Spaziani**, NC State's **Tom O'Brien**, Virginia's **Mike London** and Wake Forest's **Jim Grobe** as current ACC head coaches who have spent time as assistants or graduate assistants for the Cavaliers. Golden spent four seasons (2001-04) at Virginia as defensive coordinator under Al Groh. The Eagles' Spaziani served as an assistant coach at Virginia under then head coach George Welsh for nine seasons (1982-90), the last five as defensive coordinator. O'Brien also served under Welsh at UVa, spending 15 seasons (1982-96) there including the last six as offensive coordinator. London served two terms at UVa under Groh, serving as defensive line coach in 2001-04 and again in 2006-07 as defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. London and Golden also served as assistants to Tom O'Brien at Boston College. Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe, a 1975 Virginia graduate, who just completed his 11th season with the Deacons, lettered two seasons at UVa as a middle guard and linebacker and also spent one year as a graduate assistant coach (1975) under then Virginia head coach Sonny Randle.

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is the fourth active ACC coach with 100 career wins. Grobe now has a record of 106-104-1 career mark for 18 seasons, the last 12 with the Deacons. NC State's Tom O'Brien has 113 wins, having accumulated 75 of them in a 10-year stay at Boston College. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (255), the nation's leading active coach in the FBS in wins, and Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (144) are the other ACC coaches over the century mark in career triumphs.

North Carolina's Larry Fedora Has Heels High Scoring

North Carolina Head Coach Larry Fedora's fast-paced offense has his team scoring at a record pace. Ranked 16th nationally in scoring defense, averaging 39.44 points a game, the Tar Heels have already accomplished the following:



■ UNC scored a school-record 66 points against Idaho on Sept. 29.

■ UNC has topped the 60-point mark on two occasions this year for the first time in school history

■ The Tar Heels scored 48 points against Virginia Tech on Oct. 6, the most points for UNC against the Hokies in the 35 meetings between the two teams in football.

■ UNC's 43 points in its win against NC State was its highest point total in the series since 1996 and 3rd-best all-time.

NC State's Tom O'Brien Latest To Coach at Multiple ACC Schools

NC State's Tom O'Brien is the fifth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to have served as a head coach of two ACC schools. O'Brien coached at Boston College from 1997 through 2006, which included the school's first two seasons (2005-06) of ACC membership. Jim Tatum was the first ACC coach at two schools; he first coached at North Carolina in 1942, then at Maryland from 1947-55 before returning to UNC beginning in 1956 until his death in 1958. Others who have coached at two ACC schools include Bobby Ross (Md, GT), Al Groh (WF, UVa) and Bill Dooley (UNC, WF).



Dooley actually coached at three current ACC schools as he spent nine seasons at Virginia Tech before the Hokies joined the ACC, in between stints at UNC and Wake Forest, winning 162 games in his career. Dooley and Ross are the only coaches in ACC history to be named ACC Coach of the Year at more than one school. Others who have coached at more than one current ACC school, though not necessarily when they were in the ACC, include John Heisman, who coached at both Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Tech's Beamer Becomes 10th FBS Head Coach To Win 200 Games At One School

With a 17-10 win over East Carolina in 2011, Virginia Tech head football coach Frank Beamer accomplished yet another milestone in a career which now spans 32 years as a head coach. The win was Beamer's



200th at his alma mater making him only the 10th head coach in NCAA FBS history to have won 200 games at one school. He became only the second ACC head coach to do so, joining former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, Beamer's overall record, now in his 26th year at Virginia Tech is 213-102-2 (.675). He is now only the second active FBS head coach with 200 wins at one school with Nevada's Chris Ault (231).

In just his third season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 27-9 record (.750) in his

third season. His winning percentage ranks him tied for 5th with former NC State head coach Lou Holtz among all ACC head coaches in their third season, ahead of such figures as Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.859).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers,

Swinney's teams have won 14 of the first 16 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .875. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage has him 2nd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 10 of his first 12 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (2nd), Danny Ford (8th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

2012 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No.1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocate V100 Independence Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C.

Conditional Agreement*

8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

*If Pac-12 or Navy is unable to fill obligation and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt or Western Athletic conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is

Playoff Coming In 2014-15

On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

Bill Hancock, Executive Director

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Georgia Tech and Miami ended regulation tied at 36-36, it marked the 60th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 60 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 60 overtime contests, 30 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-19 advantage in the 53 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-28 record. Forty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
