FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVA and Miami are meeting for the 13th time in series history and for the 12th time in ACC play since the Hurricanes joined the league in 2004.
- UVA's associate head coach and linebackers coach Mike Archer is a 1976 graduate of Miami and was a standout defensive back and punter for the Hurricanes. He later became a graduate assistant coach and was elevated to defensive backs coach from 1979-83, including being a member of Howard Schnellenberger's staff on the 1983 national championship squad at Miami.
- RB Taquan Mizzell leads the nation's running backs with 499 receiving yards. His 46 receptions is No. 2 in the nation among running backs, trailing only FIU's Alex Gardner, who has 48 receptions in one more game than Smoke.
- Of WR Canaan Severin's 36 receptions, 28 have gone for a first down and/or a touchdown. That is a 77.8 percent "Money Rate."
- Fourteen Cavaliers have scored at least one touchdown this season. That ranks No. 2 in the ACC.

VIRGINIA MAKES A NOVEMBER TRIP TO THE WARM WEATHER OF SOUTH BEACH

• Virginia returns to the road for an ACC meeting on Saturday against the Miami Hurricanes. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. and the game will be televised on regional sports networks. The game will air on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic in Virginia, Maryland and Washington, D.C.

VIRGINIA VS. MIAMI

- This is the 13th meeting between the Coastal Division rivals. With UVA winning four of the last five meetings, the series is tied, 6-6.
- Miami won the first three games in the series (1996, 2004, 2005), but UVA holds a 6-3 advantage since.
- UVA owned a three-game winning streak (2010-12) that was snapped during the Cavaliers' last trip to Sun Life Stadium in 2013.
- Since the Hurricanes' arrival in the Atlantic Coast Conference (2004), UVA leads the series, 6-5.

UVA'S PLACE IN MIAMI & ORANGE BOWL HISTORY

- Eight years ago on Nov. 10, Virginia marched into the Orange Bowl and topped Miami 48-0. It was the Hurricanes' final game at the famed Orange Bowl after a 70-year stay.
- The Nov. 10, 2007 game was Miami's biggest shutout loss in the venue's history.
- Former Cavalier and former NFL cornerback Chris Cook had a 44-yard fumble return for a score with 2:26 left in the game, putting Virginia's effort into the Miami history book.
- The win topped a 44-0 beating Notre Dame put on the Hurricanes at the Orange Bowl in 1973.
- Mikell Simpson had a pair of one-yard touchdown runs and quarterback Jameel Sewell scored twice, while completing 20-of-25 passes for 288 yards.
- Miami's 58-0 setback this season to Clemson is the only home shutout loss worse than the 2007 UVA game.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

MORE ON THE UVA-MIAMI SERIES

- The first match-up occurred in the 1996 Carquest Bowl at then-Joe Robbie Stadium, a 31-21 victory by Miami.
- That game was the final collegiate action for several notable Cavaliers, including Tiki and Ronde Barber, James Farrior, Jon Harris and Jamie Sharper.
- In addition to this Cavalier quintet, the game featured a large number of future pros.
- Of the 44 starters in the game, 20 were drafted by NFL teams (11 UVA, 9 Miami). The group of NFL draftees included nine first-round picks. Twenty-one Cavaliers and 22 Hurricanes went on to play in the NFL.

VIRGINIA AT SUN LIFE STADIUM

- Virginia will be playing its seventh all-time contest in Sun Life Stadium, which is on its fourth name during that span. UVA is 1-5 all-time in the venue.
- Virginia had losses in the 1994 Carquest Bowl (31-13 to Boston College) and 1996 Carquest Bowl (31-21 to Miami) when it was Joe Robbie Stadium.
- In the 1999 Micropnc.com Bowl, Virginia lost to Illinois, 63-21, in Pro Player Stadium.
- In its 2009 match-up at Miami, in Land Shark Stadium, Virginia dropped a 52-19 contest.
- UVA won the 2011 meeting in the venue's second season as Sun Life Stadium, 28-21, which they followed up with a 45-26 setback during the 2013 meeting.

VIRGINIA AT NFL STADIUMS

- Virginia is 10-17 all-time in stadiums that at the time of the contest were active NFL stadiums.
- Eight of the 14 NFL stadiums UVA has played in are still active today.
- Since UVA's 28-21 win at Miami in 2011, the Cavaliers have lost their last four games in NFL stadiums, including twice at Pitt (Heinz Field) and once at Miami (Sun Life Stadium). The streak started in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl (Georgia Dome).
- Virginia played at Pittsburgh's Heinz Field earlier this season (Oct. 10), losing 26-19.

UVA ONLY SCHOOL TO ACCOMPLISH THIS FLORIDA FEAT

- UVA's trip to Sun Life Stadium in 2011 the Cavaliers came out on top with a 28-21 victory. The win set the table for Virginia to become the first and only program in college football history to win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season. UVA later won in 2011 at then-No. 23 FSU, 14-13.
- The two programs have brough eight combined national titles to the Sunshine State.
- Florida State has still not lost an ACC home game since the Cavaliers left Tallahassee victorious that November night in 2011.

UVA-MIAMI CONNECTIONS

- UVA safeties coach Mike Archer is a 1976 graduate of Miami and was a standout defensive back and punter for the Hurricanes. He later became a graduate assistant coach and was elevated to defensive backs coach from 1979-83, including being a member of Howard Schnellenberger's staff on the 1983 national championship squad at Miami.
- Archer and Miami offensive line coach Art Kehoe were on the same Miami staff in 1982 and 1983 when Kehoe was a graduate assistant for the Hurricanes.
- Miami defensive line coach Randy Melvin was at Wyoming from 1995-96 and during that time he faced then-WAC foes and current UVA offensive cordinator Steve Fairchild (Colorado State) and current UVA defensive line coach Jappy Oliver (Air Force) in league action.
- Five players on the Cavaliers' roster hail from the state of Florida: Naji Abdullah (Jacksonville), Eric Gallon (Lakeland), Tucker Gamble (Weston), Grant Polk (Punta Gorda) and Dominic Sheppard (Miami).
- Miami assistant head coach Mark D'Onofrio was an assistant coach at Virginia from 2004-05.

Last Meeting

Canaan Severin made a spectacular touchdown catch and Virginia dominated after halftime, beating Miami 30-13 in its home finale of 2014

Darius Jennings and Khalek Shepherd ran for touchdowns and Ian Frye kicked three field goals for the Cavaliers.

Duke Johnson saw his six-game streak of at least 100 yards rushing end after gaining 88 yards in 15 carries.

Virginia took control late in the third quarter with a 10-play drive. It originally stalled at the 2, but Miami was called for running into the kicker on a field goal try, giving Virginia a first down. Three plays later, Jennings took a jet sweep going right and overran cornerback Artie Burns to score.

Shepherd's 17-yard punt return set the Cavaliers up at the 24, and Frye's 22-yard field goal seven plays later made it 23-7. The Cavaliers sealed it when Quin Blanding intercepted Kaaya and Shepherd scored from the 4 to make it 30-7.

LOOKING BACK AT THE GEORGIA TECH WIN

- UVA's 27-21 win over Georgia Tech on Oct. 31 had some notables.
- It was the first time all season that Virginia won the field possession against an opponent. UVA's average starting field position was at the 35-yard line, while Georgia Tech was at the 28-yard line, a plus-seven advantage for the Cavaliers.
- UVA shut down the Georgia Tech option-rushing attack, limiting the Yellow Jackets to just 144 rushing yards, its second-fewest of the season for Paul Johnson's group. In return, Georgia Tech passed the ball 31 times, the most in the Paul Johnson era in Atlanta.
- UVA set its season high in rushing for the third week in a row at 233. It's the first time since a 2011 win over Georgia Tech that Virginia outrushed the Yellow Jackets (274-272).
- Quin Blanding led UVA with 15 tackles against Georgia Tech, seven of which came in the fourth quarter.

UVA OPPONENTS RACKING UP WINS

- The five UVA opponents that have beaten the Cavaliers are a combined 33-8 in 2015.
- UVA is 2-2 in ACC play, with losses on the road to Pitt and North Carolina. Those two teams are a combined 8-1 in ACC play. The lone loss came when North Carolina beat Pitt on Oct. 29.
- Overall, the eight opponents UVA has played thus far in 2015 are a combined 45-21 (.682).
- The five teams that have beaten UVA in 2015 are all currently ranked, or have been ranked at one point during the 2015 season in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls. All five teams did receive votes this week in both polls.

UVA TOPS SYRACUSE IN THREE OVERTIMES

- The last game at Scott Stadium, Virginia played its first overtime game since 2011 when the Cavaliers topped Idaho, 21-20, in one overtime.
- UVA's first overtime game since 2011 saw the Cavaliers top Syracuse, 44-38, in three overtimes. It was UVA's first three-overtime game ever.
- Virginia trailed 24-14 in the fourth quarter. Virginia won its first game trailing by 10 or more points in the fourth guarter since Sept. 28, 2002 at Wake Forest when the Cavaliers trailed 34-24 and won, 38-34.
- UVA is now 4-5 all-time in overtime games and has won four of its last five overtime games.

VIRGINIA OFFENSIVE DRIVES AND THE RECORD BOOK

- Against Syracuse UVA reeled off a 19-play drive that resulted in an Ian Frye field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime. The 19 plays serves as the second-most on a scoring drive in program history.
- Earlier in the year UVA had a touchdown drive that lasted 9:13 against William & Mary. That drive served as the second-longest scoring drive in program history.
- Against Georgia Tech UVA had a touchdown drive that lasted 8:08. That drive is the seventh-longest scoring drive in program history.

FIELD POSITION SLANTED AGAINST UVA

- Through eight games UVA's average starting field position is at its own 24 yard line, while opponents' average starting field position is the 33.
- The average difference is -9 against UVA.
- UVA has started inside its 20-yard line 27 times, while its opponents have only started inside its 20 seven

- Virginia has played seven true freshmen in 2015.

- Stalker saw time on special teams and made a tackle, while Zaccheaus caught one ball for three yards.
- WR David Eldridge joined the group in game two, seeing time on offense against Notre Dame.
- OLB Eric Gallon made his debut against William & Mary on special teams.
- CB Myles Robinson and FS Juan Thornhill made debuts against Boise State, playing both defense and special teams against the Broncos.
- TE Richard Burney made his debut at Pitt on special teams.

T.J. THORPE'S RETURN BRINGS EXCITEMENT

- WR T.J. Thorpe broke his clavicle on Wed., Aug. 12 in preseason camp and returned to action against the Tribe on Sept. 19, making his Virginia debut.
- The North Carolina transfer was cleared on Wed., Sept. 16, five weeks after being injured.
- Thorpe made his first catch for the Cavaliers against Boise State, a 75-yard touchdown reception.
- Thorpe's previous catch at Scott Stadium was the game-winning score for North Carolina on a 16-yard reception on Oct. 25, 2014.
- Thorpe led UVA with five catches for 70 yards at Pitt in his third game back.

PATRICK KERNEY NAMED ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME LEGEND

- Former Virginia All-American defensive end Patrick Kerney was announced by the Atlantic Coast Conference on as one of its Class of 2015 Legends for the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on Dec. 5.
- Kerney (1995-98) was a standout defensive end for head coach George Welsh's Virginia teams of the late 1990s. Kerney capped his collegiate career by earning first-team All-ACC and All-America honors as a senior. His 15 quarterback sacks in 1998 led the ACC, ranked second in the nation and tied the Virginia record set by Chris Slade in 1992.
- •The Yardley, Pa., native, who was originally recruited as a lacrosse player and played the sport for two seasons at the collegiate level, had his UVA football jersey (58) retired after closing out his Virginia career with 127 tackles and 24 sacks. Kerney spent 11 years in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks. He earned NFC Defensive Player of the Year honors with Seattle in 2007 after leading the NFC in sacks with 14.5 and forcing five fumbles.
- Kerney and his wife, Lisa, currently reside in Riverside, Conn., with their four children.
- The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend at the ACC Night of Legends, sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Dec. 5, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship.

VIRGINIA'S STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE UNDER LONDON

- Since Mike London became UVA's head coach prior to the 2010 season, 40-of-55 FBS opponents went on to play in a bowl game.
- Six additional FBS opponents did not play in bowl games during that span due to NCAA sanctions (Penn State, Miami, North Carolina, USC), or turned down their lone invite (Louisiana Tech).
- In total, 46-of-55 FBS opponents of UVA from 2010-14 have been bowl-eligible.
- UVA was one of four FBS programs from 2014 to play 10 teams that went on to play in bowl games. Alabama, Arkansas and Vanderbilt were the others.
- In 2013 UVA became only the second school in college football history to face 11 opponents that went on to play in bowl games. Florida State in 2002 is the other.

THE EARLY ARRIVALS AND EARLY TREND UNDER MIKE LONDON

- Two prospects from the 2015 recruiting class (of 22) enrolled in January. Those two were: OG Grant Polk, from Punta Gorda, Fla., and Charlotte High School; LB C.J. Stalker, from West Chester, Ohio and Lakota West High School.
- The two early arriving Cavaliers continue a trend of high school seniors electing to graduate early/complete requirements to graduate and enroll at Virginia for the spring semester.
- Five members of the Class of 2016 signed grant-in-aid paperwork and will enroll early at UVA in January and will take part in spring practice. London announced on Oct. 5 that TE Christian Baumgardner (Ocean City, N.J.), Tre Harbison (Shelby, N.C.) and LB Matt Terrell (Lynchburg, Va.) signed grant-in-aid paperwork with the Cavaliers. London announced on Oct. 28 that PK Holland Corbett (Charlottesville, Va.) and LB Kenneth Ruff (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) signed grant-in-aid paperwork with the Cavaliers. Since Mike London has become the head coach in 2010, Virginia will have a total of 14 players who have left high school early, including the Class of 2016. Those players are:

NEW ON THE SIDELINES

- Coach Mike London's staff will feature two new assistant coaches: Chris Beatty is the team's assistant head coach and running backs coach, while Dave Borbely is the offensive line coach.
- Beatty, a native of the Commonwealth (Centreville), comes to UVA after two seasons at Wisconsin.
- Borbely returns to UVA where he spent the 2006-09 seasons. Since his last tenure in Charlottesville Borbely spent four years under Charlie Strong at Louisville and won a NCAA DII title at Colorado State-Pueblo in 2015.

UVA HAS SOME UNTESTED YOUTH IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

- UVA has a roster of 110 players.
- Of those 110 players, 68 are either freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores.
- That comes out to 61.8 percent of Virginia's 2015 roster.

SEASON CAPTAINS FOR 2015

• Seniors: OG Ross Burbank, FB Vince Croce, DT David Dean and WR Canaan Severin have been selected by their peers as captains of the 2015 football season.

JACOB RAINEY IS A STUDENT ASSISTANT

- Jacob Rainey, a junior, assists offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild with the quarterbacks as a student assistant.
- Jacob Rainey, a quarterback from Woodberry Forest in Virginia, had his right leg amputated after a freak injury in a scrimmage in 2011.
- Rainey suffered a dislocated right knee, but while he was hospitalized the news got far worse. An artery in his lower right leg had been severed, cutting off circulation. Over the next week, Rainey underwent four surgeries as doctors tried to save his leg. They were unsuccessful.
- A week after Rainey was tackled on a routine play, doctors amputated his right leg above the knee.
- As word of Rainey's ordeal spread, he was inundated with letters and gifts from well-wishers, including Alabama football coach Nick Saban, Green Bay Packers linebacker Clay Matthews and former NFL quarterback Tim Tebow, who was quarterback for the Denver Broncos at the time.
- Tebow reached out to Rainey and wanted to meet in person. On Dec. 24, 2011, Rainey, along with his father and older brother, attended the Broncos' game in Buffalo as Tebow's guests.
- Rainey's experience and inspiring story was documented an episode of ESPN's series E:60.
- The Woodberry Forest quarterback returned to the field in 2012 and played with a prosthetic leg, throwing two touchdowns on nine passes.
- UVA WR Canaan Severin changed his number prior to the 2014 season from 84 to 9 in honor of his friend. Rainey wore number 9 at Woodberry Forest.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 449 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 254-183-12.

SMOKE MIZZELL TAKING THE NEXT STEP 2015

- Virginia junior running back Taquan "Smoke" Mizzell is in the midst of a breakout season after backing up UVA's No. 5 all-time rusher Kevin Parks the past two seasons.
- Mizzell is off to a solid pass-catching start, grabbing eight catches for 100 yards and a touchdown at No. 13 UCLA in the opener. He had four more against No. 9 Notre Dame.
- Mizzell tallied his second 100-yard receiving game of the season with 123 yards on five catches against William & Mary. Mizzell had an 80-yard touchdown reception against the Tribe, which is tied for the 16th-longest in UVA history. The play was the longest pass play since Michael Rocco found Perry Jones for a 78-yard score at Miami in 2011.
- The 80-yard reception by Mizzell is the tied for the 19th-longest in the nation this year.
- Taquan Mizzell leads the nation's running backs with 499 receiving yards. Mizzell is No. 2 in the nation among running backs with 46 receptions. FIU's Alex Gardner leads the nation's running backs with 48 receptions, but he has played one more game than Mizzell.
- Mizzell is the only running back in the nation with two 100-yard receiving games in 2015.

- Taquan Mizzell reached the 100-career reception mark in his 28th career game (Syracuse).
- Mizzell became the 19th Cavalier all-time to collect 100 career receptions.
- With his 10 catches against Syracuse on Oct. 17, Mizzell tied Billy McMullen and Kevin Ogletree as the third-fastest Cavalier to hit the milestone.

VIRGINIA'S DYNAMIC PASSING GAME RISES IN 2015

- UVA quarterback Matt Johns has thrown two passes this season that have gone for at least 75 yards. He threw an 80-yard scoring strike to Taquan Mizzell against William & Mary and then connected with T.J. Thorpe for a 75-yard score against Boise State.
- This marks only the third time UVA has completed two passes of 75 yards or longer in the same season. The last time was 1995 when Mike Groh connected on passes of 82 and 76 yards. The first time was the 1983 season when Wayne Schuchts recorded passes of 85 and 80 yards.
- Groh, Johns, Schuchts and Matt Blundin are the only Cavaliers to throw at least two career passes of 75 yards or more.
- Schuchts is the only UVA quarterback with three completions of 75 yards or more. He also connected on a 93-yard scoring strike in 1982, the second longest reception in program history.
- Between 2001 and 2014 Virginia averaged 1.28 touchdown passes a season that went for 40 yards or more. Through eight games in 2015 the Cavaliers already have five, all coming in the first four games.

SEVERIN IS UVA'S "MONEY RECEIVER" IN 2015

- WR Canaan Severin has 36 receptions in 2015 and 28 of them have gone for either a first down and/or a touchdown. That comes out to a 77.8 percent rate.
- QB Matt Johns looks at Severin the most on third downs as the senior WR has made 13 receptions on third down, 11 of which have gone for a first down and/or a touchdown, a rate of 84.6 percent.
- Severin was pretty "money" in 2014 as well as 66.7 percent of his 42 receptions (28) went for either a first down and/or a touchdown.

VIRGINIA RUSH GAME ON THE RISE

- After rushing for 233 yards against Georgia Tech, UVA has set a new season high in three straight games starting since the Syracuse contest.
- In those three games UVA has rushed for 597 combined yards after rushing for only 514 combined yards over the first five games of 2015.

UVA OFFENSE AIMS TO REVERSE SCORING TREND

- UVA looks to reverse recent scoring trends in 2015.
- UVA hasn't been in the Top 80 in national scoring average since 2010.
- UVA did score its most points per game during the Mike London era in 2014.
- It has been 11 years since UVA owned a Top 50 scoring offense.

DEFENSE THWARTS GEORGIA TECH

- UVA shut down the Georgia Tech option-rushing attack, limiting the Yellow Jackets to just 144 rushing yards, its second-fewest of the season. In return, Georgia Tech passed the ball 31 times, the most in the Paul Johnson era in Atlanta. Of the 144 rushing yards, 49 of them came on one play, a 49-yard score by Clinton Lynch.
- At halftime, Georgia Tech had 153 yards, 79 of which had come on two plays: Lynch's 49-yard run and a 30-yard touchdown pass from Justin Thomas to Lynch.
- On third-down conversations for the game, the Jackets were 5-of-13. On fourth down, they were 0-of-3.

DEFENSE GETS ANOTHER SCORE AGAINST CUSE

- Wilfred Wahee picked up a fumble and sprinted 32 yards for a touchdown against Syracuse. It is the second fumble recovery for a touchdown this year for the Cavaliers. Kwontie Moore a week before the Syracuse game picked up a fumble and sprinted 15 yards for a score at Pitt.
- Both Moore and Wahee were teammates at Norfolk Christian.
- Mike Moore forced the fumble on both fumble recovery scores.

BLANDING DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES

- UVA's Quin Blanding led UVA with 15 tackles vs. Georgia Tech, eight were solo. It was his fourth double-digit tackle game of 2015.
- Blanding has nine double-digit tackles games over 20 collegiate games.
- Blanding has 198 career tackles, 9.9 per game.

NICHOLSON BACK AT IT FOR UVA

- Senior CB Demetrious Nicholson has returned to the field in 2015 after missing 18-of-19 games during the 2013 and 2014 seasons.
- Nicholson started in the opener at UCLA and made seven tackles. It was his 32nd career start.
- Nicholson is now the veteran of the Virginia defense, starting the first 30 games of his career since he stepped foot on Grounds prior to the 2011 season.
- An injury in the third quarter against Ball State led him to miss the final seven games of the 2013 season.
- Of the 2,055 defensive plays Virginia lined up for since the opening game of the 2011 season until the injury against Ball State, Nicholson played 1,981 of those plays, meaning from Sept. 3, 2011 through Oct. 5, 2013 he played 96.39 percent of UVA's defensive plays.
- Nicholson came back to play against Kent State in 2014, starting his 31st career game. He made five tackles and recorded one interception in the end zone.
- After the Kent State game, Nicholson had to shut it down for the remainder of the season and was granted a medical hardship for the 2014 season.
- Since Nicholson's injury against Ball State, he has lined up for only 59 of UVA's 1,298 defensive plays (4.54 percent) through the 2014 season.
- In 2011 Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.

NICHOLSON IS ONE OF THE ACC'S BEST

- Senior CB Demetrious Nicholson is tied for No. 6 in the nation (No. 1 in the ACC) among active players with 36 passes defended.
- Nicholson entered the 2015 season with 28 career pass breakups, the most of any active ACC player.

VIRGINIA ENTERED 2015 WITH ONLY ONE CAREER START AMONG ITS LINEBACKER CORPS

- Virginia lost all three starting linebackers from 2014.
- Henry Coley and Daquan Romero were lost to graduation, while Max Valles left two years early to enter the NFL Draft. Only junior Zach Bradshaw has started a game at linebacker for the Cavaliers, getting the nod against Georgia Tech in 2013 as a true freshman.
- The only team in the nation with fewer career starts at linebacker entering 2015 is TCU with zero.

VIRGINIA DEFENSIVE LINE AND SECONDARY IS EXPERIENCED

- While the the linebackers may only boast one career start entering 2015, the defensive line and secondary own 121 career starts.
- CB Demetrious Nicholson entered the year with the most career starts with 31. DT David Dean had 23 career starts, while CB Maurice Canady had 22 career starts to round out the top returning starters.

DEFENSIVE TRUE FRESHMEN THAT HAVE APPEARED FOR UVA

- Four true freshmen have appeared for UVA so far in 2015.
- Seeing time thus far is LBs Eric Gallon (Lakeland, Fla.) and C.J. Stalker (West Chester, Ohio), cornerback Myles Robinson (Olney, Md.) and safety Juan Thornhill (Alta Vista, Va.).
- In the opener at UCLÁ only Stalker played of the group. Gallon made his debut against William & Mary. Robinson and Thornhill made their collegiate debuts against Boise State.

TENUTA GAVE UVA'S DEFENSE AN AGGRESSIVE MAKEOVER IN 2013 AND IT CONTINUES TODAY

- Virginia's associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta is a UVA alum and has brought an aggressive makeover to the Cavaliers since he came home to Charlottesville in 2013.
- UVA over the six seasons prior to Tenuta UVA had the sixth-worst turnover margin in the nation (-35). In 2012 UVA recorded only four interceptions, the fewest by a Virginia Cavalier team since the birth of the forward pass.
- Tenuta said prior to the 2013 season that "we want to create problems for the front five and never let the quarterback set his feet in the passing game."
- UVA over the past few seasons has been near the bottom nationally in turnover margin and sacks per game Tenuta wants to change that.
- During Tenuta's first season at UVA the Cavaliers boasted Anthony Harris, who led the nation in interceptions. Eli Harold was No. 4 in the nation among underclassmen with 8.5 sacks.
- Tenuta enters his 35th season of collegiate coaching and his 19th as a defensive coordinator. He has had stops in the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and at Notre Dame and looks to continue to create turnovers and sack numbers that have declined in recent years at UVA prior his return.

- Virginia, who leads the nation in punt return average at 26 yards per return, has not been able to return a punt for four games.
- UVA last returned punts (two) against Boise State.

ZACCHEAUS SETS KICK RETURN RECORD

- With 231 kick return yards against Boise State,
 Olamide Zaccheaus broke the UVA record for return yards in a game. He broke Marquis Weeks' mark of 172 yards against North Carolina in 2002.
- The 231 yards is tied for the third-most return yards in a game in ACC history, tying him with Leroy Gallman of Duke who had 231 against NC State in
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

CANADY TO THE HOUSE

- Senior Maurice Canady fielded two punts for 94 yards against William & Mary and took one to the house for a 74-yard touchdown return.
- The punt return is tied for the 16th-longest in the nation this season.
- The return marked the fifth-longest punt return for a touchdown in program history and the eighthlongest overall punt return.
- It was UVA's first punt return for a touchdown since Alvin Pearman against Temple in 2004.
- Canady also returned a blocked field goal 65 yards against Miami in 2014, which stands as a program record.

IAN FRYE RETURNS AS ONE OF ACC'S BEST

- Senior Ian Frye is in his final year on Grounds after one of the nation's better seasons in 2014.
- Frye, a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2014, nailed 22 field goals. The 22 field goals ranked No. 2 in the ACC and No. 2 all-time at UVA for a season.
- In 2014 Frye booted the third-longest gamewinning field goal in program history with his 42-yarder against No. 21 Louisville.
- Frye's range can reach 50+ and owns the third-longest made field goal in program history, connecting on a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against BYU in 2013.
- That 2013 kick is tied with Connor Hughes, who hit his 53-yarder in 2003 against Wake Forest.
- The program record is 56 yards by Kenny Stadlin in 1984 against Virginia Tech and matched by Rafael Garcia vs. Texas in 1995.
- Coach London put Frye on scholarship during the spring semester of 2014.

- UVA debuted a new punter in the 2015 opener after using only two the past seven seasons.
- Nicholas Conte made his collegiate debut at No. 13 UCLA and booted three punts over 50 yards, while dropping two inside the 20-yard line.
- Conte's 44.4 punting average is No. 2 in the ACC and the best by a Cavalier since 2007 when Ryan Weigand led the ACC at 45.2 yards per punt.
- From 2008-11 Jimmy Howell was Virginia's punter.
- Alec Vozenilek succeeded Howell for the 2012 season and held the job through 2014.
- Entering the season only James Coleman had punted in a game for the Cavaliers.

- UVA sophomore Quin Blanding was named by his mother Cory Lee after the movie titled "The Mighty Quinn," staring Denzel Washington and Mimi Rogers. It was the first movie she saw following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of that moment during pregnancy. She knew he will be all right and that he will be the mighty one.
- · Blanding's father, Kevin, played football at NCAA Division II Glenville State (W.V.) for current Arizona football head coach Rich Rodriguez.
- David Dean's father, Shawn, also played at Glenville State under Rodriguez and was teammates with Blanding.
- UVA WR Canaan Severin changed from number 84 to number 9 prior to the 2014 season in honor of UVA student assistant Jacoby Rainey. Rainey wore number 9 as the Woodberry Forest quarterback where a freak game accident forced the amputation of his leg. After the accident Rainey was featured on an episode of E60 and was a quest of then-Denver QB Tim Tebow at a game in Buffalo.
- UVA head coach Mike London's younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back for Virginia from 1992-95. Paul played a major part during UVA's NCAA record streak of 39 straight games with at least one interception. The streak ran from Nov. 6, 1993 through Nov. 29, 1996.
- UVA's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 105 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVA stats crew on game day.
- CB Demetrious Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.
- WR Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.
- Junior CB Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13).
- DE Trent Corney's older brother, Taylor, won the Bronze at the 2009 Pan American Junior Championships in the Decathlon. Taylor has also been ranked in the Top 10 in the world in the Decathlon.
- Matt Johns made his collegiate debut as the UVA holder in 2013. The first time Johns made it into a college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in UVA history.
- · Arizona head coach Rich Rodriguez has a connection to four Virginia Cavaliers. DT David Dean's father, Shawn Dean, and FS Quin Blanding's father, Kevin Blanding, were teammates together at Glenville State where Rich Rodriguez was the head coach.
- Rodriguez held David after he was born and said to Shawn Dean, "Make sure this boy comes and plays for me one day."
- QB Connor Brewer spent the last two seasons playing for Rich Rodriguez at Arizona.
- SS Kelvin Rainey's older brother, Derrick, spent four seasons (2010-13) playing at Arizona with his last two under Rodriguez. In 2013 Kelvin Rainey's brother, Derrick, was teammates with Brewer.

A LOOK BACK AT COLLEGE FOOTBALL HISTORY ON THE GROUNDS OF UVA AS THE COLONNADES AT LAMBETH FIELD CELEBRATE 102 YEARS

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 102 in 2015. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov.
 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013, 2014 and 2015, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

Mike London enters his sixth season at Virginia with a team that returns 10 starters and more than 40 lettermen and a commitment to returning the Cavaliers to postseason play. The focus is on finishing after last year's team produced a 5-7 record that included several close losses that could have easily resulted in wins for UVA. Having relied on a number of underclassmen on the roster the past

two years, London hopes that those talented, and now seasoned players, are ready to help the program turn the corner.

The Cavaliers face one of the nation's top schedules in 2015 with the season opener at UCLA and early home games against Notre Dame and Boise State in Scott Stadium. London preaches to his team that "To be the best," you have to beat the best!" and he has his charges eager to take on the challenging slate.

Knowing London's backstory, it is easy to understand why he is so optimistic as well as why his players enjoy and embrace his coaching approach.

A former Richmond police detective, London's time in law enforcement dealing with the entire spectrum of human emotions and actions has provided a wealth of experience that he draws on to assist players both on and off the field. There are few stressful situations he has not faced - including having a loaded pistol pointed at him and the trigger pulled, only to have the weapon malfunction and not discharge its potentially lethal round.

London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his

London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his daughter's lives when he was identified as a perfect match for her rare bone marrow disorder. That opportunity is one reason why London is an advocate of servitude and makes sure his players understand and embrace the concept of giving back through a variety of community services activities. One of the most visible is the team's annual bone marrow donor registration drive as part of the national "Get in the Game, Save a Life" initiative. During his time at UVA more than 600 names have been added to the national bone marrow registry.

London's biography includes plenty of chapters of football success on the field as well.

In the spring of 2014, defensive end Eli Harold was selected by the San Francisco 49ers and outside linebacker Max Valles later went to the Oakland Raiders to mark the 32nd consecutive season a UVA player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

During the 2014 season true freshman safety Quin Blanding earned freshman All-America honors and was named the ACC's Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In 2011, London led Virginia to one of its most outstanding seasons as the Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVA being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. Five of his players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media.

He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He defines the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVA the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years. Those results have continued to improve and during the spring of 2014, his players once again set a high mark for its GPA.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. Success has been a big part of the

Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVA staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVA to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texas. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach

and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina, are the parents of four children -Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. He has three older children, Michael, Jr., Brandon and Kristen through a previous marriage. The 53-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants practice squad. Brandon since 2010 has been with the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVA women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVA from 1991-95.
