### VIRGINIA-NORTH CAROLINA SERIES

- North Carolina holds a 171-97-4 edge in its all-time series with Virginia.
- The teams split four meetings last year, with UNC winning two of three at home in the regular season before UVa won 11-1 (8 innings) in a game ended by run rule at the ACC Tournament.
- Overall, the teams have split the last 12 games over the past three years.
- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor holds a 9-13 career record vs. UNC.

### 40 WINS IN RECORD TIME

- Virginia earned its 40th victory with its win May 4 vs. VCU, marking the earliest Virginia has reached the mark.
- It is the first time UVa has gotten to the 40-win mark before its exam break.
- Overall, this is the seventh time Virginia has won 40 games in a season; UVa has won at least 40 games in six of Brian O'Connor's seven seasons at Virginia.

### HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational in his Friday starts this season, posting a 7-1 record with a 2.00 ERA, which ranks first in the ACC.
- In 76.2 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 94 and walked just 11. Batters are hitting .179 against him – lowest in the ACC.
- He ranks fourth nationally in hits allowed per nine innings (5.75), 10th in ERA and 14th in strikeouts and walks allowed per nine innings (1.29).
- In his last start vs. Duke, Hultzen fired his first career complete game and retired 21 of the final 22 batters.

### CAVALIERS SWEEP AGAIN

- With sweeps the last two ACC weekends over Maryland and Duke, UVa has swept back-to-back ACC road series for the first time since doing so against Duke (April 2-4) and Maryland (April 16-18) in 2004.
- It was UVa's first back-to-back ACC sweeps since doing so in home series versus Boston College (March 21-23) and Virginia Tech (March 28-30) in 2008.
- UVa has never swept three straight ACC series.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa needs three wins to tie its most ever in ACC play (21 in 2006).
- Virginia has hit 27 home runs in ACC games (fourth most in ACC).
- Opponents are 6-for-18 in stolen base attempts over the last 11 games.
- UVa has tied its school record for triples (28 in 2009) and is two shy of the doubles mark (138 in 2009).
- UVa is hitting .329 in ACC games – tops in the ACC (GT is second at .300).

## ANOTHER DAY, ANOTHER GAME FOR CANNON

- Senior infielder Tyler Cannon broke the UVa career games played record April 30 at Duke by playing in his 226th career game.
- He stands at 229 career games entering the weekend.
- David Stone set the previous record of 225 from 1999-2002.

## QUICK NOTES FROM THE DUKE SERIES

- The Cavaliers scored in double figures and had at least 16 hits in each of the three games, finishing with 33 runs and 49 hits in the series.

- It marked the first time Virginia has scored in double figures of all three games of an ACC series since the league went to the three-game series format in 1990.
- Danny Hultzen and Robert Morey recorded UVa's first back-to-back complete games since Jacob Thompson and Pat McNaney on March 28-29, 2008 against Virginia Tech.
- UVa hit .398 in the series, led by Keith Werman (.667, 6-for-9) and Jarrett Parker (.538, 7-for-13). John Hicks, Tyler Cannon and Kenny Swab each hit .429 in the series.
- Virginia hit six homers over the weekend, highlighted by two long balls from Parker on Saturday.

## SEATS ADDED, MORE HERE THIS WEEKEND

- Virginia has added 979 general admission bleacher seats down the right-field line this season.
- Nearly 600 new bleacher seats in right field will be in place this weekend, pushing the Davenport Field capacity to 4,825.
- Davenport Field started the season with a capacity of 3,600.

## NOTING THE 11-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia is hitting .370, with 65 extra-base hits, including 43 doubles, in the current 11-game win streak.
- The team owns a 2.73 ERA during this stretch, walking just 21 while striking out 88. Opponents are batting just .229 in the last 11 games.
- UVa has stolen 15 bases in 17 attempts – opponents are just 6-for-18 in that same 11-game span.
- Steven Proscia has 18 RBI during the streak, while Phil Gosselin has a team-high 19 hits.
- Keith Werman has a team-best .536 batting average (15-for-28), while Reed Gragnani is hitting .455 (10-for-22) during that span.

## HICKS SHOWS OFF THE ARM

- John Hicks has thrown out seven of the last 10 potential basestealers over the past 14 games.
- For the season, Hicks has thrown out 51 percent (16-of-31) of runners attempting to steal.
- As a team, UVa has thrown out 27-of-61 (ACC-best 44.2 percent) of potential basestealers.
- Opponents have stolen an ACC-low 34 bases vs. UVa.

## GOSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .395 batting average, .471 on base percentage and 15 stolen bases.
- He leads the ACC in hits (79) and is second in the ACC in batting.
- He ranks second in the ACC in doubles (19), sixth in triples (4), seventh in total bases (124), eighth in runs (53) and ninth in on base percentage and stolen bases.
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 19 games.
- He had a streak of 122-consecutive starts snapped April 24 when he sat out because of the effects of food poisoning.

## UVA TAKES ACC WEEKLY HONORS

- Virginia captured both of the ACC Baseball honors for the week ending May 2, as infielder/outfielder Phil Gosselin earned Player of the Week laurels, while Danny Hultzen was named Pitcher of the Week.
- It marks the first such honor for Gosselin, while Hultzen earned the distinction for the third time in his career and the second time this season (March 1).
- Gosselin went 12-for-25 (.480) last week with a grand slam (vs. Coastal Carolina), three doubles and eight RBI.
- Hultzen tossed his first career complete game at Duke. He retired the last 10 hitters and 21 of the final 22 batters that he faced. He also tied a career high with 13 strikeouts while not walking a batter.

### ROTATION PRODUCING FOR WAHOOS

- Virginia's starting rotation has produced 14 ACC wins this season – most of any ACC team.
- Danny Hultzen and Robert Morey each own five wins apiece, which is tied for tops in the ACC in conference games. Cody Winiarski has four ACC wins which ranks sixth.
- Only eight other pitchers in the ACC have at least four wins in league games.

### CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 3 IN LATEST RPI

- Virginia is ranked No. 3 in the latest RPI report, which was released Tuesday by the NCAA. Arizona State and Florida top the rankings.
- Virginia has 12 wins against the RPI top 50 this year, with series against UNC (No. 28) and Miami (No. 9) remaining.

### WAHOOS RACK UP SERIES WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has won all five of its series against ranked foes, including ACC series wins over Top-10 opponents Florida State, Clemson and Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers are 11-6 this year against ranked foes.
- Virginia has played the most ranked opponents this year among ACC teams.

### VIRGINIA RANKS 23RD NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,658 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 23rd nationally in attendance.
- On April 6 vs. James Madison, UVa had its largest mid-week attendance ever, as 2,521 came out to watch the Cavaliers' win.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa is on pace to obliterate the single-season attendance average record of 1,774, set in 2007.

### UVA SHATTERS ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke its series attendance record again April 16-18, drawing 12,657 fans for the three-game series with Virginia Tech.
- Over the last two home weekends, UVa drew 25,236 fans for series against Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech.
- UVa has had record, sellout crowds of 4,219 in four of its last five weekend games.
- A record total of 77,549 fans have come out to Davenport Field this year (29 dates) – the school record was 65,661 in 2007 (37 dates).
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds and eight home crowds of more than 3,500.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, school-record crowds at William and Mary, James Madison and VMI.

### VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.88 hits per nine innings – first in the ACC and fifth fewest in the nation.
- UVa ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (7.97).
- UVa has given up more than nine hits just 15 times this season and twice in the last 11 games.

### CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon has now played in the most career games at UVa with 229. He passed David Stone (1999-2002) for first on the all-time UVa list April 30 at Duke.
- Cannon also comes into the weekend with 856 career at bats, which is third in UVa history. He needs nine ABs to tie Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) for first.
- Cannon has 59 career doubles and has broken the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (53, 2005-07). He needs two doubles to reach the ACC's career Top 25.
- He also is third in triples (12), fourth in hits (263), fifth in runs (174), sixth in total bases (364), eighth in stolen bases (48), ninth in walks (103) and 11th in HBP (19).

### LEGGING OUT THE EXTRA BAGGERS

- Virginia has sprayed the ball all over the field this year and ranks among the nation's leaders in triples and doubles (ACC leader in both).
- In the latest NCAA rankings, the Cavaliers were fifth in doubles with 136, which is two shy of the school record, set last year.
- UVa also was third nationally in triples behind Air Force (32) and Arizona State (29). UVa currently has 28 triples, which has matched the school record, set in 2009.
- The extra-base hits are coming from everyone – Jarrett Parker is the only Cavalier ranks in the top 40 nationally in either category; he is 13th nationally in triples with six.

### GOLDEN EYES

- Virginia's offense ranks 12th nationally with 242 bases on balls.
- Interestingly, the Cavaliers are just sixth in walks in the ACC – seven ACC teams ranks among the NCAA's top 15 in walks.
- FSU (2), Clemson (3), NC State (4), Georgia Tech (8), UNC (11) and Miami (25) also rank among the Top 25.

### NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 71-for-161 (.441) this season with 37 RBI and 60 runs scored.
- Against Duke, UVa's No. 9 hitters went 7-for-14.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 22-for-40 with 14 runs scored and eight RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 23-for-57 (.404) with two homers, 17 RBI and 19 runs scored in the ninth spot.

### DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Through 49 games, Virginia has committed 39 errors – good for a .979 fielding percentage.
- UVa leads the ACC in fielding and has a league-best .982 fielding mark in ACC games.
- In the latest NCAA rankings (through May 9), Virginia ranked fifth in the nation in fielding.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

### ARICO TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN SAVES

- Kevin Arico is tied with Appalachian State's Chris Patterson and Portland's Chris Dennis for No. 1 among all Division I pitchers in saves with 13 this season (in 15 attempts)
- He boasts 24 career saves – second in Virginia history and ninth in ACC history.
- Former Cavalier Casey Lambert (2004-07) is the ACC's all-time leader with 43 saves.
- Arico has been named to the midseason watch list for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, presented to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.

### OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 35-26 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded from there.
- UVa has outscored its opponents 56-16 in the second inning this year and 168-49 from the second through the fourth innings.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 428-194 this season.

### BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with 10 players boasting at least 30 hits and 25 runs each.
- In 23 games at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On six occasions all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting an .345 as a team through 49 games. Nine regular starters are batting .300 or better.

### FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders (Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor) have combined to go 74-for-195 (.379).
- Bruno is batting .400 and had a 15-game hit streak at one point this season.
- Gragnani is 10-for-21 in his last seven games.
- Taylor scored nine runs the week ending April 24 and had a career-high three hits out of the leadoff spot April 24 at Maryland.

### VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,316 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 222 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (164), Jarrett Parker (159), Phil Gosselin (151), Steven Proscia (112) Franco Valdes (106) and John Hicks (106) each have made at least 100 career starts.

### **BRUNO STREAK COMES TO HALT AT 15**

- Stephen Bruno had his 15-game hit streak snapped April 16 vs. Virginia Tech.
- He batted .397 (23-for-58) during that stretch.
- It was the longest hit streak for a UVa freshman since Brandon Guyer recorded hits in 15 straight games in 2005.

### **MOST MARCH WINS EVER**

- Virginia recorded one of its best months of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 16 games in March (16-3).
- It also is the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.842), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

### **WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE**

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

### **CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING**

- Virginia earned a No. 1 ranking from Baseball America and Rivals.com for six-consecutive weeks this season and is back at No. 1 in the Baseball America rankings for the last three weeks.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia has had five teams ranked No. 1 this season – baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer and men's tennis.

### **UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS**

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

- Virginia ranks third nationally in stolen bases the last four years with 495 (123.7 per year).
- UVa trails only Prairie View and Jackson State over that span.
- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

### **STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN**

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

### **VERSATILITY KEY FOR CAVALIERS**

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

### **STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT**

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

### **WHO'S GONE?**

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

### **SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE**

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
