Clemson Vaults to No. 3 in AP ACC Has Four Teams in Top 25

Undefeated **Clemson** vaults to third-place in latest Associated Press Top 25. Four ACC teams are in the Top 25 with **Florida State** (17), **Duke** (22) and **Pitt** (23) and **North Carolina** just out of the Top 25 at 27th.

Georgia Tech's Golden Named Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week

The Walter Camp Foundation has named Georgia Tech **S Jamal Golden** as its National Defensive Player of the Week after making nine tackles, including seven solos, with a key pass interception--the first thrown by FSU QB Everett Golson this year-- a pass breakup and a tackle for loss in Tech's upset win over 9th-ranked Florida State.

Cutcliffe, Fisher, Narduzzi, Swinney, Named to Bear Bryant Award Mid-Season List

Four ACC head coaches have been named to the Mid-Season Watch List for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top football coach. **David Cutcliffe** of Duke, **Jimbo Fisher** of Florida State, **Pat Narduzzi** of Pitt and **Dabo Swinney** of Clemson all made the list, tying for the most coaches selected by a conference.

Georgia Tech-FSU Highest- Rated ESPN2 Game of 2015

Saturday night's **Florida State** at **Georgia Tech** game, won by the Jackets in dramatic fashion, earned the highest overnight rating of the year for ESPN2 with a 1.4 overnight.

ACC League Games Have Smaller Margin of Victory Than Any Other Conference

Through Week Eight, conference games in the ACC have been decided by fewer points than have those of any other league. The average margin of victory in ACC games is 11.85 points per game, while the average scoring margin in other leagues is 18.59. ACC games have been decided by seven or fewer points 53.85% of the time compared to 27.62% for other leagues.

23rd-Ranked Pitt Hosts North Carolina in Thursday Coastal Battle

No. 3 Clemson On the Road at NC State in Atlantic Clash

22nd-Ranked Duke Hosts Miami; Louisville-Wake on ESPN2 Friday

Week Nine of the Road to Charlotte for the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Football Championship, which will be held on Saturday, December 5 in Bank of America Stadium sees **Clemson** ranked third nationally by the Associated Press and sixth by the Amway Coaches poll with still a week to go before the College Football Playoff Committee announces its first 2015 standings, which will occur on Tuesday, Nov. 3...The Tigers are coming off an impressive 58-0 win over Miami and will be facing their second straight conference road game, this one an Atlantic Division battle with **NC State** at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C....Four ACC teams are ranked in each major poll this week with **Clemson** leading the way in the AP, followed by **Florida State** (17th), **Duke** (22nd) and **Pitt** (23rd), with **North Carolina** just outside the Top 25 at 27th among others receiving votes...**Clemson** again leads the way in the Amway Coaches poll followed by **Florida State** (15th), **Duke** (18th) and **Pitt** (24th)...Four ACC teams have achieved bowl eligibility in **Clemson**, **Duke**, **Flor-**

ida State and **Pitt**, while two more, **North Carolina** and **NC State**, will earn eligibility with their next win...There is only one interdivisional game this week with **Virginia Tech** travelling to **Boston College**...The Coastal Division has a 6-3 advantage this season, though the Atlantic still maintains a 98-92 (.513) lead since divisional play began in 2005.

Coastal Division Races Heat Up

The first two games matching the current leaders of the Coastal Division will take place this week when **North Carolina** travels to 23rd-ranked **Pitt** and 22nd-ranked **Duke** hosts **Miami**. **Duke** (3-0), **North Carolina** (3-0) and **Pitt** (4-0) are all within a half-game of each other while **Miami** and **Virginia** each have two losses.

Two of the three Coastal Division leaders in **Pitt** and **UNC** collide this Thursday night in a nationally-televised game on ESPN at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa.

The Panthers, at 4-0 in the ACC, hold a half-game lead over the Tar Heels and Blue Devils, who are each 3-0...Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi**, has won four straight ACC contests, including the last two on game-deciding field goals from **PK Chris Blewitt** in wins over **Georgia Tech** and **Syracuse**...The four straight ACC wins by Narduzzi, ties him with former **Boston College** head coach Jeff Jagodzinski for the best start by a first-year head coach in the Conference...The Panthers' feature an offense built around **QB Nate Peterman** and versatile **WR Tyler Boyd** and a defense ranked 16th nationally...**North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora**, has won six straight and counters with a potent offense built around **QB Marquise Williams**, **RB Elijah Hood** and **WR Ryan Switzer**...**North Carolina** is 7-7 overall on Thursday nights, including a 6-4 mark on the road, while Pitt is 8-12 overall on ESPN Thursday, but is 1-0 since joining the ACC.

Wake Forest Hosts Louisville on Friday Night (7 p.m., ESPN2)

Friday night, **Wake Forest** hosts **Louisville** in an Atlantic Division contest set to be nationally televised on ESPN2 at BB&T Field in Winston-Salem, N.C....The Deacons, coached by **Dave Clawson**, are led by the quarterback tandem of sophomore John Wolford and freshman **Kendall Hinton**...They will face a Cardinal team coached by **Bobby Petrino** that features freshman **QB Lamar Jackson** and a defensive unit led by **DE Sheldon Rankins** and **LBs Keith Kelsey**, who is 2nd in the ACC in tackles per game (8.6), and **James Burgess**, who is 5th in the league in tackles (8.4).

No. 17 Florida State Hosts Syracuse (Noon, ABC)

Florida State looks to stay within a game of **Clemson** in the Atlantic Division race when it hosts **Syracuse** in a nationally-televised game on ABC this Saturday at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla...The Seminoles of Coach **Jimbo Fisher** are led by **TB Dalvin Cook**, who is second nationally in rushing and has topped the 1,000-yard mark for the season (1,037), averaging 8.2 yards per carry...**Syracuse**, coached by **Scott Shafer**, features an offense led by true freshman **QB Eric Dungey**, who leads the ACC and is the leading freshman nationally in passing efficiency (159.8), and a defense anchored by sophomore **LB Zaire Franklin**, who had 11 tackles, including 3 TFLs against Pitt.

Coastal Meets Atlantic When Virginia Tech Travels to Boston College (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)

The lone interdivisional game of the weekend will see **Boston College** host **Virginia Tech** Saturday at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill, Mass....The Eagles of coach **Steve Addazio** feature one of the nation's stingiest defenses. The group is ranked in the Top 10 in almost every category and remains first nationally in rushing defense (62.8 yards per game.) Sophomore **DE Harold Landry** and the LB tandem of senior **Steve Daniels** and sophomore **Connor Strachan** lead the way....Three of BC's five league losses have been by three or fewer points....**Virginia Tech**, coached by **Frank Beamer**, and led on offense by senior **QB Michael Brewer** and sophomore **TE Bucky Hodges**, who connected on

three scoring passes last week against Duke.

Georgia Tech Travels to Virginia in Coastal Contest (3 p.m. RSN)

In this, the 25th anniversary of **Georgia Tech's** dramatic 1990 win over the then No. 1-ranked **Cavaliers** in Charlottesville, the **Yellow Jackets** and **Cavaliers** will face each other again with both teams seeking to get positive momentum for the final half of the season...**Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, is coming off a dramatic upset of 9th-ranked **Florida State** and looking to maintain that momentum...The **Cavaliers**, coached by **Mike London** and led by **RB Taquan Mizzell** and **WR Canaan Severin**, are 9-2 against the **Jackets** in Charlottesville since that famed 1990 game, which led to **Tech's** National Championship season...**Mizzell**, ranks 2nd in the ACC in pass receptions (5.9 avg), and leads **Virginia** in rushing (371 yds).

No. 3 Clemson Faces Tough Road Test in Atlantic Division Battle (3:30 p.m.; ABC/ESPN2)

In the Atlantic Division race, **Clemson**, a winner of 10 consecutive games and in the lead by a game in the loss column over **Florida State**, will face **NC State** at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C....The game will be regionally televised by ABC, but viewed by the rest of the country on ESPN2...The **Tigers** of coach **Dabo Swinney** will be facing their second straight road test and feature a potent offense led by **QB Deshaun Watson** and **RB Wayne Gallman**...**Watson**, the ACC Preseason Player of the Year, is 13th nationally in pass efficiency (157.1) and is 2nd in the ACC in total offense...**Gallman** ranks 3rd in rushing in conference (100.3)...Defensively, the **Tigers** are led by the junior DE tandem of **Shaq Lawson** (1.7 TFLs/gm.) and **Kevin Dodd** (1.29 TFLs)...The **Wolfpack** of coach **Dave Doeren** are coming off a win over **Wake Forest** in which they had 322 yards of total offense in the first quarter...**State** is led by senior **QB Jacoby Brissett** and junior **RB Matt Dayes**...**Brissett** has thrown 10 TD passes with only one interception, while **Dayes** leads the ACC in rushing touchdowns (12) and is second in rushing average (113.3).

22nd-ranked Duke Hosts Miami in Key Coastal Matchup First Hurricane Game Without Al Golden (7 p.m., ESPN2)

The second game of the day which could have a big impact on the Coastal Division race occurs in Durham, N.C., when 22nd-ranked **Duke** hosts **Miami** at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium...The **Blue Devils**, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, are tied with **North Carolina** with 3-0 records and are a half-game behind **Pitt** (4-0)...**Duke** is led by junior **QB Thomas Sirk**, who is coming off a career-high 109-yard rushing and four-TD passing performance in **Duke's** win over **Virginia Tech**...The **Blue Devils** defense, ranked 9th nationally, is led by **S Jeremy Cash**...**Miami**, which named tight ends coach **Larry Scott** as interim head coach Sunday after parting ways with former head coach **Al Golden**, is led by **QB Brad Kaaya** and **RB Joe Yearby**...**Kaaya** leads the ACC in passing yards per game, but suffered an injury against **Clemson** and his availability for Saturday is in question.

ACC Football By The Numbers

1 - For the first time in ACC history, the conference had a four-overtime game when **Duke edged Virginia Tech** in four extra sessions. Previously there had been six three overtime games, but never a four-OT contest.

2 - Duke **S Jeremy Cash** is ranked second nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 2.0 per game with 14.0 in seven games. Cash is the only defensive back listed among the Top 50 players nationally in tackles for loss.

3 - For the first time this season, **Boston College** does not lead the nation in total defense, but the ACC still has three of the top four defensive units nationally and has four teams ranked in the NCAA FBS Top 10 in total defense. Michigan leads (210), but **Boston College** (2nd, 217.4) is right behind and followed closely by **NC State** (3rd, 251.1) and **Clemson** (4th, 262.3). **Duke** is ranked 9th nationally in total defense, allowing just 281.3 yards per game.

3-0 - North Carolina is 3-0 in ACC play for the first time since 1997.

3-2 - With the win over ninth-ranked Florida State, **Paul Johnson** at Georgia Tech is 3-2 in its last five games against Top 10 opponents which has occurred in Tech's last 11 games. The Yellow Jackets defeated 8th-ranked Georgia and 8th-ranked Mississippi State last year and the Seminoles this year, while dropping decisions to No. 3 Florida State in the 2014 ACC Championship Game and No. 6 Clemson earlier this year.

4 - The number of ACC players selected to the mid-season All-America team announced by ESPN.com last weekend. Chosen were Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook**, Clemson **DE Shaq Lawson**, Duke **S Jeremy Cash** and Duke **PK Ross Martin**.

4-0 - Pitt head coach **Pat Narduzzi** became only the second first-year head coach in league history to lead his team to victories in his first four ACC games, tying the mark set by Jeff Jagodzinski of Boston College in 2007.

4.5 - The number of tackles for loss for Boston College **LB Steven Daniels**.

Daniels had 11 tackles and 2.0 sacks in Saturday's game with Louisville.

8.8 - Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** ranks fourth nationally in pass receptions per game, averaging 8.8 a contest after making 12 catches in Pitt's win over Syracuse.

10 - **Clemson** has now won 10 straight games, and that ties for the fifth-longest current winning streak in the nation and the longest for the Tigers since 1983-84.

13 - Thirteen **ACC players**--the most of any conference--were chosen to the mid-season watch list for the Wuerffel Trophy, which is presented annually to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.

25 - With five regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 25 wins over the past three seasons tying the school record. The school mark was set originally by the 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade, which posted a 25-4-1 record, and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15). Duke is now 25-9 since the start of the 2013 season.

28 - **Georgia Tech** snapped Florida State's ACC winning streak at 28 games in last Saturday night in Atlanta, one shy of the ACC record set originally by the Seminoles from 1992-95.

30.0 - The number of combined tackles for loss by **Boston College** and **Louisville** in the Cardinals 17-14 victory. BC totalled 16.0 TFLs while Louisville had 14.0.

48.7% - The percentage of punts that Duke **P Will Monday** has placed inside of Duke's opponent's 20-yard line. Monday has placed 19 of his 39 punts inside the 20.

58 - **Clemson's** 58-0 win over Miami tied for the sixth-largest margin of victory in an ACC game. The Tigers' 82-24 win over Wake Forest in 1981 also shares that honor. FSU's 63-0 win over Maryland in 2013 is the record in ACC contests

62.1 - **Boston College** does lead the nation in rushing defense, allowing just

62.1 yards per game on the ground. The Eagles also rank in the top 10 in scoring defense (3rd), first-down defense (3rd), third-down conversion percentage defense (4th), team pass efficiency defense (6th) and passing yards allowed (6th)

71 - Pitt has had three games decided by field goals in the final 71 seconds of play, winning two of them in the last two weeks against Georgia Tech and Syracuse. Pitt **PK Chris Blewitt** boomed a 56-yard FG to beat Georgia Tech with 1:11 to play on Oct. 14 and a week later defeated Syracuse on the final play of the game with a 25-yard field goal.

78 - The distance of the blocked field goal return for the dramatic game-winning score for Georgia Tech **DB Lance Austin** against Florida State. The kick was blocked by Tech **NG Patrick Gamble**.

200 - Florida State **QB Everett Golson** Golson extended his streak of pass attempts without an interception to 200 before throwing an INT at Georgia Tech. The streak is the eighth longest streak in league history. The pick was FSU's first turnover of the year.

205 - The rushing yardage for NC State **RB Matt Dayes** at Wake Forest on Saturday. The total represents a career high and is his fifth game of 100 or more this season.

216 - The number of career receptions for Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** in less than three full seasons. Boyd is tied for 7th-place on the ACC career list with former Wake Forest standout WR Desmond Clark.

379 - The amount of total offense for Duke **QB Thomas Sirk** in the Blue Devils' win over Virginia Tech. Sirk ran for a career-high 109 yards and threw for 270 yards and four touchdowns. The four TD passes were also a career-best.

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When North Carolina travels to Pitt for this Thursday night's (7 p.m.) game at Heinz Field against the Panthers, the game will be the 97th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the first time North Carolina and Pitt have played each other on ESPN's Thursday night package.

Pitt will be making its 21st appearance, including 19 times as a member of the Big East, on ESPN Thursday night and the 10th time the Panthers have hosted. Pitt is 8-12 overall, including a 5-4 mark at home. The Panthers have won their only Thursday night ESPN game as a member of the ACC, a 23-16 triumph over Virginia Tech last year at Heinz Field.

North Carolina enters this week's game with a 7-7 mark overall and will be making its 15th ESPN Thursday night appearance, including a 17-13 loss to South Carolina in the first ESPN Thursday night game of this year, a game that was played at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte. In all, the Tar Heels are 6-4 away from Chapel Hill on Thursday nights.

Despite its loss to Cincinnati on Oct. 1, Miami still has the best winning percentage of any ACC team on Thursdays on ESPN. The Hurricanes are 18-4 overall (.818), including an 11-1 mark at home in the old Orange Bowl (8-0) or Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

Virginia Tech has won more games (20) on ESPN Thursday Night than any other ACC team. The Hokies of coach Frank Beamer will travel to Georgia Tech later this year (Nov. 12) for their only Thursday appearance this year. The Hokies are 20-9 overall on ESPN Thursday night.

Georgia Tech has hosted more Thursday night games than any other ACC school, a total of 19. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory. The Yellow Jackets are 11-16 overall on Thursday night ESPN games.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 169 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies and Yellow Jackets, Miami leads in total appearances with 22, followed by Pitt (20), Louisville (20), NC State (19), Clemson (15), Florida State (14), North Carolina (14), Boston College (12) and Virginia (12).

When Maryland was a member of the ACC, the Terrapins played in 13 Thursday ESPN games, 10 of them at home.

There have been many great moments in the Thursday night series, including the 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two

minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers, both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third-quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC upset 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was a classic a see-saw battle decided when the Hokies' David Wilson returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown with 2:23 remaining. Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's win over second-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating. Louisville recorded a pair of strong ratings while a member of the Big East in 2006, a 5.33 in downing West Virginia and a 5.03 in losing to Rutgers.

This week's game is the fourth of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. North Carolina dropped a 17-13 decision to South Carolina in a game played in Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium on Sept. 3; Clemson won a cliffhanger at Louisville, 20-17, on Sept. 17; and Miami dropped a 34-23 decision at Cincinnati on Oct. 1. The final ACC Thursday appearance of 2015 will be on Nov. 12 in Atlanta when Georgia Tech hosts Virginia Tech in a Coastal Division matchup at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

The ACC and ESPNU on Thursday Night

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006 and Louisville appeared on ESPNU as a member of the Big East in 2011.

Five ACC head coaches rank among the Top 20 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage, led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who ranks first overall with an .853 mark just ahead of Ohio State's Urban Meyer .851. Joining Fisher are **Dabo Swinney** of Clemson at 10th, **Bobby Petrino** of Louisville at 11th, **Paul Johnson** of Georgia Tech at 17th and **Frank Beamer** of Virginia Tech at 21st.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 276 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 168 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach **Bobby Bowden**, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).

North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 19 times and bettered 30 points 30 times in 45 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 35.8 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 450.3 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 20 of 22 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .909, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 25 of his first 28 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .893. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 201, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (46) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham.





ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

Each of the ACC's 14 football schools selected its 2015 Legend. The group will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Saturday Dec. 5, during the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium. The game will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Duke and Virginia Tech ended regulation tied at 24-24 on October 24, 2015, they played the 75th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions and the first in conference history to go into four overtimes. Of the 75 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 75 overtime contests, 37 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-25 advantage in the 66 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 40-35 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
