• UVA and Louiville are meeting for the fourth time in
series history. Its the second all-time meeting between
the Cavaliers and Cardinals in the "Derby City."
PK Ian Frye's 42-yard field goal with 1:24 left sealed
the 23-21 victory over then-No. 21 Louisville the last
time these teams met in 2014. Its the third-longest
game-winning field goal in program history.
• Saturday's game is UVA's first in the "Bluegrass State"
since 1988, the last time the Cavaliers played at Louis-
ville. UVA has played four previous games in Kentucky,
two at UK in Lexington in 1902 and 1930. UVA also
played Vanderbilt in Louisville in 1898.
• RB Taquan Mizzell leads the nation's running backs
with 539 receiving yards and with 54 receptions.
Fifteen different Cavaliers have scored at least one

touchdown this season. That ranks No. 2 in the ACC behind Georgia Tech's 17.

#### VIRGINIA CONTINUES ACC ROADTRIP AT LOUISVILLE ON SATURDAY

 Virginia continues its ACC road tour on Saturday against the Louisville Cardinals. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m. and the game will be televised on regional sports networks. The game will air on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic in Virginia, Maryland and Washington, D.C.

#### CAVALIERS MAKING THEIR THIRD ALL-TIME TRIP TO THE "DERBY CITY"

- Virginia is making its third-all-time journey to Louisville, Ky., but only its second road game to play the Cardinals. UVA and the Cardinals also met in 1988 at old Cardinal Stadium.
- The Cavaliers first played in the Commonwealth of Kentucky on Nov. 12, 1898 against Vanderbilt. UVA won, 18-0, against the Commodores.
- UVA's first-ever game in the city of Louisville fell on the same weekend 117 years prior to this season's meeting in Derby City with the Cardinals.
- With the help of the University of Louisville's Archives and Special Collections, and the Nov. 13, 1898 edition of Louisville's Courier-Journal, it was determined the game was played at Fontaine Ferry Park, which was slightly south of the terminus of Market Street near the Ohio River.
- Fontaine Ferry gets its name from a family of French Huguenot descents that settled in Louisville in the early 1800s and operated a ferry across the Ohio River. By 1898, under new ownership, the grounds housed a hotel, velodrome, outdoor restaurant, bandstand and grandstand for events like football. In the early 1900s, Fontaine Ferry became Louisville's premier amusement park. In 1997 the \$1.2 million Shawnee Park Sports Complex was built on the former Fontaine Ferry site.

• According to the Nov. 13, 1898 edition of Louisville's *Courier-Journal*, the UVA football team attended "The Royal Box" at Macauley's Theatre after the win over Vanderbilt. The theatre was located on Walnut Street, which is current day Muhammad Ali Boulevard. It was reported that the squad occupied three boxes and they filed in "to a ripple of applause" from the audience. According to Louisville's Courier-Journal, each player wore a big yellow chrysanthemum and a "large streamer of orange and blue."

#### **UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds**: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year**: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth**: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

#### UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

#### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

#### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

#### WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

#### **VIRGINIA VS. LOUISVILLE SERIES HISTORY**

• Saturday marks the fourth time in series history the Cavaliers and Cardinals have met in football and the second time in ACC play.

• All three games in the series were won in the closing minutes on field goals.

• The two schools first met at Louisville in 1988, a 30-28 Cardinal win. Louisville kicker Ron Bell connected on a 39-yard field goal with 10 seconds left in the game to give the Cardinals the triumph at Old Cardinal Stadium. UVA had led Louisville 28-14 after scoring on its opening drive of the second half. But Louisville scored 16 unanswered points to snatch the victory away from the Cavaliers.

• The tables were flipped when the series moved to Charlottesville in 1989. Jake McInerney kicked a 37-yard field goal as time expired to lift UVA over Louisville, 16-15.

• McInerney's kick is one of two field goals in UVA history to win a game with zeros on the clock. The most recent was in 2011 when Robert Randolph chipped a 23-yard game-winner at Indiana.

• Current UVA defensive end Mike Moore's father, Shawn, gave UVA a 13-9 lead with his 4-yard passing strike to Herman Moore in the closing seconds before halftime. Louisville used two fourth-quarter field goals to build a 15-13 lead before McInerney's heroics.

On UVA's game-winning drive, Shawn Moore orchestrated the offense on a 10-play, 60-yard drive, to set up McInerney's field goal. The drive included a 25-yard quarterback draw by Moore as the UVA signal caller accumulated for 40 yards during the drive with his own legs.
PK Ian Frye's 42-yard field goal with 1:24 left won the game for the Cavaliers in 2014. Frye's field goal is the third-longest game-winning field goal in UVA program history.

#### IT'S A COMMONWEALTH AND NOT A STATE

 UVA and Louisville hail from two of the four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references.

 In addition to Virginia and Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania are also Commonwealths.

 The ACC boasts members in all four Commonwealths. UVA already played in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania this season, visiting Pitt on Oct. 10.

#### LOUISVILLE IS UVA'S YEARLY ACC ATLANTIC DIVISION FOE

•The ACC said so long to Maryland when Louisville joined the league on July 1, 2014. Maryland had served as UVA's annual Atlantic Division crossover opponent every season since the ACC created the division format in 2005.

 Louisville not only takes Maryland's spot in the Atlantic Division, but also serves as UVA's annual crossover opponent.

#### CAVALIERS TO PLAY ON FIELDTURF FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2013

• UVA is playing on an artificial surface for only the fifth time in the Mike London era and for the first time since playing on Maryland's new FieldTurf in 2013.

The other three UVA games on an artificial surface under Mike London came at Boston College in 2010, at Indiana in 2011 and against Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl at the Georgia Dome.
FieldTurf won't be new to the Cavaliers since they practice on it each day at the McCue Center.

#### **UVA VS. TEAMS FROM THE BLUEGRASS STATE**

• Virginia has played seven games against teams from the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

- UVA is 4-3 all-time against teams from the "Bluegrass State."
- UVA played Centre College from Danville, Ky., at Lambeth Field in Charlottesville in 1919, a 49-7 loss.
- UVA played Kentucky in 1902, 1903 and 1930. The 1902 and 1930 games against the Wildcats were played in Lexington, Ky., while the 1903 meeting was in Charlottesville.

• Including the 1898 meeting in Louisville between UVA and Vanderbilt, Saturday is the Cavaliers' fifth all-time game in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

#### **UVA-LOUISVILLE CONNECTIONS**

• There are a couple connections between Louisville and UVA.

UVA offensive line coach Dave Borbely returns to Louisville where he was the running game coordinator and offensive line coach on Charlie Strong's 2010-13 staffs. He attended four bowl games with the Cardinals, including the 2013 Sugar Bowl win over Florida.
UL head coach Bobby Petrino coached on the same Weber State staff as UVA special teams coordinator and running backs coach

Larry Lewis. • Lewis was the outside linebackers coach at Weber State from

1981-85, while Petrino was a graduate assistant in 1984.

• Petrino returned for two years, 1987-88, as the wide receivers coach. Lewis at that point had become the defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator.

• When Petrinio was the head coach of the Atlanta Falcons, he coached former UVA standout Jason Snelling.

• The first two meetings between UVA and Louisville, the Cardinals head coach was Howard Schnellenberger. Current UVA associate head coach and linebackers coach Mike Archer was on Schnellenberger's Miami staff from 1979-83, which included the Hurricanes' first National Championship season in 1983.

• A nice UVA tie to the Kentucky Derby involves alum Hollis B. Chenery. He earned a masters degree in Charlottesville at the University of Virginia. Chenery's sister, Penny, raced Secretariat on behalf of the family after their father passed. Secretariat won the Kentucky Derby in 1973 on the way to the Triple Crown. After Secretariat's victory in the Belmont Stakes, Hollis Chenery led the horse down the walkway to the winner's circle as cameras took pictures and the crowd gave a standing ovation.

#### Last Meeting

Kelvin Rainey recovered a fumbled punt at the Louisville 25 and four plays later, Ian Frye's 42-yard field goal lifted the Cavaliers to a 23-21 victory over the Cardinals, who were ranked No. 21 in the nation by the Associated Press.

Twice in the fourth quarter, penalties against Henry Coley kept Louisville drives alive, and each finished with a touchdown, helping them erase a 20-7 deficit. The second TD came with

6:59 to play, and Virginia got one first down on the ensuing possession, and then punted. As James Quick settled under it for the Cardinals, a teammate bumped him and the ball came loose.

Before the fourth quarter, the Cavaliers controlled the game. Greyson Lambert threw for a touchdown and ran for another score, and Frye had two earlier field goals before Louisville put starting quarterback Will Gardner back in the game.

Gardner, lifted in favor of more mobile freshman Reggie Bonnafon, led consecutive touchdown drives. He hit Keith Towbridge for 28 yards on one third down play, and got help from a pass interference call on Coley to convert a third-and-8 play. Dominique Brown ran it in from the 6 three plays later to make it 20-14.



#### LOOKING BACK AT THE GEORGIA TECH WIN

• UVA's 27-21 win over Georgia Tech on Oct. 31 had some notables.

 Its the only time all season that Virginia has won the field possession against an opponent. UVA's average starting field position was at the 35-yard line, while Georgia Tech was at the 28-yard line, a plus-seven advantage for the Cavaliers.

• UVA shut down the Georgia Tech option-rushing attack, limiting the Yellow Jackets to just 144 rushing yards, its second-fewest of the season for Paul Johnson's group. In return, Georgia Tech passed the ball 31 times, the most in the Paul Johnson era in Atlanta.

• UVA set its season high in rushing at 233. It's the first time since a 2011 win over Georgia Tech that Virginia outrushed the Yellow Jackets (274-272).

• Quin Blanding led UVA with 15 tackles against Georgia Tech, seven of which came in the fourth quarter.

#### **UVA OPPONENTS RACKING UP WINS**

• The five UVA opponents that have beaten the Cavaliers are a combined 43-12 in 2015.

• UVA is 2-3 in ACC play, with losses on the road to Pitt, North Carolina and Miami. Those two teams are a combined 12-3 in ACC play.

• Overall, the nine opponents UVA has played thus far in 2015 are a combined 51-23 (.689).

• The five of the six teams that have beaten UVA in 2015 are all currently ranked, or have been ranked at one point during the 2015 season in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches polls. All six teams at one point had received votes in both polls. All six teams are currently bowl-eligible.

#### **UVA TOPS SYRACUSE IN THREE OVERTIMES**

- The last game at Scott Stadium, Virginia played its first overtime game since 2011 when the Cavaliers topped Idaho, 21-20, in one overtime.
- UVA's first overtime game since 2011 saw the Cavaliers top Syracuse, 44-38, in three overtimes. It was UVA's first three-overtime game ever.
- Virginia trailed 24-14 in the fourth quarter. Virginia won its first game trailing by 10 or more points in the
- fourth quarter since Sept. 28, 2002 at Wake Forest when the Cavaliers trailed 34-24 and won, 38-34.
- UVA is now 4-5 all-time in overtime games and has won four of its last five overtime games.

#### **VIRGINIA OFFENSIVE DRIVES AND THE RECORD BOOK**

- Against Syracuse UVA reeled off a 19-play drive that resulted in an Ian Frye field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime. The 19 plays serves as the second-most on a scoring drive in program history.
- Earlier in the year UVA had a touchdown drive that lasted 9:13 against William & Mary. That drive served as the second-longest scoring drive in program history.

• Against Georgia Tech UVA had a touchdown drive that lasted 8:08. That drive is the seventh-longest scoring drive in program history.

• WR T.J. Thorpe broke his clavicle on Wed., Aug. 12 in preseason camp and returned to action against the Tribe on Sept. 19, making his Virginia debut.

- The North Carolina transfer was cleared on Wed., Sept. 16, five weeks after being injured.
- Thorpe made his first catch for the Cavaliers against Boise State, a 75-yard touchdown reception.

• Thorpe's previous catch at Scott Stadium was the game-winning score for North Carolina on a 16-yard reception on Oct. 25, 2014.

• Thorpe led UVA with five catches for 70 yards at Pitt in his third game back.

### PATRICK KERNEY NAMED ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME LEGEND

• Former Virginia All-American defensive end Patrick Kerney was announced by the Atlantic Coast Conference on as one of its Class of 2015 Legends for the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on Dec. 5.

• Kerney (1995-98) was a standout defensive end for head coach George Welsh's Virginia teams of the late 1990s. Kerney capped his collegiate career by earning first-team All-ACC and All-America honors as a senior. His 15 quarterback sacks in 1998 led the ACC, ranked second in the nation and tied the Virginia record set by Chris Slade in 1992.

• The Yardley, Pa., native, who was originally recruited as a lacrosse player and played the sport for two seasons at the collegiate level, had his UVA football jersey (58) retired after closing out his Virginia career with 127 tackles and 24 sacks. Kerney spent 11 years in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks. He earned NFC Defensive Player of the Year honors with Seattle in 2007 after leading the NFC in sacks with 14.5 and forcing five fumbles.

• Kerney and his wife, Lisa, currently reside in Riverside, Conn., with their four children.

• The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend at the ACC Night of Legends, sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Dec. 5, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship.

• Since Mike London became UVA's head coach prior to the 2010 season, 40-of-55 FBS opponents went on to play in a bowl game.

• Six additional FBS opponents did not play in bowl games during that span due to NCAA sanctions (Penn State, Miami, North Carolina, USC), or turned down their lone invite (Louisiana Tech).

• In total, 46-of-55 FBS opponents of UVA from 2010-14 have been bowl-eligible.

• UVA was one of four FBS programs from 2014 to play 10 teams that went on to play in bowl games. Alabama, Arkansas and Vanderbilt were the others.

• In 2013 UVA became only the second school in college football history to face 11 opponents that went on to play in bowl games. Florida State in 2002 is the other.

#### THE EARLY ARRIVALS AND EARLY TREND UNDER MIKE LONDON

• Two prospects from the 2015 recruiting class (of 22) enrolled in January. Those two were: OG Grant Polk, from Punta Gorda, Fla., and Charlotte High School; LB C.J. Stalker, from West Chester, Ohio and Lakota West High School.

• The two early arriving Cavaliers continue a trend of high school seniors electing to graduate early/complete requirements to graduate and enroll at Virginia for the spring semester.

• Five members of the Class of 2016 signed grant-in-aid paperwork and will enroll early at UVA in January and will take part in spring practice. London announced on Oct. 5 that TE Christian Baumgardner (Ocean City, N.J.), Tre Harbison (Shelby, N.C.) and LB Matt Terrell (Lynchburg, Va.) signed grant-in-aid paperwork with the Cavaliers. London announced on Oct. 28 that PK Holland Corbett (Charlottesville, Va.) and LB Kenneth Ruff (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) signed grant-in-aid paperwork with the Cavaliers. Since Mike London has become the head coach in 2010, Virginia will have a total of 14 players who have left high school early, including the Class of 2016. Those players are:

#### **NEW ON THE SIDELINES**

• Coach Mike London's staff will feature two new assistant coaches: Chris Beatty is the team's assistant head coach and running backs coach, while Dave Borbely is the offensive line coach.

- Beatty, a native of the Commonwealth (Centreville), comes to UVA after two seasons at Wisconsin.
- Borbely returns to UVA where he spent the 2006-09 seasons. Since his last tenure in Charlottesville Borbely spent four years under Charlie Strong at Louisville and won a NCAA DII title at Colorado State-Pueblo in 2015.

#### **UVA HAS SOME UNTESTED YOUTH IN CHARLOTTESVILLE**

- UVA has a roster of 110 players.
- Of those 110 players, 68 are either freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores.
- That comes out to 61.8 percent of Virginia's 2015 roster.

#### **SEASON CAPTAINS FOR 2015**

 Seniors: OG Ross Burbank, FB Vince Croce, DT David Dean and WR Canaan Severin have been selected by their peers as captains of the 2015 football season.

#### JACOB RAINEY IS A STUDENT ASSISTANT

- Jacob Rainey, a junior, assists offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild with the quarterbacks as a student assistant.
- Jacob Rainey, a quarterback from Woodberry Forest in Virginia, had his right leg amputated after a freak injury in a scrimmage in 2011.
- Rainey suffered a dislocated right knee, but while he was hospitalized the news got far worse. An artery in his lower right leg had been severed, cutting off circulation. Over the next week, Rainey underwent four surgeries as doctors tried to save his leg. They were unsuccessful.
- A week after Rainey was tackled on a routine play, doctors amputated his right leg above the knee.
- As word of Rainey's ordeal spread, he was inundated with letters and gifts from well-wishers, including Alabama football coach Nick Saban, Green Bay Packers linebacker Clay Matthews and former NFL quarterback Tim Tebow, who was quarterback for the Denver Broncos at the time.
- Tebow reached out to Rainey and wanted to meet in person. On Dec. 24, 2011, Rainey, along with his father and older brother, attended the Broncos' game in Buffalo as Tebow's guests.
- Rainey's experience and inspiring story was documented an episode of ESPN's series E:60.

• The Woodberry Forest quarterback returned to the field in 2012 and played with a prosthetic leg, throwing two touchdowns on nine passes.

• UVA WR Canaan Severin changed his number prior to the 2014 season from 84 to 9 in honor of his friend. Rainey wore number 9 at Woodberry Forest.

#### SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 449 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 254-183-12.

#### **SMOKE MIZZELL TAKING THE NEXT STEP 2015**

• Virginia junior running back Taquan "Smoke" Mizzell is in the midst of a breakout season after backing up UVA's No. 5 all-time rusher Kevin Parks the past two seasons.

Mizzell is off to a solid pass-catching start, grabbing eight catches for 100 yards and a touchdown at No. 13 UCLA in the opener. He had four more against No. 9 Notre Dame.
Mizzell tallied his second 100-yard receiving game of the season with 123 yards on five catches against William & Mary. Mizzell had an 80-yard touchdown reception against the Tribe, which is tied for the 16th-longest in UVA history. The play was the longest pass play since Michael Rocco found Perry Jones for a 78-yard score at Miami in 2011.

The 80-yard reception by Mizzell is the tied for the 19th-longest in the nation this year.
Taquan Mizzell leads the nation's running backs with 539 receiving yards and with 54 receptions.

• Mizzell is the only running back in the nation with two 100-yard receiving games in 2015.

• Mizzell has a catch in 30 straight games, which is the second-longest streak in the ACC:

#### **VIRGINIA'S DYNAMIC PASSING GAME RISES IN 2015**

• UVA quarterback Matt Johns has thrown two passes this season that have gone for at least 75 yards. He threw an 80-yard scoring strike to Taquan Mizzell against William & Mary and then connected with T.J. Thorpe for a 75-yard score against Boise State.

• This marks only the third time UVA has completed two passes of 75 yards or longer in the same season. The last time was 1995 when Mike Groh connected on passes of 82 and 76 yards. The first time was the 1983 season when Wayne Schuchts recorded passes of 85 and 80 yards.

• Groh, Johns, Schuchts and Matt Blundin are the only Cavaliers to throw at least two career passes of 75 yards or more.

• Schuchts is the only UVA quarterback with three completions of 75 yards or more. He also connected on a 93-yard scoring strike in 1982, the second longest reception in program history.

• Between 2001 and 2014 Virginia averaged 1.28 touchdown passes a season that went for 40 yards or more. Through eight games in 2015 the Cavaliers already have five, all coming in the first four games.

#### **DEFENSE THWARTS GEORGIA TECH**

• UVA shut down the Georgia Tech option-rushing attack, limiting the Yellow Jackets to just 144 rushing yards, its second-fewest of the season. In return, Georgia Tech passed the ball 31 times, the most in the Paul Johnson era in Atlanta. Of the 144 rushing yards, 49 of them came on one play, a 49-yard score by Clinton Lynch.

• At halftime, Georgia Tech had 153 yards, 79 of which had come on two plays: Lynch's 49-yard run and a 30-yard touchdown pass from Justin Thomas to Lynch.

• On third-down conversations for the game, the Jackets were 5-of-13. On fourth down, they were 0-of-3.

#### **DEFENSE GETS ANOTHER SCORE AGAINST CUSE**

• Wilfred Wahee picked up a fumble and sprinted 32 yards for a touchdown against Syracuse. It is the second fumble recovery for a touchdown this year for the Cavaliers. Kwontie Moore a week before the Syracuse game picked up a fumble and sprinted 15 yards for a score at Pitt.

• Both Moore and Wahee were teammates at Norfolk Christian.

• Mike Moore forced the fumble on both fumble recovery scores.

#### **BLANDING DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES**

• UVA's Quin Blanding led UVA with 15 tackles vs. Georgia Tech, eight were solo. It was his fourth double-digit tackle game of 2015.

• Blanding has nine double-digit tackles games over 21 collegiate games.

• Blanding has 203 career tackles, 9.7 per game.

#### NICHOLSON BACK AT IT FOR UVA

 Senior CB Demetrious Nicholson has returned to the field in 2015 after missing 18-of-19 games during the 2013 and 2014 seasons.

• Nicholson started in the opener at UCLA and made seven tackles. It was his 32nd career start.

Nicholson is now the veteran of the Virginia

defense, starting the first 30 games of his career since he stepped foot on Grounds prior to the 2011 season.

• An injury in the third quarter against Ball State led him to miss the final seven games of the 2013 season.

• Of the 2,055 defensive plays Virginia lined up for since the opening game of the 2011 season until the injury against Ball State, Nicholson played 1,981 of those plays, meaning from Sept. 3, 2011 through Oct. 5, 2013 he played 96.39 percent of UVA's defensive plays.

• Nicholson came back to play against Kent State in 2014, starting his 31st career game. He made five tackles and recorded one interception in the end zone.

After the Kent State game, Nicholson had to shut it down for the remainder of the season and was granted a medical hardship for the 2014 season.
Since Nicholson's injury against Ball State, he has lined up for only 59 of UVA's 1,298 defensive plays (4.54 percent) through the 2014 season.

• In 2011 Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.

#### **BLANDING AND KISER LEADING THE ACC IN TACKLES**

• ILB Micah Kiser is No. 1 in the ACC in tackles (9.4 per game), while FS Quin Blanding is No. 2 in the ACC in stops (8.9 per game).

• The duo is the only defensive pairing from the same school that rank No. 1 and No. 2 in tackles over the 10 FBS conferences.

#### **CORNEY HAS PICKED UP PRODUCTION THE LAST TWO WEEKS**

 Senior DE Trent Corney has picked up his production the past two weeks, tallying a combined 11 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss in games against Georgia Tech and Miami.

• Over the season's first seven games Corney had 19 combined tackles and only 2.5 combined tackles for loss.

#### NICHOLSON IS ONE OF THE ACC'S BEST

• Senior CB Demetrious Nicholson is tied for No. 6 in the nation (No. 1 in the ACC) among active players with 36 passes defended.

• Nicholson entered the 2015 season with 28 career pass breakups, the most of any active ACC player.

#### VIRGINIA ENTERED 2015 WITH ONLY ONE CAREER START AMONG ITS LINEBACKER CORPS

Virginia lost all three starting linebackers from 2014.

• Henry Coley and Daquan Romero were lost to graduation, while Max Valles left two years early to enter the NFL Draft. Only junior Zach Bradshaw has started a game at linebacker for the Cavaliers, getting the nod against Georgia Tech in 2013 as a true freshman.

• The only team in the nation with fewer career starts at linebacker entering 2015 is TCU with zero.

# TENUTA GAVE UVA'S DEFENSE AN AGGRESSIVE MAKEOVER IN 2013 AND IT CONTINUES TODAY

• Virginia's associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta is a UVA alum and has brought an aggressive makeover to the Cavaliers since he came home to Charlottesville in 2013. • UVA over the six seasons prior to Tenuta UVA had the sixth-worst turnover margin in the nation (-35).

In 2012 UVA recorded only four interceptions, the fewest by a Virginia Cavalier team since the birth of the forward pass.

• Tenuta said prior to the 2013 season that "we want to create problems for the front five and never let the quarterback set his feet in the passing game."

• UVA over the past few seasons has been near the bottom nationally in turnover margin and sacks per game – Tenuta wants to change that.

• During Tenuta's first season at UVA the Cavaliers boasted Anthony Harris, who led the nation in interceptions. Eli Harold was No. 4 in the nation among underclassmen with 8.5 sacks.

• Tenuta enters his 35th season of collegiate coaching and his 19th as a defensive coordinator. He has had stops in the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and at Notre Dame and looks to continue to create turnovers and sack numbers that have declined in recent years at UVA prior his return.

#### **NO PUNT RETURNS FOR UVA**

 Virginia, who leads the nation in punt return average at 26 yards per return, has not been able to return a punt for five games.

• UVA last returned punts (two) against Boise State.

#### ZACCHEAUS SETS KICK RETURN RECORD

• With 231 kick return yards against Boise State, Olamide Zaccheaus broke the UVA record for return yards in a game. He broke Marquis Weeks' mark of 172 yards against North Carolina in 2002.

• The 231 yards is tied for the third-most return yards in a game in ACC history, tying him with Leroy Gallman of Duke who had 231 against NC State in 1992.

Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

#### **CANADY TO THE HOUSE**

• Senior Maurice Canady fielded two punts for 94 yards against William & Mary and took one to the house for a 74-yard touchdown return.

• The punt return is tied for the 16th-longest in the nation this season.

• The return marked the fifth-longest punt return for a touchdown in program history and the eighth-longest overall punt return.

• It was UVA's first punt return for a touchdown

since Alvin Pearman against Temple in 2004. • Canady also returned a blocked field goal 65 yards against Miami in 2014, which stands as a program record.

#### IAN FRYE RETURNS AS ONE OF ACC'S BEST

Senior lan Frye is in his final year on Grounds after one of the nation's better seasons in 2014.
Frye, a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2014, nailed 22 field goals. The 22 field goals ranked No. 2 in the ACC and No. 2 all-time at UVA for a season.
In 2014 Frye booted the third-longest gamewinning field goal in program history with his 42-yarder against No. 21 Louisville.

• Frye's range can reach 50+ and owns the third-longest made field goal in program history, connecting on a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against BYU in 2013.

• That 2013 kick is tied with Connor Hughes, who hit his 53-yarder in 2003 against Wake Forest.

• The program record is 56 yards by Kenny Stadlin in 1984 against Virginia Tech and matched by Rafael Garcia vs. Texas in 1995.

• Coach London put Frye on scholarship during the spring semester of 2014.

- Alec Vozenilek succeeded Howell for the 2012 season and held the job through 2014.

• Sophomore walk-on quarterback Andrew Mackay takes over holder duties from Matt Johns. Johns held on every UVA field goal and PAT attempt from 2013-14.

• UVA sophomore Quin Blanding was named by his mother Cory Lee after the movie titled "The Mighty Quinn," staring Denzel Washington and Mimi Rogers. It was the first movie she saw following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of that moment during pregnancy. She knew he will be all right and that he will be the mighty one.

 Blanding's father, Kevin, played football at NCAA Division II Glenville State (W.V.) for current Arizona football head coach Rich Rodriguez.

 David Dean's father, Shawn, also played at Glenville State under Rodriguez and was teammates with Blanding.

• UVA WR Canaan Severin changed from number 84 to number 9 prior to the 2014 season in honor of UVA student assistant Jacoby Rainey. Rainey wore number 9 as the Woodberry Forest quarterback where a freak game accident forced the amputation of his leg. After the accident Rainey was featured on an episode of E60 and was a quest of then-Denver QB Tim Tebow at a game in Buffalo.

 UVA head coach Mike London's younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back for Virginia from 1992-95. Paul played a major part during UVA's NCAA record streak of 39 straight games with at least one interception. The streak ran from Nov. 6, 1993 through Nov. 29, 1996.

 UVA's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 105 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVA stats crew on game day. • CB Demetrious Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.

 WR Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006. Junior CB Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13). • DE Trent Corney's older brother, Taylor, won the Bronze at the 2009 Pan American Junior Championships in the Decathlon. Taylor has also been ranked in the Top 10 in the world in the Decathlon. Matt Johns made his collegiate debut as the UVA holder in 2013. The first time Johns made it into a

college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in UVA history.

 Arizona head coach Rich Rodriguez has a connection to four Virginia Cavaliers. DT David Dean's father, Shawn Dean, and FS Quin Blanding's father, Kevin Blanding, were teammates together at Glenville State where Rich Rodriguez was the head coach.

• Rodriguez held David after he was born and said to Shawn Dean, "Make sure this boy comes and plays for me one day."

 QB Connor Brewer spent the last two seasons playing for Rich Rodriguez at Arizona.



#### JOHNS TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN STARTS

• Matt Johns threw at least one touchdown pass in his first 11 career starts before the streak was snapped at Miami in career start No. 12.

• A controversial offensive pass interference penalty on TE Charlie Hopkins at Miami negated the streak continuing in game number nine. Johns had found Canaan Severin in the end zone on the play.

• Johns had 17 touchdown passes over those 11 career starts which included the first eight games of 2015 and three games in 2014 (Kent State, Pitt and Duke).

#### JOHNS TOPS 200 YARDS PASSING AT MIAMI

- Matt Johns threw for 280 yards at Miami on a career-high 29 completions Johns has thrown for over 200 yards in eight of his 12 career starts.
- Johns had his string of games with 200 or more yards passing snapped at three after throwing for 199 yards against Boise State on Sept. 25.

• Johns threw for 263 yards against in-state foe William & Mary on Sept. 19 and set a career mark with three passing touchdowns.

• Johns in the home opener vs. then-No. 9 Notre Dame threw for 289 yards at Scott Stadium.

• Johns already threw for 238 yards at the Rose Bowl against then-No. 13 UCLA in the season opener.

• Dating back to 2014, Johns started his career eclipsing the 200-yard passing plateau in five of his first six career starts.

• He is only the second Cavalier to do that, joining Matt Blundin who accomplished the feat between the 1989-91 seasons. Blundin recorded at least 200-yards passing in seven of his first eight career starts.

#### JOHNS IS VIRGINIA'S STARTING QUARTERBACK

• Matt Johns finished spring football as the No. 1 signal caller for UVA.

• While Johns played well over half of the 2014 season-opening game against then-No. 7 UCLA, he became the fourth-different starting quarter-back the Cavaliers have had in four seasons (2012-15).

• Johns was the fifth-string quarterback in 2012, moved up to third string in 2013 and was the back-up in 2014.

• Johns made three starts in 2014 when Greyson Lambert was injured, going 2-1 with victories over Kent State and Pitt.

#### JOHNS GOT HIS START AS UVA'S PRIMARY HOLDER

• Johns held on every field goal attempt and PAT during the 2013 and 2014 seasons.

• The very first collegiate play for Johns came when he held on Ian Frye's 53yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter against BYU in 2013. The field goal by Frye is tied for the third longest in UVA history.

#### A LOOK BACK AT COLLEGE FOOTBALL HISTORY ON THE GROUNDS OF UVA AS THE COLONNADES AT LAMBETH FIELD CELEBRATE 102 YEARS

• The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 102 in 2015. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.

• Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.

• It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.

• Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.

• Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.

• At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.

• A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp. Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes. The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.

• On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.

• Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.

• Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013, 2014 and 2015, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

#### UVA ATHLETIC TRAINER FOR FOOTBALL IS ONE OF A FEW

Virginia's Kelli Pugh is one of eight women at the FBS level that is their school's sports medicine department's primary care provider for football.
Pugh is only one of three women at the FBS level that works with a Power-Five level program. Ariko Iso, who was with the Pittsburgh Steelers for years, is with Oregon State. Sally Nogle works with Michigan State.

Mike London enters his sixth season at Virginia with a team that returns 10 starters and more than 40 lettermen and a commitment to returning the Cavaliers to postseason play. The focus is on finishing after last year's team produced a 5-7 record that included several close losses that could have easily resulted in wins for UVA. Having relied on a number of underclassmen on the roster the past

two years, London hopes that those talented, and now seasoned players, are ready to help the program turn the corner.

The Cavaliers face one of the nation's top schedules in 2015 with the season opener at UCLA and early home games against Notre Dame and Boise State in Scott Stadium. London preaches to his team that "To be the best, you have to beat the best!" and he has his charges eager to take on the challenging slate.

Knowing London's backstory, it is easy to understand why he is so optimistic as well as why his players enjoy and embrace his coaching approach.

A former Richmond police detective, London's time in law enforcement dealing with the entire spectrum of human emotions and actions has provided a wealth of experience that he draws on to assist players both on and off the field. There are few stressful situations he has not faced - including having a loaded pistol pointed at him and the trigger pulled, only to have the weapon malfunction and not discharge its potentially lethal round. London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his

London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his daughter's lives when he was identified as a perfect match for her rare bone marrow disorder. That opportunity is one reason why London is an advocate of servitude and makes sure his players understand and embrace the concept of giving back through a variety of community services activities. One of the most visible is the team's annual bone marrow donor registration drive as part of the national "Get in the Game, Save a Life" initiative. During his time at UVA more than 600 names have been added to the national bone marrow registry.

London's biography includes plenty of chapters of football success on the field as well.

In the spring of 2014, defensive end Eli Harold was selected by the San Francisco 49ers and outside linebacker Max Valles later went to the Oakland Raiders to mark the 32nd consecutive season a UVA player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

During the 2014 season true freshman safety Quin Blanding earned freshman All-America honors and was named the ACC's Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In 2011, London led Virginia to one of its most outstanding seasons as the Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVA being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. Five of his players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media.

He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He defines the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVA the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years. Those results have continued to improve and during the spring of 2014, his players once again set a high mark for its GPA.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. Success has been a big part of the

Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders' were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVA staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVA to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texas. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach

and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina, are the parents of four children -Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. He has three older children, Michael, Jr., Brandon and Kristen through a previous marriage. The 53-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants practice squad. Brandon since 2010 has been with the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVA women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVA from 1991-95.
