'HOOS, DEACS RENEW RIVALRY

- Wake Forest leads the all-time series against Virginia, 84-67.
- The teams split four games last year, with UVA taking two of three in the regular season at home and Wake winning, 7-4, in the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Wake won two of three in the Cavaliers' last visit to Winston-Salem in 2007. UVA has lost five of its last six games at Wake.

VIRGINIA IN ACC OPENERS

- Virginia will look to buck a recent trend of struggling in the first ACC series of the year.
- UVA has lost two of three games in the ACC-opening series in each of the last three seasons, including two years ago at Wake Forest. UVA was swept in 2005 in its first ACC series at Wake.
- The Cavaliers last won an ACC-opening series March 12-14, 2004, at Georgia Tech – a three-game sweep.

PARKER WASTES NO TIME IN LEADOFF SLOT

- In just nine games as the leadoff hitter, Jarrett Parker has hit two home runs to lead off games.
- The long balls were the first of the sophomore's career.
- It was Virginia's first home run to lead off a game since Mark Reynolds hit a leadoff home run at Liberty on May 18, 2004.

PITCHING OFF TO BLAZING START

- The Virginia pitching staff has allowed just 10 earned runs in 81 innings this season – for a 1.11 ERA, tops in the ACC.
- UNC is second with a 2.22 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered just 49 hits (5.4/game) and 22 walks (2.4/game).

OFFENSE HOT AS WELL

- Virginia's offense has been strong as well, with a combined .373 batting average through nine games, which also is best in the ACC thus far.
- Steven Proscia (.486) leads the Cavaliers' attack, which boasts five hitters at .400 or better.
- Dan Grovatt (.455) has hits in all nine games and has an 11-game hitting streak dating back to last season.

POWERFUL DISPLAY

- Virginia hit eight home runs in its first seven games. It took the Cavaliers 17 games last year (until March 15) to accumulate eight homers.
- Franco Valdes already has matched his 2008 home run total with two, while Jarrett Parker hit his first career long ball vs. Bucknell and

already has a pair of dingers.

- Freshman Steven Proscia also has a pair of home runs.

CAVALIERS AMONG ACC BEST

- As a team, Virginia leads the ACC in batting (.373) and earned run average (1.11).
- Steven Proscia (.486), Dan Grovatt (.455)

and Jarrett Parker (.438) rank fourth, seventh and 11th in batting, respectively.

- The Cavaliers boast four of the top 10 pitchers in ERA in the ACC. Danny Hultzen and Neal Davis are tied for first with 0.00 marks.
- Andrew Carrway (0.68) is fifth, while Will Roberts (1.00) is 10th.
- Parker leads the ACC in triples (3) and in slugging percentage (.969)
- Proscia is third in doubles (6) and RBI (13) and fourth in hits (17).

HULTZEN COMING OFF BIG START

- Freshman Danny Hultzen racked up the strikeouts in his last outing vs. Fordham (Feb. 27).
- In just his second college start, Hultzen notched 12 strikeouts, the most by a UVA pitcher since Sean Doolittle fanned 13 at Maryland on April 28, 2006.
- Hultzen has whiffed 17 batters this year – third-most in the ACC. He has walked only one batter.

ROBERTS HAS MEMORABLE FIRST START

- In his first college start against William & Mary (Feb. 24), Will Roberts recorded eight strikeouts in five innings (3 H, 1 BB).
- It was the most strikeouts for a freshman in his first start since Andrew Carraway racked up eight vs. VMI on April 18, 2006.
- Roberts has allowed just seven hits and two walks while striking out 15 in nine innings this year.

CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS

• Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
• Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
• Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVA – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVA students.

UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

• Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
• The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
• The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

• Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
• UVA ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.

WAHOOS RANK FOURTH NATIONALLY IN STOLEN BASES LAST THREE YEARS

• Over the last three years, Virginia ranks fourth nationally in stolen bases.
• From 2006-08, UVA stole 376 bases, an average of 125.3 steals per season.
• The Cavaliers ranked fifth nationally last year with 134 stolen bases. They were 11th in 2007 (128) and 19th in 2006 (114).

SB RECORD GOES DOWN EACH OF LAST TWO YEARS

• UVA ripped off a school-record 134 stolen bases last season.
• The previous mark of 128 was set in 2007.
• UVA stole more bases than any ACC team attempted last year and ranked fifth nationally in stolen bases per game.

• Virginia's returning players accounted for just over half of the total last year (68 of 134, 50.7 percent).

ROOKIES WILL BE KEY

• Virginia has one of its youngest teams in recent memory, featuring 23 underclassmen, including 12 true freshmen.
• UVA returns 19 letterwinners from last season, while losing 11.
• Despite featuring so much youth, the Cavaliers still return four of their top six hitters from 2008.

SUMMER SUCCESS = SPRING SUCCESS?

• Several Cavaliers had extremely strong summers and will look to parlay that into big 2009 seasons.
• Among the top performers:
• Tyler Wilson (Delaware) earned the Great Lakes Collegiate League Pitcher of the Year Award.
• Corey Hunt (Sanford) won the New England Collegiate Baseball League's defensive player of the year award.
• Andrew Carraway (Hyannis – Cape Cod), Sean Lucas (Saratoga – NYCBL), Hunt and Wilson all were named to their respective leagues' all-star teams.

ERA CHAMP PACKER ON WALLACE LIST

• UVA junior left-handed pitcher Matt Packer was named to the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List.
• Packer recorded the lowest ERA last year in NCAA Division I, posting a 1.14 mark after allowing just nine earned runs in 71.1 innings.
• He went 6-3 last year and allowed just 51 hits and 15 walks while striking out 58 as batters hit an ACC-low .202 against him.
• His season ERA was the fourth-lowest in Virginia history, and he became just the second Virginia pitcher (Seth Greisinger, 1996) to lead the country in ERA.

HIGH SCHOOL ALL-AMERICANS HIGHLIGHT INCOMING CLASS

• Among the strong class of incoming UVA freshmen are two players who earned High School All-America honors last year.
• LHP/1B Danny Hultzen won first-team honors from Baseball America and Louisville Slugger after going 13-0 with a 0.74 ERA last season.
• INF Steven Proscia nabbed second team honors from Baseball America after hitting .545 with 10 HR, 48 RBI and 20 SB last year.

PLAYING IT CLOSE IN ACC

• Nineteen of UVA's 34 games vs. ACC teams last season were decided by two runs or fewer (6-5 in 1-run games; 5-3 in 2-run games; 11-8 total).
