VIRGINIA-LOUISVILLE SERIES

- Louisville holds a 5-2 lead in the brief series with Virginia.
- The teams split four games last year, with Louisville taking two of three games on its home field in the regular season before UVA won 7-2 on May 28 in the ACC tournament in Durham.
- The majority of the games have been one-sided: only one game has been decided by three runs or fewer.
- UofL handed UVA a home series sweep in 2015 in Charlottesville.

CAVALIERS IN MIDST OF BIG HOME STRETCH

- Virginia is currently in the midst of a stretch in which it plays 14 of 15 games at home at Davenport Field.
- UVA is playing three straight ACC series at home, the first time the Cavaliers have hosted three straight home ACC series since the 2001 season.
- The Cavaliers are 13-2 at home this season.
- Virginia is 390-97 (.802) at Davenport Field since 2004.

KNIGHT EMERGES IN CATCHER ROLE

- Caleb Knight has stepped up over the last week to take over as the starting catcher in the absence of Robbie Coman, who has missed the last seven games with a hamstring injury.
- Since entering in the third inning last Friday against Duke, Knight has gone 8-for-14 (.571), including three straight multi-hit games.
- He was the NJCAA Division I Defensive Player of the Year and a Rawlings Gold Glove Award winner last year at Connors State College (Okla.).

DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Virginia has hit 27 home runs, its most homers through 26 games in the Brian O'Connor era.
- The Cavaliers hit 42 home runs in 2016 and did not record their 27th homer last year until May 3 (48th game).
- Nine Cavaliers have gone yard this year, while UVA is tied for third in the ACC in home runs.
- Adam Haseley is fifth in the ACC with eight home runs, while Pavin Smith is ninth with seven long balls.

CAVALIERS STRIKE LATE

- UVA has outscored its foes 106-44 from the sixth inning on this season.
- The Cavaliers have rallied for three wins this year when trailing in the seventh inning or later.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Pavin Smith is 8-for-24 (.333) in seven career games vs. Louisville (HR, 5 RBI).
- With three strikeouts in 117 PA, Smith is the second toughest to strike out in Division I.
- Adam Haseley ranks second in the ACC in batting, OBP and slugging, fifth in hits and home runs, sixth in runs and ninth in walks
- Haseley (40) and Ernie Clement (37) rank third and fourth, respectively in the ACC in hits.
- Tommy Doyle ranks second in the ACC in saves (7).

NOTING THE DUKE SERIES

- Virginia rebounded from an ugly loss Friday to post 13-6 wins Saturday and Sunday in its ninth straight series win over Duke.
- UVA scored in double figures in back-to-back ACC games for the first time since May 10-11, 2013, also against Duke.
- UVA had 20 hits and no strikeouts Saturday.
- Adam Haseley was 5-for-11 with six runs scored in the series, while Caleb Knight was 5-for-10 and Charlie Cody was 5-for-11 (2B, 2 HR, 4 RBI).

BIG INNINGS PLAGUE CAVALIERS

- Virginia has given up 13 innings of four or more runs this year, including eight in ACC play.
- In each of UVA's five ACC defeats, the Cavaliers have given up at least one inning of four-plus runs.
- UVA allowed 12 innings of four or more runs in 2016 and 16 in 2015.

HASELEY CONTINUES STRONG 2017

- Adam Haseley is off to a strong start to the 2017 campaign, putting up team highs in batting (.412), extra-base hits (15) and on base percentage (.513) while hitting in the 3-hole.
- Haseley owns a team-high eight home runs – seven of which have gone to the opposite field.
- He ranks second in the ACC in batting, OBP and slugging, fifth in hits and home runs, sixth in runs and ninth in walks.
- Haseley also is 4-1 with a 3.60 ERA in 35 innings on the mound.

WEBER GIVES LINEUP BOOST AT SECOND BASE

- Andy Weber has started each of the last 13 games and 16 of the last 17 at second base, allowing Ernie Clement to shift to shortstop.
- He has hits in 12 of the 16 starts, with a team-high 21 RBI in that 16-game span.
- Weber is second on the team with 24 RBI despite having 66 at-bats, which is eighth on the team.

CAVALIERS IGNITE RUNNING GAME

- After stealing a season-high seven bases Wednesday at VCU, Virginia is 44-for-50 in base thievery this year (second to Louisville, 45).
- It marked UVA's most steals since the Cavaliers racked up seven against Radford on April 7, 2010.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 17 steals, nearly triple what any Cavalier had in the entire 2016 season (Ernie Clement led team with six).
- McCarthy is second nationally in stolen bases to Campbell's Drew Butler (22).
- It marks the most steals for a UVA player since Phil Gosselin had 18 in 2011.
- UVA stole 27 bases in 60 games last year, its fewest stolen bases during the Brian O'Connor era.
- Louisville has surrendered 19 stolen bases in 30 attempts this year (seventh in ACC).

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- Virginia batters have struck out an ACC-low 94 times in 26 games (3.6 strikeouts per game).
- That total by far the fewest among ACC teams (Louisville, 135).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 22 of 26 games.
- Pavin Smith has a team-low three strikeouts despite owning 117 plate appearances and ranks second nationally in the toughest to strike out category (1 K/34 AB).

WALKS WILL HAUNT

- In four of Virginia's six losses this year, Cavalier pitchers have walked six or more batters. In the other two losses, UVA pitchers handed out four free passes.
- On the flip side, UVA pitchers have walked four or fewer in 17 of their 20 wins.

O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He was the 10th coach in ACC history to reach the 600-win plateau and, in 825 games, was the second-fastest in league history to reach 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 616 career wins, O'Connor ranks ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (248) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

COMEBACK KIDS

- Virginia has come from behind on three occasions this year when it trailed in the seventh inning or later.
- UVA twice has rallied from large, late deficits.
- UVA came back from a 6-0, seventh-inning deficit on Feb. 19 against Kansas to win 9-6. It marked the Cavaliers' largest comeback since rallying from 6-0 down in the first inning on May 16, 2006, at Old Dominion.

- The Cavaliers rallied from a 6-2 deficit in the seventh inning against VMI, winning 9-7.

IN THE POLLS

- Virginia is ranked as high as No. 16 in the latest polls (USA Today Coaches and NCBWA polls).
- UVA is 2-4 against ranked teams this year.
- UVA has 12 games scheduled against teams currently ranked in the USA Today poll: Louisville (3), Clemson (5), North Carolina (7), Florida State (10).
- The Cavaliers do not play Wake Forest (receiving votes) in league play this year.

RECORDS WATCH

- Currently with 71 games and 10 saves, RHP Alec Bettinger needs two appearances and two saves to reach the top 10 in UVA history.
- Adam Haseley is ninth in program history with 10 triples and will move into a fifth-place tie with his next triple.
- Haseley also needs 11 runs to reach UVA's top 10.
- Pavin Smith (22 HR) is four long balls shy of the top 10 at UVA and with 131 RBI needs 15 RBI to reach the top 10 at UVA.
- Ernie Clement (7 triples) is two triples shy of the top 10 at UVA.

TRIO OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named to various All-America teams in the preseason: Ernie Clement (2B), Adam Haseley (UTL) and Pavin Smith (1B).
- Haseley and Smith also were named to the 55-man Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- The Preseason All-America honors:
 - **Ernie Clement:** 1st team (D1Baseball), 2nd team (Baseball America)
 - **Adam Haseley:** 2nd team (Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball)
 - **Pavin Smith:** 1st Team (Baseball America, Perfect Game), 2nd Team (Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball)

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 616-229-2 (.728) in his 14th season as UVA's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history on May 28, 2016, against Louisville.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's first 13 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 616 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 13 seasons.

UVA SECOND NATIONALLY IN ERA SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the second best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 12 seasons with a 3.17 team ERA since 2005.
- UVA finished second nationally in ERA (2.23) in 2014 and has ranked among the NCAA top 20 in nine of the 13 years under the current coaching staff.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2011 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

CAVALIERS AT HOME AT DAVENPORT

- This marks the 129th season of Virginia Baseball, including the 16th at Davenport Field, which opened in 2002.
- Virginia is 390-97 (.802) at Davenport Field since 2004 under Brian O'Connor.
- UVA averaged 3,675 fans per game last year, including a program-record 3,638 per game for the regular season.
- The Cavaliers passed the 100,000 mark in attendance for the sixth time in seven years this season (120,082 total).

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia has posted the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- UVA has accrued a .973 fielding percentage over the last 13 seasons.
- UVA owns a .975 fielding percentage this year (fourth in ACC).

CAVALIERS TOP ACC IN BATTING SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years with a combined .303 average and is third this year (.317).
- The Cavaliers led the conference in batting in 2009, 2010 and 2013 and were second in 2011, 2012 and 2014.
- UVA was third in the ACC in batting last year at .304.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia lost several key players off of its 2016 team.
- Two-time All-America catcher Matt Thaiss (153 career starts) was a first-round draft pick (16th overall) of the L.A. Angels after batting a team-high .375 in 2016.
- Three-year starting shortstop Daniel Pinero (194 starts) was drafted in the ninth round by the Tigers.
- UVA's Friday starter, Connor Jones, was selected in the second round by St. Louis, and finished fourth in career wins (22) and eighth in innings (268.2) at UVA.
- Left-handed pitchers Kevin Doherty and David Rosenberger each graduated after playing key roles out of the bullpen last year.
