TODAY'S GAME

- Virginia hosts Virginia Tech in the third round of the NCAA Tournament
- The Cavaliers are in the round of 16 for the seventh consecutive season (only North Carolina has a longer active streak)
- UVA is looking for its first quarterfinal appearance since 2005
- First ever NCAA Tournament game in any sport between UVA and VT

SERIES HISTORY

- UVA leads 14-2-1 (UVA leads 9-1-0 in Charlottesville)
- Virginia won the regular season meeting 4-0 on Oct. 20 at Klöckner Stadium
- Cavaliers have won the last two meetings by a combined 7-0 score

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Virginia is participating in its 18th consecutive NCAA Tournament and 24th NCAA Tournament overall
- Only North Carolina and Notre Dame have longer active consecutive NCAA streaks
- Since the tournament expanded to 64 teams in 2001, Virginia is one of five schools to advance from the first round every year (North Carolina, Portland, Texas A&M, UCLA, Virginia)
- Virginia has a 24-21-4 all-time NCAA Tournament record
- Under Steve Swanson, the Cavaliers have a 21-10-3 NCAA Tournament record

AT HOME IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Virginia is hosting NCAA Tournament play for the 18th year
- At home, Virginia is 18-11-3 in NCAA Tournament play
- UVA is 16-3-2 at home in NCAA play since 2000

LAST TIME OUT

- UVA defeated Washington State 3-0 in the 2nd round of the NCAA Tournament
- Lauren Alwine, Gloria Douglas and Caroline Miller scored for the Cavaliers
- Chantel Jones posted her NCAA record 46th career shutout

ACC-OLADES

- Morgan Brian was named ACC Freshman of the Year
- Morgan Brian and Caroline Miller were named First Team All-ACC
- Brian was joined by Olivia Brannon and Danielle Colaprico on the ACC All-Freshman

HIGH SCORING

- Virginia leads the ACC with 55 goals this season
- The Cavaliers rank 13th nationally at 2.48 goals per game (as of 11/14)
- UVa leads the ACC in goals, assists, points, shots and corner kicks
- Virginia is averaging 3.3 goals per game at home this season

SECOND PLACE 'HOOS

- Virginia tied its highest finish in the ACC by finishing in second place
- UVa also finished second in 1990, 1991, 1998, 2001, 2004 and 2005

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS ... WORKING OVERTIME

- Four of Virginia's 10 ACC regular season games went to overtime (3-0-1 record)
- The Cavaliers' three overtime wins are their most since 2001
- UVa has two road OT wins in a season for the first time since 1998

RANKED WINS

- Virginia has five wins over ranked opponents this season
- It is the team's most since having seven ranked wins in 2005

TOP 10 WINS

- Virginia has three top-10 wins this season (Maryland, North Carolina, Florida St.)
- The last time UVa had three top-10 regular season wins was in 1999 (with four)

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- 17 of Virginia's 23 games this season have come against teams selected for the NCAA Tournament
- 10 of 18 regular season opponents have been ranked at some point this season
- Virginia played a school-record seven consecutive games against ranked opponents this season
- UVa's opponents had a .651 winning percentage in the regular season, the second highest percentage in the nation
- The Cavaliers played the other top-five teams in the ACC standings all on the road, and all in a row over a 15-day span

KLÖCK-WORK AT HOME

- Virginia has a 14-1-1 record at home this season
- The 14 home wins ties a school record (set in 2005)
- The Cavaliers have outscored opponents 52-10 at home this season

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- Virginia has had 14 different goal scorers and 16 players record a point in 2011
- UVa leads the ACC with seven players in double figures in points
- The last time the Cavaliers had at least seven players in double figures in points was in 2005 (with eight players)



JONES SETS NCAA SHUTOUT RECORD

- Chantel Jones is the NCAA career leader with 46 shutouts
- She set the NCAA record for career shutouts as she posted her 45th shutout in the victory over Long Island in the NCAA first round
- She broke the mark set by Erin Guthrie of Rutgers (2006-09)
- Jones is one three active keepers with at least 40 career shutouts

JONES NAMED TO HERMANN WATCH LIST

- Chantel Jones was one of 42 players named to the Hermann Trophy Watch List
- The Missouri Athletic Club will name 15 semifinalists in November

MILLER LEADS CAVALIER OFFENSE

- Caroline Miller leads the Cavaliers with 15 goals and 34 points
- Her totals of 15 goals and 34 points are career-highs
- The 15 goals places her 5th on UVa's single season goal scoring list
- Her four multi-goal games this season ranks T-4th in school history
- Her seven goals in ACC play was a school record, breaking the mark of six set by Angela Hucles in 1997

ALWINE SETS CAREER ASSIST RECORD

- Lauren Alwine has set a new the UVa career assist record with 41 (eight this season)
- The previous record was 36 career assists set by Shannon Foley (2003-07)
- She also set a new record with 16 career game-winning assists
- Alwine had the GWA on the golden goals in wins over Florida State and NC State

MILLER HONORED BY ACC AGAIN

- Caroline Miller was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on Oct. 11
- She was honored for her two-goal performance against Florida State
- It was her second award of the season (third of her career)
- Miller was also honored on Sept. 25 after scoring the OT goal at North Carolina

YOUNG AND SCORING

- Virginia has 15 goals this season from first-years (Brian-9, Colaprico-3, Brannon-2, Torres-1)
- It is the Cavaliers' highest total by a freshman class since 2005 (20 goals)

UP NEXT

- Today's winner advances to the NCAA quarterfinals, against the winner of the Florida State-Louisville game
- That game will be played next weekend (date and location TBA)
- Virginia split a pair of games with Florida State this season, winning 4-3 in overtime in the regular season meeting in Charlottesville and losing 2-1 in the ACC semifinals in Cary, N.C.
- The Cavaliers have never played Louisville
