Noting ACC Football North Carolina Moves to No. 12 in AP, Coaches Polls

North Carolina, the leader in the ACC's Coastal Division and winner of nine straight games, moved up to No. 12 in both the AP and Amway Coaches polls Sunday.

Notre Dame, Boston College Face Off At Fenway

This week for the first time since Dec. 1, 1956, Boston College will be playing a football game at Fenway Park, when BC takes on Notre Dame. The game is actually Notre Dame's home game and part of its Shamrock Series. The two teams have never met at Fenway, where the Eagles dropped a 7-0 decision to Holy Cross some 59 years ago.

Florida State's Dalvin Cook Leads In Rushing, Receiving

Florida State RB **Dalvin Cook** has averaged 174.55 yards per game rushing and receiving, despite being hampered by injury which forced him to miss one game and parts of several others. Cook, who has run for 1,369 yards and caught passes for 202 yards for 1,571 total yards, has still averaged slightly more yards rushing and receiving as has LSU's Leonard Fournette (174.22) in nine games and Stanford's Christian McCaffrey (172.1) in 10.

Florida State's Fred Biletnikoff Named Walter Camp Man of the Year

Former Walter Camp All-American Fred Biletnikoff (Florida State) is the recipient of the Walter Camp Football Foundation's 2015 "Man of the Year" award. The Walter Camp "Man of the Year" award honors an individual who has been closely associated with the game of football as a player, coach or close attendant to the game.

Clemson Ranked No. 1 by the CFP Committee for 2nd Straight Week; FSU 16th, UNC 23rd

Clemson earned its second straight No. 1 ranking by the College Football Playoff Committee, while Florida State remained at No. 16 and North Carolina moved into the rankings at No. 23.

No. 23 North Carolina Travels to Virginia Tech in Search of Coastal Berth

No. 1 Clemson Seeks to Maintain Top CFP Ranking

No. 4 Notre Dame Hosts Boston College in Rare Fenway Experience

With two weeks remaining in the regular season, **Clemson** remains undefeated and ranked No. 1 by the College Football Playoff Committee Rankings... The Tigers of coach **Dabo Swinney** are also ranked No. 1 by both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls... **Clemson** claimed sole ownership of the Atlantic Division crown with a win over Syracuse last Saturday... The Tigers may find out who their Championship Game opponent will be this Saturday as Coastal Division leader **North Carolina**, ranked 12th nationally in the Amway Coaches and AP polls and 23rd in last week's College Football Playoff Rankings, can clinch a berth in the 2015 Dr Pepper Atlantic Coast Conference Football Championship Game, set for Saturday, Dec. 5, at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium with either a

win over **Virginia Tech** in Blacksburg, Va., (Noon, ESPN) or a loss by second-place **Pitt**, which hosts **Louisville** at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa. (3:45 p.m., ESPNNews) ... For the Panthers to claim the Coastal Division berth, Coach **Pat Narduzzi's** club would have to win both of its remaining games against the Cardinals and at home versus **Miami** on Nov. 27, and have **UNC** lose twice, both Saturday and at **NC State** on Nov. 28

Eight ACC Teams Bowl Eligible; Virginia Tech Seeking to be the Ninth

The ACC begins the week with eight teams having earned bowl eligibility in **Clemson**, **Duke**, **Florida State**, **Louisville**, **Miami**, **North Carolina**, **NC State** and **Pitt**...**Virginia Tech** will have a chance to become the ninth with a win in either of its final two games: at home against **North Carolina** Saturday or at **Virginia** on Nov. 28...The Hokies of coach **Frank Beamer** are seeking to continue the nation's longest current bowl streak recognized by the NCAA, having gone to bowl games in each of the last 22 seasons.

Two ACC Punters Named Semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award

The ACC placed two of the eight semifinalists named for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top punter. Honored by the ACC were Syracuse senior **Riley Dixon**, who leads the conference with a 44.5 average, and has 22 of his 51 punts (43.1%) inside the 20-yard line with just four touchbacks and Wake Forest senior **Alex Kinal**, who is averaging 43.8, but has placed 26 of his 61 punts (42.6%) inside of Wake's opponents 20-yardline with only three touchbacks.

Beamer Home Finale Set for Saturday

Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** will be coaching in the final home game of his illustrious career Saturday, when the Hokies host Coastal Division leader and 12th-ranked (AP) **North Carolina** at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. (Noon, ESPN)...Beamer, who leads all active coaches and ranks sixth on the all-time coaching list with 278 wins--236 of them in 29 years in Blacksburg--announced his retirement on Nov. 1, effective at the end of the year...The Hokies are led by QB **Michael Brewer** and LB **Andrew Matuapuaka**...Their defense, which ranks 7th nationally in passing yards allowed, will be severely tested by a Tar Heel team that has won nine straight games for the first time since 1997, and ranks fourth nationally in team passing efficiency and ninth in scoring offense (42.0)...UNC is led by QB **Marquise Williams**, who is ranked seventh nationally in pass efficiency (163.8), but is almost 10 points higher in ACC games only (173.6).

Clemson Hosts Wake Forest in Home Finale

Clemson, undefeated and ranked No. 1 by all of the major polls, hosts Wake Forest in its ACC regular-season finale at Memorial Stadium (3:30 p.m., ESPN2)...Coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by sophomore QB **Deshawn Watson**, the Tigers are looking to post

their first undefeated and untied championship-eligible ACC campaign since its 1982 squad finished 6-0...The 1983 Clemson team, also coached by Danny Ford, finished 7-0 but was on probation...**Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by LB **Brandon Chubb**, ranks 23rd nationally in total defense and 12th in passing yards allowed.

Fourth-Ranked Notre Dame Hosts Boston College and the Nation's No. 1 Defense in Rare Fenway Park Appearance

In a rare game in Boston's Fenway Park, Notre Dame, ranked fourth by the College Football Playoff Committee, will host Boston College, which features the nation's No. 1 defense Saturday (7:30 pm, NBC-SN). The Eagles, coached by Steve Addazio and led by LB **Steven Daniels**, lead the nation in total defense (236.5), rushing defense (71.7), and first downs defense (127) and is third in scoring defense (14.4)...Notre Dame, coached by **Brian Kelly** and led by QB **DeShone Kizer**, is playing the last of six games against ACC foes this year.

Pitt Hosts Louisville in Key Interdivisional Game

Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by WR **Tyler Boyd**, will look to keep its hopes alive for the Coastal Division title when the Panthers host **Louisville** this Saturday at Heinz Field (3:45 p.m., ESPNNews)...Pitt is the only other school besides Coastal leader **North Carolina**, still in the hunt for a Championship Game berth. but it needs to finish with two wins and have UNC finish with two losses...The Coastal has a 7-4 lead on the Atlantic Division this year, with the Atlantic holding an overall, 99-94 edge since 2005...Louisville, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, and led by the linebacker tandem of **Keith Kelsey** and **James Burgess**, is looking to improve its bowl resume.

Syracuse and Duke Hit the Road for the One Last Time in 2015

Coastal Division rivals **Miami** and **Georgia Tech** meet at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. Saturday (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...**Miami** is coached by interim head coach **Larry Scott**, while **Paul Johnson** leads the Yellow Jackets...In Raleigh, N.C., **NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren**, hosts **Syracuse**, coached by **Scott Shafer**, in an Atlantic Division game at Carter-Finley Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)... In Tallahassee, Fla., 16th-ranked **Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by RB **Dalvin Cook**, hosts Chattanooga, which just captured its third consecutive Southern Conference title, at Doak Campbell Stadium (3 p.m., Regional Sports Networks) ...The Mocs are coached by **Russ Huesman**...Finally, in Charlottesville, Va., two of the nation's best safeties will be on display when Virginia, coached by **Mike London** and led by sophomore S **Quin Blanding**, hosts Coastal Division foe **Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by S **Jeremy Cash**, at Scott Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...Blanding, leads the ACC in tackles (9.4), and Cash ranks 2nd nationally in tackles for loss (1.8)...**Duke** and **Virginia** are meeting for the 67th time, with the series tied at 33 wins apiece.

ACC Football By The Numbers

.900 - The field goal percentage of Clemson **PK Greg Huegel**. Huegel, originally a walk-on who was not on the roster of Clemson's preseason media guide, has made 18 of 20 field-goal attempts and is tied for seventh nationally in field-goal percentage. He has made all 15 of his field goal attempts in ACC play, the most consecutive field goals this year in league play nationally.

1 - **Boston College** leads the nation in total defense (236.5), in rushing defense (71.7) and in first downs defense (127). The Eagles are also second nationally in third-down conversion percentage (.233) and fourth-down conversion percentage (.200) and are third in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 14.4 points per game.

2 - Duke **S Jeremy Cash** is ranked third nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 1.75 per game with 17.5 in 10 games. Cash is the only defensive back listed among the Top 50 players nationally in tackles for loss.

7 - North Carolina **WR-PR Ryan Switzer's** 78-yard TD punt return against Miami Saturday was the seventh of his career, which is an ACC record and is one shy of the NCAA career mark.

7.59 - The average gain per play for **North Carolina's offense**. The Tar Heels are threatening the ACC season record for highest gain per play in total offense of 7.67, set in 2013 by Florida State.

8 - The ACC has eight teams that have achieved **bowl eligibility** in **Clemson, Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Miami, North Carolina, NC State and Pitt**. **Virginia Tech** can become the ninth bowl-bound league team with a win this Saturday against North Carolina or on Nov. 28 against Virginia.

8.05 - The average number of yards per carry for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook**. Cook's average ranks second nationally only to Matt Breida of Georgia Southern.

9 - **North Carolina** has now won nine consecutive games. That is the sixth-longest current winning streak in the FBS.

9.4 - The average number of tackles

per game for Virginia sophomore **S Quin Blanding**. Blanding leads the ACC and is 8th nationally among all defensive backs in total tackles.

13 - **Clemson** has now won 13 straight games, and that is the second-longest current winning streak in the nation (only to Ohio State's 23 straight) and the longest for the Tigers since 1980-81 when the Tigers won 13 straight and the second longest in Clemson history (15, 1947-49). It also ties for the sixth-longest winning streak in ACC history.

25 - With two regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 25 wins over the past three seasons, tying the school record. The school mark was set originally by the 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade, which posted a 25-4-1 record, and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15). Duke is now 25-12 since the start of the 2013 season.

46.67 - The percentage of 2015 ACC league games that have been decided by seven or fewer points. That is the highest percentage of any conference nationally.

63 - After making 9 catches for 89 yards against Louisville, Virginia **RB Taquan Mizzell** has 63 receptions this year, which ties former UVA RB Alvin Pearman for the fourth-highest total for a running back in ACC history. Boston College's Andre Callender set the record in 2007, making 76 catches.

71 - **Dabo Swinney** is now 71-26 in his career at Clemson. He is in 15th-place on the ACC career wins list.

125 - The number of points **North Carolina** has scored in back-to-back ACC games against Duke (66-31) and Miami (59-21). That's the most by a team in ACC history in consecutive games, both of which were in conference play. The previous high was 122, set by Florida State in 1995 at Clemson (45-26) and at home against NC State (77-17).

164.95 - The pass efficiency rating for Clemson **QB Deshaun Watson** in his last five games. During that time Watson completed 137 of 179 passes (.709) for 1,603 yards and 12 TDs. In his last five games, he has totalled 1,995 yards, an average of 399 yards

per game, and 16 TDR despite playing little more than a half in one of those games. He has topped 100 rushing yards in each of his last two games, averaging 6.3 yards per carry.

182.08 - The pass efficiency rating for North Carolina **QB Marquise Williams** in his last four games. Williams has completed 69 of 100 passes (.690) for 1,095 yards and 7 TDs and has run for 400 more yards and six scores.

232 - The number of career receptions for Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** in less than three full seasons. Boyd is tied with former Clemson standout Aaron Kelly (232, 2005-08) for sixth place on the ACC career receptions list. Boyd has been in double figures in catches in four of his nine games this year.

278 - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314). To give perspective, Florida State's Jimbo Fisher has averaged 11.6 wins a year in his first five years as a head coach, the best mark in league history. Fisher would have to average 11.6 wins a year for the next 19 years, or until 2034, to pass Beamer on the all-time wins list.

397 - The number of career points for Duke **PK Ross Martin**. Martin moved into third place on the ACC career list and now trails only Chandler Catanzaro of Clemson (404, 2010-13) and Dustin Hopkins of Florida State (466, 2009-12).

699 - **Clemson's** win over Syracuse last week was the 699th in the school's history. A win Saturday against Wake Forest at Clemson would make the Tigers the fifth ACC team to top the 700 win mark.

1,369 - The number of rushing yards this year for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook**, which is an FSU school season record. Cook needs 89 yards this week against Chattanooga to have the 10th-best single season in league history.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 278 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 168 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, in his sixth season as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 22 of 24 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .917, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 26 of his first 29 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .897. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 2014, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (46) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).



North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 21 times and bettered 30 points 32 times in 48 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 36.8 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 13.5-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 456.2 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.



ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

Each of the ACC's 14 football schools selected its 2015 Legend. The group will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Saturday Dec. 5, during the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium. The game will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

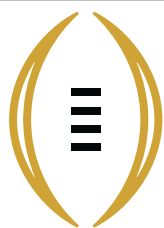
Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

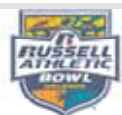

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Duke and Virginia Tech ended regulation tied at 24-24 on October 24, 2015, they played the 75th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions and the first in conference history to go into four overtimes. Of the 75 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 75 overtime contests, 37 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-25 advantage in the 66 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 40-35 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
