### VIRGINIA RETURNS TO FIELD AGAINST MIAMI

- Virginia leads the all-time series, 26-24, and has won seven straight series against the Hurricanes.
- UVA took two of three from then-No. 1 Miami last season in Coral Gables.
- Miami's last series win against the Cavaliers came in 2009 in Charlottesville.
- Since 2010, UVA is 17-7 against Miami. Head coach Brian O'Connor is 23-19 against the Hurricanes.

### PRIOR TO THE HIATUS ...

- Virginia was playing some of its best baseball of the season when it went into the nine-day break for final exams.
- UVA went 16-4 over its previous 20 games, including a 15-4 mark in April.
- The Cavaliers won four straight ACC series in that stretch, including taking two of three at Florida State from April 28-30.
- In the last 20 games, Cameron Simmons batted .447 (34-76), racking up a team-high in hits while ripping four homers and driving in 24 runs.
- Pavin Smith (.416, 3 HR, 28 RBI), Adam Haseley (.390, 4 HR, 22 RBI), Caleb Knight (.386) and Jake McCarthy (.386) also were strong in that stretch.

### NOTING THE FLORIDA STATE SERIES

- Virginia took two of three games at Florida State (April 28-30).
- UVA won its second straight series in Tallahassee and its third ever (2010, '14, '17).
- UVA held FSU scoreless for 14 consecutive innings from Friday to Sunday.
- The Cavaliers batted .327 in the series, led by Nate Eikhoff (4-for-8), Adam Haseley (6-for-14) and Cameron Simmons (5-for-13).
- UVA pitchers limited FSU to 15 hits in three games (.167 BA).

### AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- UVA batters have struck out an ACC-low 173 times in 47 games (3.7 per game).
- That total by far the fewest among ACC teams (Louisville, 244).
- UVA is the only ACC team to walk more than it has struck out (198 BB).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 40 of 47 games.
- Ernie Clement (2nd), Pavin Smith (3rd) and Robbie Coman (15th) all rank among the top 15 nationally in toughest to strike out and are the three toughest in the ACC.

### SIMMONS HOT IN APRIL

- After a hot April, Cameron Simmons is sixth in the ACC in batting (.378).
- He is batting .400 in league games, tops among UVA players and third in the ACC.
- He had a career-high 12-game hit streak snapped April 19. He batted .500 (21-42) during that stretch.
- Simmons had his streak of seven straight multiple-hit games broken on April 18. No other UVA player has more than four straight multi-hit games this year.

### THINGS TO KNOW

- Virginia is 7-6 in its first game back from the finals break during Brian O'Connor's tenure (won last eight series following the break).
- Virginia ranks fourth nationally in batting (.327), 10th in OBP (.410) and 12th in hits (538).
- UVA boasts four players among the ACC's top 10 in batting.
- UVA has stolen an ACC-best 73 bases, its most steals since swiping 90 in 2011.
- Adam Haseley is on a 13-game hit streak and has reached base in 45 of 46 games, including 28 straight.
- Jake McCarthy is batting .387 (12-31) with six extra-base hits in his last 10 games.
- Charlie Cody (7-15), Justin Novak (4-9) and Robbie Coman (10-24) are UVA's top returning

## IF YOU DON'T READ ANYTHING ELSE, READ THIS

- UVA went 15-4 in April and has won four straight ACC series.
- In the first four weeks of the ACC schedule, UVA played UNC and Clemson on the road and Louisville at home; each is currently ranked in the top 10 (UVA lost two of three games in each series).
- Virginia leads the ACC in batting at .327, with seven regulars hitting over .300.
- Two-way standout Adam Haseley is having an All-America caliber year, batting .399 with 12 homers, 12 doubles and 45 RBI, in addition to pitching on Sundays.
- Cleanup hitter Pavin Smith also has put up big numbers, batting .355 with 10 homers and 59 RBI.
- UVA has one of the nation's most aggressive offenses, and the Cavaliers strike out at a low rate, averaging just 3.7 strikeouts per game. UVA has more walks than strikeouts this year (198/173).
- Fifth-year catcher Robbie Coman is the veteran leadership presence on the team and the lone remaining Cavalier to have played in both the 2014 and 2015 CWS.
- The Cavaliers have picked up their running game this year, swiping an ACC-high 73 bases, including Jake McCarthy's league-best 26 (most at UVA since 2008).
- UVA's rotation has been in flux throughout the season. The Cavaliers inserted freshman Noah Murdock into the rotation for the Louisville series. He has allowed three runs in 22 1/3 innings over four ACC starts.

## SMITH & HASELEY LEAD D1BASEBALL'S TOP HITTERS LIST

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley were listed as the top two college hitters this week by D1Baseball.com.
- The list was compiled after polling scouts and coaches from across the nation.
- According to D1Baseball, the "list is geared toward ranking the college hitters with the best pure "hit tool" on the scouting scale MLB scouts use to analyze these players for the upcoming draft."

## HASELEY CONTINUES STRONG 2017

- Adam Haseley is putting up team highs in batting (.399), extra-base hits (25) and on base percentage (.491) while hitting in the 3-hole.
- He is on the John Olerud Two-Way Player Award, National Pitcher of the Year and Golden Spikes Award watch lists.
- Haseley owns a team-high 12 home runs – seven of which have gone to the opposite field. He is tied for ninth in UVA single-season history in homers.
- He leads the ACC in batting and runs (55) and is second in OBP, third in hits (71) and slugging (.680), fourth in total bases (121), seventh in walks (32), 10th in home runs and 11th in RBI (45).
- Haseley also is 7-1 with a 3.58 ERA in 65 1/3 innings on the mound. He is fourth in the ACC in wins and 14th in ERA.

## CAVALIERS MASHING

- UVA has hit 48 home runs, which already is third most in the Brian O'Connor era.
- The top two home run seasons under O'Connor: 2010 (61) and 2009 (59), both of which came with the old bats.
- The Cavaliers hit 42 home runs in 2016 (60 games).
- Eleven Cavaliers have gone deep this year, and UVA is seventh in the ACC in homers.
- Adam Haseley is 10th in the ACC with 12 home runs, while Pavin Smith has 10 homers.
- UVA had a streak of 10 straight games with at least one home run snapped on April 19 (longest since 11-game stretch from Feb. 28-March 15, 1998).

## RUN, RUN AND RUN SOME MORE

- Virginia has stolen 73 bases this year (in 86 attempts), its most since swiping 90 in 2011 (68 games). UVA ranks second in the ACC to Louisville (74) in stolen bases.
- UVA ranks 24th nationally in stolen bases.
- Four Cavaliers have at least nine stolen bases. UVA's leader in 2016 was Ernie Clement with six.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 26 steals in 28 tries. He ranks seventh nationally.
- It marks the third-most steals in a season for a UVA player and the most since Greg Miclat had 30 in 2008.
- UVA stole 27 bases in 60 games last year, its fewest stolen bases during the Brian O'Connor era.

## KNIGHT BOLSTERS OFFENSE

- Caleb Knight has provided a boost to UVA's lineup over the last month, starting 21 games since the Duke series. UVA is 18-3 in his starts.
- In those starts, Knight has gone 29-for-67 (.433) with 16 RBI and 23 runs scored. His on-base percentage is .556 in his 21 starts.
- His four homers all have come in ACC games.
- He was inserted in the lineup as a defensive replacement in the first game against Duke.

## PAVIN SMITH: NOT YOUR NORMAL POWER HITTER

- Pavin Smith has put up some big numbers this season, hitting for power as well as contact.

- Smith has more home runs (10) than strikeouts (7).
- He ranks as the third toughest to strike out of any player in Division I, with seven strikeouts in 183 official at bats (217 plate appearances).

## DOYLE NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Junior right-hander Tommy Doyle was named to the midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List.
- Doyle is 1-1 with 12 saves in 18 outings this year.
- He is third in the ACC and ninth nationally in saves. Eight of his saves have come in ACC play.
- He has struck out 28 and walked six over 26 1/3 innings out of the bullpen.

## BETTINGER OUT OF PEN

- Senior right-hander Alec Bettinger has worn many hats during his career, working as a starter, reliever and closer.
- This year he primarily has worked as a long reliever. In 10 of his 16 appearances this year, he has worked more than two innings, including six of his last seven outings.
- He is 7-0 with a 2.05 ERA in 44 innings in 2017 and has been a part of each of UVA's four shutouts this year.
- He is tied for fourth in the ACC with seven wins and is now 21-10 in his career (sixth in wins in school history).
- Bettinger has appeared in 77 career games (eighth in school history).

## TIME TO ... GO TO WORK!

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley are the first UVA teammates to each record at least 10 homers in a season since Phil Gosselin (11), Jarrett Parker (10) and Steven Proscia (10) in 2010.
- Haseley (12) is sixth in the ACC in HR; Smith (10) is 13th.
- With 25 career homers, Smith is one round-tripper from reaching the top 10 in program history. He ranks sixth in career RBI at UVA with 159.

### OFFENSE LOOKS TO KEEP HUMMING

- Virginia tops the ACC in batting in all games (.327) as well as ACC games (.315)
- UVA already has faced the conference's top three teams in ERA (Louisville, North Carolina, Clemson), while Miami ranks fourth.
- In ranking 12th nationally in scoring at 7.9 runs per game, UVA is fourth among all Division I teams in batting and 12th in hits (538).

### WHATEVER IT TAKES

- A key part of Virginia's scoring numbers has come from execution.
- UVA is second nationally in sacrifice flies with 32 and 16th in sacrifice bunts with 44.
- UVA also has been hit by 43 pitches, which is fourth most in the conference and 38th nationally.

### BIG INNINGS PLAGUE CAVALIERS

- Virginia has given up 17 innings of four or more runs this year, including 11 in ACC play.
- In seven of UVA's 10 ACC defeats, the Cavaliers surrendered at least one inning of four-plus runs.
- UVA allowed 12 innings of four or more runs in 2016 and 16 in 2015.

### HASELEY, SMITH NAMED TO MIDSEASON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia's junior duo of Adam Haseley and Pavin Smith were named to the 40-man midseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award.
- UVA is one of six schools to have two players on the list.
- Haseley was named to the midseason watch list for the second year in a row.
- The semifinalists will be named May 31, with the finalists unveiled on June 14. The trophy will be presented June 29 in Los Angeles.

### O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He was the 10th coach in ACC history to reach the 600-win plateau and, in 825 games, the second-fastest in league history to hit 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 632 career wins, O'Connor ranks ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (258) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

### IN THE POLLS

- Virginia is ranked as high as No. 6 in the latest polls (Perfect Game). UVA is 10th in the D1Baseball and USA Today Coaches poll.
- UVA is 3-6 against ranked teams this year, all of whom currently are ranked in the top 10.
- UVA has played 10 games against teams currently ranked in the D1Baseball poll: Louisville (2), North Carolina (4), Clemson (8) and Old Dominion (25).
- The Cavaliers do not play Wake Forest (21) in league play this year.

### RECORDS WATCH

- Having pitched in 77 career games, RHP **Alec Bettinger** has appeared in the eighth-most contests in school history.
- Bettinger has won 21 career games — tied for sixth in UVA history (moves to fourth with next win).

- **Adam Haseley** stands seventh in school history with 172 runs scored and needs three to pass David Stone (1999-2002) and four to eclipse Adam Robinson (1994-97) for fifth.
- Haseley is ninth in program history with 10 triples and will move into a fifth-place tie with his next triple.
- **Pavin Smith** (25 HR) is one long ball shy of the top 10 at UVA and with 159 RBI is tied for sixth in program history (needs three for fifth).
- Smith has 58 RBI this season — nine shy of the single-season school record of 67, set by Kenny Towns (2015) and Joe Koshansky (2004).
- With 15 career saves, **Tommy Doyle** is eighth in school history (needs one save for seventh).
- **Jake McCarthy** (26 SB) is tied with David Stone (2002) for third in single-season stolen bases and needs four to reach the No. 2 slot (Greg Miclat, 2008). The record is 32, set by Miclat in 2007.

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation this decade (367).
- UVA has won 632 games since 2004 – an average of more than 45 victories per season.

- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history on May 28, 2016, against Louisville.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's first 13 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

## LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 632 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 13 seasons.

## UVA SECOND NATIONALLY IN ERA SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the second best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 12 seasons with a 3.17 team ERA since 2005.

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years with a combined .303 average and is tops again this season (.326).

## CHANGES COMING AT DAVENPORT

- Davenport Field is scheduled to undergo a \$12-18 million expansion following the 2017 season, with renovations slated to be complete in time for the start of the 2018 campaign.
- Among the planned renovations to improve the game-day experience:
  - A new grand entry in right field.
  - An expanded concourse down the right-field line that extends around the right-field pole toward right centerfield.
  - A field-level club area and seating for approximately 140 fans.
