Cavaliers Look to Set New Road Mark

- The Cavaliers have already matched the school record of three ACC road wins in a season, set in 2005 and can set a new record with a win today
- Virginia finished that season with a school record 8-2-0 conference record

Cavaliers Offensive in ACC

- •The Cavaliers have scored 16 goals over the first five conference games
- That total is one shy of the school record for goals over an entire ACC regular season, as the Cavaliers scored 17 goals in 2004
- That season the Cavaliers won the ACC Championship

Offense Explodes Against Wolfpack and Tigers

- In consecutive games, UVa beat NC State 6-0 and Clemson 7-1
- The 13 goals are the most Virginia has ever scored in consecutive ACC games
- UVa's seven goals against Clemson were the most for the team since a 9-0 win over Richmond in 2005
- It was the most goals Virginia scored against an ACC opponent since an 8-0 win over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the 2004 ACC Tournament
- The results are the most lopsided regular season games in the conference since a 9-3 Duke win over Virginia Tech in 2004

Lenczyk and Farrelly Score Hat Tricks

- Meghan Lenczyk and Sinead Farrelly both have hat tricks this season, marking the first time in school history that Virginia has had two different players have a hat trick in the same season
- Farrelly had a career-high three goals in the first half of the 7-1 win at Clemson
- Lenczyk had a career-high three goals in the 5-0 win over Liberty
- Lenczyk's was the first hat trick by a Cavalier since 2004 (Kelly Hammond vs. JMU)
- Farrelly's was the first hat trick in school history against an ACC opponent

Alwine Piling Up Assists

- Lauren Alwine already has 10 assists this season, which ranks 5th by a Cavalier in a season
- She is only four assists shy of the school record of 14 in a season, set by Sarah Huffman in 2004

Spreading the Wealth

- Through the first 13 games of the season, Virginia has 18 different players with a point
- •The number already is one more than the number of point scorers last year
- That list includes 12 different goal scorers

Second Half Strong

- The Cavaliers have scored 22 of their 36 goals this season in the second half
- Last year Virginia had 30 second half goals, compared to just 10 in the first half

ACC Leaders

- Lauren Alwine leads the conference with 10 assists
- Celeste Miles is tied for the conference lead with seven shutouts
- Miles leads the conference with a 0.54 goals against average

Lenczyk Named Player of the Week

- Meghan Lenczyk was honored as the ACC Co-Player of the Week and the Soccer America National Player of the Week on Tuesday
- She scored the game-winning goals at Florida State and Miami last week

Game-Winning Connection

- In four of the past six Cavalier wins (vs. William & Mary, vs. Dartmouth, at Florida State, at Miami), the game-winning goal has been scored by Meghan Lenczyk on an assist by Lauren Alwine
- Those goals are the only four GWG of Lenczyk's career and only four GWA of Alwine's career

Klöck-work at Home

- The Cavaliers are on a 19-game home unbeaten streak (17-0-2)
- · Last year Virginia went undefeated at home (11-0-2) for the first time in history
- Since 2001, Virginia 73-10-7 at Klöckner Stadium
