FOR OPENERS

- The Cavaliers meet La Salle for the first time since the 1957-58 season at the Barclays Center Classic.
- Virginia is 5-0 for the first time since 2007-08 and seeks its first 6-0 start since 2004-05.
- Virginia has won each of its first five games by at least 17 points.
- The Virginia-La Salle winner meets the Rutgers-Vanderbilt winner on Saturday, Nov. 29 at 9:30 p.m.
- The Cavaliers rank first in the nation in scoring defense (44.6 ppg) and second in field goal percentage defense (29.3%).
- UVa has outrebounded each of its opponents and has a +16.2 rebounding margin.
- Justin Anderson has led or tied for the team lead in scoring in each of the first five games and is averaging a career-high 16.8 points.
- Virginia's 43-point margin of victory was its most since a 45-point win over Grambling on Dec. 30, 2001 (112-67)

VIRGINIA MOVES UP TO NO. 8 IN LATEST ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL

- UVa is ranked No. 8/7 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today coaches' polls.
- The Cavaliers were ranked No. 9 in the AP poll for the first three weeks of the season.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVa's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVa's No. 3 final AP ranking last season marked its highest final ranking since 1982.

CAVALIERS VS. LA SALLE, RUTGERS AND VANDERBILT

- La Salle leads Virginia 2-0 in the all-time series that dates back to the 1947-48 season.
- The Explorers topped the Cavaliers, 67-59, in the first meeting in Philadelphia on Jan. 10, 1948.
- La Salle added a 72-64 win over Virginia in the last meeting in Richmond on Dec. 27, 1957.
- Virginia is 3-0 all-time against Rutgers in a series that started in 1986-87.
- The Cavaliers are 1-5 all-time against Vanderbilt in a series that began in 1952-53.

ALL-TIME AGAINST THE ATLANTIC 10

- La Salle is one of four Atlantic 10 Conference opponents on UVa's 2014-15 schedule (Davidson, George Washington and VCU).
- The Cavaliers are 1-0 against the A-10 this season, defeating George Washington 59-42 on Nov. 21.
- Virginia is 113-79 all-time against current Atlantic 10 members (11-4 vs. Davidson, 2-0 vs. Dayton, 0-3 vs. Fordham, 7-1 vs. George Mason, 26-23 vs. George Washington, 0-2 vs. LaSalle, 2-0 vs. UMass, 1-1 vs. Rhode Island, 52-36 vs. Richmond, 2-6 vs. Saint Joseph's, 0-1 vs. Saint Louis and 10-2 vs. VCU).

AGAINST THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

- Virginia is 97-128 all-time vs. current Big Ten Conference opponents, including a 3-0 record vs. Rutgers and 74-107 mark against Maryland - the Big Ten's newest additions.
- The Cavaliers dropped a 61-59 decision to Michigan State in the 2014 NCAA Sweet 16 in their last game against a Big Ten opponent.

ALL-TIME VS. SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 60-61 all-time vs. current Southeastern Conference opponents, including a 1-5 mark against Vanderbilt.
- The Cavaliers would meet a SEC opponent for the first time since losing 87-52 at Tennessee on Dec. 30, 2013.

LAST TIME OUT

- Justin Anderson had a season-high 20 points on 7-7 shooting, including 5-5 from 3-point range, as Virginia stormed past Tennessee State on Nov. 25.
- Mike Tobey tallied his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 16 rebounds and Anthony Gill added 16 points on 6-6 shooting.
- Virginia led 42-17 at the half, had a 32-0 run and led by 45 points in the win.
- The Cavaliers dominated the glass, outrebounding the Tigers 49-22.
- The 36 points allowed by Virginia tied for the third-lowest total by an opponent in the shot clock era

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year UVa head coach Tony Bennett sports a 111-60 mark in Charlottesville and 180-93 record in nine seasons.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 64-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09; second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, fifth in 2012-13 and first in 2013-14).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 71.8 points and allowing a nation-leading 44.6 points, marking its best averages under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVa has shot 48.4 percent from the field and 39.2 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 29.3 percent from the field and 30.4 percent from 3-point range.
- The Cavaliers have held 29 straight opponents and 37 straight ACC opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field.
- UVa has limited its opponents to eight fast break points.
- In 2014-15, the Cavaliers rank in the top five nationally in five defensive categories: points per game (1st), field goal percentage (2nd), true shooting percentage (4th), effective shooting percentage (5th) and points per possession (5th).

BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason All-ACC performer Malcolm Brogdon leads UVa into action this season.
- Brogdon ranks second on the team at 11.8 points per game and had a season-high 17 points against South Carolina State.
- Brogdon has scored in double figures in 26 of the last 29 games dating back to last season.
- In 2013-14, Brogdon averaged a career-high 12.7 points and 5.4 rebounds en route to All-ACC honors.
- Brogdon scored a career-best 23 points in the 2014 ACC Tournament final win against Duke.

SIXTH MAN NO MORE

- Junior guard Justin Anderson has started and led or tied for the team lead in scoring in each of the first five games.
- Anderson tallied a season-high 20 points against Tennessee State and 18 points against James Madison and George Washington.
- He is averaging career highs in points (16.8), rebounds (4.8), field goal percentage (59.6%) and 3-point field goal percentage (68.2%).
- Anderson tied a career high with five 3-pointers on 5-5 shooting from distance against Tennessee State.
- Anderson was named 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds off the bench.
- In 2013-14, Anderson led the team in scoring in five games and had several game-changing defensive plays to ignite UVa.

HIGH POINT MAN IN THE PAINT

- Anthony Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, is averaging career highs in points (11.8) and rebounds (6.0) this season.
- Gill has hit doubles figures in three games, tallying a season-high 16 against Tennessee State.
- Gill leads the team in field goal percentage (62.9%) and is shooting a career-best 83.3 percent (15-18) from the free-throw line after shooting 62.7 percent last season and 64.6 percent at South Carolina in 2011-12.

LONDON CALLING

- Sophomore point guard London Perrantes returned to the lineup against Norfolk State and tallied seven points, four assists and no turnovers.
- Perrantes is 4-10 from 3-point range and has a 3.0 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Perrantes averaged 5.5 points and 3.8 assists and ranked sixth nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5) to earn All-ACC Freshman Team honors last season.
- Perrantes (140 assists) became the fourth UVa freshman to record 100 assists in a season, joining Cory Alexander (144 in 1991-92), Jeff Jones (136 in 1978-79) and Sean Singletary (113 in 2004-05).

NOLTE KNOWS SHOOTING

- Junior forward Evan Nolte is one of Virginia's top 3-point shooting threats.
- Nolte, who keyed UVa's rally with a pair of 3-pointers against Coastal Carolina in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, has shot 36.4 percent from 3-point range during his career.
- Nolte returned to the lineup against Norfolk State and had five points, two rebounds and one steal.

ROOKIES OFF TO GOOD START

- Redshirt freshman Devon Hall and true freshmen Isaiah Wilkins and Marial Shayok have made strong impressions in 2014-15.
- Hall had five points and five steals in a starting role in place of London Perrantes at James Madison.
- Wilkins chipped in eight points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks at James Madison.
- Freshman B.J. Stith has seen limited action in four games, scoring his first career points (4) against Tennessee State.
- Wilkins averaged 18.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.4 blocks en route to Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year honors for Greater Atlanta Christian last season, while Shayok averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds per game for Blair Academy.
- Stith averaged 12.4 points and 4.3 rebounds for national runner-up Oak Hill Academy.
- Wilkins is the stepson of NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, and Stith is the son of UVa all-time leading scorer Bryant Stith.

PAINT IT ORANGE AND BLUE

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 180-68 in the paint after five games.
- Frontcourt players Anthony Gill, Mike Tobey and Darion Atkins have combined to shoot 57.6 percent (57-99) from the field and are averaging 20.2 rebounds as a unit.
- The threesome has led the team to a +16.2 rebounding margin as UVa is averaging 43 rebounds.
- Gill, Tobey, Atkins and Isaiah Wilkins have combined for 27 blocked shots in five games.

ABOUT THE 2014-15 SCHEDULE

- Five of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the latest AP poll (Duke, North Carolina, Louisville, VCU and Miami), while three (Syracuse, NC State and Maryland) received votes.
- Nine opponents (Duke, Louisville, Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Harvard, North Carolina, Syracuse and VCU) played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, while three (Clemson, Davidson and Florida State) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Norfolk State and Cleveland State) in the CollegelInsider.com Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball for the second consecutive season.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last five seasons.
- Duke was the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Louisville, Virginia, Syracuse, Pitt, Notre Dame, Florida State, NC State, Miami, Clemson, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Boston College and Virginia Tech.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.
