FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Saturday's game with Richmond commences the 123rd season of UVa football and the 97th season the Cavaliers open the year at home. UVa is 70-19-7 all-time when the first game of a season is played in Charlottesville.
- Richmond's head coach Danny Rocco is a former UVa assistant head coach (2001-05) and is the uncle of UVa QB Michael Rocco.
- With a win over Richmond, Mike London will become the first UVa head coach since Rice Warren (1913, 1920-21) to win the season openers in his first three seasons at the helm of the Cavalier football program.
- UVa has won eight straight games vs. Richmond, dating to 1946.
- UVa is one of 16 schools in the nation entering 2012 with the same nine assistants that started the 2011 season.

VIRGINIA OPENS 123RD SEASON OF FOOTBALL

- The University of Virginia commences its 123rd season of football Saturday against Richmond.
- UVa will be playing its 82nd season in Scott Stadium, which opened Oct. 15, 1931, against VMI.
- UVa is 78-35-9 (.676) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 72-19-7 (.770) in home openers and have won 14 of their last 18 openers in Scott Stadium.
- In his career as a head coach, Mike London has won all four of his season-openers: 2008 at Elon and 2009 at Duke while at Richmond and 2010 vs. Richmond and 2011 vs. William & Mary while at Virginia.
- With a win over Richmond, Mike London will become the first UVa head coach since Rice Warren (1913, 1920-21) to win the season openers in his first three years at the helm of the Cavalier football program.

VIRGINIA VS. RICHMOND, CAA

- Virginia owns a 26-2-2 edge in the all-time series with Richmond, which dates to 1893. UVa has won the last eight meetings, including a 34-13 win in 2010 in Mike London's debut as UVa's head coach.
- Richmond's last win in the series came in 1946, a 19-7 victory in Richmond.
- The Cavaliers own a 55-9-3 record against current members of the CAA.
- London is 15-3 all-time vs. the CAA and 8-3 all-time against FCS ranked CAA foes.

FAMILIAR FACES ON BOTH SIDELINES

- The coaching staffs from the two teams are uniquely intertwined, with former UR head coach Mike London now in his third season at UVa and former UVa assistant head coach Danny Rocco now the head coach at Richmond.
- Both London and Rocco served as defensive assistants together at Virginia under former UVa head coach Al Groh (2001-04). Rocco played two seasons under Groh at Wake Forest, was a graduate assistant with the Demon Deacons and later joined Groh with the Jets in 2000. Rocco followed Groh to Charlottesville in 2001 and spent five seasons with the Cavaliers.
- UR head coach Danny Rocco is the uncle of UVa QB Michael Rocco.
- UR head coach Danny Rocco's daughter Amy is a second-year at UVa and works in the football office.
- UVa defensive coordinator Jim Reid is another former Richmond head coach, serving as the head coach of the Spiders from 1995-2003.
- Three UVa assistants coached at Richmond before coming to UVa with Mike London and helped the Spiders to the 2008 FCS National Title (Vincent Brown, Jeff Hanson, Mike Faragalli); Brown also was on UVa staff in 2007 as a graduate assistant.
- Four Richmond assistants (Wayne Lineburg, Bob Trott, Levern Belin, Byron Thweatt) have been assistant coaches at Virginia. Thweatt is a former Cavalier standout and was a UVa graduate assistant in 2006.
- UVa OL coach Scott Wachenheim spent three seasons as the OC and assistant head coach at Liberty (2006-08) under current Richmond head coach Danny Rocco. The Flames put up prolific numbers under Wachenheim's offense and ranked in the top-10 in the FCS in yards and scoring during the tenure.
- Richmond assistant coaches Brandon Streeter (OC/QBs) and Blaine McCorkle (OL) both worked under Wachenheim during UVa's offensive line coach's time at Liberty.
- Richmond WR assistant coach Fontel Mines was four-year letterwinner (2003-06) at UVa and finished his career with 68 catches for 737 yards and 5 TDs. He graduated in 2007 before a brief NFL career with the Bears.
- Richmond QB Michael Strauss spent the 2010 and 2011 seasons at UVa. He redshirted the 2010 season and did not appear in any games in 2011 before enrolling at Richmond as a transfer student last spring.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

On each Monday during the football season, the UVa Athletics Media Relations office will conduct the weekly football press conference, attended by head coach Mike London and selected student-athletes. London will field questions beginning at 3 p.m. and student-athletes will begin interviews at 3:30 p.m. Snacks will be served.

Penn State week the weekly football press conference will be held Tuesday, Sept. 4 at 1:30 p.m.

Quotes from the Monday press conference will be posted on VirginiaSports.com Monday afternoon.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available each Monday, depending on class schedules. This is the best opportunity to interview players. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVa Athletics Media Relations office by Noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

ACC INJURY GUIDELINES

On each Monday during the season, ACC schools will announce any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

LAST MEETING: 2010 (UVA 34, UR 13)

- Keith Payne rushed 16 times for 114 yards and four TDs to lead UVA to the 34-13 victory.
- UVA QB Marc Verica threw for 283 yards and 1 TD, while his favorite targets were Kris Burd and Dontrelle Inman, who both came away with seven catches a piece.
- Burd, who graduated a year ago tied for the UVA program record (9) for most 100-yard receiving games in a career, posted the very first of his career vs. Richmond with 122 yards.
- The contest was the first for Mike London's new 4-3 defense and they were led by LaRoy Reynolds' eight tackles and Chase Minnifield's seven stops and one INT.

SEASON-OPENERS VS. IN-STATE FOES

- 2012 is the 35th season UVA has hosted a Commonwealth team in Scott Stadium's first game of the year.
- Playing in the season-opener against UVA, Richmond will have been the team four times out of those 35 games.
- Hampden-Sydney leads all Commonwealth teams in those 35 seasons with 11 appearances.

A LONDON/UR FLASHBACK TO 2010 MEETING

- Mike London made his UVA debut in 2010 vs. the Spiders the last time these teams met.
- UVA's 34-13 win against the Spiders in 2010 made London the first UVA coach to win his UVA debut game since the Bill Elias-led Cavaliers defeated William & Mary 21-6 in 1961. Six UVA coaches in between lost their debut game.
- Since 1931, the first season at Scott Stadium, a total of seven UVA coaches won their debut as head coaches of the Cavaliers - all seven defeated an in-state opponent.
- The full list: Fred Dawson (1931 vs. Roanoke), Gus Tebell (1934 vs. Hampden-Sydney), Frank Murray (1936 vs. Hampden-Sydney), Art Guepe (1946 vs. Hampden-Sydney), Ben Martin (1956 vs. VMI), Elias (1961 vs. W&M), London (2010 vs. Richmond).
- London became only the second coach (George Welsh - Navy) to make his UVA head coaching debut against his alma mater. Welsh opened up with Navy to kickoff the 1982 season for the Cavaliers.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY

- For the third season in a row the UVA coaching staff under head coach Mike London has remained intact.
- UVA is one of 16 schools in the nation entering 2012 with the same nine assistants that started the 2011 season.
- Florida State, Miami and Virginia Tech join UVA among ACC schools on the list of 16.
- BYU, Colorado, Georgia, Louisiana Tech, UL-Lafayette, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Mississippi State, Northwestern, Oregon, San Diego State and Texas also made the list.
- Virginia joins Florida State and Louisiana Tech as schools that have staff that have remained intact for two years in a row, while the only school on the list of 16 with a longer tenure is Oregon (three years).

FIVE CAPTAINS NAMED FOR 2012 TEAM

- Virginia will have five team captains this season.
- The captains: senior OT Oday Aboushi, senior ILB Steve Greer, senior DT Will Hill, senior TB Perry Jones and senior OLB LaRoy Reynolds.
- Perry Jones is the lone repeat captain from 2011 and becomes the first Cavalier to be named a captain multiple times since Nick Jenkins (2010-11).

THREE CAVALIERS COMPETING AS GRADUATE STUDENTS

- There are three Cavaliers that are graduate students at UVA this fall.
- (HLD) Jacob Hodges, (TE) Kyle McCartin and (WR) Brian Pomper all already hold their undergrad degree from UVA.
- Pomper was a two-year letterwinner on the UVA men's lacrosse team and part of the Cavaliers No. 1 recruiting class in 2008.

UVA GOES BOWLING FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2007

- With eight wins in 2011, Virginia was bowl eligible for the first time since 2007. UVA's five ACC victories were the most for UVA since finishing 6-2 in league play in 2007.
- Virginia won four road games in 2011, the most since winning four in 2007.

LONDON SERVES AS VOTER ON USA TODAY COACHES' POLL

- For the third-consecutive season, Mike London will serve as a voter on the USA Today Coaches' Poll.
- Fifty-nine coaches from FBS institutions across the nation participate in the poll.

LONDON FACES THREE FORMER COLLEAGUES IN 2012

- UVA head coach Mike London will face three head coaches this season (Danny Rocco of Richmond, Tom O'Brien of NC State and Al Golden of Miami) that he has formerly worked with.

WINNING THE TIME OF POSSESSION BATTLE

- Fourteen times in Mike London's time as head coach Virginia won the time of possession battle.
- London-led teams at UVA are 9-5 when winning the possession battle.

VIRGINIA RUSHING GAME PRODUCED IN '11

• Virginia averaged 165.3 rushing yards per game in 2011. That number is the second-highest amount put up by the Cavaliers in the past 12 seasons. During that time only the 2004 team (242.8) had a higher rushing average than the 2011 squad.

PERRY JONES PUT UP IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS

• Jones had 915 rushing yards in 2011, which was the most by a UVA Cavaliers since Alvin Pearman (1,037) in 2004.

• Jones has 1,468 all-purpose yards last season. That number is UVA's best since Alvin Pearman led the ACC in 2004 with 1,938.

PERRY JONES STANDS ALONE IN THE BCS

• Jones was one of only two players (only BCS player) in the nation last season to rush for at least 900 yards and notch at least 500 yards receiving, joining him was New Mexico State's Kenny Turner (1074 rush, 514 rec).

PERRY JONES CLIMBS TWO UVA ALL-TIME LISTS

• Perry Jones is climbing two all-time lists at UVA, in all-purpose yards and rushing. Below is where Jones racks up all-time on UVA's career lists:

• Jones set a career high with nine catches at FSU in 2011.

• His 78-yard reception at Miami (Oct. 27, 2011) was the longest of his career and the longest for the Cavaliers in 2011.

JONES ONE OF FEW RBs IN THE NATION

• With 80 career receptions, Perry Jones is tied for No. 2 in the nation among active running backs in career catches.

• Jones leads all active ACC running backs with his 80 career catches, with NC State's James Washington (72) the closest of all league backs.

UVa had 536 yards of total offense against Indiana in 2009 and 643 yards of total offense at Duke in 2010.
• UVa has amassed more than 400 yards of total offense in 12-of-25 games since offensive coordinator Bill Lazor brought his pro-style attack to Charlottesville. The Oct. 22, 2011 game vs. NC State (249 yards) and UVa's 2011 (241 yards) and 2010 (291 yards) regular season finales are the only games during the Mike London tenure where the Cavaliers failed to amass at least 300 yards of total offense.
• Three times since 2005 UVa has amassed 500 yards of total offense. They did so against Maryland in 2011, Duke in 2010 and Indiana in 2009.

HILL, TERRELL NAMED SPRING'S MOST IMPROVED

• Prior to the team's annual spring game, head coach Mike London announced the recipients of the Rock Weir Awards representing the most improved players during spring drills.
• Senior DT Will Hill was the most improved player on defense, while sophomore WR Dominique Terrell was tabbed the offense's most improved player.

FIVE FORMER UVA ASSISTANTS NOW HEAD COACHES

• Five current ACC head coaches have previously been assistant coaches at Virginia. Boston College's Frank Spaziani, NC State's Tom O'Brien, Miami's Al Golden, Wake Forest's Jim Grobe (graduate assistant) and of course UVa's Mike London.

CANADIANS ON UVA'S ROSTER

• UVa is tied with Eastern Michigan for the most Canadian natives in the nation on its current roster.
• UVa has four (Trent Corney, Ryan Doull, Brendan Morgan and Brent Urban).
• Buffalo, UConn, Iowa and Rice are tied for second with three.
• Boston College, Boise State, Northern Illinois, UNLV and Wyoming have two.
• There are 16 schools with at least one Canadian.
• Former UVa offensive guard Austin Pasztor hailed from Langton, Ontario and was a second team AP All-American last season and is now in camp with the Minnesota Vikings.

LONDON'S SECOND SEASON BY THE NUMBERS

• According to a study by Phil Steele's College Football Publications, UVa head coach Mike London in year two was ahead of the numbers of most second-year head coaches.
• According to research done on head coaches hired from 1990-2011, UVa's eight wins last season put Mike London 2.25 victories ahead of the average of 5.75 wins amongst all second-year coaches over the last 22 seasons.
• Since 1990 there have been 368 head coaches that have experienced a second season of their tenure, the combined record over that span is 2119-2268, good for a .483 winning percentage.
• In Year Two at UVa Mike London went 8-5, good for a .615 winning percentage.

- UVa has zero seniors in its secondary after having three senior starters a year ago.
- Only three other schools (Florida State, LSU and North Texas) in the nation also lack a senior in its secondary.

NO UPPERCLASSMEN AT CORNERBACK

- UVa has zero upperclassmen on its roster at the cornerback position.
- On UVa's roster there are four Fr. and three So. listed as corner backs.
- UVa is one of 13 schools in the nation that has zero upperclassmen at a specific position on its roster.
- North Texas lacks upperclassmen at cornerbacks and safeties.
- Six of those schools (Auburn, Indiana, Marshall, Nevada, Oregon and Texas A&M) are at the QB position.
- Boston College, Navy and North Texas join UVa at the cornerback position.
- Rounding out the list are Illinois (RBs), Idaho (TEs) and Tulsa (TEs).

NICHOLSON WASTED NO TIME MAKING AN IMPACT ON 'D'

- Sophomore CB Demetrius Nicholson last season was the first true freshman to start a season-opening game for UVa since Branden Albert in 2005 against Western Michigan at Scott Stadium.
- He was the first true freshman to start on defense since Ahmad Brooks opened up the 2003 season at linebacker in Scott Stadium against Duke.
- Nicholson also became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook did so in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.
- He has started all 13 of the Cavaliers' 2011 contests and earned freshmen All-America honors from two different publications.

- Former UVa greats D'Brickashaw Ferguson and Matt Schaub will have their jerseys retired and honored with plaques on Legends Walk in the north end of Scott Stadium at halftime of today's game.
- Ferguson (No. 66), a current member of the New York Jets, finished his career as one of the most decorated offensive linemen in school history. He was named a first-team All-American as a senior in 2005 and was an All-ACC pick as both a junior and senior.
- Schaub (No. 7) was named ACC Offensive and Player of the Year in 2002. The former Cavalier signal caller finished his career with 22 school records, including the marks for career yards passing, touchdown passes, completions, attempts, completion percentage, 300-yard games, and 200-yard games. Schaub is currently the starting quarterback for the Houston Texans.

DID YOU KNOW?

- UVa QB Michael Rocco and WR Dominique Terrell share a unique bond as both from 2006-08 could be spotted at Liberty football games watching their older brothers play together for the Flames. Zach Terrell and Chris Rocco were teammates for three years together in Lynchburg where current UVa offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator.
- Ausar Walcott has a unique story behind the meaning of his name first name. His mother, Pamela Robinson, named him Ausar, which is a derivative of Osiris, the Egyptian god of the afterlife. Osiris is classically depicted with two large ostrich feathers at either side, ironic since Ausar has stated over his life people have told him it looks like he runs like an ostrich.
- 2012 marks the fifth season in a row that UVa has seven home games on the schedule.
- Cornerback Demetrius Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.
- Freshman Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.

- Freshman Israel Vaughan's older brother, Joshua, is a member of the Carolina Panthers and played for Mike London at Richmond, and was a member of its 2008 FCS National Championship team.
- Air Force Academy graduate and UVa assistant coach Scott Wachenheim was awarded his bachelor's degree by then-President Ronald Reagan.
- Holder Jacob Hodges served as a team manager for two years (2008, 2009).
- Sophomore CB Drequan Hoskey ran track at Virginia in 2010 and competed at the ACC and NCAA Championships.
- UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 102 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day.
- Freshman CB C.J. Moore is the nephew of three-time Olympic champion in track & field, Gail Devers.
- TB Perry Jones, WR Tim Smith and QB Phillip Sims were all members of Oscar Smith High School's Virginia Group AAA Division 6 State Championship in 2008.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 420 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 241-167-12.

Mike London's plans to build the Virginia football program made remarkable progress during his second season in 2011.

The Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the

ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVA being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. A total of five Cavalier players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Virginia's 2011 squad ranked No. 4 in the ACC in total offense at 399.8 yards per game and rose to No. 3 in total defense at 351.7 yards allowed per game. The Cavaliers were one of just two ACC teams to be ranked in the top four of both of those key statistical categories.

In the spring of 2012 DE Cam Johnson was selected by the San Francisco 49ers to mark the 29th consecutive season a UVA player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media. He did not just wait for constituents to come to Virginia, he actively took the Cavalier program to the public.

London embraced a groundbreaking 18-episode television production entitled "The Building of a Program" that gave an all-access look at UVA football. He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He quickly defined the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVA the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years and student-athletes were heavily involved in community service projects and outreach programs.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. His first edition of Virginia football produced a 4-8 record but achieved a number of milestones that showed positive progress.

The Cavalier offense ranked third in the ACC at 404.8 yards per game after finishing last in 2009 at 269.6 yards per game. Senior Marc Verica led the league's fourth-best passing attack, finishing with 2,799 yards in the air, marking the third-best season mark in UVA history. Wide receivers Dontrelle Inman and Kris Burd became the first UVA wide receiving duo to each total a minimum of 40 receptions in a season. They also recorded over 600 yards receiving, also a program first for a wide receiver tandem.

Keith Payne led a much-improved rushing attack that featured two of the ACC's most productive runners. Payne led

the ACC with 14 rushing touchdowns, 16 total touchdowns and an 8.7 points per game scoring average.

Honorable mention All-American Chase Minnifield anchored the UVA defense in 2010, earning first-team All-ACC honors. Minnifield's two interceptions helped spark the Cavaliers' upset of No. 22 Miami, giving UVA its first win over a ranked team since 2008. Minnifield finished the year No. 2 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation with six INTs.

Offensive lineman Morgan Moses earned freshman All-America honors by helping the Cavaliers go 13 consecutive quarters without allowing a quarterback sack.

Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVA staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVA to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texans. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew

Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.
