VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia is competing in its 15th NCAA tournament, including its 12th straight trip to the Big Dance.
- UVa is 42-32 in the tournament, including 30-16 over the last six seasons.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVa is 36-26 in the NCAA tourney.
- UVa owns five regional championships – all in the last six seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014) – and advanced to the College World Series in 2009, 2011 and 2014, taking runner-up honors to Vanderbilt in the 2014 CWS Finals.

FIRST ROAD REGIONAL SINCE 2009

- Virginia is hitting the road for an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2009.
- UVa swept through the Irvine Regional in 2009 for its first-ever regional championship, defeating San Diego State (and ace pitcher Stephen Strasburg) before twice beating sixth-seeded UC Irvine.
- UVa's last three regionals on the road all have come in the state of California (2008 Fullerton, 2009 Irvine).
- UVa had hosted five straight regionals prior this season, joining South Carolina as the only schools to host regionals each of the previous five years.
- Virginia is 10-10 while on the road for a regional (1972, 1985, 1996, 2005, 2008, 2009).

VIRGINIA ONE OF SIX SCHOOLS IN LAST 12 NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of six Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last 12 seasons (including 2015).
- The Cavaliers are one of three teams in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State and Miami.

- Virginia is making its third trip to California (all in the NCAA tournament).
- Since Nathan Kirby went down on April 17, UVa's weekend starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 2.86 ERA and averaging 6 1/3 IP per start.
- UVa catchers have thrown out 37.3 percent of potential base stealers (third in ACC).
- UVa owns 23 road/neutral wins (8th in D-I).
- UVa played 21 home games this year (fewest since 1984).

VIRGINIA AGAINST THE 2015 NCAA FIELD

- Virginia faced seven teams this year that advanced to the NCAA tournament (East Carolina, Florida State, Louisville, Miami, NC State, Notre Dame, VCU).
- Twenty-two of Virginia's 56 games were against NCAA qualifiers – UVa went 11-11 against those teams.

NEW FOES DOT THE REGIONAL FIELD

- Virginia has played just one game previously against the NCAA Lake Elsinore Regional field.
- UVa played San Diego State in the opening game of the 2009 Irvine Regional (May 29), downing the Aztecs and Stephen Strasburg, 5-1.

- UVa has not played USC or UCSB previously.
- The Cavaliers' lone games in the state of California all came during their NCAA tournament games in 2008 and 2009 (4-2 record).

UVa BOASTS NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

- Virginia's position players have combined for 59 games of NCAA tournament experience.
- Kenny Towns has played in 20 tournament games over the last three seasons. He batted .340 (18-for-53) with 10 RBI during a dozen tourney games last year.
- Joe McCarthy has started each of UVa's 17 tournament games over the last two years, while Daniel Pinero started all 12 NCAA games at shortstop in 2014.

KEY NCAA EXPERIENCE ALSO RETURNS ON MOUND

- Virginia has some solid NCAA tournament experience returning from its pitching staff as well. Six pitchers have earned time on the mound in NCAA play.
- Brandon Waddell has made six NCAA tournament starts, covering 38 2/3 innings (4-1 record). He fired a complete game in UVa's Game 2 win in the CWS Finals against Vanderbilt.
- Josh Sborz has pitched in six NCAA tournament games during the last two years, making three starts. He worked seven innings of one-run ball in the super regional final vs. Maryland to send the Cavaliers to Omaha.
- Nathan Kirby has pitched in five tournament games and made four starts, working 22 2/3 innings.

SIX CAVALIERS EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

- Six Cavaliers were named to the 2015 All-ACC Team.
- Nathan Kirby (starting pitcher) was named to the first team, while Daniel Pinero (SS), Josh Sborz (relief pitcher) and Kenny Towns (3B) were tabbed on the second team.
- Adam Haseley and Pavin Smith each were named to the ACC All-Freshman Team.

ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Virginia went 1-3 in the ACC Baseball Championship last week at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in Durham, N.C.
- The Cavaliers run-ruled Georgia Tech, 11-0 in seven innings, in the play-in game before dropping three straight games to Miami, Notre Dame and NC State.
- UVa held a three-run lead in the eighth inning against Miami and was tied in the eighth against NC State before dropping both contests.
- Josh Sborz took a perfect game into the seventh inning against Georgia Tech before the leadoff batter doubled in the seventh; he settled for a 1-hitter.
- UVa's starting pitching was strong. The Cavaliers' starters allowed 15 hits and limited opponents to a .172 batting average over 25 innings.
- Robbie Coman and Daniel Pinero each went 5-for-12, while Pavin Smith had a team-high six hits.

TOWNS STEPS UP TO MAN CLEANUP SPOT

- Senior Kenny Towns is in the midst of his best season at Virginia.
- Out of the cleanup spot, Towns is batting .308 and owns 55 RBI (sixth in the ACC); he also leads the team in doubles (18) and is tied for second in hits (68).
- He has set career highs in hits, RBI, doubles and walks.
- His streak of reaching base safely in 36 straight games came to an end in the first game of the March 7 double-header against Pitt; it ranked fourth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players at the time.

COMAN SOLID AT PLATE SINCE RETURN

- Robbie Coman is batting .387 (36-for-93) over his last 24 games since returning after taking a BP grounder to the face and missing one game.
- He has a .431 on-base percentage in that span (second on team) and hits in 19 of the 24 games.
- Coman has raised his batting average more than 100 points in that stretch – he was batting .208 heading into the Georgia Tech series and now is hitting a season-high .309.
- He started 21 straight games behind the plate before shifting to first base last Saturday against NC State.

THAISS CONTINUES STRONG SEASON

- Matt Thaiss has had a breakout season and leads the team in batting at .324 (14th in ACC).
- He recently was named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy (nation's top player).
- Thaiss has blasted a team-high nine home runs (14th in the ACC) and also leads the team in slugging (.529) percentage and ranks second in OBP (.413).
- Thaiss batted .321 in ACC games (second on team, 18th in ACC).
- He was tabbed the ACC Player of the Week on April 27 after going 11-for-23 (.478) with four doubles, a homer and 11 RBI in five games from April 21-26.

PLAYING IT CLOSE

- Fourteen of Virginia's 22 defeats have come by two runs or fewer, including seven games by one run. UVa was 6-10 in ACC games decided by two runs or fewer.
- UVa's last six regular-season losses all were by two runs or fewer.

FRESHMEN A MAINSTAY IN LINEUP

- Virginia has put at least four freshmen in 46 of the 56 starting lineups this year, including eight games with five rookies and three contests with six.
- Adam Haseley (RF/CF) and Pavin Smith (1B/LF) have started every game.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in eight games.
- Fourteen of UVa's 30 players are freshmen.

CLOSER? STARTER? SBORZ HAS THRIVED AT BOTH

- For most of the season, Josh Sborz has filled the Cavaliers' closer role, but recent injuries have prompted him to make three starts.
- Sborz has recorded an ACC-best 12 saves and is limiting opponents to a .172 batting average
- He was named to the Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List.
- In his three starts, he has allowed three runs in 20 innings (1.35 ERA).
- Sborz went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- With the crazy weather year, Virginia has spent plenty of time away from home.
- Owning 23 road/neutral victories, the Cavaliers have the eighth-most road/neutral wins of teams in Division I baseball and the most in the ACC.

- Missouri State has 29 road/neutral wins to lead the nation.

INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup as injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- The Cavaliers have trotted out 30 different starting lineups in 56 games.
- Kenny Towns (3B) is the lone Cavalier to start every game at the same position, while freshmen Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley also have started every game.

THE WALKING WOUNDED

- Virginia position players have combined to miss 140 games this season because of injuries.
- Three returning starters have missed significant time:
 - OF Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and missed 11 weeks (35 games) prior to his return April 15.
 - C Robbie Coman injured his knee on Feb. 21 and missed eight games. He missed the April 1 game vs. VMI after taking a grounder to the eye in batting practice.
 - INF/OF John La Prise is out for the season with a hip injury that limited him to four games early this season.
- 2B/OF Ernie Clement missed seven games in April with a hamstring injury.
- Matt Thaiss suffered an ankle injury April 12 but missed only one game. Daniel Pinero was hit in the chin with a pitch April 21 and missed the next game.
- INF Jack Gerstenmaier (hamstring) made his season debut April 15 after undergoing hamstring surgery in late September (missed 35 games).

KIRBY, CASEY SIDELINED BY INJURIES

- In addition to the position player injuries, starting pitchers Nathan Kirby and Derek Casey each have gone down recently with injuries.
- A 2014 First-Team All-American and ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year, Kirby exited after three innings April 17 against Miami with a strained left lat muscle and will miss approximately 6-8 weeks.
- Casey left after 2 2/3 innings in his April 21 start against Longwood with an undisclosed injury. He will not pitch again this season.
- Pitcher Riley Wilson (shoulder) also has been sidelined and has not played this season.

MCCARTHY RETURN KEY TO LINEUP

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy has been a big addition to the UVa lineup since returning April 15 after missing 11 weeks following back surgery on Jan. 29.
- UVa is 13-8 in that span, including ACC series wins over Miami, Duke and North Carolina.
- McCarthy has started all 21 games since returning.
- He reached base in nine of his 14 plate appearances in the series against North Carolina.

- A two-time All-ACC selection, McCarthy now has reached base safely in 139 of his 150 career games, including 17 of 21 this season.

JONES SETTLES INTO NO. 1 ROLE

- In his first season in the UVa rotation, Connor Jones has been solid, with a 5-2 record and 3.05 ERA.
- In 88 2/3 innings, Jones is limiting opponents to a .225 batting average, but he has walked 41 batters.
- He has worked at least seven innings and struck out seven or more in each of his last five starts, with four of the five games coming against teams that advanced to the NCAA tournament.
- He has worked five innings or more in 13 of his 14 starts.

DOHERTY GIVES CAVALIERS ANOTHER OPTION

- Junior Kevin Doherty has given Virginia a boost this season, both on the mound and at the plate.
- He has been one of UVa's top left-handed options out of the bullpen, pitching in 19 games, which is third most on the team (3-1, 3.29 ERA, 3 saves, 41 IP, 34 K, .177 BAA).
- Doherty also has stepped into a role at the plate this year. He has batted in 32 games, including 29 starts.
- He has reached base safely in 25 of his 32 games this season and is batting .229 with 17 RBI.

VETERAN WADDELL SLATED FOR SEVENTH NCAA START

- Brandon Waddell has been a consistent presence in UVa's rotation in his three seasons.
- Waddell's next start will be his 49th career start. That will tie for the second most in program history.
- It also will be his 10th career postseason start, including his seventh NCAA start. He has made the second-most NCAA tournament starts at UVa (Danny Hultzen, 10).
- He ranks third at UVa in NCAA wins (4), innings (38 2/3) and strikeouts (25).
- With his start at UNC, he made his 39th straight regular-season weekend start, dating to opening day in 2013.
- Waddell has an 19-11 career record and needs one win to reach the top 10 in UVa history.
- He ranks seventh in program history with 278 1/3 career innings and with two innings will match sixth-place Pat Daneker (1995-97).
- The veteran graduated in just three years from UVa last on May 16 with a degree in economics.

FRESHMEN PROVIDE BOOST

- Virginia's freshmen have played a key role this year.
- UVa's first-year players have combined to record 46.2 percent of the position player starts and 47 percent of the at bats.
- The first-years also are responsible for 43 percent of the hits and runs scored.

WALKS WILL HAUNT

- Virginia's pitching staff has been plagued at times by walks this year. UVa has walked six or more batters in 16 games (UVa is 4-12 in those games).
- UVa walked 34 batters in the three-game series with Florida State and 22 in the series at Georgia Tech.
- Those two series featured the most walks in a three-game series during Brian O'Connor's tenure – the previous high was 21 in a 2007 series vs NC State.
- UVa has walked 241 batters this year – most of any UVa team under the current staff (214 in 2010).
- UVa ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03 last year and was tops in the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).

WEATHER WREAKS HAVOC ON HOME SCHEDULE

- Inclement weather has forced UVa to postpone or cancel four midweek games and relocate three weekend series.
- In all, Virginia has had 14 home games altered because of inclement weather.
- UVa was forced to shift its series with Marist (Feb. 20-22) to Charleston, S.C., and its round-robin tournament with Hartford and Seton Hall to Myrtle Beach.
- UVa played its first home game March 11 (but not until after a two-hour rain delay). UVa's midweek games with VCU, GW and Radford were cancelled.

LA PRISE OUT FOR SEASON

- Virginia INF/OF John La Prise had hip surgery on April 1 and will miss the remainder of the season.
- His scheduled recovery period is approximately six months.

- La Prise was slated to be the Cavaliers' starting center fielder heading into the year but played in just four games early this season while battling the injury.
- La Prise batted .348 with 10 doubles and 17 RBI in 2014. He was fifth on the team with 62 hits and had the second-most hits of any returning Cavalier this year.

CAVALIERS ADD PAIR FROM CLUB TEAM

- With injuries causing some major depth issues early this season, Virginia added a pair of players to the roster. Both were members of the UVa club team.
- Catcher Ben Cassillo, a freshman, is wearing No. 41, while senior infielder Kevin Radford sports No. 5.
- Cassillo is a native of Latham, N.Y., while Radford hails from Norfolk, Va. (Maury HS).

UVA STARTS SEASON 10-0 FOR FOURTH TIME

- Virginia recorded a 10-0 start for the fourth time in program history – all during Brian O'Connor's 12 seasons as head coach. All 10 games were away from home (three road, seven neutral).
- UVa won 19 consecutive games to begin the 2009 season. That remains the longest win streak at any point in program history.
- UVa won 11 straight to open the 2008 season and 14 straight to begin the 2013 campaign.
- The Cavaliers were one of the last two unbeaten teams in the nation, joining Texas A&M.

CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Feb. 22 in Charleston, S.C. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.
- It is believed to be the second-longest game by time (5:08), behind the 2006 CofC game, which lasted 5:19.
- Virginia shut out Marist over the final 11 innings.
- Freshman Christian Lowry's first college hit, a one-out single in the 18th, scored Matt Thaiss with the winning run.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

CLOSER SUCCESS AT VIRGINIA

- Josh Sborz took over the closer role this season for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken 19th overall by the Cincinnati Reds in the MLB Draft.
- UVa closers own 162 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.6 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

CAVALIERS TAKE FIRST-EVER FOREIGN TOUR

- Virginia went on an eight-day international tour to Central America from Dec. 17-24, marking the baseball program's first-ever foreign tour.
- UVa traveled to Panama and Costa Rica.
- The foreign tour enabled the young squad to gel through extra practice time, an exhibition game in Panama City and team-building events.
- In its exhibition contest, UVa scored a 9-1 win over Panama Metro on Dec. 18 at Rod Carew National Stadium, a 27,000-seat stadium which hosted games in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- During its travels through Panama, the Cavaliers had the opportunity to tour the Miraflores Locks at the Panama Canal, canoe down the Tigris River and visit the indigenous Embera Village, where the team toured and learned about the village's customs.
- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 548-199-2 (.732) in his 12th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor's 74.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 1 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 11 of O'Connor's seasons, including nine 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

MOST WINS SINCE 2009

- With 332 victories since the start of the 2009 season, Virginia owns the most wins of any team in the nation in that span.
- The Cavaliers have won 50 games or more four times in the last five seasons.

VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 13 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).
- UVA also lost OF Brandon Downes (7th round), INF Branden Cogswell (7th), RHP Artie Lewicki (8th), RHP Whit Mayberry (21st) and C Nate Irving (34th).
- With eight players drafted, UVA tied for the second most picks of any school in 2014 (Ole Miss, 9).
- UVA had six players taken in the top 10 rounds – most of any school.

VIRGINIA HOLDS NATIONAL ERA LEAD SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 10 seasons with a 3.04 team ERA since 2005.
- UVA finished second nationally in ERA (2.23) last year and has ranked among the NCAA top 20 in nine of the last 10 years.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2012 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
