VIRGINIA MEETS TOLEDO FOR FIRST TIME

- Virginia will play Toledo for the first time in program history this weekend.
- UVa is 7-4 against current members of the 12-team Mid-American Conference, although the Cavaliers have not faced a MAC team since 1987 when they split a four-game series with Kent State.
- UVa is 5-0 against Akron, 2-2 against Kent State and 0-1 against Buffalo and Ohio University; the Cavaliers have never played Ball State, Bowling Green, Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan, Miami (Ohio), Northern Illinois, Toledo and Western Michigan.
- The reigning MAC West champions, Toledo went 1-1 in its opening weekend in Cary, N.C.

O'CONNOR, MEE REUNITE THIS WEEKEND

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor and Toledo head coach Cory Mee are good friends; the two spent five years working together at Notre Dame as assistants under then-coach Paul Mainieri (1995-99).
- The Fighting Irish went 209-93 and reached the NCAA tournament in 1996 and 1999 during their tenure together in South Bend.
- Interestingly, their 1996 team was eliminated by Virginia.

OFFENSE SCORCHING TO START SEASON

- Virginia has scored 47 runs in the first four games, racking up nine runs or more in each.
- The Cavaliers are batting .357 as a team and own 16 extra-base hits (opponents batting .241 with six extra-base hits).
- The runs have tended to come in bunches, as UVa has scored three runs or more in an inning eight times.
- UVa owns a gaudy .486 team on-base percentage through four games.

CAVALIERS ATTACK LATE AT THE PLATE

- Virginia has scored over half of its runs in the seventh and eighth innings.
- UVa has scored 15 seventh-inning runs and 10 eighth-inning runs; the Cavaliers have scored 47 runs this season.
- Just five of UVa's runs have come in the first three innings, and all are first-inning tallies.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia is 73-11-1 in February during Brian O'Connor's tenure (since 2004).
- The Cavaliers have scored 47 runs in their first four games.
- In UVa's four games (36 innings), freshmen have accounted for 62 percent of the innings pitched.
- UVa already has been hit by 11 pitches this year (2.75/game), on pace for 148 HBP in the 54-game regular season.
- Cavalier batters also have walked 28 times (7/game).

TOWNS IN MIDST OF EARLY POWER SURGE

- Kenny Towns has started the season strong in the power department, with three home runs in four games (11 at bats).
- He slugged two grand slams in the season opener at ECU, going yard in the first and seventh innings – both to the opposite field. They were his first career home runs.
- He added a 2-run homer to left field Tuesday vs. William and Mary.
- With 10 RBI this year, Towns already has nearly matched his 2012 total (12).

FRESHMAN PITCHERS

- Virginia's freshman pitchers have taken advantage of their early opportunities.
- Six newcomers already have taken the mound, combining for 22 1/3 innings (62 percent of team total).
- The freshman have combined to allow 21 hits and nine earned runs (3.63 ERA).

WADDELL GETS OPENING-DAY NOD ON MOUND

- Rookie Brandon Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.
- He worked 4 2/3 innings and allowed one earned run in the 14-4 win at East Carolina.

- He also got the first weekend start for a UVa freshman since Branden Kline on May 20, 2010, at Miami, the first opening-weekend start since Danny Hultzen on Feb. 21, 2009, against Bucknell, and the first opening-weekend road start since Matt Packer on Feb. 11, 2007, at Coastal Carolina.

FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors set to guide the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has started 147 career games, with 128 career starts, including 85 straight starts dating to 2011.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

YOUTH WILL DOMINATE PITCHING STAFF

- Virginia's pitching staff will take on a decidedly young look in 2013 with eight freshman hurlers on the roster (four RHP, four LHP).
- Freshman catchers Robbie Coman and Scott Williams also could see time at some point on the mound.

CAVALIERS BOAST SECOND-MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns 195 wins since 2009 – second most in Division I baseball (South Carolina, 198).
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.

CLOSE BUT NOT QUITE IN 2012

- Fourteen of Virginia's 19 losses last season came by three runs or fewer, including eight one-run defeats.
- UVa held leads in the eighth or ninth inning in six of the defeats.
- UVa was 11-12 in games decided by one or two runs.

WHO'S BACK IN THE FIELD

- Of its 19 returning letterwinners, Virginia has five field starters back from 2012, including all three starting outfielders, Derek Fisher (.288 BA, 7 HR, 50 RBI), Brandon Downes (.321, 7 2B, 22 RBI) and Colin Harrington (.305, 5 2B, 28 RBI).
- Three of the four starting infielders left for professional baseball, with first baseman Jared King (.263, 21 XBH, 44 RBI) serving as the lone holdover.

• Sophomore catcher Nate Irving (.279 BA, 35 RBI, 415 OBP) has a full season under his belt after starting 49 of the 59 games behind the plate in 2012.

NEW-LOOK INFIELD

• Virginia will unveil a new-look infield, as senior Reed Gagnani (2B) and sophomores Branden Cogswell (SS) and Nick Howard (3B) are slated to join King.
• They replace four-year starter Keith Werman (2B), two-year starter Chris Taylor (SS) and Stephen Bruno (3B), who was third in the ACC in batting at .370.
• Gagnani has battled injuries the past two years, but he hit .362 in 20 games (19 starts) last year. Cogswell (41 GP, .260, 4 3B, 15 RBI) and Howard (26 GP, .346, 6 RBI) each saw significant action last year while serving in a backup capacity.

BEHIND THE DISH

• The Cavaliers lacked depth behind the plate last year, but that won't be an issue this year. Irving is the established veteran there and will be joined by sophomore Brandon Downes as well as a pair of rookies, Robbie Coman and Scott Williams.
• Irving caught over 80 percent of the innings last year.

PLENTY OF DEPTH ON OFFENSE, DEFENSE

• Virginia sports a lot of options on offense and in the field. Infielder Kenny Towns (28 games, .294, 12 RBI) emerged in mid-April last year and provides the Cavaliers an option at DH as well as first and third base.
• Mike Papi (35 games, .283, 17 RBI) was sidelined with an injury in the second half of the 2012 season which derailed his strong start. He will see time in the outfield and also could get time at first base.
• Freshmen John LaPrise and George Ragsdale and sophomore Thomas Woodruff each provide the Cavaliers with more options on the infield.
• Freshmen Joe McCarthy and Rob Bennie are both former multi-sport high school standouts who will provide a physical presence at the plate while spending time in the outfield.

WHO'S BACK ON PITCHING STAFF

• Virginia's pitching staff will be anchored by junior Kyle Crockett and redshirt senior Scott Silverstein. Crockett was the Cavaliers' go-to southpaw out of the bullpen last year, going 5-2 with a 2.25 ERA as batters hit just .204 against him in 60 innings (32 appearances).
• In his first extended action on the mound after a pair of shoulder surgeries, Silverstein went 2-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 15 starts last year. He started the season strong, but was inconsistent through much of the second half of the season.
• Sophomore righty Nick Howard will start at third base but also will be key on the bump. He went 3-0 with a 2.81 ERA in 19 outings out of the bullpen last year; batters hit just .221 against him.
• Junior RHP Austin Young (1-1, 21 GP, 4.86 ERA) saw significant action last year and will be counted on out of the bullpen once again.

• LHP Nathaniel Abel pitched in seven games last year and will see time out of the bullpen as well this year.
• A pair of starters from the 2012 rotation, RHPs Whit Mayberry and Artie Lewicki, each are rehabbing from arm surgeries, and their return dates are still unknown.

YOUTH APLENTY ON MOUND

• Virginia's pitching staff will have plenty of new faces, with eight rookie pitchers on the roster. The roles that each will play still are not certain as the season begins.
• Virginia strengthened its staff with the addition of four left-handers: Nathan Kirby, Brandon Waddell, David Rosenberger and Kevin Doherty. Redshirt freshman Brett Lisle also provides UVa another lefty option.
• Trey Oest, Josh Sborz, Cameron Tekker and Tyler Car-rico all are right-handed options for the Cavaliers.
• Catchers Robbie Coman and Scott Williams also could see time on the mound.

CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

• Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason. Most notably, a new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews installed a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
• The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
• Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
• In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

A HOT TICKET AT DAVENPORT FIELD

• UVa fans continue to fill Davenport Field, as more than 110,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past three seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last three years.
• UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
• Davenport Field will seat 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
• The entire reserved section in the grandstand is sold out once again this year.

O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

• Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 411-149-2 (.734) in nine seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
• O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage ranks fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

2013 SCHEDULE DETAILS

- The Cavaliers' 54-game schedule will be challenging as usual, featuring 21 games against teams that qualified for the 2012 NCAA Tournament, 12 of which will come on the road.
- UVa has home series slated against Florida State (2012 CWS), NC State (Super Regionals), Miami (Regionals), Maryland and Duke.
- On the road, the Cavaliers will play East Carolina, a 2012 NCAA Regional team, in a three-game non-conference series to open the season.
- UVa has ACC road series scheduled against 2012 Super Regional participant Clemson, 2012 Regional qualifiers Georgia Tech and North Carolina as well as Wake Forest and Virginia Tech.
- UVa will play three of its first four ACC series at the friendly confines of Davenport Field. The Cavaliers are scheduled to play 34 home games and 20 on the road.

GET 'EM ON, GET 'EM OVER, GET 'EM IN

- Virginia ranked 14th nationally in scoring last year with 6.9 runs per game despite ranking 37th in batting (.296).
- The Cavaliers found a variety of ways to get their runners on base, over and home.
- The Cavaliers led the ACC and ranked eighth nationally in hit by pitch (98), were 10th in the country in on base percentage (.400) and 21st in walks (267).
- Once UVa put runners on base, it ranked fourth nationally with 85 sacrifice bunts and 11th with 36 sac flies.

BUNTS PILE UP FOR CAVALIERS

- Virginia historically is a strong bunting team, with the 2012 squad proving to be particularly adept.
- Virginia recorded 85 sacrifices in 59 games, breaking the ACC record of 83, set by the 1990 North Carolina squad (65 games).
- UVa shattered the program record of 63 sacrifice hits, set over the course of 62 games in 2006.
- Keith Werman (1st, 28) and Colin Harrington (11th, 18) each ranked among the top 20 nationally in sacrifices, while Nate Irving also had 15 sacrifices. The trio ranked 1-2-3 in sac bunts in the ACC last year.

VIRGINIA RANKED SECOND NATIONALLY IN TRIPLES IN 2012

- Virginia finished fourth in the nation with 34 triples last year.
- Northern Colorado (39) led all Division I teams, followed by CWS teams Stony Brook (36) and Arizona (35).
- UVa tied the school single-season triples record, which was set in 2010.
- Derek Fisher was 10th nationally with eight triples, which tied the single-season program record, set by Jarrett Parker in 2010.

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT

- Virginia batters were plunked by an ACC-high 98 pitches last year (1.66 HBP per game).
- UVa ranked eighth nationally in the category.
- Five Virginia players were hit by at least 10 pitches each, including 2013 returnees Nate Irving (14), Brandon Cogswell (12), Derek Fisher (10) and Colin Harrington (10).

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA FROM 2005-12

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past eight seasons, boasting a 3.14 team ERA from 2005-11.
- UVa was the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA from 2005-11 seasons; UVa was 57th with a 3.48 ERA last year.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2012 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also was the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each season from 2008-11.
