VIRGINIA-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

- Virginia holds an 85-77 advantage in the all-time series with Virginia Tech.
- The Cavaliers won two of three games last year in the series with the Hokies in Charlottesville.
- The Hokies took two of three from Virginia in 2009 in UVA's last trip to Blacksburg, breaking a UVA win streak of 12 straight in the series, dating to April 16, 2003.
- Virginia has won 13 of the 16 meetings with VT since the current coaching staff started in 2004.

VIRGINIA STRONG IN RECENT YEARS VS. IN-STATE FOES

- Virginia is 3-0 this year vs. in-state opponents.
- UVA went 11-2 last year against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- Under the current coaching staff (since 2004), the Cavaliers have a 65-10 record against in-state opponents.

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on Tuesday in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVA has allowed just 2.3 runs per game, tied with California for the second fewest in Division I. Texas A&M (2.0) is the only team to allow fewer.
- Virginia owns a .986 fielding percentage this season, which is tied for the best mark nationally with San Francisco.
- UVA has committed 14 errors in 27 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia boasts a Division I-high 25 wins this season.
- UVA is outscoring its opponents by 4.7 runs per game (second best nationally).
- Steven Proscia ranks second in ACC games with a .447 batting average.
- UVA has its fewest losses entering April since 1972 (UVA was 4-2 in '72 heading into April).
- Virginia owns a .986 fielding percentage, which is tied for the national lead.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top 10 in all of those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (5th, 2.00), strikeouts (2nd, 10.9), fewest hits/9 inns (2nd, 6.51), fewest BB/9 inns (6th, 2.18).
- UVa has recorded eight shutouts (two in 2010) and allowed more than four earned runs just once this year.

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 58 batters (2.1/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 1.92 team ERA.
- UVa averages more than a half a walk fewer per nine innings than any other ACC team this year. (Clemson, 2.75/9 innings).

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this season with 71, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA by one.
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in each of his six starts this season (15.86 per nine innings - first in the nation).
- Hultzen has issued only seven walks.
- UVa is 6-0 in Hultzen's starts this year and 30-8 in his career, including 20-2 since 2010; UVa is 12-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia has won 12 straight series openers with Hultzen pitching, dating to April 2, 2010 at NC State.
- He has allowed no more than six hits in any start.

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record two weeks ago. With 301 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He needs five strikeouts to move into a tie for 22nd place.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He is now second in career wins at UVa with 25; the record is 27, set by Jacob Thompson (2006-08).
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.926; 25-2), just ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.27 stands fourth in UVa history, while his 301 strikeouts ranks first.
- He stands just outside the top 10 in innings pitched with 242.1. With 3.2 innings he will reach the top 10.

CAVALIERS SHUT DOWN BIG OFFENSES

- Virginia is yielding just 2.3 runs per game – tied for second fewest in Division I baseball with California (Texas A&M, 2.0).
- It's not like UVa is padding its numbers against inferior offenses. UVa has played seven games (six wins) against top 25 offenses in the nation this year.
- UVa swept three games from Clemson (No. 22, 7.5 runs/game), won two of three against Florida State (No. 15, 7.8) and picked up a 7-3 midweek victory over James Madison (No. 1, 10.6).

SHUTOUTS PILING UP

- Virginia has recorded an ACC-best eight shutouts in its 25 wins this season. That represents more than the last two seasons combined (four in 2009, two in 2010).
- The school record for shutouts in a season is 11, set in 2005. That mark is tied for the ACC record with the 1977 Clemson team.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has virtually stopped its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just nine stolen bases in 19 attempts (47.3 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 12 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 52.7 percent of potential base stealers, UVa easily tops the ACC. UNC is second at 40 percent.

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate to start the year.
- He is batting a team-best .378, which ranks eighth in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks has racked up a .350 batting average in nine ACC games this season (12th in conference).

NOTING THE ROBERTS PERFECT GAME

Some quick bullet points on Will Roberts' perfect game against George Washington on March 29:

- Eighth nine-inning perfect game in NCAA Division I since 1957 (19 total - 10 7-inning, one 5-inning)
- Second ACC perfect game (Dick Reitz of Maryland vs. Johns Hopkins, 1957)
- First perfect game in Virginia history; first UVa no-hitter since Mike Ballard vs. BC on April 16, 2006
- First perfect game in Division I since March 2, 2002 (Auburn's Eric Brandon vs. Murray State)
- Roberts threw 98 pitches (67 strikes)
- He went to just four three-ball counts (one 3-0 count) and six two-ball counts
- He was behind in the count in just 12 instances (five were at 1-0); nine outs came on the first two pitches
- Roberts recorded 10 strikeouts, 14 groundouts, two pop outs and one fly out
- He tied a career high with his 10 strikeouts
- Final out came on a groundout to second baseman Keith Werman, who was the busiest UVa defender with seven assists and two putouts
- It was Roberts' first career complete game and shutout (previous career high was 7.2 innings)
- He threw seven pitches in second and seventh inning and eight in the third
- Game lasted just 1 hour, 55 minutes
- The perfect game earned ESPN's top play that night and the next day
- The win marked Virginia's 2,000th victory in program history (122 seasons)

PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .447 clip (17-for-38). That ranks second in the conference to Georgia Tech's Kyle Wren (.475).
- Proscia has driven in a team-high 11 runs during UVa's ACC series against Clemson, Florida State and Maryland.
- He also leads the team with a .476 on base percentage in ACC play.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers.
- He has moved into eighth place in career RBI at Virginia with 150; he needs four RBI to match Mike Lindner (1987-90) for seventh and seven to tie Dan Grovatt (2008-10) for sixth.
- He is 17 shy of Sean Doolittle's school record of 167.
- Proscia also owns 50 career doubles, which is tied with Phil Gosselin (2008-10) for fourth in the Virginia career annals.
- He needs two doubles to match Bill Narleski (1984-87) for third.

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 10 saves in as many opportunities.
- He is tied for the national lead with East Tennessee's Bo Reeder.
- Kline has struck out 23 in 15.2 innings. In that span he has allowed two runs, 10 hits and four walks (1.15 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He ranks third on the team with a .315 batting average and stands second in the ACC with 31 runs.
- He has notched hits in 22 of his 27 games this year and scored at least one run in all but seven games.
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

VIRGINIA RANKS 20TH IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 17 dates), Virginia ranked 20th nationally in total attendance in 2011 with a total of 45,028.
- UVa also stood 24th in average attendance at 2,648 fans per game.
- UVa has played in front of four home crowds of 3,000-plus this season.

ROTATION SETS TONE FOR CAVALIERS

- Virginia's starting rotation of Danny Hultzen, Tyler Wilson and Cody Winiarski collectively has been strong over the first six weekends.

- The three have combined to go 11-1 with a 2.22 ERA in 109.1 innings. The trio has allowed just 76 hits and 25 walks while striking out 145.
- They have allowed more than two runs in a start just four times this year.

LAST WEEKEND: VIRGINIA SWEEPS MARYLAND

- Virginia swept its three-game series with Maryland last weekend at Davenport Field (14-1, 4-2, 4-2).
- Chris Taylor went 6-for-12 with six RBI in the series, while Steven Proscia hit 6-for-12 with three RBI.
- UVa scored 10 runs in the fourth inning of the opener to break the game open. Danny Hultzen tossed six innings of one-run baseball and struck out nine.
- The teams played a doubleheader Saturday with UVa taking a pair of 4-2 games. Branden Kline saved both ends of the double-dip.
- In game 1, UVa trailed 2-1 heading to the eighth, but a pair of UM errors opened the door as UVa scored three in the inning.
- In the finale the Cavaliers scored four in the second inning and rode a strong pitching outing from Cody Winiarski (7 IP, 2 ER, 4 H, 5 K).

2010: VIRGINIA WINS 2 OF 3 AGAINST HOKIES

- Virginia won two of three games against Virginia Tech last season (April 16-18), winning the first two games by 4-2 and 8-2 counts. The Hokies scored five in the ninth inning to rally and to win the finale, 8-5.
- UVa scored two in the eighth inning of the opener, while Danny Hultzen struck out 10 in seven innings.
- Phil Gosselin posted three hits in game 2, while Robert Morey threw seven innings of 2-run baseball.
- Tyler Cannon and Jarrett Parker each went 4-for-10.
- The series was well-played – both teams committed two errors each.
- UVa got three strong performances from its starting pitchers (Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey, Cody Winiarski). All three worked at least six innings and gave up only two earned runs apiece.
- Virginia Tech hit just .222 in the three games.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 3-0 with a 2.27 ERA this year. In 35.2 innings he has allowed just 28 hits and nine walks with 45 strikeouts (third most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 20 career wins, which is tied for seventh in Virginia history (20-7, 3.08 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 78 (eight starts).

WILSON A CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 15.1 innings out of the bullpen and 19.1 innings total in 18 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVA while recovering from shoulder surgery.

HULTZEN NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK – AGAIN

- Virginia LHP/utility Danny Hultzen was named one of *Collegiate Baseball's* National Players of the Week Monday (March 11). He joined Baylor RHP Logan Verrett and Georgia Tech RHP Mark Pope in earning the honor.
- It marks the second time in three weeks that Hultzen gleaned this distinction from *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Hultzen improved to 4-0 on the season after firing 6.2 shutout innings Friday against Clemson, which came into the game as the top hitting team in the ACC with a .343 batting average. He fanned 14 Clemson batters and struck out at least two batters in six of the seven innings he worked during a 5-0 win against the Tigers.
- Hultzen also went 3-for-8 with three RBI at the plate for the week.

UVA EARNS NATIONAL PITCHING STAFF OF THE WEEK AWARD

- Virginia's pitching staff was honored Monday (March 7) by InsidePitching.com as the National Pitching Staff of the Week following a 6-0 week.
- UVA's pitchers combined for three shutouts and posted a miniscule 0.67 team ERA for the week. UVA struck out 60 and walked just 12 in 54 innings.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVA head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVA averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

NINE WAHOOS SELECTED IN 2010 MLB DRAFT

- Virginia had a school-record nine players selected in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Seven of the nine signed contracts:
 - OF Jarrett Parker (2nd round, SF), 2B Phil Gosselin (5th round, ATL), RHP Robert Morey (5th round, FLA), RHP Kevin Arico (10th round, CIN), OF Dan Grovatt (11th round, PIT), INF Tyler Cannon (12th round, CLE) and Neal Davis (36th round, PHI).
- RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Kenny Swab each have returned for their senior seasons.
- The previous UVA high for draft picks in a year was six.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVA is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.
