**Four ACC Teams Ranked by AP, USA Today Coaches Polls
 3rd-Ranked Clemson Hosts Boston College; Pitt Travels to No. 24 Virginia Tech
 Virginia-Maryland; Syracuse-NC State Headlines Conference Match-Ups**

For first time in its 61-year history, the ACC has three football teams with 5-0 records in No. 3 Clemson, No. 6 Florida State and No. 13 Miami... The ACC has four teams nationally-ranked this week as Virginia Tech makes its first appearance in the national polls this season, ranked 24th in AP, 25th in the USA Today Coaches poll...The Hokies have now made at least one appearance in the Coaches poll in every year since 1993...FSU true freshman QB Jameis Winston was named the Walter Camp Foundation National Offensive Player of the Week for his play against Maryland...Races for Division titles and a berth in the Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game in Charlotte on Dec. 7 are beginning to take shape...In the Atlantic, Clemson and Florida State are both 3-0 and in the lead for the division title...In the Coastal, Virginia Tech has gotten off to a 2-0 league start and sits in the lead just ahead of Miami (1-0) and Pitt (2-1)...One of the four ACC games this Saturday matches the Panthers and Hokies in an important Coastal Di-

vision contest at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. (Noon, ESPNU)...Pitt is coached by Paul Chryst, and led by QB Tom Savage, the potent wide receiver tandem of senior Devin Street and true freshman Tyler Boyd, and NT Aaron Donald, who is 2nd nationally in sacks... Boyd leads all freshmen nationally in reception yards per game... Virginia Tech, coached by Frank Beamer, ranks 5th nationally in total defense and 8th in pass efficiency defense... The Hokies are led by QB Logan Thomas, who has overcome a slow early season start to complete 72 percent of his passes in his last two games...In Clemson, S.C., the 3rd-ranked Tigers of Coach Dabo Swinney host Atlantic Division foe Boston College at Memorial Stadium Stadium (3:30 pm; ABC/ESPN2)...The Tigers are led by QB Tajh Boyd, who ranks 6th nationally in pass efficiency and ranks 2nd in ACC history in career TD passes (87) and touchdown responsibility (107)...The Eagles, coached by Steve Addazio, counter with an

offense built around the nation's leading rusher in RB Andre Williams (153.6 yds/gm) and QB Chase Rettig who has a pass efficiency rating of 183.17 for his last two games...In College Park, Md., the Terrapins of Coach Randy Edsall will host Virginia at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (3:30 pm; ESPNU) looking to stay close to FSU and Clemson in the Atlantic Division race... Maryland is led by its own potent wide receiver combination of Stefon Diggs and Deon Long but may be without QB C.J. Brown, who suffered an injury in the Terps first loss of the year to FSU last Saturday... Virginia, coached by Mike London, is led by RB Kevin Parks, who has topped 100 yards rushing twice this year, and DT Brent Urban, who is averaging 1.40 tackles for loss ...The Cavaliers and Terrapins are meeting for the 78th time in a series which began in 1919... In Raleigh, N.C., NC State, coached by Dave Doeren and led by QB Pete Thomas, will continued, page 2

host Atlantic Division foe Syracuse, with both teams looking for their initial ACC win of the year...The Orange, coached by **Scott Shafer**, and led by **RB Jerome Smith** and **DT Jay Bromley**, are playing in their first road contest in the ACC at State's Carter-Finley Stadium (3:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks)...Smith is tied for the ACC lead in touchdowns (8) while Bromley is 9th nationally in sacks (1.00/gm.)...Saturday's game will mark the first meeting between the two teams since 1998...Two non-conference games complete the ACC schedule this week...Georgia Tech travels to Provo, Utah, for a game with BYU at Lavell Edwards Stadium (7 pm, ESPNU) and Duke hosts Navy at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham (12:30 pm, ACC Network)... The Yellow Jackets, coached by **Paul Johnson**, and led by **QB Vad Lee** and **BB David Sims**, are looking to get back on the winning track after back-to-back ACC losses to Virginia Tech and at Miami...Georgia Tech is facing a balanced Cougar team, coached by Bronco Mendenhall and led by QB Taysom Hill, that is ranked 24th nationally in total defense and 26th in total offense...It will be a battle of two of the nation's top rushing offenses...Georgia Tech is ranked 7th nationally (300.0 yds/gm) while BYU is 13th (277.8 yds/gm)... The ground game will also be a concern in Durham, as Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **QB Brandon Connette** and **WR Jamison Crowder**, is hosting one of the nation's top rushing attacks in Navy's version of the spread option which ranks 8th nationally in rushing offense, gaining 294 yards a game...Coached by Ken Niumatalolo and led by QB Keenan Reynolds, the Midshipmen have won three of their first four games...Connette has totaled 11 TDR and 647 passing yards in his last two games as Duke's starter at QB...Jamison leads the ACC and ranks 5th nationally in punt returns (19.3 avg.) while also ranking 2nd in the ACC in receptions per game (7.4) and 4th in receiving yards per game (106.0)...The Blue Devils are looking to finish their non-conference slate unbeaten as Duke has captured its first three contests with non-league foes.

ACC News & Notes

ACC Has Three 5-0 Teams For First Time

The ACC has three 5-0 teams for the first time in its 61-year history. Third-ranked Clemson, 6th-ranked Florida State and 13th-ranked Miami all begin this week without a loss after 5 games. The ACC is also the only conference nationally with three teams with 5-0 records.

ACC Has Four Ranked Teams

Though Maryland slipped out of the national rankings after its loss to FSU, the ACC still has four nationally-ranked teams with Virginia Tech making both polls-AP and USA Today Coaches--for the first time this year. Clemson is ranked 3rd, Florida State 6th, Miami 13th and Virginia Tech 24th in the AP poll....Clemson is 4th, FSU 6th, Miami 14th and Virginia Tech 25th in the USA Today Coaches poll.

Virginia Tech Ranked; Continues Coaches Poll String

Virginia Tech is ranked 25th in this week's USA Today Coaches poll. It is the Hokies' first ranking of the 2013 season and continues a streak which has seen Tech be ranked at least once each year in the Coaches poll since 1993. The Hokies made their first appearance in the Coaches poll on Oct. 25, 1993, at No. 24

Boston College's Andre Williams Leads Nation in Rushing

Boosted by his 263-yard effort against Army last week, Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** leads the nation in rushing this week, averaging 153.6 yards per game. Williams became the first ACC running back since 2006 to record multiple 200-yard rushing games in one season. Williams ran for 204 yards against Wake Forest on Sept. 6. The 263 rushing yards tied for the 10th-best performance in league history (Raymond Priester, Clemson, 1995, vs. Duke) and his 5 rushing TDs marked the most for an ACC back since BC's Montel Harris had a quintet of scoring jaunts against NC State on Oct. 17, 2009.

Florida State's Jameis Winston

Named Walter Camp Offensive Player of the Week; Athlon Sports National Player and Rookie of Week

Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**, who completed 23 of 32 passes for 393 yards and 5 TDs in leading the Seminoles to a 63-0 win over 25th-ranked Maryland, was named the National Offensive Player of the Week by the Walter Camp Foundation and was named both the National Player and Rookie of the Week by Athlon Sports. He becomes the fourth ACC player honored as National Player of the Week by the Walter Camp Foundation, joining Virginia's **Anthony Harris** (Defensive, Sept. 1); Pitt's **Tom Savage** (Offensive, Sept. 22) and Maryland's **A.J. Hendy** (Defensive, Sept. 22). He was honored by Athlon for the third time this season.

Clemson's Beasley, Pitt's Donald Lead Nation in Sacks

Clemson junior **DE Vic Beasley** leads the nation in QB sacks, and has 8.0 sacks in five games for an average of 1.60/gm. Pitt senior **NT Aaron Donald** is right behind in 2nd place nationally with 6.0 sacks in four games, an average of 1.50 per game. Additionally, Maryland's **LB Marcus Whitfield** (1.10/gm) is tied for 6th nationally while Syracuse' **DT Jay Bromley** is tied for 9th (1.10 gm.).

Clemson's Tajh Boyd Throws for career-high 455

Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** threw for a career-high and Clemson school record 455 passing yards in the Tigers 49-14 win at Syracuse. The yardage total was the 23rd best single day for an ACC quarterback. Boyd also threw for 5 TD passes and now has 87 for his career, just 8 shy of the ACC career record of 95 held by former NC State QB Philip Rivers. Boyd also has now accounted for 107 TDR, just five shy of Rivers' ACC career record (112).

Wake's Campanaro Leads ACC in Receiving, 5th Nationally

Wake Forest senior **WR Michael Campanaro**, who had 12 catches for 153 yards and 2 TDs in the Demon Deacons' upset of NC State, leads the ACC in pass receptions and ranks 5th nationally, averaging 8.8 receptions per game. The performance against the Wolfpack marked the second time he has been in double figures in pass receptions, having tied the ACC single-game record with 16 catches against Louisiana Monroe on Sept. 14.

2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 5

Florida State 63, Maryland 0

QB Jameis Winston threw for a career-high 393 yards and five touchdowns as the eighth-ranked Seminoles rolled past the 25th-ranked Terrapins on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles (5-0, 3-0) held Maryland and its 18th-ranked offense to 234 total yards -- including just 33 on the ground. The FSU defense limited the Terps (4-1, 0-1) to just 2-of-15 on third-down conversions and nine total first downs. As an offense, Florida State racked up 614 total yards and picked up 33 first downs while churning out 7.5 yards per play with no turnovers. RB Devonta Freeman ran for 63 yards and a score. RB Karlos Williams added two more touchdown runs, and WR Rashad Greene grabbed four catches for 108 yards. WR Kenny Shaw added 96 yards on five catches with a touchdown to bring his season total to 463 yards, and WR Kelvin Benjamin had 60 receiving yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Clemson 49, Syracuse 14

QB Tajh Boyd passed for a school-record 455 yards and a career high-tying five touchdowns as the third-ranked Tigers won at Syracuse in the first-ever ACC game for the Orange. WR Sammy Watkins was on the receiving end of four of Boyd's passes for 126 yards, including a 91-yard scoring play that was the second-longest in Clemson school history. WR Adam Humphries added a pair of touchdown receptions and finished with three catches for a career-high 18 yards as the Tigers remained unbeaten at 5-0 (2-0 ACC). CB Darius Robinson picked off a pair of Syracuse passes and DE Vic Beasley had two sacks and four total tackles for loss to key Clemson's defensive effort. The Orange (2-3, 0-1) saw RB Jerome Smith rush for 125 yards and RB Devante McFarlane finish with 95 yards on the ground. P Riley Dixon's 75-yard punt in the first quarter set a Syracuse school record.

Miami 45, Georgia Tech 30

The 14th-ranked Hurricanes, off to their first 5-0 start since 2004, trailed for the first time since last Nov. 10 and overcame a 10-point deficit to win their ACC opener. QB Stephen Morris threw three touchdown passes, and RB Duke Johnson rushed for 184 yards as Miami finished strong after a shaky start in the Coastal Division battle. WRs Phillip Dorsett and Allen Hurns, as well as TE Clive Walford, caught scoring passes for the Hurricanes, who scored 23 points in the game's final 7:15 with the help of DB Ladarius Gunter's 30-yard interception return for a touchdown. RB Dallas Crawford added a pair of rushing touchdowns. RB David Sims rushed for 77 yards and a pair of touchdowns to lead Georgia Tech (3-2, 2-2), which had eight different players rush for at least 28 yards. The Hurricanes built a 45-23 lead before Tech backup QB Tim Byerly scrambled 15 yards for a touchdown with 10 seconds remaining in the game.

Virginia Tech 27, North Carolina 17

On a day in which he became Virginia Tech's all-time leading passer, QB Logan Thomas threw for 293 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Hokies (5-1, 2-0), who have won five straight games since a season-opening loss to top-ranked Alabama. The Hokies scored the clinching TD in Saturday's game when RB Trey Edmunds barreled into the end zone from one yard out with 4:06 to play for a 27-10 Virginia Tech lead. Thomas entered the game needing just three yards passing to surpass Tyrod Taylor's mark of 7,017 career passing yards from 2007-10. Thomas broke the record on a 5-yard toss to Demetri Knowles on the Hokies' first possession. UNC QB Marquise Williams, making the start in place of injured Bryn Renner, completed 23 of 35 passes for 277 yards and two touchdowns. He also led the Tar Heels (1-4, 0-2) with 56 yards rushing.

Wake Forest 28, NC State 13

QB Tanner Price accounted for four touchdowns -- three passing and one rushing -- as the Demon Deacons defeated the Wolfpack for the sixth straight time in Winston-Salem, N.C. Price's 1-yard keeper opened the scoring for Wake Forest (3-3, 1-2), and he followed up with touchdown passes of 10 and 27 yards to WR Michael Campanaro, and a 3-yard scoring strike to WR Jared Crump. Campanaro finished with 12 receptions for 153 yards, and his 206 career receptions rank second on Wake Forest's all-time list behind Desmond Clark's 216. NC State (3-2, 0-2) led briefly at 10-7 when QB Pete Thomas found WR Quintin Payton with an 11-yard touchdown pass with 39 seconds remaining in the first half, but the Demon Deacons responded by driving 75 yards in five plays in 33 seconds to reclaim a 14-10 lead just before halftime, with Price's 10-yard toss to Campanaro accounting for the score.

Boston College 48, Army 27

RB Andre Williams rushed for 263 yards -- one shy of the Boston College school record -- and scored five touchdowns to lead the Eagles (3-2) to a homecoming win over the Black Knights (3-3). Williams scored on runs of 34, 1, 37, 3 and 34 yards, but Boston College's efforts weren't confined solely to the ground attack. QB Chase Rettig finished 11-of-13 for 203 yards, and WR Alex Amidon had five receptions for 122 yards. LB Kevin Pierre-Louis led Boston College defensively with an eye-opening 18 tackles, including eight solo stops. Army's strong running game accounted for 326 yards and was led by RB Larry Dixon, who finished with 125 yards rushing and two touchdowns.

Ball State 48, Virginia 27

RB Jahwan Edwards ran for two scores, and QB Keith Wenning threw for a pair of touchdowns and ran for another to lead the visiting Cardinals (5-1). Virginia RB Kevin Parks rushed for 104 yards and two touchdowns, while QB David Watford had a 27-yard touchdown run and passed for 203 yards. P-PK Alec Vozenilek kicked a pair of field goals for the Cavaliers (2-3). DT Brent Urban led Virginia defensively with 10 tackles and broke up two passes.

ACC Notes By The Numbers

.717 - The pass completion percentage for Virginia Tech's **Logan Thomas** in his last two games. In Coastal Division wins over Georgia Tech and North Carolina, Thomas completed 38 of 53 passes for 514 yards, 4 touchdowns and no interceptions. In Tech's four previous games, Thomas completed only 48.5 percent of his passes for 4 TDs and 6 interceptions.

.895 - The winning percentage for Clemson in home ACC football games under current head coach **Dabo Swinney**. The Tigers are 17-2 against league foes in the cozy (or uncozy) confines of Memorial Stadium.

.917 - The field goal percentage for NC State's **Niklas Sade**. Sade has made 11 of his 12 three-point field goal attempts this year. Sade is tied for 5th nationally in field goals per game (2.2). One of the most improved performers in the ACC, prior to this year, Sade made 61.5% of his field goals (24 of 39).

.968 - Clemson PK **Chris Catanzaro** has made 30 of his last 31 field goal attempts, a .968 percentage. He had a school-record string of 20 field goal attempts without a miss in 2012 and now has a current streak of 10 without a miss.

1 - After rushing for 263 yards against Army, Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** leads the nation in rushing yardage per game. Williams, who became the first ACC running back with multiple 200-yard games in the same season since Virginia Tech's Brandon Ore did it in 2006, is averaging 153.6 yards per game.

1.60 - The average number of sacks per game by Clemson junior **DE Vic Beasley**. Beasley leads the nation in QB sacks, having made 8.0 sacks in five games. Pitt **NT Aaron Donald** is right behind Beasley. Donald is 2nd nationally in QB sacks, averaging 1.50 per game.

2 - Inheriting double duty last weekend, Virginia junior **Alec Vozenilek** did not disappoint. Against Ball State, the UVa punter added placekicking to his duties and made both of his field goal attempts of 38 and 39 yards, while also averaging 45.0 yards a boot on four punts.

4 - When FSU **QB Jameis Winston** was honored by the Walter Camp Foundation as its National Offensive Player of the Week, it marked the fourth time this year that the Foundation has honored an ACC player with national accolades. Virginia's **Anthony Harris** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Foundation on Sept. 1 for his play against BYU; Pitt **QB Tom Savage** earned National Offensive Player of the Week honors for his play on Sept. 21 against Duke and Maryland **S A.J. Hendy** was named the National Defensive Player

of the Week that week for his play in the Terps' win over West Virginia.

5-0 - For the first time in its history, the ACC has three teams that are undefeated after five games in the season. **Clemson, Florida State** and **Miami** all enter the week with spotless 5-0 records. The ACC is also the only conference nationally with three 5-0 teams.

6.81 - The average career yards per carry for Miami sophomore **RB Duke Johnson**. Johnson, who had 184 yards on just 22 carries (8.4) in Miami's win over Georgia Tech. Johnson's per-carry average would be the 7th-best in ACC history.

8.8 - Wake Forest senior **WR Michael Campanaro** leads the ACC and ranks 5th nationally in pass receptions per game. Campanaro, who moved into a tie for 7th place with Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins on the ACC career receptions list, now has 206 career catches.

10 - Clemson junior **WR Sammy Watkins** recorded the 10th 100-yard performance in his career last Saturday with a four-catch, 126-yard, 1 TD performance against Syracuse. Watkins has topped 100 receiving yards in three of Clemson's five games this year including efforts against 5th-ranked Georgia (127) and Wake Forest (113) and just missing against NC State (96).

11 - In his last two games, Duke **QB Brandon Connette**, who is starting due to the injury suffered by Anthony Boone, has been responsible for 11 touchdowns rushing and passing. For the season, Connette has thrown for 11 touchdowns and run for 6 more, a total of 17 TDs in just three games as a starter and two as a part-time player.

11.5 - The number of tackles for loss for Wake Forest senior **NG Nikita Whitlock** which leads the ACC. Whitlock has 11.5 tackles for loss in 6 games, a 1.92 average. Pitt **NT Aaron Donald** leads the ACC in tackles for loss per game, averaging 2.25 per contest.

19.2 - Duke **WR Jamison Crowder** ranks 6th nationally in punt return average, averaging 19.2 yards per return with two touchdowns. Crowder also ranks 14th in receptions per game (7.4), 16th in receiving yards per game (106.0) and 9th in all-purpose yards per game (169.6).

21.2 - The per-catch average for Maryland sophomore **WR Stefon Diggs**. He has 20 catches for 424 yards and 3 TDs and is tied with Pitt's Devin Street for the best per-catch average among the top 10 ACC receiving leaders.

47.2 - The punting average for Miami graduate student **Pat O'Donnell** this year. The average leads the ACC and would rank 4th nationally if he had enough punt attempts (3.6/gm). O'Donnell, who graduated from Cincinnati last year, entered graduate school at Miami for his final year of eligibility.

63 - When **Florida State** defeated 25th-ranked Maryland, 63-0, last Saturday, it was the largest margin of victory in a game between ACC teams. The Seminoles held the previous mark of 60 points in a 77-17 win over NC State in 1995.

88.6% - The completion percentage for Clemson's backup QB junior **Cole Stoudt**. The Dublin, Ohio junior has completed 31 of 35 passes this season in relief of Tajh Boyd for 238 yards, 4 TDs, no interceptions and a pass efficiency rating of 183.41.

106.3 - The average number of receiving yards this season for Pitt true freshman **WR Tyler Boyd**. He is the leading freshman receiver in the nation in receiving yards per game. His average of 175.25 all-purpose yards per game ranks him 6th nationally and he also leads all freshmen in that category.

153.65 - Bouyed by a school-record 455 passing yards set against Syracuse last Saturday, Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** has pushed his career pass efficiency rating to 153.65, which, if maintained would be an ACC career mark. Florida State's Chris Weinke set the ACC standard in 2000, when he finished with a 151.15 rating.

213.9 - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**. Winston has recorded the third-best pass efficiency rating this century for a quarterback in his team's first five games of a season (minimum 15 attempts per game). This season, Winston ranks 2nd nationally only to Baylor's Bryce Petty (229.6), who may join this list next week, but has played in only four games this season. Winston's rating trails only that of Russell Wilson (216.9, Wisconsin, 2011) and David Johnson (214.8, Tulsa, 2008) and is just ahead of Robert Griffin, III (212.9, Baylor, 2011).

263 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 263 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

1993 - When **Virginia Tech** was ranked this week in the USA Today Football Coaches poll, it continued a streak of 21 straight years of being ranked in the Coaches poll at least once each season. The streak began on Oct. 25, 1993, when the Hokies were ranked No. 24.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 263 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 150 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th, 8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

Golden, London, Grobe Have Virginia Ties

Three current ACC head football coaches have ties to Virginia in Miami head coach Al Golden, UVA head coach Mike London and Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe. Golden served as defensive coordinator under former UVA head coach Al Groh at Virginia for five seasons from 2001-2005. London, served two terms as an assistant coach at UVA under Groh. London was an assistant in Charlottesville from 2001 through 2004, then returned as defensive coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Grobe is actually a Virginia graduate, a two-year starter for the Cavaliers under former head coach Sonny Randall, and a former member of the 1974 All-ACC Academic team.

Syracuse Leads All ACC Schools In Games Played

New ACC member Syracuse, now in its 124th season of college football, leads all ACC schools in number of college football games played. The Orange have played in 1,249 football games, three more than Virginia (1,246). Both schools are in their 124th season this fall, as is new member Pitt. North Carolina, in its 123rd season, is third with 1,232 games, follow by Pitt with 1,226. Overall, Syracuse and Virginia rank 5th and 6th among all NCAA Bowl Subdivision Teams and 12th overall among all schools in Division I. Ivy League member Penn (1,313) leads all schools in Division I.

In His Fourth Season at Florida State Jimbo Fisher Joining Select Company



Now in his fourth season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has already joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 36-10 record (.783). His winning percentage has him in 3rd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 45-5-1 record (.892). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 2nd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792), followed by Fisher and Clemson's Danny Ford (.772).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. Now in his sixth season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 17 of the first 19 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .895. That is the best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is just ahead of former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 11 of his first 13 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Swinney (1st), Hatfield (2nd), Danny Ford (8th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

North Carolina Sets Offensive Records In First Year Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,



■ In Fedora's first 17 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 17 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 11 occasions.

■ In his first 17 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 14 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.

NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 3-2 record in his three games as State's head coach and now is 26-6 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 3-2 start to the 2013 season, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 23 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.



■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

Wake Forest's Jim Grobe is Longest Tenured Coach in ACC Play

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is in his 13th season as head coach of the Demon Deacons, the most of any current coach in Atlantic Coast Conference play. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer, of course, is in his 27th year as head of the Hokies, but has been in ACC play only since 2004, or the last nine years. Beamer is the longest-tenured FBS head coach nationally and Grobe is 7th. Grobe, now in his 19th season as a head coach, has posted 109 victories and is one of four ACC current coaches--joined by Beamer, Clemson's Dabo Swinney and Florida State's Jimbo Fisher--to have won an ACC Football Championship. Grobe led his 2006 Wake Forest squad to the ACC championship.

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Marshall ended regulation tied at 21 in week four of the 2013 season, it marked the 63rd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 63 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 63 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-20 advantage in the 55 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-31 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.

ACC Announces 2013 Football Championship Game Legends Class

National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers

Terry Kinard, Tom Scott, Floyd Little and Johnny Majors;

ACC 50th Anniversary Team Members Kinard and Boomer Esiason Headline 2013 Class

Led by four members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and two members of the Atlantic Coast Conference's prestigious 50th Anniversary team, the ACC has announced the 2013 Class of Legends for its 9th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 7.

Leading this year's class are former Maryland quarterback **Boomer Esiason (East Islip, N.Y.)**, Clemson safety **Terry Kinard (Sumter, S.C.)**, Virginia defensive end **Tom Scott (Baltimore, Md.)**, Syracuse running back **Floyd Little (New Haven, Conn.)** and former Pitt head coach **Johnny Majors (Lynchburg, Tenn.)**.

Esiason and Kinard were both chosen in 2003 to be members of the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, which honored the 50 best players of the league's first 50 years, while Kinard, Scott, Little and Majors are members of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend. They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 6, and on Dec. 7, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

The group of 15 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year; 10 former All-Americans, including six first-team All-America honorees; and 12 players who combined for 97 years in the National Football League. Twelve of the Legends were drafted into the NFL, including six first- or second-round draft choices.

In all, the collection of players combined for two national championships, five ACC Championships and one Super Bowl title.

Joining the aforementioned selections are Boston College running back **Mike Cloud (Portsmouth, R.I.)**, who ended his collegiate career in 1998 as the Eagles' all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards; Duke halfback and end **Wes Chesson (Edenton, N.C.)**, who ended his career with nine 100-yard receiving games, at the time the most in ACC history; Florida State guard **Jamie**

Dukes (Orlando, Fla.), a consensus first-team All-America for the Seminoles in 1985; and Georgia Tech tailback **"Rambling" Robert Lavette (Cartersville, Ga.)**, who is still the leading career rusher in Yellow Jacket history with 4,066 yards.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2013 are Miami's **Edgerrin James (Immokalee, Fla.)**, one of the most successful running backs in Hurricane history; North Carolina's **Ken Willard (Richmond, Va.)**, a second-team All-America fullback for the Tar Heels; NC State's famed Buckey twins, **Dave Buckey (Akron, Ohio)**, an All-ACC quarterback, and **Don Buckey (Akron)**, an All-ACC wide receiver, who keyed the Wolfpack's football resurgence in the 1970s under then head coach Lou Holtz; Virginia Tech wide receiver **Andre` Davis (Niskayuna, N.Y.)**, a first-team All-America and explosive performer who was one of the leaders of Tech's 2000 team which reached the BCS National Championship Game; and Wake Forest quarterback **Jay Venuto (Salem, N.J.)**, the 1979 ACC Player of the Year who led the Deacons to wins over three nationally-ranked foes that year.

Esiason (1981-83), one of the most successful quarterbacks in Maryland and ACC history, led the Terrapins to the 1983 ACC Championship and back-to-back bowl game appearances (1982-83) under then head coach Bobby Ross. Named a second-team All-America by The Sporting News in 1983, Esiason set 17 school records during his collegiate career, completing 461 of 850 passes for 6,259 yards and 42 touchdowns. He was the first quarterback selected in the 1984 NFL Draft, chosen in the 2nd round by the Cincinnati Bengals. He enjoyed a 14-year NFL career, the first nine with the Bengals, three seasons with the New York Jets and one year at Arizona. He led Cincinnati to Super Bowl XXIII and was named to the Pro Bowl four times, an All-Pro twice, and in 1988 was honored as MVP of the National Football League. He ended his career as perhaps the best left-handed quarterback in league history, completing 57 percent of his passes for 37,920 yards with 247 touchdowns. Following the conclusion of his professional career, Esiason has appeared in a variety of television programs, has hosted both the 1998 Miss America Pageant and

CBS' Thanksgiving Day parade coverage and served as the color commentator on ABC's Monday Night Football. He is currently a studio analyst for The NFL Today on CBS, is a color analyst for Westwood One's radio broadcasts of Monday Night Football and co-hosts a long-running and top-rated morning radio show, "Boomer and Carton," on WFAN the Fan in New York City. In 1993, after his son Gunnar was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis, Esiason created the Boomer Esiason Foundation, which has raised in excess of \$100 million to fund research to find a cure for the disease of the respiratory and digestive systems. In 1995, he was honored with the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award for his community service. Originally a native of East Islip, N.Y., he currently lives in Plandome, N.Y.

Kinard (1979-82), one of the leaders of Clemson's 1981 National Championship team, was a two-time first-team All-America safety who earned unanimous All-America honors in 1982. Named the CBS National Defensive Player of the Year in 1982, Kinard was also selected to the USA Today All-College Football team in the 1980s and to the Sports Illustrated All-Century team of College Football. He helped lead the Tigers, under coach Danny Ford, to a four-year record of 33-10-1 including a 21-1-1 mark in his final two seasons of play. His 17 career interceptions is still a Clemson record. He was named to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2001. That same year he was inducted into Clemson's Ring of Honor. The 10th overall pick on the first round in the 1983 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, he went on to have an eight-year NFL career. He started in 115 NFL games, making 31 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries, helped lead the Giants to Super Bowl XXI and completed his career with the Houston Oilers in 1990. Originally a native of Sumter, S.C., Kinard now lives in Hilton Head Island, S.C.

Scott (1950-52), one of many standout players for Virginia in the early 1950s, played in the era of single platoon football as a stand-out offensive and defensive end for the Cavaliers. Named a first-team All-America in 1952 by both the Associated Press and NEA, he helped lead Virginia to a three-year 24-5 record, including an 8-1 mark and a No. 13 national ranking in 1951. The first two-sport All-America for the Cavaliers, Scott was a member of UVa's 1952 National Champion lacrosse

team, earning All-America honors that season. The 60th overall pick in the 5th round of the 1953 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams, he played 12 seasons in the NFL, six years each with the Philadelphia Eagles and New York Giants. He was twice named to the NFL Pro Bowl (1957-58), and played on New York Giant teams that played in NFL title games in 1961, 1962 and 1963. He was named to the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1979. Originally a native of Baltimore, Md., Scott now lives in Charlottesville, Va.

Little (1964-66), a three-time All-America for Syracuse under coach Ben Schwartzwalder, still holds the school record for career touchdowns (46) and career punt returns for touchdowns (6). He helped lead the Orange to a three-year 22-10 record, including appearances in the 1965 Sugar Bowl and the 1966 Gator Bowl. Voted the 1966 ECAC Player of the Year, he finished his college career as Syracuse' all-time leading rusher with 2,704 yards and still ranks sixth on the school's career rushing list. The sixth overall selection in the 1967 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos, Little enjoyed a spectacular 9-year NFL career, all with Denver. He rushed for 6,323 yards and 43 touchdowns and led all of American Professional Football in rushing in 1969 and 1971. He was named an American Football League All-Star in 1968 and to the first-team All-AFL team in 1969. He was named to the AFC-NFC Pro Bowl three times in 1970, 1971 and 1973. He was inducted into the National Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1983 and was inducted into the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2010. His jersey, the famed number "44" which was also worn by Jim Brown, Ernie Davis and several others, was retired by Syracuse in 2005. Originally a native of New Haven, Conn., he currently lives in Syracuse and serves as Special Assistant to Syracuse Athletics Director Dr. Daryl Gross.

Majors (1973-76; 1993-96) inherited a Pitt program which had won 23 games in nine years prior to his arrival, including a 1-10 season in 1972. He then guided the Panthers to a four-year record of 33-13-1, including three bowl trips and a perfect 12-0 National Championship campaign in 1976. In two of his four seasons at Pitt he was named National Coach of the Year in 1973 and 1976. He coached or recruited 23 All-Americans in his career including nine at Pitt. An All-America tailback at Tennessee as a player, he was twice named MVP in the SEC, leading the Vols to a perfect 10-0 re-

cord in 1956. After Pitt's national championship season, he returned to his alma mater as head coach in 1977, guiding the Vols to three SEC championships. In 29 years as a head coach at Iowa State, Pittsburgh and Tennessee, Majors posted a 185-137-10 (.572) record. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1987 as a player. Originally a native of Lynchburg, Tenn., he currently lives in Knoxville, Tenn.

Cloud (1995-98) is one of the top running backs in Boston College history. His total of 3,597 rushing yards still ranks third on the BC all-time rushing list. In his senior season of 1998, he set the Eagles single-season rushing record which still stands when he ran for 1,726 yards in just 11 games, an average of 156.9 yards per game, while scoring 14 touchdowns. That year he was named a consensus first-team All-America being selected by both the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and by the Football Coaches. The 54th overall selection in the second round of the 1999 NFL draft, he went on to a seven-year career in the NFL with Kansas City, New England and the New York Giants. Born in Charleston, S.C., he grew up Portsmouth, R.I., and now lives in Rockwell, Texas.

Chesson (1968-70) is a record-setting receiver for the Duke teams of 1968, 1969 and 1970 for Coach Tom Harp. Chesson earned first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1970 after setting ACC single-season records with 74 pass receptions for 1,080 yards. His per-catch average of 6.73 per-game still ranks as the ninth-best single-season mark in ACC history. He ranks fifth on the Duke career receiving list with 2,399 career yards, averaging 14.6 yards per catch on his 164 career catches. His nine 100-yard receiving games were also an ACC record at the time. His 13 pass receptions against Clemson in 1970 is tied for the third-best single-game mark in Duke history. Selected in the seventh round of the 1971 NFL Draft, he played four seasons in the NFL, two each with the Atlanta Falcons and Philadelphia Eagles. He is the principal owner of the Chesson Company, an investment firm in Raleigh, N.C., and has served for over 30 years on the Duke Radio network as color analyst. He will be inducted into the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 11. A native of Edenton, N.C., he currently lives in Raleigh.

Dukes (1982-85), one of the important building blocks of Bobby Bowden's early Florida State programs in the 1980s,

earned consensus All-America honors as a senior offensive guard for Florida State in 1985. He started all 48 games during his four-year career at Florida State, helping lead the Seminoles to a record of 33-13-2 (.708) and appearances in four straight bowl games. Those bowl appearances were the beginning of Florida State's current 31-year consecutive bowl streak. A first-team Freshman All-America in 1982, Dukes earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1983 and second-team All-America accolades in 1984. Though not selected in the 1986 NFL Draft, Duke enjoyed a 10-year career in the National Football League, spending eight seasons with the Atlanta Falcons and one year each with Green Bay and Arizona. In all, he played in 124 professional games, starting 62. After retirement from football, Dukes has enjoyed a successful broadcasting career and joined the NFL Network in 2006 as an analyst on NFL Total Access and NFL GameDay Scoreboard. He is also a regular contributor to NFL.com. Born in Schenectady, N.Y., he played his high school football in Orlando, Fla., and currently lives in Atlanta.

Lavette (1981-84), perhaps the most productive running back in Georgia Tech history, is still the Institute's all-time rushing leader with 4,066 yards. He is one of only five ACC running backs to have topped the 4,000-yard mark and still ranks fourth on the league's all-time rushing list. While playing for the Bill Curry-coached Tech teams of the early 1980s, he topped the 1,000-yard mark in rushing twice, gaining 1,208 yards and scoring a then ACC-record 19 touchdowns in 1982. A versatile performer, Lavette ended his Tech career as the school's leading career rusher, pass receiver (114 catches) and scorer (276 points). At his best in the big games, Lavette contributed greatly to Tech's upsets over No. 1-ranked Alabama in 1981 and 13th-ranked Clemson in 1984. He earned third-team All-America honors in 1984 by the Football News and was a first-team All-ACC selection in 1982 and 1984. Selected in the fourth round of the 1985 NFL draft by the Dallas Cowboys, Lavette played three seasons for the Cowboys and Philadelphia Eagles. A native of Cartersville, Ga., he now resides in Austell, Ga.

James (1996-98), an explosive runner who averaged 6.2 yards per carry throughout his career, is one of the most successful running backs in Miami history. Though he played just three seasons in college, James totaled 2,960 yards and still has the top two

single-game rushing days in schools history. James ran for a school-record 299 yards against UCLA in 1998 and for 271 yards against Boston College in 1997. He is the only running back in school history to have multiple 1,000-yard seasons. James helped Miami compile a 23-12 mark and earn two bowl berths. The fourth overall selection in the 1999 NFL Draft by Indianapolis, he played 11 seasons in the NFL, including his first seven with the Colts. He was named to the NFL's Pro Bowl four times. He was named the 1999 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by the Associated Press and claimed the NFL rushing title in each of his first two seasons in the league. After leaving Indianapolis, he played three seasons with Arizona, helping the Cardinals to Super Bowl XLIII. He completed his professional career with Seattle in 2009 with 12,246 career rushing yards and 80 touchdowns. He was named to the NFL All-Decade team for the 2000s. Originally from Immokalee, Fla., James now resides in Miami.

Willard (1962-64), a hard-running fullback, was one of the mainstays of the North Carolina teams of Jim Hickey in the early 1960s. He was named to the All-ACC teams in 1963 and 1964 and helped the Tar Heels claim a share of the 1963 ACC Championship. That year, he helped lead UNC to a 9-2 record that included a 35-0 win over Air Force in the Gator Bowl. He led North Carolina in rushing in each of his three varsity seasons and still ranks 14th on UNC's career rushing list with 1,949 yards. A two-sport standout in college, he was a stand-out baseball player for the Tar Heels as well. He is also the first North Carolina player to be honored as an Academic All-America. Named a 2nd-team All-America in 1964, he was the second player chosen in the 1965 NFL Draft. He enjoyed a 10-year NFL career,

the first nine with the San Francisco 49ers before closing out his pro career with the then St. Louis Cardinals. He earned selection to the NFL's Pro Bowl four times and played on three 49er teams that won the NFC West title in 1970, 1971 and 1972, and the Cardinals team that won a division title in 1974. Originally from Richmond, Va., he resides in nearby Midlothian, Va.

Dave Buckey (1972-75) and Don Buckey (1972-75), the only identical twins to earn All-ACC football honors, were two of the key performers in the resurgence of NC State football in the early 1970s under Lou Holtz. The pair formed a potent passing combination that complemented the run-oriented split-back Veer offenses of Holtz as the Wolfpack earned four consecutive bowl bids. Dave Buckey was an accurate passer and skilled operator of the Veer offense, while Don was the sure-handed clutch receiver for the Wolfpack. Dave Buckey still holds the career mark for passing yards per attempt, averaging 8.18 yards a throw. Don Buckey had 102 career receptions, averaging 17 yards a catch. They combined to help the Wolfpack post a four-year record of 33-12-3 and claim the 1973 ACC Football title. During this span, State earned trips to two Peach Bowls, the Liberty Bowl and the Bluebonnet Bowl. Both Buckeys were named to the 1975 All-ACC team, with Don also earning first-team All-America honors from the FWAA. Both were selected by the New York Jets, and their former coach Holtz in the 1976 NFL Draft, and taken one right after another: Don at No. 327 and Dave at No. 328. Don played one season with the Jets. Originally natives of Akron, Ohio, they now live in Raleigh.

Davis (1998-2001) was one of the main offensive weapons for the Frank Beamer coached teams at the turn of this century. An explosive receiver and kick returner, he still

holds the Virginia Tech record for most yards per catch in a season, averaging 27.5 yards a reception in 1999 with 35 catches for 962 yards and nine touchdowns as the Hokies reached the 2000 BCS Championship Game in the Sugar Bowl before losing to Florida State. Dangerous in the return game as well, he averaged 15.9 yards on 55 career punt returns, including four for touchdowns. In 2000, he finished ranked 21st nationally in punt return average. During his four seasons in Blacksburg, Davis helped lead the Hokies to a 39-5 record, including 11-1 campaigns in 1999 and 2000, and four consecutive bowl game appearances including the Music City Bowl (1998), the Sugar (1999) and back-to-back trips to the Gator Bowl (2000, 2001). He earned first-team All-America honors by the FWAA in 2000. The 47th overall selection on the second round of the 2001 NFL Draft, Davis went on to enjoy an eight-year NFL career with Cleveland, New England, Buffalo and Houston. Originally from Niskayuna, N.Y., he currently resides in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

Venuto (1979-80) quarterbacked Wake Forest to a dream season in 1979 as the Demon Deacons defeated 12th-ranked Georgia in Athens, 14th-ranked North Carolina in Chapel Hill and 13th-ranked Auburn at home en route to an 8-4 season and a berth in Tangerine Bowl for Coach John Mackovic. That year, Venuto led the ACC in total offense, broke six ACC records including total offense, pass attempts, pass completions, passing yards and total plays, and also set a single-game mark with 28 completions against East Carolina. For his efforts, he was named the ACC's Football Player of the Year. A first-team All-ACC selection in both 1979 and 1980, he led the league in total offense and passing efficiency as a senior. Originally from Salem, N.J., he now lives in Newfield, N.Y.
