VIRGINIA AT THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia has won three ACC tournament titles (1996, 2009, 2011), all in Durham at Durham Bulls Athletic Park (most of any school).
- UVA now has played in each of the 43 ACC tournaments.
- Virginia is 55-70 all-time at the ACC Baseball Championship and 17-13 in tournament games in Durham.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), Virginia is 24-17 in the tournament.
- The Cavaliers are 8-8 all-time as the No. 3 seed and have been a top-four seed in nine of O'Connor's 13 seasons.

CAVALIERS AGAINST POOL OPPONENTS

- Virginia went 5-4 this season against the other members of its pool, but has not played Clemson since the 2014 regular season.

O'CONNOR MATCHES UVA WINS RECORD

- Brian O'Connor scored his 594th win as Virginia's head coach on Saturday, tying Dennis Womack (1981-2003) for the UVA career record with 594.
- O'Connor already holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (244).
- O'Connor also holds 24 career ACC tournament wins, one behind Womack for most in program history. At 24-17, O'Connor's .585 ACC tourney win percentage is fourth best in league history.
- UVA recorded its 13th straight .500-or-better ACC record under O'Connor.

FOUR CAVALIERS EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

- A quartet of Cavaliers earned spots on the 2016 All-ACC Team, with each earning his first such honor.
- Connor Jones was a first-team pick at starting pitcher.
- Matt Thaiss (catcher) and Pavin Smith (first base) were second-team selections, while Ernie Clement (second base) was a third-team honoree.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Brian O'Connor is 25-6 against Clemson.
- Matt Thaiss is currently riding a career-best 13-game hit streak.
- With 83 hits, Ernie Clement had the most hits in a regular season by a UVA player since Phil Gosselin recorded 85 in 2010.
- UVA had a 3.88 ERA in ACC play (fourth in conference).
- UVA has struck out the fewest times of any ACC team (265).
- UVA hit .325 in its two ACC series following the finals break.

THAISS CONTINUES BIG SEASON

- Matt Thaiss is in the midst of his best season at UVA and comes into the series on a career-high 13-game hit streak.
- He was named one of 15 semifinalists for the Johnny Bench Award last Wednesday.
- He leads Virginia in multiple-hit (26) and multiple-RBI (15) games.
- Thaiss is UVA's top hitter in ACC play (.357) and has driven in a team-high 32 runs in conference play.

PITCHING MOVES PAY DIVIDENDS IN ROTATION

- Virginia tinkered with its pitching rotation in early April, moving Adam Haseley and Alec Bettinger in and shifting Tommy Doyle to the closer role.
- In the six series since Bettinger came out of the closer role, UVA's weekend starters are 10-3 with a 2.62 ERA in 120 innings (6 2/3 inns per start) while batters are hitting .209 against them.
- Each of the starters has recorded at least one complete game while UVA has totaled five this year, all in the last ACC six series (UVA had 5 CG in the previous four seasons combined).
- It marks the most complete games by a UVA staff since 2004, Brian O'Connor's first year at UVA (6 CG).

DOYLE LEARNING AS CLOSER

- In six weekends as the UVA closer, Tommy Doyle has been challenged in an array of tough situations.
- Doyle has struck out 17 batters in 13 1/3 innings in nine ACC bullpen appearances.
- After a tough first weekend at BC, Doyle has allowed two earned runs in the last five weeks while picking up three saves and finishing off four more wins.
- He earned his first two saves at then-No. 1 Miami, picking up a two-inning save Friday before recording four straight outs to close the Sunday victory.
- He left the bases loaded to end the Friday game.

CLEMENT CONTINUES TO RAKE

- Ernie Clement led the ACC in hits in the regular season with 83 and tied for second in runs (59) while batting .353 (12th in ACC).
- He recorded the most regular-season hits for a UVA player since current Arizona Diamondback Phil Gosselin racked up 85 hits in the 2010 regular season.
- Clement owns hits in 48 of 54 games and has four streaks of eight games or more this season, including an 11-game streak that was snapped Saturday.
- He has 23 multiple-hit games this year after picking up 12 in the entire 2015 season.

SIMMONS STEPS UP IN 9-HOLE

- Freshman Cam Simmons struggled for much of the first two months this season, but has turned things around over the past month, primarily while batting in the 9-hole.
- In his last 14 games, including 13 straight starts, Simmons is batting .360 (18-for-50), accounting for nearly half of his hits this season (37).
- Simmons was batting .207 as of April 20, but has raised his average 54 points to .261.
- Of the 6-foot-3, 195-pound Simmons, head coach Brian O'Connor recently said "I think he's the largest 9-hole hitter in captivity. He's a big man."

NOVAK GIVES LINEUP BOOST

- Justin Novak has been a jack-of-all-trades for UVA this season, but of late has been a steady force at third base.
- Novak has started UVA's last 28 games, including 20 straight at third base.
- He has played in 43 games, with 38 starts (26 at 3B, six at 2B, five at C and one at SS).
- Novak is batting .265 in 12 games since his move to the 2-hole in the order.
- After recording five hits the first five ACC series, Novak picked up 16 in the last five ACC series.

DEFENSE SHINES DURING RECENT STRETCH

- During the last 12 games, Virginia has been much more solid on defense, committing just eight errors (.982 fielding percentage) while going 11-1.
- After a strong start defensively to the season, Virginia then committed 45 errors over a 26-game stretch (14-12 record), good for just a .956 fielding mark.
- UVA recorded 11 errors in its first 16 contests (.982 fielding pct).
- The Cavaliers currently own a .969 fielding percentage, which ranks seventh in the ACC.

HASELEY SHOWS HIS VERSATILITY

- In addition to his work on the mound, Adam Haseley has been a key instigator in the Cavaliers' offense this season.
- He ranks fourth in the ACC in runs (56) and seventh in doubles (18) and owns a team-high 27 extra-base hits (18 2B, 3 3B, 6 HR).
- He hit his sixth home run May 13 against Georgia Tech and is tied for second on the team in long balls.
- He has reached base safely in all but seven games this season.

SENIOR DAY FOR FOUR CAVALIERS

- Virginia held Senior Day ceremonies last Saturday for fourth-years Robbie Coman, Kevin Doherty and David Rosenberger as well as manager Tom Regn.
- The class has been a part of 184 wins during its four years, which includes three NCAA Super Regionals, two College World Series and the 2015 NCAA Championship.
- All four earned their undergraduate degrees last weekend from UVA. Doherty and Rosenberger majored in history, Coman in economics (with a history minor) and Regn in mechanical engineering.

NOTING THE EIGHT-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia's season-long eight-game win streak came to a halt Sunday.
- In that stretch, Cam Simmons led the team in batting at .406 (13-32) with five doubles, while Daniel Pinero batted .375 (12-32) and Pavin Smith .367 (11-30).
- UVA batted .337 as a team, while opponents hit only .218.
- UVA committed only six errors in that span (.981 fielding pct.).
- The start of the streak coincided with Ernie Clement's move to the leadoff spot in the batting order. He batted .361 (13-36) in that stretch.

MAKING HEADWAY ON THE ROAD

- Virginia concluded a successful road trip on May 3 at Liberty prior to the exam break, capping a 7-1 swing with a 7-3 win over the Flames.
- The eight-game trip was UVA's longest stretch of regular-season true road games since 1999.
- UVA picked up ACC series wins at then-No. 1 Miami and Pitt.
- The Cavaliers finished 11-8 in true road games in the regular season.

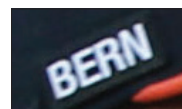
CAVALIERS CONTINUE HOME SUCCESS

- Virginia completed the regular season with six straight home games, the Cavaliers' longest stretch of home contests to end the season since 2008.
- UVA was the lone ACC team to play its final two ACC series of 2016 at home.
- Virginia is 375-93 (.806) at home since 2004 under Brian O'Connor, including a 23-10 mark this year.
- UVA has averaged 3,638 fans per game this year, a program record for the regular season. The Cavaliers passed the 100,000 mark for the sixth time in seven years (120,082 total).

QUICK SEASON RECAP

- Virginia started the season 20-14 after dropping two of three games at BC (4/8-10), but has gone 16-4 since.
- UVA started 7-8 in first half of ACC play, but went 12-3 the rest of the way (won last five ACC series).
- Virginia altered its rotation in early April, moving midweek starter Adam Haseley and closer Alec Bettinger into the weekend rotation, while shifting Tommy Doyle from the rotation to closer.
- In the six series since Bettinger came out of the closer role, UVA's weekend starters are 10-3 with a 2.62 ERA.
- Connor Jones has anchored the rotation with an 11-1 record and a 2.05 ERA in a league-high 92 1/3 innings. He owns a league-best nine ACC wins this year.
- Matt Thaiss is having another All-America caliber season, as he ranks fifth in the ACC in batting (.378) while starting at catcher in 49 of UVA's 54 games, including 23 straight.
- Ernie Clement has emerged as one of UVA's top hitters with a league-high 83 hits (.353 average).

- A long-time bus driver for several teams in the Virginia Athletics Department, Martin tragically passed away while driving the UVA baseball team's charter bus in Miami on April 21.

2015 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- In a turbulent season, Virginia peaked at the perfect time as the Cavaliers won their first NCAA National Championship.
- Making its second straight trip to the College World Series Finals, UVA avenged its 2014 series defeat to Vanderbilt by defeating the Commodores in a best-of-three series.
- Virginia finished with a 44-24 record, including a 10-2 mark in the NCAA tournament.
- UVA became the first ACC team to win the NCAA baseball championship since Wake Forest in 1955.
- The NCAA championship was the 23rd in Virginia Athletics history.

REGULAR SEASON

- Dealing with youth and an onslaught of injuries, the Cavaliers went 18-19 in March and April and a berth in the ACC tournament was in peril.
- UVA bounced back to go 5-1 in their final two ACC series, including a three-game sweep at North Carolina to end the regular season.
- After winning their ACC tournament play-in game, 11-0, over Georgia Tech, UVA then lost the next three games in pool play.

NCAA TOURNAMENT

- After winning three straight games at the Lake Elsinore Regional, UVA rallied for back-to-back super regional wins at home against Maryland, with Ernie Clement's walk-off, two-run single sending UVA to Omaha.
- UVA topped Arkansas, 5-3, in its CWS opener, and won two of three games against No. 4 seed Florida to advance to the CWS Finals.
- UVA dropped the first game of the CWS Finals to Vandy, 5-1, but allowed just two runs over the final two games to rally and win the title.
- The Cavaliers trailed 2-0 after one inning in Game 3 against Vandy, but Pavin Smith's two-run homer in the fourth inning tied the game and his two-out RBI single in the fifth gave UVA the lead.

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- UVA came from behind in seven of its 10 tournament and scored the go-ahead run in the fifth inning or later in each of their 10 wins.
- Forty of Virginia's 57 runs in the tournament came in the fifth inning or later. In seven CWS games, Virginia recorded 24 two-out hits that resulted in 15 runs.
- Sborz was named College World Series Most Outstanding Player. He tied a CWS record by earning three wins at the 2015 CWS.
- Sborz made eight appearances in the NCAA tourney and did not allow an earned run. He did not allow an earned run over his final 27 innings, including all 13 of his innings in Omaha.
- Virginia was just the the third No. 3 seed or lower to win the CWS Finals since seeding began in 1988 (joining No. 3 Oregon State in 2007 and No. 4 Fresno State in 2008).

BIG FIVE HIGHLIGHT THE BATTING ORDER

- Virginia has leaned on five veterans to anchor its batting order this year: Matt Thaiss (.378), Ernie Clement (.353), Daniel Pinerio (.328), Pavin Smith (.320) and Adam Haseley (.293).
- They are batting a combined .335 this year.
- The quintet has 353 of the team's 574 hits (61.5 percent) and 238 of the 363 runs (65.5 percent).

UVA EARNS SERIES WIN AT NO. 1 MIAMI

- Virginia won its seventh straight series against the Hurricanes, matching UVA's longest current streak against an ACC opponent (Clemson).
- Then-No. 1 Miami led in only four innings in the series (sixth through ninth Saturday).
- Twelve of Virginia's 15 runs came with two outs.
- UVA got contributions up and down the lineup, while its typical top four in the order (Haseley, Clement, Thaiss, Smith) went 8-for-47 (.170).
- Justin Novak (4-9) and Daniel Pinerio (4-10) led UVA in hits.
- UVA's starting rotation allowed five earned runs in 20 innings in three straight quality starts.

YOUTH IS SERVED

- Even with five key returning veterans anchoring the lineup, Virginia has one of its greenest teams in recent years.
- Virginia's 35-man roster includes just three seniors and six juniors, which includes JuCo transfers Holden Grounds and Tyler Shambora.
- UVA has 16 freshmen, one redshirt freshman and 10 sophomores.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES AGAIN

- Much like 2015, Virginia has relied on a host of freshmen as part of its regular lineup.
- UVA has started at least three freshmen in the field in 32 games, including three games with four rookie starters.
- Five rookies have played in at least 20 games.
- Ryan Karstetter leads the freshmen with 46 games and 30 starts. Cam Simmons (44), Nate Eikhoff (37), Andy Weber (32) and Doak Dozier (25) also have seen significant action.
- 30 percent of UVA's at bats have come from rookies.

INJURIES PLAGUE CAVALIERS AT KEY POSITIONS

- Injuries hit UVA hard during the first few weeks of the season.
- A pair of regulars, Robbie Coman (elbow) and Jake McCarthy (big toe), each are out for the season after injuries suffered in the East Carolina series.
- Charlie Cody suffered a sprained ankle against VMI, but returned on April 6.
- Starting pitcher Derek Casey (elbow) also has missed the entire season.

TRIO OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers have earned preseason All-America honors from the plethora of national publications: RHP Connor Jones, 1B/OF Pavin Smith and C Matt Thaiss.
- Jones has been named to the preseason All-America squads of D1Baseball (first team), Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game (second team) and Baseball America (third team).
- Thaiss was a second-team selection by D1Baseball and a third-team pick by Collegiate Baseball.
- Smith was a third-team selection by Baseball America.

RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation over the last eight years (378).
- UVA has won 594 games since 2004 – an average of more than 46 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 39 wins each of the last 12 years, including 10 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 has played in at least one College World Series.

THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

- Virginia has qualified for 12 straight NCAA tournaments, capped by UVA's first national championship in 2015.
- UVA is one of six programs nationally to play in each tournament since 2004 and one of two to play in six of the last seven NCAA Super Regionals.
- Virginia is one of 17 schools in Division I history to have a streak of at least 12 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- UVA has won 40 NCAA tournament games since 2009 – second most in the nation in that span.
- Eighteen of the 40 tournament wins since 2009 have come in the College World Series.
- Virginia has earned four national seeds in the NCAA Tournament, including the No. 1 overall seed in 2011.

BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

- Virginia has made four College World Series appearances, including two trips to the CWS Finals.
- UVA has won six NCAA Regional and four Super Regional championships since 2009.
- UVA earned the 2010 and 2011 ACC Coastal Division Championships (regular season).
- Virginia has made four appearances in the ACC Championship game, including titles in 2009 and 2011.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- UVA reached the No. 1 national ranking in the polls in 2010, 2011, 2014 and 2015.
- Twenty-one Cavaliers have earned All-America selections in the last 12 seasons.
- Brian O'Connor has been named National Coach of the Year on three occasions.

SUCCESS AT NEXT LEVEL

- Sixty-six Cavaliers have been selected in the MLB Draft in the last 12 years, including seven in 2015

- UVA had 14 freshmen on the roster last year, which was the previous high.
- The 17 newcomers hail from nine different states.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 594-219-2 (.729) in his 13th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor needs one win to surpass Dennis Womack (1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history; the two each have 594 career wins.
- O'Connor's 73.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 14th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Coming off the program's first national championship in 2015, Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 12 of O'Connor's seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

MOST WINS SINCE 2009

- With 378 victories since the start of the 2009 season, Virginia owns the most wins of any team in the nation in that span.
- In the time, Virginia has been to four College World Series, including two CWS Finals.
