FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Saturday's game with BYU commences the 124th season of UVA football and the 100th season the Cavaliers open the year at home. UVA is 73-19-7 all-time when the first game of a season is played in Charlottesville.
- The last time BYU came to Charlottesville was the dedication game at the newly expanded Carl Smith Center, Home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium on Sept. 2, 2000.
- Virginia is one of five schools at the FBS level that does not have a quarterback on its 2013 roster that appeared in any 2012 games. California, FAU, Iowa and Penn State are the others.
- UVA junior running back Kevin Parks amassed 1,443 yards during his first two seasons with the Cavaliers. Only Wali Lundy (1,755) has rushed for more yards at UVA during his first two seasons in Charlottesville.
- Virginia is one of four FBS schools with three assistant coaches that have been an FBS or FCS head coach.

VIRGINIA OPENS 124TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

- The University of Virginia commences its 124th season of football Saturday against BYU.
- UVA will be playing its 83rd season in Scott Stadium, which opened Oct. 15, 1931, against VMI.
- UVA is 79-35-9 (.679) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 73-19-7 (.773) in home season openers and have won 16 of their last 19 openers in Scott Stadium.
- In his career as a head coach, Mike London has won all five of his season-openers: 2008 at Elon and 2009 at Duke while at Richmond and 2010 vs. Richmond, 2011 vs. William & Mary and 2012 vs. Richmond while at Virginia.
- With a win over BYU, Mike London will become the first UVA head coach to win a season-opening game in each of his first four years at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- In addition to London, Rice Warren (1913, 1920-21) is the only other UVA head coach to win the season openers in his first three years at Virginia.

VIRGINIA VS. BYU

- Virginia owns a 2-1 edge in the all-time series with BYU, which dates back to the 1987 All American Bowl in Birmingham, Ala. The last two games between these two programs were part of a home-and-home series in 1999 (Provo) and 2000 (Charlottesville).
- The last meeting (Sept. 2, 2000) opened up the 2000 season and was the dedication game at the newly expanded Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium. BYU won in overtime, 38-35.
- The 2000 meeting featured two coaching greats – Virginia's George Welsh and BYU's LaVell Edwards, who amassed 446 career head coaching wins between the two of them. Ironically each man retired from coaching following the 2000 season. Entering 2013 season, Welsh's 189 career victories place him No. 30 all-time at the FBS level and Edwards' 257 wins place him No. 7 all-time.
- BYU is the first Independent team UVA has faced since hosting Navy on Sept. 10, 1994.
- BYU was in the WAC when these programs first met in the 1987 All American Bowl and the Mountain West Conference during the 1999 and 2000 meetings.
- Virginia returns the trip to Provo next season (Sept. 20, 2014). UVA and BYU also have two more meetings scheduled: Sept. 7, 2019 (Charlottesville) and Sept. 19, 2020 (Provo).

NOTABLES FROM THE BYU SERIES

- The 1987 All American Bowl was billed as a high scoring, offensive shootout between Virginia QB Scott Secules, the ACC's top-rated passer, and BYU's Sean Covey. Instead the Cavaliers relied on a conservative run-oriented attack and several big defensive stands to defeat pass-happy BYU, 22-16, at Legion Field in Birmingham, Ala.
- BYU's Covey threw for 394 yards on 37-of-61 passing with one INT and one TD, while Secules was 10-of-19 for 162 yards and one TD pass. Secules rushed for another score.
- In the 1999 trip, UVA's first to Provo, Utah, the Cavaliers outran No. 17 BYU 45-40 behind 210 rushing yards and two TDs by future NFL standout Thomas Jones.
- Dan Ellis threw for 190 yards and three TDs as UVA jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead.
- BYU made the game interesting with the game's only score of the fourth quarter when an errant 19-yard pass by BYU QB Kevin Feterik caromed off a UVA defender in the end zone and into the hands of Carlos Nuno for a TD with 10:54 to play. Feterik was later intercepted on a fourth-and-goal pass by UVA safety Jerton Evans with 1:37 left to preserve the victory.
- Owen Pochman's 26-yard field goal in overtime lifted BYU to a 38-35 win over UVA in the most recent meeting, in Charlottesville to kickoff the 2000 season.
- BYU rallied from 21-0 deficit at halftime to force overtime. BYU's Bret Engemann was 34-of-41 for 447 passing yards. He completed two TD passes in the final 8:11 of the second half, including a six-yard scoring strike to WR Margin Hooks with 50 seconds remaining to erase a 14-point fourth-quarter Cavalier lead.
- Antwoine Womack led UVA on the ground with 15 rushes for 160 yards and two touchdowns.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

On each Monday during the football season, the UVa Athletics Media Relations office will conduct the weekly football press conference, attended by head coach Mike London and selected student-athletes. London will field questions beginning at 3 p.m. and student-athletes will begin interviews at 3:30 p.m. Snacks will be served.

Quotes from the Monday press conference will be posted on VirginiaSports.com Monday afternoon.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available each Monday, depending on class schedules. This is the best opportunity to interview players. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVa Athletics Media Relations office by Noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

ACC INJURY GUIDELINES

On each Monday during the season, ACC schools will announce any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

VIRGINIA IN THE MONTH OF AUGUST

- UVA's 2013 season-opening game with BYU on Aug. 31 marks the seventh game in Virginia football history to be played in the month of August and the first since 2008's season-opening loss to USC.
- Virginia is 1-5 all-time in the month of August and 1-2 at Scott Stadium.
- UVA faced Notre Dame in 1989, Wisconsin in 2001, Colorado State & Florida State in 2002, Duke in 2003 and USC in 2008.

BYU CONNECTIONS

- UVA offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild knows BYU well, facing the Cougars as the quarterback at Colorado State from 1978-80. Fairchild was a second-team All-WAC quarterback in 1980 behind BYU's Jim McMahon.
- Fairchild also faced BYU 15 times during his coaching stops at Colorado State, New Mexico and San Diego State.
- UVA associate head coach for offense and tight ends coach Tom O'Brien first faced BYU as a collegiate coach in the Inaugural Holiday Bowl in 1978 when he was at Navy as the offensive tackles and tight end coach. It was O'Brien's first bowl game as a collegiate coach. Navy won 23-16.
- O'Brien was also part of the UVA staff during the 1987 All American Bowl as the offensive line coach. O'Brien defeated BYU in 2005 and 2006 as the head coach at Boston College.
- UVA offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim faced BYU while playing on the offensive line at the Air Force Academy.
- Wachenheim also faced BYU six times during his coaching stops at Air Force, Rice and Utah State.
- UVA special teams coordinator and running backs coach Larry Lewis has faced BYU five times as a collegiate coach during stops at Colorado State and Washington State.

SCHOOLS BOUND FOR THE EAST: UVA HOSTS BYU AND OREGON

- BYU and Oregon visit Scott Stadium in consecutive weeks to open the 2013 season for the Virginia Cavaliers.
- It is the first time in UVA program history that two different schools west of the Mississippi River have come to Charlottesville to face Virginia in the same season.
- In fact, BYU and Oregon's trips to Scott Stadium only mark the 11th and 12th time in UVA program history that the Cavaliers have hosted a team from west of the Mississippi River.
- Teams that have visited Charlottesville from the West are: BYU (2000, 2013), Colorado State (2002), Idaho (2011), Kansas (1991), Louisiana Tech (2012), Oregon (2013), San Jose State (1998), Texas (1996), TCU (2009) USC (2008) and Wyoming (2006).
- UVA is 5-5 against teams from west of the Mississippi River when the game is played in Charlottesville.
- Including 2013, UVA has hosted a team from west of the Mississippi River in six of the past eight seasons after hosting only five in the first 116 years of the program.
- The combined round trip miles for BYU and Oregon to travel to Charlottesville and back is 9,148 miles.
- More teams from west of the Mississippi River are scheduled to come to Charlottesville in the future: UCLA (2014), Boise State (2015), Stanford (2017) and BYU (2019). UVA will return each trip the subsequent season.

REMEMBER THE TITANS

- UVa's Jay Whitmire is slated to start at right tackle for the Cavaliers in 2013.
- Whitmire owns one career start entering 2013, which came in the 2012 Wake Forest game at right tackle when Morgan Moses missed the start with an injury.
- Whitmire graduated from T.C. Williams High School in Alexandria, Va., the same school made famous in Disney film, "Remember the Titans."
- There is a tragic connection between UVa and Charlottesville with one of the real life individuals from the famous Titans story.
- Gerry Bertier, the defensive lineman who was paralyzed from the waist down in an automobile accident, passed away at the University of Virginia hospital due to injuries suffered from a second accident, when his car was struck by a drunk driver on March 20, 1981 on Route 20 in Charlottesville. Bertier was 27.

TIGHT ENDS CONTINUE TO PRODUCE

- Virginia has been strong at tight end over the last decade, and that continues with Jake McGee and Zachary Swanson.
- McGee had one of the more successful offensive seasons for a tight end in recent memory, hauling in 28 receptions for 374 yards and five touchdowns in 2012.
- McGee's five touchdowns in 2012 tied for the fifth-most all-time by a UVa tight end in a season.
- Only Heath Miller (2002 & 2003), Bruce McGonnigal (1989) and Ed Carrington (1965) own more touchdowns in a season by a tight end than McGee's 2012 total.
- Swanson moves back to tight end after being the nation's tallest fullback in 2012.
- Rob Burns moved in 2012 from defensive end to tight end and should see time in 2013.
- UVa TEs have caught 577 passes for 6,222 yards and 52 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span.

- TE Jake McGee and current Seattle Seahawks' starting quarterback Russell Wilson both are graduates of Richmond's Collegiate School.
- When Wilson graduated and left to play for current UVa associate head coach of offensive and tight ends coach Tom O'Brien at NC State, McGee was the quarterback that replaced Wilson at Collegiate for the 2007 season.
- McGee came to Virginia in 2010 as a quarterback and was issued No. 14. He switched to tight end the first week of preseason camp.

- UVa is tied for second behind Michigan State for the most Canadian natives in the nation on its current roster.

NICHOLSON ANCHORS DEFENSIVE SECONDARY

- Junior CB Demetrious Nicholson is now the salty veteran of the Virginia defense, starting all 25 of Virginia's games since he stepped foot on Grounds prior to the 2011 season.
- Of the 1,699 defensive plays Virginia has lined up for since the opening game of the 2011 season, Nicholson has played 1,654 of those plays, meaning since Sept. 3, 2011 he has played 97.35 percent of UVa's defensive plays.
- In 2011 Demetrious Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the corner-back position since Kevin Cook did so in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.

REPLACING GREER AND REYNOLDS

- Virginia must replace linebackers Steve Greer and La'Roy Reynolds who amassed 626 career tackles between them from 2009-12. Greer concluded his career No. 6 all-time at UVa with 376 career tackles.
- Greer's 376 career tackles are 237 more than the combined career numbers of all linebackers still in the UVa program. Daquan Romero (57), Henry Coley (44), D.J. Hill (15), Demeitre Brim (8) and Kwontie Moore (4) combined have only 139 career tackles entering 2013.
- Greer and Reynolds' 626 career tackles is almost equal to the 629 combined career tackles of every other returning Cavalier that started a game on defense in 2012.
- Greer's 376 tackles led all ACC active players at the conclusion of the 2012 season and was No. 7 among all active FBS players. Only Notre Dame's Manti Te'o had more career tackles among active BCS conference players at the time.
- Reynolds missed 2.5 games with a hand injury and still amassed 90 tackles in 10 games. Reynolds now a rookie with the Jacksonville Jaguars and was signed as a free agent.

UVa CLOSED 2012 RANKED IN THREE & OUTS

- UVa closed out 2012 No. 15 in the nation as a defense forcing three and outs, posting a 4.58 three and out average per game.
- UVa's opponents went three and out 55 times over 12 games; 33.5 percent of UVa's opponents drives ended in a three and out.
- UVa was No. 3 in the ACC as Florida State led the nation at 47.3 percent of drives ending in a three and out.
- Former NC State assistant head coach for defense and current UVa defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta helped the Wolfpack (5.08 per game) tie for No. 8 and Clemson (4.00 per game) was No. 20, rounding out the ACC in the top 20.
- UVa opens 2013 with BYU, who finished 2012 ranked No. 3 in the nation with 5.31 three and outs per game.

TENUTA GIVING UVa'S DEFENSE AN AGGRESSIVE MAKEOVER IN 2013

- Virginia's new associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta is a UVa alum and looking to bring an aggressive makeover to the Cavaliers.
- UVa over the past five seasons has the sixth-worst turnover margin in the nation. In 2012 UVa recorded only four interceptions, the fewest by a Virginia Cavalier team since the birth of the forward pass.
- Tenuta said prior to the season that "we want to create problems for the front five and never let the quarterback set his feet in the passing game."
- UVa over the past few seasons have been near the bottom nationally in turnover margin and sacks per game – Tenuta wants to change that.
- Tenuta enters his 33rd season of collegiate coaching and his 17th as a defensive coordinator. He has had stops in the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and at Notre Dame and looks to create turnovers and sack numbers that have declined in recent years at UVa.

- For the third season in a row, UVa will enter the year with a different placekicker atop of the depth chart.
- Robert Randolph concluded his four-year career in 2011 and he was followed by Drew Jarrett in 2012.
- Heading into the 2013 camp, Ian Frye was slated to take the primary placekicking duties for the Cavaliers.
- Also in the mix to replace Jarrett is redshirt freshman Dylan Sims and fifth-year transfer R.C. Willenbrock, who graduated from Dartmouth in May. Willenbrock played in one game for the Big Green in 2009 and missed the 2010 and 2011 seasons with an injury. Willenbrock also played in nine games for the Dartmouth men's lacrosse team from 2010-12.
- Willenbrock built his own computer at the age of 13.
- Frye has the most experience as the primary kickoff specialist for UVa in 2012. He was 3-of-5 on field goals with a long of 30 yards. Frye kicked off 48 times with 22 touchbacks. He averaged 62.0 yards per kickoff.

LS BLAKE BLAZE TEACHES A UVA CLASS

- Junior back-up long snapper Blake Blaze taught a class in the Spring that three UVa football players took.
- The one-credit class was titled "Survey of Masculinity."
- PK Ian Frye, WR Miles Gooch and SS Anthony Harris took the class which was a pass/fail class.

BLAZING HIS WAY IN LEADERSHIP

- UVa LS Blake Blaze is the lone UVa student representative on the University's Board of Visitors for the 2013-14 academic year.

LONG SNAPPING THE LAWN

- Junior long snappers Matt Fortin and Blake Blaze were both bestowed the honor of residing in a room on The Lawn at UVa.
- Only 54 students enjoy the annual privilege of residing in one of the University's original buildings.
- Blaze is located three doors down from Fortin.
- Notable Lawn residents include former UVa men's basketball All-American Ralph Sampson, as well as Katie Couric and Tiny Fey.

FIVE STUDENT ASSISTANTS HELP STAFF, INCLUDING JACOB RAINEY

- Virginia has five student assistants currently helping out.
- Pablo Alvarez, Adam Caplinger and Tim Cwlna will not play due to medical reasons in 2013.
- Due to offseason surgery, Sean Cascarano is currently not participating and also helping out as a student assistant.
- Also on that list of student assistants is Jacob Rainey, a freshman who will assist offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild with the quarterbacks.
- Jacob Rainey, a quarterback from Woodberry Forest in Virginia, had his right leg amputated after a freak injury in a scrimmage in 2011.
- Rainey suffered a dislocated right knee, but while he was hospitalized the news got far worse. An artery in his lower right leg had been severed, cutting off circulation. Over the next week, Rainey underwent four surgeries as doctors tried to save his leg. They were unsuccessful.
- A week after Rainey was tackled on a routine play, doctors amputated his right leg above the knee.
- As word of Rainey's ordeal spread, he was inundated with letters and gifts from well-wishers, including Alabama football coach Nick Saban, Green Bay Packers linebacker Clay Matthews and current New England Patriot Tim Tebow, who was quarterback for the Denver Broncos at the time.
- Tebow reached out to Rainey and wanted to meet in person. On Dec. 24, Rainey, along with his father and older brother, attended the Broncos' game in Buffalo as Tebow's guests.
- Rainey's experience and inspiring story was documented an episode of ESPN's series E:60.
- The Woodberry Forest quarterback returned to the field in 2012 and played with a prosthetic leg, throwing two touchdowns on nine passes.

DID YOU KNOW?

- UVa WR Tim Smith is cousins with MLB stars B.J. and Justin Upton of the Atlanta Braves. Smith's father, Timothy Smith, Sr., is first cousins with B.J. and Justin's father, Manny Upton.
- UVa quarterback David Watford and current wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins and both were quarterbacks at Hampton High before enrolling at UVa.
- UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 103 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day. (More on page 11).
- Paul Wisman also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew staff and has done so since 1956. His 58 straight years of work in the press box is the longest current streak in the nation (More on page 11).
- Current UVa offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator at Liberty (2006-08) when UVa WR Dominique Terrell's older brother, Zach, was a standout All-Big South running back and slot receiver for the Flames.
- 2013 marks the first time in program history UVa has had eight home games on the schedule and is the sixth season in a row that UVa has had at least seven home games on the schedule.
- CB Demetrious Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.
- Redshirt freshman Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.
- Redshirt freshman CB Kelvin Rainey has two brothers who have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick is a senior this year at Arizona.
- Redshirt freshman Israel Vaughan's older brother, Joshua, is a member of the Atlanta Falcons, played for Mike London at Richmond and was a member of its 2008 FCS National Championship team.
- Air Force Academy graduate and UVa assistant coach Scott Wachenheim was awarded his bachelor's degree by then-President Ronald Reagan.
- Graduate assistant Jacob Hodges served as a team manager for two years (2008, 2009) and then was a three-year letterwinner as UVa's holder (2010-12).
- CB DreQuan Hoskey, DE Trent Corney and RB Khalek Shepherd all were members of the UVa track & field team in 2013.
- Hoskey also ran track at Virginia in 2010 and competed at the ACC and NCAA Championships.
- Freshman Daniel Hamm came to UVa to run track. He also walked on to the football team as a tailback.
- Redshirt freshman CB C.J. Moore is the nephew of Gail Devers, three-time Olympic champion in track & field.
- Sophomore Trent Corney's older brother, Taylor, won the Bronze at the 2009 Pan American Junior Championships in the Decathlon. Taylor has also been ranked in the Top 10 in the world in the Decathlon.

DAVID WATFORD MAKES FIRST CAREER START AGAINST BYU

- UVa head coach Mike London announced during a teleconference on Aug. 12 that David Watford would start against BYU in the season opener.
- Watford became the fourth different QB to start a game during the Mike London era at Virginia.

Of London's 37 games at UVa, 12 have been started by Marc Verica, 21 by Michael Rocco and four by Phillip Sims.

Watford is the seventh different UVa QB to start a game since the start of the 2007 season. Included in that group was two games started by Vic Hall and two by Peter Lalich. The other 70 games over the span of six seasons have been started by Jameel Sewell (23), Marc Verica (22), Michael Rocco (21) and Phillip Sims (4).

WITH WATFORD ITS ALL IN THE FAMILY

- David Watford and current UVa wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins.
- Both played quarterback at Hampton High School in Hampton, Va., and Watford followed his older cousin to UVa to play quarterback.
- Hagans was the starting quarterback at UVa from 2004-05. He was wide receiver and kick returner in 2002 and 2003 when he was the back up quarterback to Matt Schaub.
- Other notable quarterbacks from the Hampton HS football family are Ronald Curry and Tyrod Taylor.

WATFORD OWNS OVERTIME WIN FOR VIRGINIA

- David Watford led UVa to an overtime victory over Idaho in 2011.
- Coming off the bench as a true freshman, Watford completed a 27-yard pass to fellow true freshman Dominique Terrell for what ended up as the game-winning touchdown.
- The Virginia defense deflected a two-point attempt afterwards to solidify the overtime victory, 21-20.
- Watford ended the Idaho game 10-of-20 for 95 yards and the touchdown.

A LOOK BACK AT COLLEGE FOOTBALL HISTORY ON THE GROUNDS OF UVA AS THE COLONNADES AT LAMBETH FIELD CELEBRATE 100 YEARS

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 100 in 2013. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field in 2013 camp, taking part in two scrimmages on the hallowed ground.

WISEMAN AND RISHER HAVE BOTH WORKED ON UVA'S FOOTBALL STAT CREW FOR 50+ YEARS

- Paul Wiseman and Dr. John Risher have each worked on the stats crew at Scott Stadium for over 50 years.
- Wiseman enters his 58th consecutive season on the UVA stat crew, which is tied with Toledo's Chet Sullwold for the longest active streak in FBS football. Both men started in 1956.
- Risher began in 1963 and enters his 51st season in a row.
- Risher use to be Wiseman's primary care physician down in Lynchburg before retiring. When Risher found out what Wiseman did with UVA, he hounded him to plug him in with the stats crew too.
- Risher is UVA's oldest living football alum. He turned 103 on May 13 of this year. He golfed nine holes on his 100th birthday in 2010.
- Wiseman has missed only one home game at Scott Stadium since he started working on the stat crew and that was the 2011 season-opening game against William & Mary.
- The William & Mary game in 2011 is the only home game Wiseman has missed for that matter at Scott Stadium since 1946.
- In April 2013, both Risher and Wiseman were recipients of this year's "Order of the Crossed Sabre" award, which goes annually to someone who has contributed greatly to Virginia football.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 428 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 244-172-12.

As Mike London prepares for his fourth season as the head football coach at Virginia, the makeup of the Cavalier program continues to change and improve.

London will enter the 2013 season with a lot of new looks. His coaching staff underwent a major overhaul following a 4-8 finish in 2012 and now features five new faces sporting a significant amount of major college coaching experience. London's fourth edition of UVa football will feature new coordinators on offense, defense, special teams and for recruiting.

The Virginia football program took on a dramatic new look in March when the George Welsh Indoor Practice Facility opened behind the McCue Center. The facility, that features a full field and end zones, allows the Cavaliers to practice and train without disruption from inclement weather. As part of the project, the team's primary practice field received a new FieldTurf playing surface.

Topping off the off-season was another top-30 recruiting class that featured the first five-star signee in London's tenure at Virginia.

With all of those changes, there is still one constant in the Virginia program - London's desire to build a program that competes for championships. While the results from the 2012 campaign were not satisfactory for London, the team featured a number of young players who displayed the ability to turn the fortunes of the Cavaliers like they experienced in 2011.

That season the Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVa being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. A total of five Cavalier players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

In the spring of 2013 OT Oday Aboushi was selected by the New York Jets to mark the 30th consecutive season a UVa player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media. He did not just wait for constituents to come to Virginia, he actively took the Cavalier program to the public.

London embraced a groundbreaking 18-episode television production entitled "The Building of a Program" that gave an all-access look at UVa football. He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He quickly defined the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVa the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years and student-athletes were heavily involved in community service projects and outreach programs.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVa staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVa to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texas. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and

played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina, are the parents of four children - Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. He has three older children, Michael, Jr., Brandon and Kristen through a previous marriage. The 51-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants practice squad. Brandon since 2010 has been with the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVa women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVa from 1991-95.
