12th-Ranked FSU Travels to Arch-Rival Miami Virginia Tech Visits 14th-Ranked Clemson Duke-North Carolina; NC State-Maryland Meet in Key Coastal, Atlantic Tilts

Heading into Week Eight of the Road to Charlotte, four teams in each Division are within one loss of each other...In a bit of a much-too-early Divisional race scenario, the only teams to control their own destiny are Maryland, NC State and Virginia Tech... Should any of those three teams win out they will earn a berth in Charlotte...Of course, there is way too much football remaining to be played in the ACC, beginning with this weekend as the two Atlantic Division teams, NC State and Maryland, that "control their destiny" will meet in College Park, Md., at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPNU)...The Terrapins, the only unbeaten team remaining in conference play, are coached by **Randy Edsall** and feature a defensive unit led by a pair of seniors in **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, that is ranked 9th nationally in both rushing and total defense...The Wolfpack, coached by **Tom O'Brien**, are led by senior **QB Mike Glennon**, who is 3rd in the ACC in passing yards per game with a 280.2 average...The Terrapins and Wolfpack are meeting for the 69th time in a rivalry which began in 1909 and is the ACC's 8th longest continuous series...In Miami Gardens, Fla., another intense rivalry takes place for the 57th time when Miami hosts 12th-ranked Florida State at Sun Life

Stadium (8 pm, ABC)...The Hurricanes of coach **Al Golden** lead the Coastal Division by a half game, while the Seminoles of coach **Jimbo Fisher** are one of three one-loss teams behind Maryland in the Atlantic Division...Miami is led by junior **QB Stephen Morris**, who is 2nd in the ACC in passing and total yards, while FSU counters with senior **QB EJ Manuel**, who is 4th nationally in pass efficiency...In Clemson, S.C., the 14th-ranked Clemson Tigers of coach **Dabo Swinney** host Virginia Tech, coached by **Frank Beamer**, in a rematch of the 2011 ACC title game, this time at Memorial Stadium (3:30 pm, ABC/ESPN2) ...Both teams can ill afford another league loss as they look to keep pace in the race for Charlotte...Clemson is led by junior **QB Tajh Boyd**, who is 11th nationally in total offense, and junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins**, who is 3rd nationally in receiving yards per game...The Hokies counter with junior **QB Logan Thomas** and senior **WR Marcus Davis**, who is averaging 21.7 yards per catch...In Durham, N.C., Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and North Carolina, led by coach **Larry Fedora**, will meet in an important Coastal Division contest at Wallace Wade Stadium (7 pm, ESPNU)...The Blue Devils and Tar Heels are two of the four Coastal Divi-

sion teams with just one league loss...Saturday's meeting will be the 99th meeting between the arch-rivals...UNC is led by sophomore **RB Giovani Bernard**, who has run for 439 yards and 2 TDs in the last two weeks, with senior **WR Conner Vernon**, the ACC's all-time leading receiver (243 career catches), heading the Blue Devils...In Atlanta, Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, hosts Boston College, coached by **Frank Spaziani**, at Bobby Dodd Stadium (3 p.m., RSN)... The Yellow Jackets will be playing their first game with new defensive coordinator **Charles Kelly** and are led by senior **QB Tevin Washington**, who is 2nd nationally in scoring; while the Eagles will be led by junior **WR Alex Amidon**, who is 8th nationally in receiving yards per game... Both teams are looking to get back on the winning track as are Wake Forest and Virginia, who meet this Saturday at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...The Demon Deacons of coach **Jim Grobe** are led by junior **QB Tanner Price**, while coach **Mike London's** Cavaliers feature an offense led by the RB tandem of senior **Perry Jones** and sophomore **Kevin Parks**, who have combined for 793 rushing yards and 5 TDs.

National Football Hall of Fame To Induct Miami's Jimmy Johnson



Atlantic Coast Conference schools will have one inductee this year at the annual National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annual banquet in New York City. Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

Johnson coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been

selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

.866 - The winning percentage for Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** against ACC opponents at Clemson's Memorial Stadium. Swinney's Tiger teams have captured 13 of the 15 ACC home games at "Death Valley" during his tenure.

1 - Virginia Tech sophomore **S Kyshoen Jarrett** leads the ACC and the nation this week in punt return average. Jarrett is averaging 20.2 yards per punt return. Two other ACC players rank among the top 6th nationally in punt return average including Duke Lee Butler (5th, 17.0) and Florida State's Rashad Greene (6th, 16.8).

1.83 - The average number of tackles for loss this year for Maryland All-America **DE Joe Vellano**. Vellano, who leads a Terrapin defense ranked 9th nationally against the run and 9th in total defense, leads the ACC and is 13th nationally in TFLs per game.

2 - The number of years since **Duke** and **North Carolina** have met in football with identical, five-win records. The teams were each 5-3 when they met in Durham in 2010.

3 - The number of times **Virginia Tech** and **Clemson** have faced each other in little more than 12 months time. The two teams met in Blacksburg, Va., last Oct. 1; in the 2011 ACC Championship Game on Dec. 3 and this Saturday, which is Oct. 20.

5 - The number of ACC quarterbacks named to the candidate list for the 2012 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the most of any conference nationally. The ACC had one-third of those named. Representing the Conference on the Unitas list are **Tajh Boyd**, Clemson; **EJ Manuel**, Florida State; **Bryn Renner**, North Carolina; **Mike Glennon**, NC State and **Logan Thomas**, Virginia Tech.

7 - Duke junior **CB Ross Cockrell** is tied for 7th nationally in passes defended. Cockrell leads the ACC with 4 interceptions and 9 pass breakups for a total of 13 passes defended in seven games, an average of 1.86 per game.

9 - Duke freshman **P Will Monday** leads the ACC and ranks 9th nationally this week in punting average. Monday is averaging 45.89 yards per punt and has dropped 11 of his 37 punts inside of Duke's opponent's 20-yard line.

10.05 - The per-carry average for Georgia Tech A-Back **Orwin Smith** throughout his career. If maintained for the rest of this season, it will be an ACC record for 1,000 or more career rushing yards. Smith, from Phenix City, Ala., has 151 carries for 1,519 yards in his career, a 10.05 average, including an 11.3 per-carry norm this year.

16 - The number of career interceptions for NC State junior **CB David Amerson**, who led the nation in interceptions last year. Amerson

leads the nation among active players in career interceptions and is tied for 9th on the ACC career list. Clemson's Rashard Hall, who has 13 career picks, is tied for 4th nationally among active players.

19 - Clemson **PK Chandler Catanzaro** has made 19 consecutive field goals, a streak which began in the 2011 season. He broke the Clemson school record of 14, set by Obed Arriri, in 1980, with a 50-yarder on Sept. 22 against Florida State. The ACC record is 27 straight set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Catanzaro is now 47-60 over his career, a .783 percentage and has made all 11 of his field goal attempts this year. His streak ties UNC's Connor Barth for the 4th-longest in ACC history.

20 - In his four-plus seasons leading the Duke football program, **David Cutcliffe** has guided the Blue Devils to 20 victories. That's one more win than the Duke football program managed in 12 full years prior to Cutcliffe's arrival in Durham.

23 - The number of times **ACC teams** have topped the 500-yard mark in total offense this season through the first seven weeks of this year. In all of the 2011 season, conference teams only topped the 500-yard mark a total of 15 times.

31 - The number of career rushing touchdowns for Georgia Tech senior **QB Tevin Washington**. This year, Washington ranks 2nd nationally in points per game (13.33) and is 2nd on the ACC career list in career TDs for a QB, trailing only former ACC standout Joshua Nesbitt of Georgia Tech (35).

51 - The number of career touchdown passes for Clemson junior **QB Tajh Boyd** in a year and a half as the Tigers' starting quarterback. Boyd is 18th on the ACC's career list and is 11th among active quarterbacks in the NCAA's FBS.

67.7 - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 469 of 693 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .677. If maintained for the rest of this year, that would be the best in ACC history. Virginia's Matt Schaub (.670) and Wake Forest's Riley Skinner (.669) are currently 1-2 on the career list.

99 - Saturday's meeting between arch-rivals **North Carolina** and **Duke** will be the 99th meeting between the two teams in football. UNC leads the series with a 56-35-4 record which obviously does not equal 98 games. Both Duke and UNC claim the 1889 contest in Durham and the game is not included in the series total by the ACC. The Tar Heels also vacated wins in 2008 and 2009, which do not appear in the series record. The series is the 5th most-played among ACC teams topped

only by UNC-UVa (106), NC State-Wake Forest (105), UNC-Wake Forest (103) and UNC-NC State (101).

103 - The actual number of yards for Maryland true freshman **Stefon Diggs'** kickoff return on the opening kickoff of Maryland's 27-20 win over Virginia. The return goes into the record books as 100-yards, but Diggs was at least three yards deep in his own end zone when he fielded the ball. Diggs ranks 4th nationally in kickoff return average (33.3) and 9th in all-purpose yardage (168.8).

129.50 - The receiving yards average for Clemson junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins**, who is averaging 129.5 yards a game and ranks 3rd nationally. Hopkins also ranks 7th nationally (8.17) in receptions per game.

243 - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon became the ACC's all-time career-leading receiver on Oct. 6 against Virginia. He has shattered the old mark of 232 catches set by Clemson's Aaron Kelly during the 2005-2008 seasons. His career total of 3,300 receiving yards puts him in 4th place on the ACC career list. He needs 218 receiving yards to set a new standard, currently held by FSU's Peter Warrick (3,517).

255 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 255 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. With the Hokies' win over Duke Saturday, Beamer tied former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne for 7th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list.

439 - The total rushing yards the last two weeks for North Carolina sophomore **TB Giovani Bernard**. That includes a 262-yard effort against Virginia Tech on Oct. 6 that was the 11th-best in the 60-year history of the ACC and the most ever by a back against a Frank Beamer coached Tech team. It was also the 5th-best mark by a UNC running back since the school began play in the conference in 1953. Bernard then ran for 177 yards in the Tar Heels' win over Miami last week. For the year, he is averaging 8.3 yards per carry. Ironically, Bernard does not appear in the ACC or NCAA stats this week as he has not yet appeared in the NCAA minimum standard of 75% of UNC's games playing in just 5 of 7 contests

402 - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** shattered the ACC and Florida State career scoring records last weekend with a 15-point performance against Boston College. That gives him 402 points for his career, outdistancing the records of 393 points set by Maryland's Nick Novak (ACC, 2001-04) and Derek Schmidt. Hopkins, who also has 75 field goals, five short of the ACC standard set by Novak, moved into 8th place on the NCAA list for points by kicking. The NCAA scoring mark is 439 points set by Boise State's Kyle Brotzman during the 2007-10 seasons.

2012 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 13

#12/11 Florida State 51, Boston College 7

PK Dustin Hopkins became the all-time leading scorer in both Atlantic Coast Conference and Florida State history as the Seminoles (6-1 overall, 3-1 ACC) rolled to victory over the visiting Eagles (1-5, 0-3). Hopkins kicked three field goals and six extra points in Saturday night's win, giving him 402 points for his career. Hopkins surpassed former Seminole PK Derek Schmidt (393 points) for the school scoring record and passed former Maryland PK Nick Novak (393 points) for the ACC career scoring record. Hopkins is now in 8th place on the NCAA's career points-by-kicking list. FSU QB EJ Manuel finished the game 27-of-34 for a career-high 439 yards with a career-high four touchdowns and two interceptions. Boston College's lone touchdown came late in the second quarter, when QB Chase Rettig found WR Bobby Swigert with an 18-yard scoring pass. Eagles RB Andre Williams led all rushers with 104 yards on 20 carries.

Virginia Tech 41, Duke 20

The Hokies (4-3, 2-1) spotted the visiting Blue Devils a 20-0 lead in the first quarter before storming back with 41 unanswered points. The comeback marked the largest by the Hokies under Tech head coach Frank Beamer, and with it, Tech snapped a two-game losing streak. Duke – which lost to the Hokies for the 12th straight time, including nine straight since Tech joined the ACC – fell to 5-2 overall, 2-1 in league play. Virginia Tech freshman RB J.C. Coleman, in his first collegiate start, rushed for 183 yards and two touchdowns. The win also marked the 255th by Beamer as a head coach, tying him with former Nebraska coach Tom Osborne for seventh place on the all-time list. He needs just three more victories to move past former BYU coach LaVell Edwards into sixth place. Duke scored on its first three possessions, taking a 13-0 lead after back-to-back possessions ended with field goals by PK Ross Martin. S Jordon Byas then returned an interception 20 yards for a touchdown with 3:12 left in the first quarter for the Blue Devils' early 20-0 lead. Duke's 20 first-quarter points were the second-most allowed in the first quarter by a Beamer-coached team. The Hokies had never won a game under Beamer when giving up 15 points or more in the first quarter.

North Carolina 18, Miami 14

Tar Heel RB Giovani Bernard, playing just a few miles from his hometown of Davie, Fla., put on an impressive show by rushing for 177 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Tar Heels (5-2, 2-1) to their first road win of the season. Bernard had first-half scoring runs of 10 and 17 yards and gained 105 of his 177 yards after halftime for UNC, which has won four straight and two in a row against ACC Coastal Division opponents. UNC ran a season-high 84 plays from scrimmage and amassed 486 yards of total offense, coming just shy of gaining 500 yards for the third week in a row. Miami RB Mike James had career-bests of 22 carries and 96 yards for the Hurricanes, and he scored Miami's first touchdown on a 1-yard run. QB Stephen Morris scored the Hurricanes' second touchdown from 5 yards out in the third quarter, but suffered an ankle injury and had to leave the game with 8:26 to play. Bernard's big afternoon helped the Tar Heels overcome 15 penalties. The outcome left the Coastal Division standings logjammed, as UNC, Miami, Duke and Virginia Tech each currently have one loss in ACC play.

Maryland 27, Virginia 20

Freshman WR Stefon Diggs returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and freshman QB Perry Hills threw for one TD and ran for another as visiting Maryland defeated Virginia. Maryland improved to 4-2 overall and 2-0 in the ACC with the win, while Virginia dropped to 2-5 and 0-3 in the league. The road team has won six of the last seven games in the series. Diggs had just the fourth 100-yard kickoff return for a TD in Maryland school history and the first since Josh Wilson had one in 2006. Diggs' return helped Maryland jump out to an early 17-point lead. That proved too much for Virginia to overcome, despite moving the ball well at times and rallying behind backup QB Michael Rocco. Rocco came on in relief of a struggling Phillip Sims in the fourth quarter with the Cavaliers down 27-13 and promptly directed a 10-play, 81-yard drive. His 24-yard touchdown pass to Jake McGee pulled Virginia within 27-20 with 4:10 left. But Maryland, which ranks ninth nationally in total defense, halted the Cavaliers from there as the Terps posted their second straight ACC win.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

2012 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No.1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocate V100 Independence Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C.

Conditional Agreement*

8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

*If Pac-12 or Navy is unable to fill obligation and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt or Western Athletic conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is

Playoff Coming In 2014-15

On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

Bill Hancock, Executive Director

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Georgia Tech and Miami ended regulation tied at 36-36, it marked the 60th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 60 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 60 overtime contests, 30 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-19 advantage in the 53 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-28 record. Forty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
