VIRGINIA-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

- Virginia leads the series with Virginia Tech, 82-72.
- Virginia has won 12 straight in the series (including all 10 ACC games) dating to its last loss on April 16, 2003, in Blacksburg.
- The Cavaliers swept a three-game series at home against Virginia Tech last season (10-1, 9-2, 2-1).

CAVALIERS PLAYING WELL VS. IN-STATE FOES

- Virginia is 7-0 this year against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- Under the current coaching staff (since 2004), the Cavaliers have a 56-6 record against foes from Virginia.

AMONG A CHOICE FEW

- The Cavaliers are one of just eight teams in the nation to boast 38 or more wins this season.
- Coastal Carolina, North Carolina and LSU (39) are the only teams to have more wins than Virginia.
- UVa is tied with Arizona State, East Carolina, George Mason and Kansas State with 38 victories.

GETTING IT DONE ON CHAMPIONSHIP SUNDAY

- Virginia has piled up five straight ACC series wins or ties.
- It is the first time UVa has done so since 2007 when the Cavaliers won or tied seven straight ACC series.
- It is the third-longest streak of ACC series wins/ties under Brian O'Connor since 2004. UVa won six straight series in 2006.

THE HOMERS KEEP COMING

- Virginia has hit 45 home runs this year, nearly doubling its total from the entire 2008 season (25 in 62 games).
- It is the most home runs of any UVa team in the Brian O'Connor coaching era (since 2004); the previous high was 35 in 2005.
- Seven Cavaliers have at least three homers this year – only three players had at least three in 2008.

GRAND SLAMS KEEP COMING TOO

- Jarrett Parker's grand slam Sunday was the Cavaliers' fourth this season.
- UVa had four grand slams in the previous four seasons combined.

- Andrew Carraway has moved into eighth place in career strikeouts at Uva (215). He needs 14 to move into a tie for seventh place.
- He ranks second in career winning percentage at Uva (16-3 record, .842 pct.).
- He also has made 67 career appearances and will move into a tie for eighth Friday.

HULTZEN ZEROES IN ON UVA FRESHMAN K RECORD

- Danny Hultzen (76) needs one strikeout to match the Virginia freshman record for strikeouts in a season.
- Jacob Thompson posted 77 strikeouts in 2006.

HICKS BECOMES JACK OF ALL TRADES

- John Hicks made his first career appearance in left field on Sunday. He played first base, catcher and left field in his three starts last weekend.
- Hicks has made 20 starts at catcher, 13 at first, nine at DH and one in left field.

FRESHMEN DIG THE LONG BALL

- Uva freshmen Steven Proscia and John Hicks each have been key figures in the Cavaliers' power surge this year.
- Proscia has seven homers, while Hicks has five.
- Proscia's seven homers are the most by a Cavalier freshman since Sean Doolittle swatted 11 in 2005.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

- Jarrett Parker is having a monster season.
- Just 49 games into the season, he ranks among the top 10 in Uva single-season history in the following categories:

Runs67 – 1st
 Doubles18 – T8th
 Triples5 – T6th
 Home runs14 – T5th
 Total bases144 – 3rd

- He is just shy of the top 10 in hits (74), RBI (55) and stolen bases (18).

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO PUT UP NUMBERS

- In 49 games, Virginia has already topped its 2008 total in runs (414), triples (20) and home runs (45).
- UVA scored 384 runs and hit 18 triples and 25 home runs last year (62 games).

GROVATT STRONG ON WEEKENDS

- Dan Grovatt has a team-best .396 batting average in ACC games this year (fifth-best in conference).
- His three home runs and four of his five doubles have come in ACC play.
- He also has 29 RBI in league play – tied for fifth in the conference.

CAVALIERS KEEP IT UP IN ACC PLAY

- Virginia, which leads the league in batting (.338) and pitching (3.22), also paces the conference in batting in ACC games only. UVA is hitting .332 in ACC contests.
- In contrast, UVA hit just .260 in ACC games last season.
- UVA also is third in ERA in ACC games only with a 4.61 mark (UNC leads at 4.30).

CLOSE TO THE VEST IN ACC PLAY

- Fifteen of UVA's last 20 ACC games have been decided by three runs or fewer.
- Six of UVA's nine ACC losses have come by one run, with one coming by two and another by three.

DEFENSE COMES THROUGH

- The Cavaliers have a .972 fielding percentage, which is second in the ACC (Duke - .976).
- In ACC games, that mark is even higher – UVA has a .976 fielding percentage, tied with BC and trailing only Duke (.979).

UNDERCLASSMEN PUT UP BIG NUMBERS

- UVA's offense has been dominated by the freshmen and sophomores.
- In all, 83 percent (492 total) of the Cavaliers' hits this year have come from underclassmen (94 from upperclassmen).
- Freshmen and sophomores also account for 83 percent of the team's runs and RBI.

CAVALIERS CRACK TOP 10 IN THE RPI

- Virginia is 10th in the latest RPI ratings, released last Tuesday by the NCAA.
- The Cavaliers are up from No. 12 the previous week.

UVA GETS EARLY JUMP ON FOES

- Virginia has scored first in 34 of its 49 games, including 17 of the 25 ACC games.
- UVA is 12-4-1 when scoring first in ACC games and 29-4-1 overall.
- The Cavaliers have combined to outscore their opponents 148-54 in the first three innings this season.

HOOS HAVE TOP K:BB RATIO IN ACC, SIXTH BEST OVERALL

- Virginia pitchers currently have the best strikeout to walk ratio in the ACC and the sixth-best in the nation (2.92:1).
- The Cavaliers have allowed the fewest walks (149) in the ACC and boast the fourth-most strikeouts (438).

RAIN RAIN GO AWAY

- Rain and poor weather have been main adversaries of the Cavaliers this year.
- UVA has lost five games to weather this year, including two games with then-No. 14 Florida State and one game against then-No. 19 Coastal Carolina.
- The Cavaliers also have had five games delayed by rain.
- Including the Saturday Duke game, Virginia has altered seven game times in order to get in games (not including cancelled games).

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVA's lead-off hitter.
- He is second in the ACC with 67 runs scored and has scored at least one run in 37 of 49 games (75.5 percent)
- Parker ranks fifth in the ACC in batting (.383). He leads the ACC in triples (5) is second in total bases (144) and is seventh with 74 hits.

PARKER SPRINTS PAST RUNS RECORD

- Jarrett Parker scored his 61st run of the season April 26, breaking the previous record of 60. It took Parker 44 games to break the mark.
- The record was held by two former players, Mark Reynolds (2004) and David Guy (1988).
- Reynolds needed 59 games to score 58 times, and it took Guy 49 games.

LEADING OFF WITH A BANG

- Jarrett Parker has hit four home runs to lead off games this season – UVa had not had a leadoff homer in the four previous years.
- Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.
- Parker also has hit leadoff home runs against Delaware, North Carolina and Maryland.

PITCHING AT TOP OF ACC HEAP

- The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (3.22) in the conference thus far.
- Clemson is second with a 3.50 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered 370 hits (7.5/game) this year.
- Opponents are batting an ACC-low .231 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

- Virginia leads the ACC with 99 stolen bases.
- That total ranks 20th nationally.
- UVa has been caught stealing just 21 times.
- NC State (105) is the only ACC team which has attempted more stolen bases than UVa has stolen.
- Four Wahoos ranks among the top 10 in the ACC in steals – Phil Gosselin (third, 19), Jarrett Parker (fourth, 18), Tyler Cannon (sixth, 16) and Dan Grovatt (10th, 13).
- Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

- In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.
- He ranks first among ACC freshmen and 20th overall with a .346 batting average.
- Proscia is third in the ACC with 17 doubles.

OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

- In the NCAA's latest rankings (5/10), Virginia ranked 15th nationally in team batting average (.341 entering the week). Eastern Illinois leads at .366.
- The Cavaliers also are 28th in hits (585) and 17th in triples (20).

PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

- Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (3.26 as of 5/10). Only Texas (2.66) and Arizona State (2.89) were better.
- UVa also stands first in hits allowed per nine innings (7.66) and 14th in strikeouts per nine innings (9.1).

HULTZEN ANCHORS PITCHING STAFF

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has gone 6-1 with a 2.39 ERA in 11 starts. His ERA ranks second in the ACC.
- In 64.0 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 76 batters – fourth-most in the ACC and one shy of the UVa freshman record.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a pair of nine-strikeout games (at Wake Forest, vs. NC State).

CARRAWAY NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

- Andrew Carraway has been named to the 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Baseball Team. Carraway was a first-team selection on the District 3 First Team.
- District 3 consists of schools from Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia.
- It marks the second straight year that he has earned the honor. He will now be on the ballot for the Academic All-America award.

EVERYONE HITS!

- Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.
- In 49 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 25 times.
- UVa's high in one inning this year is 13 batters, set March 31 against Radford.
- UVa scored a season-high nine runs in the second inning vs. Radford.

O'CONNOR BECOMES THIRD-FASTEST TO 250

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor has 254 career wins in his six seasons at Virginia (354 games total).
- With his 250th career win April 25 vs. NC State (348th career game), he became the third-fastest to reach 250 wins in ACC history.
- Only Clemson's Jack Leggett (338 games) and FSU's Mike Martin (343 - since joining ACC) reached 250 wins faster.
- O'Connor is 254-99-1 (.716) at Virginia.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa had a brutal ACC stretch in March, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- It started when the Cavaliers played host to Florida State. Miami then came to Charlottesville before Virginia traveled to North Carolina. UVa went 3-4 in that stretch (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. UNC). Three of the four losses were by one run, the other by two.
- Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss March 21 to Miami.
- UVa was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers also started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY

- The Cavaliers' 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth-longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
