## THE GAME

Louisiana Tech (3-0) looks to win four straight to open a season for the first time since 1975 as the Bulldogs take on Virginia (2-2) on Saturday, Sept. 29 in Charlottesville, Va. Louisiana Tech and Virginia will face each other for the first time ever when they kick off at 2:30 p.m. CT/3:30 p.m. ET at Scott Stadium.

## THE COACHES

**Louisiana Tech:** Sonny Dykes is in his third year at Louisiana Tech and overall as a head coach. He has a 16-12 record overall and led the Bulldogs to a 2011 WAC Championship and Poinsettia Bowl appearance last year.

**Virginia:** Mike London is in his fifth year as a head coach with a 38-20 record overall. The 2012 season marks his third at Virginia where he has accumulated a 14-15 mark heading into Saturday's game.

# TEAM NOTES

## CONSISTENT HIGH POWERED LEADS NATION

With the nation entering week five of the college football season, Louisiana Tech stands alone in one impressive area - overall scoring. While its scoring offense is ranked third in the nation averaging 54.67 points per game (an impressive ranking) it is the consistent number of points that stands well above the rest of the nation.

Louisiana Tech is the only team to score 50 or more points in each of its games this season with no other team able to achieve such distinction. Tech still stands at the top of the lists when moving the bar down to 45 points considering its competition. Only two other schools - Baylor and Florida State - join Louisiana Tech is having scored 45 points or more in each of their respective games this year but LA Tech is the only one of that group of three to have not yet faced an FCS-level team. Baylor (3-0; 59, 48, 47) has one win over an FCS team while Florida State (4-0; 69, 55, 52, 49) has two wins over FCS-level teams. With opponents of Houston, Rice and Illinois, Tech has not yet faced a team from the FCS level yet this season.

## TECH RECORDS SEVEN-GAME ROAD WINNING STREAK, A FIRST SINCE 1973-75

Carrying over its road success from last season, Louisiana Tech shows it is quite comfortable in its many homes away from homes. The Bulldogs currently have a seven-game road winning streak, the longest such streak for the program since winning 11 straight road games from 1973-75.

The streak started last season that was part of Tech's improbable run to a Western Athletic Conference Championship. Part of that improbable success of last year's team was not just that they won, it was that they primarily won on the road. Of the seven consecutive games that Louisiana Tech won to end the regular season last year, five of those came on the road with three of them in consecutive weeks at Fresno State, Ole Miss and Nevada.

## LOOKING TO EXTEND THE REGULAR SEASON WINNING STREAK

As Louisiana Tech entered the 2012 season, the Bulldogs were hoping to build off of last year's momentum including building on an improbable winning streak. Louisiana Tech ended the 2011 regular season by winning seven straight games that was capped off by a 44-0 shutout of New Mexico State to clinch the WAC title and included a 27-7 blowout at Ole Miss and a come-from-behind win at Nevada. The team's current 10-game regular season winning streak ranks third in the nation and is tied with TCU, the only team to beat Louisiana Tech in the past 11 games (2011 Poinsettia Bowl).

## TURNOVER BATTLE KEY TO WINNING STREAKS

Part of the reason for Louisiana Tech's regular season and road game winning streaks is due to the Bulldogs winning the turnover battle in those games. In every one of those wins, Tech has notched a positive turnover margin. During the 2011 campaign, the team's +11 turnover margin overall and +15 turnover margin during its seven-game winning streak led the Bulldogs to finish the year ranked 13th in the nation in turnover margin.

Now in 2012, Tech has a +6 turnover margin and is currently ranked sixth in the nation and first in the Western Athletic Conference in that category.

# TEAM NOTES

## LAST TWO GAMES VS. BCS TEAM RESULTED IN TECH FUMBLE RETURN FOR TD...

Louisiana Tech's opportunistic team seems to have a heightened sense of opportunity when it faces a team from a Bowl Championship Series conference. In its last two games vs. BCS-level teams, the Bulldogs have recovered/returned a fumble for a touchdown. The first came in Tech's 27-7 win at Ole Miss in 2011 when Chad Boyd returned a fumble 33 yards for a score while the second came in Tech's 52-24 dismantling of Illinois as Antonio Mitchum recovered a fumble in the end zone for six points.

## ...HIGH-POWERED OFFENSE LED TO WINS, TOO

It wasn't just opportunity knocking that led Louisiana Tech to knock off BCS-level teams in its last two meetings but also a high-powered offense that kept the Bulldogs out of reach. In its wins over Ole Miss (2011) and Illinois (2012), LA Tech outscored its opponents by 48 points (79-31). If you include its overtime loss at Mississippi State last year, Tech is outscoring opponents by 22 points (99-57).

## BULLDOGS GET BIG (TEN) VICTORY

With its 52-24 win at Illinois on Sept. 22, Louisiana Tech evened its all-time series against teams from the Big Ten Conference at 2-2. Tech has won two consecutive games over the Big Ten Conference including a 20-19 win at Michigan State in 2003.

## TECH OPENS SEASON WITH WIN ON THE ROAD FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1995

Louisiana Tech's win 56-49 in Houston on Sept. 8 marked the end of another drought as the Bulldogs opened the season by winning on the road for the first time since 1995. Since Tech won 28-21 at Bowling Green to open the 1995 campaign, the Bulldogs have started the year on the road six times (prior to this year) and gone 0-6 in those contests with four of those six opponents having been ranked in the top 20 (three of those four ranked in the top 10).

## FIRST WIN WHILE RANKED OR RECEIVING VOTES

Surprising as this stat may seem but Louisiana Tech's 56-49 win at Houston on Sept. 8 marked the first time in school history the team has won a game while either being ranked or having received votes in a poll. The team has only been ranked once - holding the No. 25 spot late in 1999 before falling at Southern Cal, 45-19, and was receiving votes when the Bulldogs dropped a 31-24 decision to No. 15 TCU in the Poinsettia Bowl last season.

Louisiana Tech hadn't even started the season yet and the team was already dealing with making changes on the fly. First it was the team's opening game being postponed due to Hurricane Isaac. Then the Bulldogs began preparing for Houston only to see Houston change offensive coordinators after the Cougars' season-opening loss to Texas State. Before even playing a snap of football in 2012, Louisiana Tech has prepared for three different offensive coordinators.

This accomplishment of academic excellence is par for the course in Ruston as Tech has consistently proven itself as an academic institution of the highest regard, especially when it comes to student-athletes.

### Among Tech's many laudable academic honors:

- ▶ Last year, Tech recorded its highest four-year graduation rate ever, ranking No. 1 in the state of Louisiana among FBS public institutions and second among WAC schools.
- ▶ Tech boasts one of the best retention rates (84.5) in the state of Louisiana, which tops the averages of both the LSU System (79.3) and the UL System (77.7).
- ▶ Tech has had more than 900 student-athletes earn Academic All-WAC honors since joining the league in 2001, including more than 94 this past year.
- ▶ Tech has the highest graduation rate (53.2%) in the UL System.
- ▶ Tech also saw nine of its 16 NCAA sanctioned programs record their highest multi-year APR rates ever while five of the programs registered their highest single year APR score ever. Four of the programs also earned a perfect 1,000 score on the single year rate while men's golf earned a perfect 1,000 on its multi-year rate. **All 16 of Louisiana Tech's NCAA sanctioned programs will be penalty free (in 2012-13) for the second consecutive year.**

## TEAM NOTES

### DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS

Louisiana Tech will play five games against teams from neighboring Texas this season. The last time that happened? Head coach Sonny Dykes was 11 years old and the Bulldogs were 4-6-1 under head coach Billy Brewer as a member of the Southland Conference.

With games against West Texas State, Baylor, Texas A&M, UT-Arlington and Lamar, the 1981 season was the last (and only other) time Louisiana Tech has played five teams from the state of Texas in a season. Tech was 1-4 against those teams with the only win coming against Lamar.

This year, the Bulldogs face Houston, Rice, Texas A&M, UTSA and Texas State. Twenty-six players on this year's roster list Texas as their home state — five more than in 2011 and more than twice as many from any state other than Louisiana.

The regional matchups also mean eight of 12 contests this season will take place in either Louisiana or Texas, cutting down on the wear on the team itself.

The Bulldogs played five or six fellow Louisiana teams 23 of 24 seasons from 1952-1975, but the 1981 campaign marks the only previous instance in which they have faced five or more schools for any other single state in a season.

### SEEING RED

Last week's game against Rice marked Louisiana Tech's annual RED OUT game where the Bulldogs wore their red jerseys at home instead of their traditional home blue jerseys. Since instituting the RED OUT game promotion in 2009, Louisiana Tech has gone 2-2 in those games.

### CURTAIN CALL

The 2012 season will mark Louisiana Tech's final year in the Western Athletic Conference. After a 12-year reign, Tech will make the move to Conference USA on July 1, 2013.

### BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS FOR FIRST TIME SINCE DISCO WAS KING (ON WZAZ)?

If Louisiana Tech can fulfill some of the hefty expectations laid at its feet this season then the Bulldogs will have an opportunity to do what has happened only once before: go to back-to-back bowl games. The last time Tech was in back-to-back bowl games was in 1977 and 1978 when the Bulldogs played in a pair of Independence Bowls in Shreveport. Tech won the 1977 contest against Louisville, 24-14, then dropped the 1978 game to East Carolina, 35-13.

### WHAT ABOUT BACK-TO-BACK CONFERENCE TITLES?

Not only could Tech go to back-to-back bowl games, the Bulldogs have a chance at back-to-back conference titles if they can once again come out on top in Western Athletic Conference play. Louisiana Tech last won back-to-back conference titles in 1977-78 as they won the Southland Conference championship in consecutive years.

### COULD HAPPEN IF PROGNOSTICATORS ARE RIGHT

The chance to win back-to-back conference titles for the first time since 1977-78 could happen if prognosticators are correct. Every major national media outlet making projections, along with the official WAC Media and Coaches' Preseason Polls, have picked Tech to win the WAC title in the league's final year of football.

### WHAT ABOUT BACK-TO-BACK WINNING SEASONS? LAST TIME WAS 1996-97

This year's Louisiana Tech team is looking to do something a Bulldog squad has not done since the 1996-97 seasons - record back-to-back winning seasons. The '96 Tech team went 6-5 and the '97 squad went 9-2 under then head coach Gary Crowton.

### BCS BUSTER POTENTIAL?

After ending the 2011 season with a seven-game regular season winning streak and a narrow loss to No. 15 TCU in the Poinsettia Bowl, national media outlets seem to be enchanted by Louisiana Tech's potential in 2012. Several outlets - including Yahoo!, Sports Illustrated and The Sporting News - have picked the Bulldogs to have a shot at Busting the BCS. With a challenging non-conference schedule that includes three bowl teams from three BCS conferences (Texas A&M, SEC; Illinois, Big Ten; Virginia, ACC) along with facing a Houston team that went 13-1 last season, if the Bulldogs can miraculously run the table they could have a chance at playing in a coveted BCS bowl.



# TEAM NOTES

## BULLDOG OPENER HISTORY

After Louisiana Tech outlasted Houston 56-49 to open the 2012 campaign, Tech moved to 51-49-5 all-time in season openers. That mark includes a record of 9-1 at Joe Aillet Stadium. Tech's only loss in Joe Aillet Stadium on opening day was 12-7 to Tennessee-Chattanooga in 1978.

## WATCH OUT!

Not only has Louisiana Tech garnered attention as a team, some of the standout players in the program have been honored with Preseason Watch List accolades heading into the 2012 season. Highlighting that list includes Ryan Allen, last year's Ray Guy Award-winning punter and Quinton Patton, a Biletnikoff Award Watch Listee.

## HURRICANE ISAAC GIVES OPENING WEEKEND THE SHAFT

Who's the cat that won't cop out / When there's danger all about? Well, college football fans aren't exactly Shaft and with Hurricane Isaac on a path towards Northwest Louisiana, Tech officials were forced to postpone what was supposed to be the season opener against Texas A&M on Aug. 30 at Independence Stadium in Shreveport. Instead, Louisiana Tech will now open the season on the road on Sept. 8 at Houston against a team that won 13 games last season while the rescheduled game against Texas A&M means the Bulldogs will not have a bye week this season. (Note: Isaac Hayes wrote the lyrics to the Theme from Shaft.)

## NOT SURPRISING THAT COMES AGAINST TEXAS A&M

Foul weather has consistently plagued the Louisiana Tech-Texas A&M series throughout history. Going back two meetings ago, the 2006 game in College Station was delayed due to lightning from a thunderstorm passing through southeast Texas. The 1998 meeting between the two schools was played the day before Hurricane Ike hit the Texas coast. Texas A&M head coach R.C. Slocum is quoted after that game about the terrible conditions caused by wind and rain.

## TECH GETS THREE STRAIGHT HOME GAMES FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1997

With Louisiana Tech being forced to reschedule its game against Texas A&M for Oct. 13 due to Hurricane Isaac, the Bulldogs get the rare benefit of three straight home games this season. Tech will host UNLV on Oct. 6 in Ruston, host the Aggies on Oct. 13 in Shreveport in Tech's secondary home of Independence Stadium, then return back to its Ruston campus on Oct. 20 to begin Western Athletic Conference play by hosting Idaho.

The last time Louisiana Tech hosted three straight home games was during the 1997 season when the Bulldogs opened the season with three straight home contests, with all three games being played at Joe Aillet Stadium in Ruston and Tech winning all three. Tech opened that stretch with a 30-23 win over Mississippi State on Aug. 30, followed that with a 17-16 win against UL-Monroe on Sept. 13 and then completed the home stretch with a 56-28 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 20.

Coincidentally, that 1997 campaign also featured a win over a Southeastern Conference team (26-20 over Alabama on Nov. 1 in Tuscaloosa) and was the last time the Bulldogs have recorded consecutive winning campaigns (1996-97).

The win against New Mexico State last November clinched the program's 23rd conference title in school history and the second Western Athletic Conference Championship since entering the league in 2001. ## LA TECH-UTSA GAME TO MARK 142ND ANNIVERSARY OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEGINNING

When Louisiana Tech faces upstart UTSA on Nov. 3 at Joe Aillet Stadium it will mark 143 years that the first college football game was played. On Nov. 6, 1869, nearly 100 spectators gathered to witness the first-ever college football game between Rutgers and Princeton. That game was reportedly "replete with surprise, strategy, prodigies of determination and physical prowess." Rutgers defeated Princeton, 6-4.

- ▶ Accepted an invitation to join Conference USA in an all-sports move starting July 1, 2013.

- ▶ Won the NCAA Pack the House Challenge for the WAC for the fifth straight year, the only school in the country to win it four straight years.

**T&F** ▶ Track stars Chelsea Hayes (long jump, USA), Jason Morgan (discus, Jamaica) and Ayanna Alexander (triple jump, Trinidad) all qualified for the 2012 Summer Olympics in London.

**MBB** ▶ Bulldog basketball upset No. 1 seed Nevada and advanced to its first ever WAC Tournament championship game under first-year head coach Mike White.

**SB** ▶ Lady Techster outfielder Dacia Hale tied the NCAA Division I softball single game record with 11 RBI in 17-7 win over perennial NCAA Tournament power Fresno State.

**GOLF** ▶ Bulldog golf earned its highest end-of-the-year ranking in program history, finishing 77th and barely missing its first ever NCAA Regional appearance.

**WBB** ▶ Lady Techster basketball recorded its 38th straight winning season and advanced to the WAC Tournament championship game for the eighth time in 11 years.

## HALL OF FAMERS COME HOME

When Louisiana Tech hosts Texas A&M on Oct. 13 at Independence Stadium, it will be a very special Homecoming for the Bulldogs. Dubbed as "Pro Football Hall of Fame Day," two of Louisiana Tech's three inductees into the Pro Football Hall of Fame - **Fred Dean** and **Willie Roaf** - will be at Independence Stadium and will be recognized and honored on the field during the game.

Louisiana Tech's three Pro Football Hall of Fame Inductees matches the three that came out of LSU while Lincoln Parish is responsible for seven of Louisiana's 13 Pro Football Hall of Fame Inductees.

**Terry Bradshaw (Class of 1989)** - Played for the Bulldogs from 1966 through 1969 where he captained LA Tech to back-to-back winning seasons and Grantland Rice Bowl appearances his junior and senior year. The All-American was selected with the No. 1 overall pick in the 1970 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers where he led the franchise to eight AFC Central titles and four Super Bowl titles. He was twice named MVP of the Super Bowl.

**Fred Dean (Class of 2008)** - Tormented opposing backfields in a Bulldog uniform from 1971-74 as LA Tech registered a combined record of 44-4 and won back-to-back Division II national championship titles. A three-time All-American, Dean was a second round selection of the San Diego Chargers in the 1975 NFL Draft where he was named to four Pro Bowls between his time with the Chargers and San Francisco 49ers. His career sack total was near 100.

**Willie Roaf (Class of 2012)** - Played for the Bulldogs (1989-92) during the program's first four years as a member of the Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) and helped guide LA Tech to the 1990 Independence Bowl against Maryland. After being named a finalist for the 1992 Outland Trophy as the nation's top lineman, Roaf was selected in the first round of the 1993 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints where he was chosen for 11 Pro Bowls during his 13 year career.

## SONNY DAYS ARE HERE AGAIN

Last season marked the second year of the Sonny Dykes era at Louisiana Tech as the coach guided the Bulldogs to seven straight wins and an appearance in the Poinsettia Bowl. In his first season at the helm, he guided the Bulldogs to the verge of bowl eligibility entering the last game of the season. He was one of very few of the 22 first-year head coaches that season to improve upon his team's conference record in his first year at the helm.

The son of legendary Texas Tech coach Spike Dykes, he is no stranger to success on the field having won at stops in the Pac-10, SEC and Big 12 en route to being named LA Tech's head coach.

## LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Sonny Dykes made his debut as a head coach on Sept. 4 and did so at the same stadium his father made his coaching debut in. Spike Dykes first guided Texas Tech on Dec. 20, 1986 in the Independence Bowl. However, while Spike's Red Raider squad lost to Ole Miss, 20-17, Sonny's Bulldog team toughed out a 20-6 win over Grambling.

## FAMILY TRADITION

Thomas Graham is back for his sixth year with the Bulldog football team. Graham has joined the staff as a graduate assistant (working with the linebackers). This coaching position comes after one year on the strength and conditioning staff which was immediately preceded by four years as the team's deep snapper. As the team's deep snapper, he continued a family tradition as his brother, Matt, was the deep snapper for LA Tech four straight years before him. The Graham brothers come from a football family has their grandfather Bill Graham, who is the Director of Special Events at Tech, played football for Florida State (and was roommates with Burt Reynolds) at running back and their father, Randy Graham, played rover back at Missouri. The youngest of the Graham brothers, Gantt, is also with the program as a student worker on the equipment staff.

## FAMILY TRADITION - PART II

Former walk-on and now scholarship recipient Hayden Slack is the third generation of his family to play football at Louisiana Tech. His father, Terry, played at LA Tech from 1974-77 and his uncle, Jay, played at Tech from 1984-87. Going back one more generation in the Slack family, J.W. Slack (Hayden's grandfather) played at Tech from 1957-59.



# OFFENSE NOTES

## THE OFFENSIVE POTENTIAL FOR YEAR THREE

As Louisiana Tech enters year two of Sonny Dykes' and Tony Franklin's high octane offense, Tech has the potential to showcase offensive fireworks this season. By comparison, below is a list of select offensive categories from 2006 and 2007 at Troy, where Franklin was once the offensive coordinator. The chart also lists offensive categories from 2007 and 2008 at Arizona, where Dykes was the offensive coordinator, along with the pair's first year at Louisiana Tech. The increase in offensive output in Franklin's offense with the Trojans and Dykes' offense with the Wildcats shows some of the potential that Louisiana Tech brings to the gridiron this fall.

## THREE STRAIGHT 50-POINT GAMES A FIRST FOR THE PROGRAM

Louisiana Tech's offense shot out of the gates to start the 2012 season and achieved a feat that a Bulldog team has never done before. As Tech scored 56 points in its first two games then slacked off to only score 52 in its third, the Bulldogs have scored 50 or more points in three straight games for the first time in school history.

The two first wins marked the first time Tech scored 50-plus points in back-to-back games in the same season for the first time since 1910. That season Tech won 60-0 over Louisiana College then followed that with a 75-0 win over the school now known as Louisiana-Lafayette.

Only one other time in school history has Tech posted back-to-back 50-plus point games but that spanned the course of two seasons. Tech beat what is now known as Louisiana-Monroe, 55-35, in the 1976 season finale and then opened up the 1977 season with a 56-0 win over Sacramento State.

## OFFENSE RANKS HIGH NATIONALLY

Louisiana Tech's offense got the 2012 season off with a bang, impressing opponents and fans alike with a knack for big plays and quick scores. The fast pace and dominating stats Tech's offense has posted places the Bulldogs near the top of the national rankings in several offensive categories including rushing offense (22nd in the nation, first in the WAC), passing offense (22nd nationally, second WAC), total offense (11th nationally, first WAC), scoring offense (third nationally, first WAC) and pass efficiency (third nationally, first WAC).

## KING ONLY SECOND FRESHMAN TO RUN FOR 200 YARDS FOR TECH

With his 204 rushing yards on 22 carries (averaging 9.3 yards per rush), Tevin King became only the second freshman in Louisiana Tech history to rush for over 200 yards in a game. The only other time a freshman has ran for 200-plus yards in a game was on Sept. 28, 1991 when then freshman Jason Cooper ran for (coincidentally) 204 yards against Arkansas State. Cooper went on to set the school record for career rushing yardage (3,342 career yards) before that title was topped in 2009 by Daniel Porter.

## IN MEMORY OF TYRONE DUPLESSIS

Last February the Louisiana Tech Family was dealt a shocking and devastating loss when Tyrone Duplessis suffered a heart attack and tragically passed away at the age of 21. Duplessis was in his third year at Louisiana Tech. A native of New Orleans, Duplessis ran the ball seven times last season with a long rush of seven yards as he sought to come back from a knee injury that sidelined him during the 2010 season. Six of those carries came in the regular season finale against New Mexico State as Louisiana Tech clinched a WAC title with a 44-0 win.

"Tyrone was a valuable part of this football family," head coach Sonny Dykes said. "This is a tragic, senseless loss, but he made a lasting impact on this team, University and everyone that knew him."

Teammate Kendrick James (who previously wore No. 42) is wearing No. 22 this year in honor of Duplessis, as is Southern Miss' Deron Wilson (who previously wore No. 7), a high school friend of Duplessis.

**RED ZONE SUCCESS**

And then there were 11. Louisiana Tech is one of only 11 schools in the nation that still remain perfect when entering the red zone. Though early in the year, Tech is 17-for-17 in red zone efficiency with a 1.000 percentage and a total of 115 points. Of the 10 other schools that are perfect in the red zone still, only Oklahoma State (132 points) has scored more points and Oklahoma State and Alabama are the only teams with more drives in the red zone.

**OFFENSE SCORES EARLY AND OFTEN**

Part of the reason behind Louisiana Tech's success early in the 2012 season has been because of the fast starts by the Bulldogs offense. So far this season, Louisiana Tech has out-scored opponents 56-13 in the first quarter, giving the Bulldogs an opening cushion and forcing opponents to play catch-up the rest of the game.

In that first quarter Tech has been able to sustain drives by making key plays in tough situations, including a 6-for-9 (67 percent) conversion percentage on third downs in the first frame of action while Tech's defense has held opposing teams to a 5-for-14 (26 percent) success rate.

Tech's scoring drives in the first quarter have been quick and lethal. Of the eight touchdowns Tech has scored in the opening 15 minutes, six of them have been on drives lasting shorter than 80 seconds.

## LOUISIANA TECH-HOUSTON GAME SETS FOUR NCAA RECORDS

Louisiana Tech's 56-49 win over Houston on Sept. 8 was so much of a showcase between two prolific offenses that the teams combined to set several NCAA records.

The Bulldogs and Cougars broke NCAA records for most plays ran by both teams (regulation), most first downs recorded by both teams, most combined completed passes and most combined pass attempts without an interception.

## THAT SHOWS IN SACKS ALLOWED

That experienced offensive line has had reasonable success against attacking defensive lines so far in 2012 as Tech currently ranks 25th in the nation in sacks allowed. Quarterback Colby Cameron has only been caught three times this year as Tech is averaging only one sack allowed per game.

## MOST POINTS SCORED IN A GAME SINCE 2000

The 56 points Louisiana Tech scored in its season opening win at Houston on Sept. 8 marked the most points a Bulldog team has scored in a single game since before the program joined the Western Athletic Conference. The last time Tech's offense put up so many points on the scoreboard was on Aug. 26, 2000 when the Bulldogs thrashed Mississippi Valley State, 63-10, in Ruston. That 2000 campaign marked the final year Tech was an independent; the Bulldogs joined the WAC starting with the 2001 season.

## KING RECORDS A FIRST SINCE THE 1970s, ONLY THE SECOND TO DO SO

As he ran across Houston with 13 carries for 112 yards and three touchdowns, Tevin King became the first Louisiana Tech running back (and only second Tech RB ever) to run for over 100 yards as a freshman in the first game of a season. The only other Tech tailback to achieve that feat was Charles McDaniel in 1972 when he ran for 117 yards on 21 carries (but no touchdowns) against Tampa on Sept. 18, 1971. McDaniel went on to rush for 2,754 yards on 553 carries and 52 touchdowns in his career as a Bulldog.

## STAND AT ATTENTION, THE GENERAL IS COMING!

There is no doubt who is the field marshal of the 2012 Bulldog team and he has attained a rank few can reach. Wide receiver Quinton "The General" Patton has proven in just one short year in Ruston that he can command respect among his teammates and provide leadership both on and off the field. The Biletnikoff Award Watch Listee, Patton caught 79 passes for 1,202 yards and 11 touchdowns last season and was the constant focus of defensive double teams.

His 1,202 yards in a single season ranks seventh in school history, the 79 receptions ranks tied for seventh in school history and his 11 touchdown receptions are tied for fourth in school history. He needs only 909 reception yards to reach Tech's career top 10 charts.

However his leadership extends well off the field of play. At last year's Poinsettia Bowl, Patton showed leadership and maturity when he selflessly gave his bowl gift (a \$300 Best Buy gift card) to a Make-A-Wish Foundation kid during the bowl's community service event. Why? The child's wish was to go on a shopping spree and Patton was happy to be able to grant that child's wish.

## FINALLY, THE FIELD CAPTAIN IS KNOWN

For the first time in Sonny Dykes tenure at Louisiana Tech, the Bulldogs enter a season with a known starting quarterback. After a revolving door in the shotgun in 2010 and a battle throughout camp and a change midway through 2011, Colby Cameron has secured his spot as the team's starting QB. After losing the job to Nick Isham a year ago, Cameron won the job back after guiding the team to a win at Utah State after entering the game in the third quarter then leading Tech to seven straight wins.

## A CHANCE AT REDEMPTION?

For a few players on this year's squad - including quarterback Colby Cameron and center Stephen Warner - the season opener against Texas A&M could prove to be a chance at redemption. During the 2010 meeting between the two teams, a game where Cameron was making his first career start at quarterback and Warner his second career start at center, the Bulldogs got off to a rough start and ended the game with a 48-16 loss. With a much improved squad in 2012, the team is looking for a chance for a better performance against the Aggies.

## TWENTY-ONE THE MAGIC NUMBER

Dating back to the 1998 season, history has shown that when the Louisiana Tech offense struggles the team tends to struggle. Since 1998 the Bulldogs have compiled a 4-56 record when scoring less than 21 points. Before the Bulldogs won the 2008 Independence Bowl vs. Northern Illinois 17-10, the last victory for Tech when scoring less than 21 points was in 2003 against Michigan State when the Bulldogs upset the then ranked Spartans, 20-19. Tech added a win to that tally on Sept. 4, 2010 when the Bulldogs defeated Grambling State, 20-6 but dropped a 26-20 overtime decision at Mississippi State on Sept. 24, 2011.

## DEFENSE NOTES

## CAN THEY REPEAT LAST YEAR'S PERFORMANCE?

After losing five starters from the 2011 squad, the 2012 Louisiana Tech defense will be challenged to repeat as the opportunistic defensive squad that highlighted the 2011 campaign. That squad:

- Held 12 of 13 opponents under their average rushing yardage
- Was third in the nation in interceptions (21)
- Was third in the nation in Pick-Sixes (5)
- Was 13th in the nation in turnover margin (+0.85)
- Was 25th in the nation in sacks (2.46)
- Was 26th in the nation in Pass Efficiency Defense (117.30)
- Was 29th in the nation in Rushing Defense (127.38)

But all is not lost; indeed, the defense does have six starters returning. The defensive line returns both starting tackles (including All-WAC Justin Ellis) and the secondary has six seniors returning this fall.

## QUINN GILES LOOKS FOR MORE PASSES

Last year Quinn Giles quietly racked up four interceptions, including one in the Poinsettia Bowl against No. 15 TCU and the Horned Frogs quarterback Casey Paschall. This year, Giles is looking for a repeat performance of a year where he ranked 23rd in the nation in interceptions. Giles is the boyfriend of 2012 Olympian and Tech alumna Chelsea Hayes.

## A LOOK AT THE "DAVE CLARK FIVE"

Entering this season, Louisiana Tech's defense will put a stronger emphasis on its Nickel defensive package against the various pass-heavy offenses it will face. This package could also be called the "Dave Clark Five" as it is led, in part, by redshirt senior Dave Clark.

This unit is "Glad All Over" this season "Because" the secondary has looked much improved to date, "Reelin' and Rockin'" through fall camp. While the offense challenges opponents to "Catch Us If You Can," the defense is always "At the Scene" dressed in their "Red and Blue." The pass defense worked hard "Over and Over" to be much improved in 2011 after a disappointing 2010 season by improving "Bits and Pieces" at a time and looks to improve even more in 2012.

The man himself, Dave Clark, says "I Knew It All The Time" that the pass defense would be improved this season.

*Note: The Dave Clark Five was a British pop group in the 1960s. Everything in quotations is a song title from that group.*

## BENCHMARK SET AT 300?

Louisiana Tech allowed over 300 yards rushing on Sept. 5, 2009 at Auburn and that standard can be a fairly accurate predictor for the outcome of games. Since 2000, LA Tech is 1-12 when allowing teams to rush for 300-plus yards with the lone win coming over Nevada in 2001. LA Tech has not allowed opponents to post back-to-back 300-yard rushing games since 2000 when Auburn ran for 301 yards on Oct. 21, 2000 and Miami (Fla.) ran for 331 on Oct. 28, 2000.

## MATT NELSON CLOSING IN ON ALL-TIME PAT RECORDS

Kicker Matt Nelson is quickly closing in on becoming the most successful - and most active - extra point kicker in Louisiana Tech history. After his career-high eight PATs on Sept. 8 at Houston, Nelson moved into second all-time at Tech in career PATs made and third all-time in PATs attempted. The Cibola, Texas native is likely to set the school record in both categories this season.

## SPECIAL TEAMS GETS SIX IN SEVEN STRAIGHT

Louisiana Tech has one of the longest streaks in the country when it comes to special teams touchdowns. For seven consecutive years, the Bulldogs have scored six points while the special teams unit has been on the field with a mix of kickoff returns for a touchdown, punt returns for a touchdown and fumble recovery/returns for a touchdown. Only Florida has matched that mark with the Gators' special teams units finding the end zone for seven straight years from 2005 to 2011, but UF has not yet had a special teams touchdown this season while North Carolina State also has a streak of seven straight years going including the 2012 season.

Prior to the current streak, Louisiana Tech had one of the longest return droughts in the nation, having not returned a kickoff for at touchdown since 1989 and not returned a punt for at ouchdown since 1999.

## HE'S BAAAAACK!

After a season where his punts defied logic, Ryan Allen is back for one more year at Louisiana Tech. During the 2011 campaign, Allen averaged a school record 46.1 yards per punt while sending 39 punts inside the 20 and 22 punts inside the 10 yard line with only five touchbacks. He was so impressive during the season and in the Poinsettia Bowl, ESPN's Joe Tessitore couldn't help but exclaim on air, "Good things happen when Ryan Allen is on the field."

Allen won the Ray Guy Award for the nation's top punter after his impressive season, becoming the first punter from a non-BCS school to win the award and the only player from a non-BCS school to win a national award in 2011. Now he has a chance to do something no other punter has done - repeat as the Ray Guy Award winner.

## AN ALL-AMERICAN KID

Seemingly coming out of nowhere in 2011, Ryan Allen dominated the nation's punting stats in not just average yardage but also in placement of the ball inside the 20 yard line. For his efforts, Allen was named All-America last year by the Sporting News (First Team), the Associated Press (Second Team) and the Walter Camp Football Foundation (Second Team).

Can he repeat that performance this year? If so, he would be the first special teams player from Louisiana Tech to receive All-America honors in multiple years. Two kickers from Tech have been named All-America in the past (Marty Kent, Josh Scobee) but Allen was the first punter to receive such an honor.

## PHENOMENAL PUNT PLACEMENT

Part of what made Ryan Allen's 2011 season such a success was his ability to place the ball deep in opponents' territory without it rolling into the end zone. Allen led the nation last year with an impressive 39 punts inside the 20 yard line with only five touchbacks. Even more impressive, he sent 22 of those 39 punts inside the 10 yard line.

## ONE OF THE TOP RETURN TEAMS IN THE NATION

Under special teams guru Mark Tommerdahl, Louisiana Tech has emerged as one of the top special teams units in the country. That is no surprise as since Tommerdahl came to Ruston, the Bulldogs have excelled in special teams.

During the 2011 season, punter Ryan Allen wowed the nation with 39 punts inside the 20 and 22 punts inside the 10 as he averaged 46.1 yards per punt. For that, he became the first punter from a non-BCS school to win the Ray Guy Award.

Tommerdahl has also guided a return game that has been as effective as it has been dangerous. During the 2010 season, Phillip Livas tied the NCAA record for combined punt and kickoff returns for a touchdown with eight career returns for a score. The next year (2011), injuries plagued the return game but that didn't stop the Bulldogs as even Craig Johnson, then the team's seventh-string punt returner, ran his first punt back for a touchdown against New Mexico State in a driving rainstorm at Joe Aillet Stadium.

## ATTENDANCE NOTES

### TECH SETS AVERAGE ATTENDANCE MARK

Last year, Louisiana Tech set a new school record for average attendance (attendance per game) at Joe Aillet Stadium. The Bulldogs averaged 21,518 in its five games at Joe Aillet Stadium during 2011, a new record. The previous record for average attendance at Joe Aillet Stadium was 20,435 set in 1999 (also the last time Tech won five consecutive games).

### TOP CROWDS ENTER JOE AILLET STADIUM IN 2011

Louisiana Tech posted remarkable attendance numbers in 2011 with two of the top 10 crowds to watch a game at Joe Aillet Stadium coming through the turnstiles this season. Tech had 25,212 show up to watch the Bulldogs face Hawai'i (fourth largest crowd) and 24,628 to watch Tech host Houston (sixth-largest crowd). That marks only the second time in school history Tech has had three separate games of 20,000-plus attendance (UCA, Houston, Hawai'i) while 2009 was the only other year that has happened.

### ATTENDANCE RECORD SET UNDER DYKES' WATCH

Louisiana Tech set a single season attendance record in 2010 as 116,908 fans went through the turnstiles at Joe Aillet Stadium. That is over 8,700 more fans than the previous season high attendance mark of 108,121 set in 2008.

### JOE AILLET IS A TOUGH PLACE TO PLAY...

It always nice to be home and Louisiana Tech has experienced recent success in the friendly confines of Joe Aillet Stadium. LA Tech has won 12 of its last 17 games at home. That record ranks fifth in the league with six of the WAC's nine teams having a winning record at home in that time frame.

### JOE AILLET STADIUM FUN FACT

NFL Hall of Famer and four-time Super Bowl Champion Terry Bradshaw threw the first touchdown pass in the history of Joe Aillet Stadium connecting with Buster Herren from 5-yards out against East Carolina on Sept. 28, 1968. Tech went on to win the game 35-7.





# SONNY DYKES

Head Coach

Sonny Dykes was introduced as the 32nd head coach in Louisiana Tech history on Jan. 20, 2010 in front of an overflowing Jarrell Room filled with Bulldog fans at the Charles Wylie Athletic Center. In just his second season, his parade was rained on from start to finish.

In a downpour at Joe Aillet Stadium on Nov. 26, the Dykes-led Bulldogs blanked New Mexico State, 44-0, to cap off a seven-game winning streak and to clinch the program's first Western Athletic Conference championship in a decade. For that, Dykes was named the 2011 WAC Coach of the Year.

The streak and title should not have come as a surprise to Bulldog fans as Tech showed they belong with the big boys early in the year, despite a 1-4 start. In the end, an opportunistic defense that was third in the nation in interceptions and pick-sixes along with a fundamentally sound offense and the 2011 Ray Guy Award-winning punter helped LA Tech notch its first seven-game win streak since 1974.

In his first season, Dykes put his high octane offense into effect, resulting in him being one of only four of the nation's 22 new head coaches to improve a team's conference record from the year before. Dykes' exciting brand of offense improved in several areas of the NCAA statistical ranks including passing offense (91st in 2009 to 62nd in 2010) and total offense (66th to 52nd) while the team's average offensive national rank improved from 65th in 2009 to 54th in 2010.

Dykes, son of Texas Tech coaching legend Spike Dykes, has coached in the PAC-10, Southeastern Conference and Big 12 during his 16 years in the college football profession while also serving under some very successful head coaches including Mike Leach and Mike Stoops.

He won the 2006 Mike Campbell Top Assistant Award, presented by the All-American Football Foundation, and was a nominee for the 2009 Broyles Award, which goes to the nation's top assistant coach.

Dykes came to Louisiana Tech after completing his third season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona, leading the Wildcats to an 8-5 record and an appearance in the Holiday Bowl. That Holiday Bowl appearance marked Dykes' 10th bowl appearance as a coach with all 10 appearances coming within an 11 year span.

A spread-offense specialist, Dykes' offensive attack set at least five single-season records at Arizona while also racking up a pile of single-game marks in the UA record book. Former Wildcat quarterback Willie Tuitama, a disciple of Dykes, notched career numbers that are among Arizona's best.

"Coach Dykes has demonstrated throughout his coaching career all the leadership qualifications we are looking for in the next leader for our football program," said acting athletics director Bruce Van De Velde. "His coaching success has been achieved at the highest level of competition, from the SEC to the Big 12 to the Pac-10."

Rivals.com cited Dykes as one of the countries brightest offensive minds and top ten college recruiters in the country.

"I have worked my entire life to get to this point, and I have had lots of great mentors that have worked with me and taught me and brought me along," said Dykes. "I am very fortunate to be here."

Dykes' Arizona team went 6-3 in the Pac-10 Conference during the 2009 campaign, finished tied for second in the league with Oregon State and Stanford.

Fond of the passing attack, Dykes Arizona offense in 2008 ranked 16th in scoring and 33rd in total offense while developing an outstanding run-pass balance.

Dykes orchestrated an Arizona offense that was ranked 10th nationally in passing yards per game in 2007 as he coached then-junior Tuitama to honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors that year. That same season, he helped develop the offensive scheme that pushed receiver Mike Thomas to first-team all-league status as a junior and senior ('08).

Prior to his tenure at Arizona, Dykes was co-offensive coordinator working with then-head coach Mike Leach and inside receivers coach Dana Holgorsen running Texas Tech's wide-open passing attack in 2005-06 after having been Texas Tech's wide receivers coach since 2000. The Red Raiders were among the nation's top six in total offense and passing during the span.

Texas Tech was No. 3 in passing and No. 6 in total offense in 2006 under his co-direction, throwing for 370 yards and accumulating nearly 450 overall. He directed an offense that scored 32 points per game in 2006 with two receivers ranked top three in the nation and a third in the top 20 in receptions per game.

While in Lubbock, Dykes helped develop Joel Filani into a two-time first team All-Big 12 honoree and a sixth-round NFL draft selection by the Tennessee Titans in 2007. Receiver Jarrett Hicks also signed a free-agent deal with the San Diego Chargers that year.

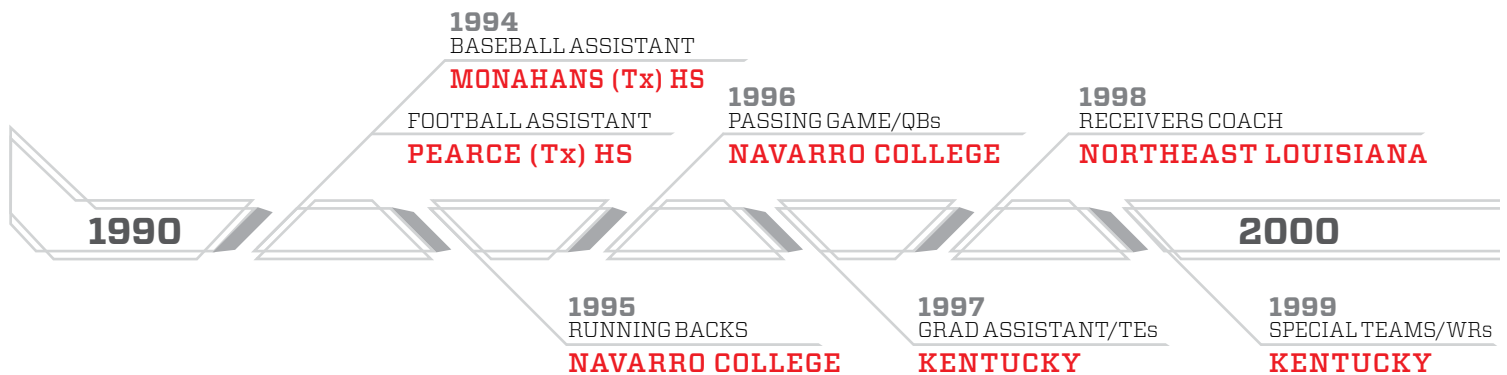
Dykes also worked with quarterback Graham Harrell who completed 412 passes for 4,555 yards and 38 touchdowns in 2006, ranking Texas Tech third nationally in total offense that season.

Prior to his five seasons at Texas Tech, Dykes spent two non-consecutive seasons at Kentucky, first coaching tight ends as a graduate assistant in 1997 and then coaching special teams and wide receivers in 1999 under the "Air Raid" attack of former UK coach Hal Mumme. Dykes coached Kentucky's James Whalen to AP All-America honors after his Division I-A record for receptions by a tight end.

Sandwiched in between his two stints in Lexington, Dykes was the wide receivers coach at Northeast Louisiana where he helped receiver Marty Booker set school season and career records and earn Blue-Gray and Shrine Game spots before getting drafted in the third round by the Chicago Bears in 1999.

A 1993 graduate of Texas Tech, Dykes lettered for three years as a baseball player for the Red Raiders. At age 40, Dykes is one of the nation's youngest coaches in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Dykes is married to the former Kate Golding and they have two daughters, Alta Carolina (Ally) who is four and Charlotte Reese (Charlie) who turns 18 months old on Oct 18.

**HOUSTON** - Colby Cameron threw for three touchdowns, Tevin King ran for three and Louisiana Tech overcame 580 yards passing by David Piland to defeat Houston 56-49 Saturday night.

The two explosive teams combined for 1,291 yards of offense and 78 first downs in a game that lasted 4 hours and 8 minutes and wasn't secured until Houston (0-2) failed on an outside kick attempt with 35 seconds remaining.

Cameron had touchdown passes of 6, 8 and 14 yards while completing 34 of 52 passes for 353 yards; King rushed for 112 yards, including TDs of 13, 9 and 59 yards; and Kenneth Dixon added 90 yards rushing and a touchdown for the Bulldogs, who were playing their first game after their opener against Texas A&M was postponed last week due to Hurricane Isaac.

Louisiana Tech needed all of that to offset Piland, who completed 53 passes in a school-record 77 attempts for 580 yards. He had touchdown passes of 32, 74, 7 and 12 yards to four different receivers. Daniel Spencer caught seven passes for 157 yards and a score, while Dewayne Peace had 11 catches for 141 yards and a TD for the Cougars.
